TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Todd Rosiak's Brewers** and the fifth game (2-2) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that includes a 2-1 series victory over the **Phillies** (Mon-Wed).
- Thu's off day was Cin's first since 7/24...played 20 consecutive days without a rest...were scheduled off on 8/3 but instead finished the suspended **Speedway Classic** vs **Atl** in **Bristol, TN**.
- Following tomorrow's game, will hit the road for a 9-game trip at **LAA** (8/18-8/20), **AZ** (8/22-8/24) and **LAD** (8/25-8/27)...it will be their first of 2 consecutive trips out west (at **Padres**, **A's**, and **Cardinals** next month).

HARD TO SWALLOW: The Reds have lost 28 games this season in which they held a lead, including yesterday vs **Mil** (up 8-1, lost 10-8).

- Last night's 10-8 loss was the first time the Reds squandered a lead of at least 7 runs and lost since 9/23/23 vs **Pit** (up 9-0, lost 13-12).
- It was Cin's fourth loss when scoring 8 or more runs, matching **AZ** for the most such occurrences in the majors.
- Following **Noelvi Marte's** 2nd-inning single, **Mil** pitchers retired the next 23 consecutive Reds batters...it marked the first time since 8/29/23 vs **SF** (26) that 23 Cin batters went down in order.
- The Reds went 7 consecutive innings in last night's game in which they didn't reach base vs relief pitchers...was the first time that's ever happened since at least 1901.

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have not been swept in any of their last 40 series dating back to last year and including all 39 series in which they've completed this year.

- Haven't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at **Cle** (2g), a span of 40 straight series...per *Elias*, that ranks as the fourth-longest streak of sweepless series in team history (see below).
- This 39-series, *in-season* streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 6 occasions during this streak, avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a series (4/23 at **Mia**, 5/15 vs **CWS**, 6/22 at **StL**, 7/2 at **Bos**, 7/23 at **Wsh**, 7/30 vs **LAD**).

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD: The Reds are in the midst of a final 59-game stretch in which 32 games have been/will be played against opponents with records at or above .500 (3-0 vs **TB**, 1-2 vs **LAD**, 2-1 at **Chc**, 2-1 vs **Phi**, 0-1 vs **Mil**, 3g at **LAD**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**, 3g at **SD**, 4g at **Chc**, 3g at **Mil**).

- As of today, the Reds have the toughest remaining schedule in the Major Leagues, based on opponents' winning percentage (.529).
- NYM** has the 10th-toughest remaining schedule (.509) while **Chc** (.475), **SD** (.467), and **LAD** (.466) have the easiest remaining schedules in the majors.

SERIES NOTES: The **Brewers** have won each of the last 12 series, 13 of the last 14 series, and 16 of the last 18 series vs Cin dating back to 2021.

- Since 7/16/21, **Mil** has won 43 of 59 meetings against Cin, including 25 of 34 contests against the Reds since the beginning of the 2023 season.
- The Reds have lost 44 of 78 games at **American Family Field** since 2016 and 17 of 25 there since 2022.
- The Reds have lost 32 of 43 games vs **Mil** at **GABP** since 9/24/19.

EXTRA DE LA CRUZ: In last night's 10-8 loss to the **Brewers**, **SS Elly De La Cruz** collected his 153rd career extra-base hit (2nd-inning, 2-run double) to tie **Vada Pinson** (1958-60) for second-most XBH by a Reds batter through his first 3 career seasons since 1900, trailing only **Frank Robinson's** 196 from 1956-58 (courtesy *Elias*).

NOELVI'S JUST RIGHT: RF **Noelvi Marte** made his first 2 apps in RF on 7/20 & 7/22 and has played exclusively at that position beginning 7/29 (15g, 13gs) .

- In 15 games beginning 7/29, is slashing .321/.321/.536 with 2 HR, 6 2B, 9 RBI and 18 times on base.
- From 8/9-8/13 collected 5 doubles over 5 games to become the fifth Reds batter since 1900 to produce at least 5 doubles over any 5-game span at age 23 or younger...he joins **George Foster** (1971), **Bobby Tolan** (1969), **Vada Pinson** (several times from 1959-60), and **Frank Robinson** (1956) as the only Cin batters to accomplish that feat before turning 24 (courtesy *Elias*).

DEADLINE DEALS: Cin made 3 trades leading up to the 7/31 deadline:

- 7/31: Acquired from the **Athletics INF/OF Miguel Andujar** (ahn-DOO-har) in exchange for **RHP Kenya Huggins**.
- 7/30: Acquired from the **Pirates 3B Ke'Bryan Hayes** (key-Bryan, #3) in exchange for **LHP Taylor Rogers**, **SS Sammy Stafura**, and cash considerations.
- 7/30: Acquired from the **Rays RHP Zack Littell** (lih-TELL, #52) in exchange for **LHP Adam Serwinowski** and **RHP Brian Van Belle**.

PRONUNCIATION: Last name is pronounced “lih-TELL”.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 14-8 win on 8/10 at Pit (4.2ip, 9h, 4r/4er, 0bb, 3k, 83TP).

- Was his shortest start since 4/10 vs LAA (4.0ip).
- Was his 11th start in which he didn’t issue a walk.
- With 1 out in the 5th, allowed an RBI-groundout to the last batter he faced, Jack Suwinski...was replaced by Scott Barlow who struck out Jared Triolo to end the inning and strand a runner at third.
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 16 of his 24 batters.

AUGUST 5 (REDS DEBUT): Made his Reds debut on 8/5 at Chc and earned the 5-1 win (7.0ip, 3h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 8k, 1hr, 92TP).

- Became the fifth Reds pitcher over the last 125 years to post at least 7.0 innings and allow 1 run or none, with 8 or more strikeouts in his team debut (Also: Brady Singer 3/31/25 vs Tex, Johnny Cueto 4/3/08 vs AZ, Mo Sanford 8/9/91 at SD, and Tom Seaver 6/18/77 at Mon).
- Was his 14th quality start of 2025, the 28th of his career.
- His 8 strikeouts were a season high and his most since striking out a career-high 9 batters on 5/28/24 vs Oak.
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 17 of the 26 batters he faced... improved his first-pitch strike pct. to 65.8% which ranks among Major League leaders.

JULY 30: Did not factor in the decision in the Rays’ 11-inning 5-4 loss on 7/30 at NYY (5.0ip, 2h, 0r, 4bb, 4k, 94TP)...was traded to the Reds following the game.

- Was his first scoreless app of the season and his first since 9/19/24 vs Bos (7.0ip).
- Was his 69th start and 224th career appearance.
- Was in line for the 1-0 victory but fell victim to Bryan Baker’s blown save.

JULY 25: Suffered the 7-2 loss on 7/25 at Cin (6.0ip, 10h, 5r/5er, 0bb, 2k, 2hr, 97TP).

- Gave up 10 hits for the second time this season (also: 5/31 at Hou).
- Gave up a 1-out solo homer in the 2nd inning to Tyler Stephenson...retired 5 straight after that.
- Allowed 4 singles in a 2-run 4th inning.
- Stranded a leadoff double in the 5th and had 2 outs with nobody on in the 6th before allowing a double and a 2-run homer to TJ Friedl.
- Was the third time in 21 starts he gave up 5 or more runs.

MAY 31 (COMPLETE GAME): Produced his first career complete game in the 16-3 win on 5/31 at Hou (9.0ip, 10h, 3r/3er, 1bb, 6k, 2hr, 1hb, 117TP).

- It was the first CG by a Rays pitcher since Ryan Yarbrough (6/3/21 at NYY).
- Littell’s CG ended the Rays’ run of 647 consecutive games without a CG...was the second-longest streak in Major League history, eclipsed by TB’s own 731-game streak from 5/15/16-6/2/21.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB: Was acquired by the Reds from the Rays on 7/30 for LHP Adam Serwinowski and RHP Brian Van Belle.

3 RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in 18 of his last 21 outings dating back to April 16 (128ip, 45r/45er, 20bb, 86k, 22hr, 3.16 ERA, 13QS).

STARTING AS A STARTER: Is in his second season as a full-time starter after joining the Rays rotation in July 2023.

EFFICIENT: Averages 14.5 pitches per inning, the T2nd-lowest mark in the majors (Sea’s Bryan Woo 14.2, Phi’s Cristopher Sánchez 14.5).

- Has retired 137 batters on 2 pitches or fewer, second-most in the majors behind Sea’s Bryan Woo (140)...this includes a Major League-best 64 first-pitch outs.

LIMITING FREE PASSES: His 3.9% walk rate is the lowest mark among all qualified Major League pitchers (Det’s Skubal 4.0%, StL’s Gray 4.0%).

- Since 2023, his 4.1% walk rate ranks third in the majors during that time (min. 1000bf) behind Sea’s George Kirby (3.3%) and Bal’s Zach Eflin (3.6%).
- Is just 1 of 2 active pitchers with 60 or more career starts, who has fewer walks as a starting pitcher (68) than games started (71)...Kirby (104gs/84bb) is the other.

BEGINNING JULY 27, 2024: Over his last 33 starts dating back to 7/27/24, is pitching to a 3.15 ERA (.238/.275/.414, 17qs, 1.07 WHIP, 4.2 BB%, 68er/194.1ip).
