TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their first road trip of the 2026 season with the 2nd of 3 contests against the Los Angeles Angels (1-0)...Seattle will also visit the Texas Rangers for a 3-game series on the trip...the Mariners went 3-4 on their opening homestand against the Cleveland Guardians (2-2) and New York Yankees (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners opened their road schedule with a 3-1, 10-inning victory over the Los Angeles Angels.

- **Good Morning, Good Afternoon, Good Night** - **Andrés Muñoz** struck out the side in order last night, the 14th time since 2022 he has done so.
- **'WOO'nderful Yet Again** - **Bryan Woo** allowed just 1 hit over 7.0 scoreless innings in last night's win... Woo has recorded 3 starts of at least 7.0 innings and 1-or-fewer hits since the start of last season, tied for the most in MLB (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD).
- **Naylz is Clutch** - **Josh Naylor** recorded 2 hits including a 2-run single in the 10th inning...since 2023, Naylor has recorded 105 RBI in the 7th-inning or later, 4th-most in MLB during that span.
- **Ouchy!** - **Randy Arozarena** has recorded 99 hit-by-pitches in his career, 1 away from becoming the ninth active player with 100+ career HBP at the plate...Arozarena's 68 HBP since 2023 are tied for the most in MLB (also: Ty France).
- **Emerson Extended** - The Mariners signed top prospect **Colt Emerson** to a contract extension through the 2033 season, with a club option through 2034...Emerson was selected to the 40-man roster and optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...Emerson, 20, is ranked as the Mariners #1 prospect, and the #7 overall prospect in the Major Leagues, according to both *MLB Pipeline* and *Baseball America*
- **Cap is Back** - **J.P. Crawford** made his season debut in last night's game after being activated from the 10-day Injured List (right shoulder inflammation) on Thursday.

COLE BLOODED...**Cole Young** extended his hitting streak to a career-high tying 7 games (3/27-c) with a go-ahead triple in the 10th inning last night...the 22-year-old second baseman is batting .310 (9x29) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 5 RBI, a .333 OBP and slugging .552 (.885 OPS) in 8 games so far this season...Young's 0.8 bWAR is tied for the MLB lead (also: Joey Wiemer-WSH and Shea Langeliers-ATH).

DONNIE BALLGAME...**Brendan Donovan** yesterday appeared in his 500th career game...his 7-game on-base streak to begin his Mariners career was snapped, but he is still batting .370 (10x27) with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 4 RBI, 1 stolen base, a .485 OBP and slugging .667 (1.152 OPS) with a 244 OPS+... among MLB hitters so far in 2026 he ranks T-8th in OBP.

BIG EM ON THE BUMP...**Emerson Hancock** makes his 2nd start of the 2026 season in tonight's game... in his season debut on *Sunday Night Baseball*, March 29 against the Guardians, he tossed 6.0 no-hit innings allowing just 1 walk and 1 hit-by-pitch with 9 strikeouts...he became just the 2nd starting pitcher in Mariners history to toss at least 6.0 no-hit innings with at least 9 strikeouts, joining Félix Hernández (Perfect Game, 8/15/12 vs. TB).

"THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW" RETURNS...the second season of "The Cal Raleigh Show" presented by the Puyallup Tribe debuted Thursday on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)**...the show, hosted by Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer**, will feature in-depth conversations with Mariners star catcher, **Cal Raleigh**...the program is set to air **every Thursday**, usually at 5:00 p.m. PT, moving into an earlier slot when the Mariners play in different timezones... 'catch' all of the episodes on SeattleSports.com or on the Seattle Sports app.

CALLING ALL ANGELS...several Mariners players have been historically good against the Angels in their careers...**Andrés Muñoz** holds a 16.75 SO/9 and a 0.68 ERA over 26.1 IP, ranking 1st all-time in SO/9 and 5th in ERA (min. 20.0 IP) of any pitcher against the Angels...**Julio Rodríguez** has a 1.064 OPS in 219 plate appearances against the Halos, 2nd highest OPS trailing only José Ramírez-CLE (1.085).

PITCHING HAS BEEN NAILS...the Mariners pitching staff has been excellent over their first 8 games of 2026, holding a 2.68 ERA (22 ER, 74.0 IP), 18 walks, 88 strikeouts, 0.88 WHIP and a 4.89 strikeout to walk ratio...among MLB staffs, the Mariners rank 3rd in ERA, 3rd in WHIP, 2nd in SO/BB, 5th in SO/9 (10.70), 2nd in BB/9 (2.19), T-2nd in fWAR, 3rd in H/9 (5.7) and T-1st in quality starts (5).

T-MOBILE PARK IS THE PLACE TO BE...during the Mariners opening homestand, they drew 239,504 total fans as of the morning of April 3, 3rd-highest total in the big leagues so far behind only the Dodgers and Padres...an average of 34,214 fans watched the Mariners at T-Mobile Park through 7 games.

EXCITEMENT AROUND MARINERS BASEBALL...approximately 450 interviews and media sessions with Mariners players, coaches, and front office personnel were facilitated at 2026 Spring Training, in over 50 unique local, national, and international media outlets that visited Mariners camp in Peoria, Arizona.

MARINERS TV...the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on Mariners.com/Watch to find providers in their area.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners pitching staff dominated the Angels in yesterday's game, tossing the 26th 1-hitter in Mariners history, and...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...**Bryan Woo**, **Matt Brash**, **Andrés Muñoz** and **Gabe Speier** combined to allow just 3 baserunners (1 hit, 1 walk and 1 HBP) and 1 unearned run while striking out 12 and not allowing a runner to reach scoring position until the "ghost runner" in the 10th inning, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...yesterday marked the first time the Mariners have allowed 1-or-fewer hits in an extra-inning game?...it marked the 26th extra-innings 1-hitter in MLB history and first since the Arizona Diamondbacks did so on July 25, 2025 at PIT.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 4

- **1984** - Rookie Phil Bradley's one-out single in the bottom of the 10th inning scores Spike Owen from second as the Mariners top the Toronto Blue Jays, 3-2, before an Opening Night crowd of 43,000.
- **2001** - Norm Charlton begins his third stint with the Mariners by tossing two scoreless innings to close out a 10-2 win over the A's...Charlton previously appeared with the Mariners in '93 and '95-'97
- **2003** - Kazuhiro Sasaki became just the 19th pitcher in AL history with four strikeouts in an inning, at Texas (9th inning).

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 2nd start of the season and the 33rd start of his career...this will be his 39th career appearance including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 1st start against the Angels this season and his 3rd career appearance, including a start and one relief appearance in 2025.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT... Earned his first win of 2026 in his season debut on March 29 vs Cleveland after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings while allowing no hits, only 1 walk and striking out a career-high 9 batters...he threw 97 pitches (62 strikes).

STARTING ON A HIGH NOTE... In his last start on March 29 vs Cleveland he threw a career high 9-strikeouts on 97 pitches, the 3rd most pitches he has thrown in his career...he became the 2nd player in franchise history to toss 9+ SO without a hit allowed, joining Félix Hernández who threw 12 SO in his Perfect Game on Aug. 15, 2012 vs. Tampa Bay... is the first Mariners starter with 6.0+ IP and no hits allowed since James Paxton's threw a no-hitter (5/8/18 at TOR).

FIRST TIME IN ANAHEIM... Tonight's start will mark Hancock's first appearance in Anaheim...his previous 2 appearances against the Angels have been at T-Mobile park where he allowed 3 runs over a combined 7.2 innings, walked only 2, and struck out 6 Angels batters.

FACING SOCAL... In 4 appearances (3 starts) vs. Southern California teams (LAA, SD), he owns a 2.74 ERA and a .261 opponent batting average with 12 strikeouts and 6 walks over 16.4 innings pitched...he has allowed only 2 home runs and 3 extra base hits, including the 2 homers and a double, against the two SoCal teams.

KEEPING IT CLEAN... Owns a 15.2 scoreless inning streak stretching back to last season (9/7/25-c)...his 15.2 scoreless innings have been recorded over 6 appearances, including his start on March 29 vs. Cleveland and 5 relief appearances at the end of the 2025 season...this is the longest streak of his career in innings as well as games...15.2 scoreless innings is the 4th most pitched by a Mariners pitcher since 2022, trailing Andres Muñoz who holds the 1st and 2nd longest (24.2 IP, 19.1 IP) and Matt Brash (17.1 IP).

2025 SEASON... Went 4-5 with a 4.90 ERA (49 ER, 90.0 IP), 64 strikeouts and 31 walks across 22 appearances (16 starts).

LENGTH ON THE MOUND... Has tossed 6.0+ innings in 11 of his 32 career starts, including 6 times during the 2025 season and already once in the 2026 season (last: 3/29 vs. CLE)...the Mariners are 8-3 when he tosses 6.0+ innings compared to 14-12 when he tosses less than 6.0 innings... has also tossed 5.0+ innings in 23 of 32 career starts, doing so in 12 of his 16 starts in 2025.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT... Became the third pitcher in Mariners history and the second starter to record 7-or-more strikeouts withno walks in 4.0-or-less innings pitched on 9/25/25 against Colorado (also: Yusei Kikuchi as a starting pitcher, 6/5/21 at LAA, and Roy Thomas as a relief pitcher, 4/23/1983 at DET).

LIGHTS OUT... Was one of 4 Mariners pitchers to toss 7.0+ shutout innings during the 2025 season after doing so in his July 15 start against the Guardians, joining Luis Castillo (done 2x, 5/19 at CWS and 7/5 vs. PIT), Bryan Woo (6/17 vs. BOS) and George Kirby (8/12 at BAL).

TRANSITION TO THE 'PEN... Made his first career appearance out of the bullpen on 9/1/25 at Tampa Bay, collecting 2 strikeouts across 1 inning pitched...owned a 2.08 ERA (2 ER, 8.2 IP) with a 1.269 WHIP and 4 strikeouts to just 1 walk allowed across 6 relief appearances in 2025.

2025 POSTSEASON... Made two appearances in relief during the Championship Series against Toronto...came into the game in the 9th inning both times, recording 3 strikeouts, 5 walks, and 2 runs on 2 hits in a combined 4.0 innings pitched.

QUICK TRIP TO TACOMA... was 1-2 with a 5.24 ERA (26 ER, 44.2 IP) with a 1.54 WHIP and 56 strikeouts across 11 games (9 starts) with Triple-A Tacoma during the 2025 season...between the 2024 and 2025 seasons, he is 8-5 with a 4.01 ERA (62 ER, 139.0 IP), 1.37 WHIP and 122 strikeouts across 28 appearances (26 starts) with Tacoma...tossed a complete game shutout across 9.0 innings on July 21, 2024 with Tacoma.

- **Stingy** - Has tossed 11.2 scoreless and hitless innings against the Angels in his career...has allowed 1 walk with 16 strikeouts.
- **Rare Air** - Is the only pitcher in MLB history with at least 100 strikeouts and a 1.000 winning percentage.
- **2025 Totals** - Went 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (22 ER, 78.2 IP) with 27 walks, 82 strikeouts and a 1.017 WHIP in 73 appearances, limiting opponents to a .187 batting average in 2025.
- **El Campeón** - Won the 2026 World Baseball Classic with Team Venezuela, which included a pitching appearance in the Championship Game against Team USA on March 17.
- **Career Year** - Posted career bests in ERA (2.52), wins (5), innings pitched (78.2), strikeouts (82) and WHIP (1.017) in 2025.
- **Winning Ways** - Is the only pitcher in MLB history to have 100+ strikeouts and a 1.000 win percentage over their career.
