PITTSBURGH PIRATES (11-17) vs. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (17-10)

April 27, 2025 - Dodger Stadium - Los Angeles, CA - 1:10 PDT - Game #29/Road #16

LHP Bailey Falter (1-2, 5.19 ERA) vs. RHP Tyler Glasnow (1-0, 3.71 ERA)

THE PIRATES: will wrap up their six-game, Los Angeles-area road trip with today's series finale here at Dodger Stadium (won two of three against the Angels in Anaheim to begin the trip)...Would secure their first winning road trip of more than three games since July 9-14, 2024 (2-1 at Milwaukee, 3-0 at Chicago-AL) with a win today...Will have off on Monday before returning to PNC Park to begin a six-game homestand vs. Chicago-NL (April 29-May 1) and San Diego (May 2-4).

HEADING HOME: After today, Pittsburgh will begin a stretch where nine of 12 games will be played at PNC Park (April 29-May 1 vs. Chicago-NL, May 2-4 vs. San Diego, May 9-11 vs. Atlanta)...The only road games that the Pirates will play in that span will be during a three-game trip to St. Louis from May 5-7...Pittsburgh will make two more trips to California in 2025, coming here to play San Diego from May 30-June 1 (also in Arizona from May 26-28) and San Francisco from July 28-30 (also in Colorado from August 1-3).

LEADING THINGS OFF: Oneil Cruz hit his fourth leadoff home run in the last nine games (since April 17 vs. Washington) with his leadoff homer off Roki Sasaki in Saturday night's game...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Cruz is the first Pirates player since at least 1900 to hit four-plus leadoff home runs in a nine-game span (first Major League player to do it since Washington's Kyle Schwarber from June 20-29, 2021)...Per Sarah Langs, his four leadoff home runs in April are the most by a Pirates batter in any calendar month in team history.

A MIGHTY MARCH/APRIL: Oneil Cruz has eight home runs in 2025, tied for third-most in the National League and tied for sixth-most in Major League Baseball...Six of his home runs have come over the last 10 games (since April 16 vs. Washington), which are the most

in Major League Baseball in that stretch...Cruz is the first Pirate with six-plus home runs in any 10-game, single-season span since Josh Bell (also six) from June 27-July 6, 2019...His eight total home runs in March/April are the third-most by a Pirate in a single season during the two months since at least 1901...Only Willie Stargell (11) in 1971 and Jeff King (nine) in 1996 had more...Cruz' four leadoff home runs in 2025 are most in MLB, while they're the most in a season by a Pirate since Adam Frazier (five) in 2019.

WE ARE PHAM-A-LEE: With his fifth-inning double off Roki Sasaki in Saturday night's game, Tommy Pham recorded the 1000th hit of his Major League career...His first big-league hit was a double off San Diego's Odrisamer Despaigne on July 4, 2015, while he was with St. Louis...Over his last five games (since April 20 vs. Cleveland), Pham is batting .400 (8-for-20) with four runs scored.

UP GOES FRAZIER: Adam Frazier singled off Roki Sasaki in the fifth inning on Saturday, extending his hitting streak to 10 games (since April 16 vs. Washington)...It's the first double-digit streak by a Pirates batter since Andrew McCutchen hit safely in 14 consecutive games from July 28-September 2, 2024...It's also Frazier's longest streak since hitting safely in 13 straight games from May 27-June 10, 2021, during his first stint with Pittsburgh...He's batting .345 with five walks and five runs on his current streak.

PACED BY PITCHING: Over its last 16 games (since April 9 vs. St. Louis), Pittsburgh's pitching staff has posted a 3.06 ERA (144.0ip/49er), the sixth-lowest mark in all of Major League Baseball, trailing San Diego (2.18), Detroit (2.47), New York-NL (2.59), Houston (2.96) and Texas (2.98)...The Pirates' 3.12 ERA from their starting pitchers in that stretch is the ninth-lowest mark in MLB, while the 92.1 innings pitched from starters are tied for fourth-most in MLB.

BUCS ON THE BASES: With Bryan Reynolds' steal on Saturday, Pittsburgh now has 34 stolen bases this season, the fourth-most in all of MLB, behind Chicago-NL (44), Milwaukee (36) and Seattle (35)...The Pirates have seven players with multiple steals, tied with Tampa Bay, Texas and Washington for third-most in MLB...Only Milwaukee (eight) and Seattle (eight) have more-such players.

GO, GO, GREENSBORO: High-A Greensboro defeated Bowling Green on Saturday, capturing its 15th win in 20 games to begin 2025...The Grasshoppers allowed one hit in the 3-0 shutout...Hung-Leng Chang gave up the hit and issued one walk while striking out nine across his 5.0 innings...Duce Gourson, Shalin Polanco and Lonnie White Jr. each recorded two hits in the victory.

Burnett started and earned the win, striking out six Cardinals in 6.0 innings. Jason Grilli, who went on to be named the National League Reliever of the Month, earned his 10th save of the month in the victory.

2025 RECORD: 1-2, 5.19 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-4/205 BATS/THROWS: R/L

BORN: April 24, 1997

AGE: 28 SIGNED: Thru 2025

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia in deal for INF Rodolfo Castro on 8/1/23.

STARTING OFF: The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023 in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He's in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Falter allowed three runs on five hits with five strikeouts across 4.0 innings, but had a no-decision in the team's 9-3 win on Tuesday at Angel Stadium in Anaheim...He left the game due to low back tightness (with Pittsburgh leading 5-3).

AGAINST THE DODGERS: This will be Falter's fourth career appearance (third start) vs. the Dodgers...He allowed four runs in 4.0 innings in his last start against Los Angeles here at Dodger Stadium last August 11 (the Bucs were walked off in 10 innings).

PESKY LEFTIES: According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Falter (7.0ip/0r on April 16) and Andrew Heaney (7.1ip/0r on April 17) became the first pair of Pirates left-handed teammates to pitch 7.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive team games since John Candelaria (9.0ip) and Larry McWilliams (7.0ip) did so on July 25 and July 27, 1982.

ALL GOOD THINGS COME TO AN END: In his start on April 5, Falter had his streak of plate appearances without hitting a batter snapped at 1124 (began on August 20, 2022) when he hit the Yankees' Jazz Chisholm Jr. leading off the second inning... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last pitcher with as long of a streak without hitting a batter was Yusmeiro Petit (1205pa) from April 21, 2017 to June 6, 2021.

2024 IN REVIEW: Falter spent his first full season in the big leagues while going 8-9 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 starts with the Pirates in 2024...He was on an Opening Day roster for the third straight season after also doing so with the Phillies in both 2022 and 2023.

STAYING IN THE PARK: Falter surrendered 11 home runs in 68.1 innings (1.45 per 9.0 innings) in his first 12 starts of the 2024 season...In his last 16 starts beginning on June 12, he surrendered six home runs in 74.0 innings, averaging just 0.73 per 9.0 innings.

JUST LIKE SANDY: Growing up in Chino Hills, California, Falter's father, Darwin, taught him to idolize fellow left-handed pitcher Sandy Koufax...Bailey would do reports on Koufax at school and even had a framed picture of the Dodgers southpaw hanging above his childhood bed...To this day, his delivery on the mound mimics that of Koufax...In 2024, he ranked in the 98th percentile in extension (per Baseball Savant).

BACK HOME IN CALIFORNIA: Attended Chino Hills High School, where he was classmates with NBA players Lonzo and LaMelo Ball...Falter had committed to play collegiately at the University of California, Santa Barbara prior to being drafted by and signing with Philadelphia in 2015.


