PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (21-23) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (24-20) May 15, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #45/Home #24 RHP Aaron Nola (2-3, 5.14 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (2-2, 2.77 ERA)



THE PIRATES: started this six-game homestand by winning two of three games vs. Colorado (3-1 win on Tuesday, 10-4 loss on Wednesday, 7-2 win on Thursday)...Will host Philadelphia for three games during MLB Rivalry Weekend (Friday-Sunday) before embarking on a six-game road trip to St. Louis (May 19-21) and Toronto (May 22-24)...Are in the 20th game of a stretch of 25 straight games vs. the National League (last interleague game was on April 23 at Texas)...Have the best stolen base percentage (88.9, 40-for-45) in Major League Baseball (Philadelphia, 87.1 percent/27-for-31, ranks second).

PHILTHY NUMBERS: Pittsburgh has won seven of its last eight games against Philadelphia at PNC Park, dating back to July 29, 2023 (Endy Rodríguez had a double, a triple and four RBI in that win)...The Pirates won the final two games of a three-game series from July 28-30, 2023, took two of three games from July 19-21, 2024 and swept a three-game series last year from June 6-8... Their sweep of the Phillies last season was their first of seven three-game sweeps (also June 27-29 vs. New York-NL, June 30-July 2 vs. St. Louis, July 21-23 vs. Detroit, July 28-30 at San Francisco, August 22-24 vs. Colorado, September 2-4 vs. Los Angeles-NL).

33 BUCS: Endy Rodríguez made his season debut and became the 33rd different Pirate (pitcher or player) to appear in a game this year when he went 2-for-3 with a double, two RBI and a walk in Thursday's win vs. Colorado...He was the first Pirates catcher with two hits (including a double), two RBI and a walk in a season debut since Ryan Doumit on April 5, 2010 vs. Los Angeles (NL).

O'YEAH: Ryan O'Hearn went 3-for-4 with a home run, two RBI and two runs scored in Thursday's 7-2 win vs. Colorado...He has gone deep in back-to-back games (also Wednesday vs. Colorado) for the first time since April 16-17, 2025 with Baltimore vs. Cleveland...O'Hearn has homered in three straight games twice in his career, coming from May 27-June 23, 2021 with Kansas City and April 14-16, 2024 with Baltimore...He is 9-for-28 (.318) with five RBI over his last seven games (since May 7 at Arizona).

KONNOR KONNECTS: Konnor Griffin went 2-for-4 with a stolen base and a run scored on Thursday vs. Colorado...He is hitting .324 (23-for-71) with four doubles, a triple, three home runs, 11 RBI, seven walks, six stolen bases and 11 runs in his last 19 games, dating back to April 24 at Milwaukee (20th birthday)...Griffin ranks tied for third in the National League in steals, tied for fourth in hits, fifth in batting, tied for fifth in total bases (38), tied for eighth in slugging (.535) & ninth in OPS (.915) in that time.

FROM THE ASHES: Braxton Ashcraft, who will start tonight vs. Philadelphia, has a 0.61 ERA (14.2ip/1er) in his first two May starts (he pitched 7.2 scoreless innings on May 3 vs. Cincinnati and allowed one run in 7.0 innings on May 9 at San Francisco)... He ranks eighth in ERA in Major League Baseball during May, behind Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (0.00), Tampa Bay's Shane Bieber (0.00), Paul Skenes (0.00), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (0.00), Cincinnati's Chase Burns (0.47), St. Louis' Michael McGreevy (0.50) and Arizona's Eduardo Rodríguez (0.59)...He also has a .196 batting average against (10-for-51) in May.

RELIABLE RELIEVER: Evan Sisk struck out a batter (Willi Castro) and tossed a scoreless second inning on Thursday vs. Colorado...Sisk has a 1.56 ERA (17.1ip/3er), 21 strikeouts and a 0.98 WHIP in 14 games since making his season debut on April 13 vs. Washington...His 1.56 ERA since April 13 ranks first among all Major League relievers (minimum 17.0 innings).

INDISPENCEABLE: Spencer Horwitz doubled and scored a run on Thursday vs. Colorado...He is hitting .333 (11-for-33) with five doubles, nine RBI, six walks, three runs and a .981 OPS in his last 10 games (since May 2 vs. Cincinnati)...He ranks tied for second in the National League in doubles, fifth in OBP (.436) and tied for seventh in both batting and RBI during that stretch.

THE OUTFIELD: Pirates outfielders have recorded 76 RBI so far this season (Oneil Cruz has 30 RBI, Ryan O'Hearn has 24 RBI, Bryan Reynolds has 21 RBI and Jake Mangum has one RBI)...Their 76 RBI from outfielders lead the National League and rank second in all of Major League Baseball, behind only New York-AL (79)...Pittsburgh's 202 RBI from its outfielders during 2025 were the ninth-fewest among all teams throughout Major League Baseball.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

May 15, 2021: Jacob Stallings finished a triple shy of the cycle after going 3-for-5 with four RBI, including a walkoff, two-run home run, in Pittsburgh's 8-6 win over San Francisco at PNC Park. He tied the game at 6-6 with a two-run double in a four-run seventh inning. He then connected for a walkoff homer off Jake McGee that also scored Bryan Reynolds, giving the Pirates a walkoff for a second straight game.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Ashcraft won a 13-3 decision after allowing one run (a fifth-inning, solo home run to Bryce Eldridge) and striking out six batters over 7.0 innings on May 9 at San Francisco...He has a 0.61 ERA (14.2ip/1er) and a 0.82 WHIP in his first two starts during the month of May (also pitched 7.2 scoreless innings on May 3 vs. Cincinnati).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Ashcraft has posted a 2.77 ERA (48.2ip/15er) and 51 strikeouts (issued 14 walks) over his first eight starts of the 2026 campaign...He is one of just five Pirates pitchers during the 21st century to have a sub-2.80 ERA, at least 50 strikeouts and 14 or fewer walks issued in their first eight starts of a season, along with Gerrit Cole (2015), as well as teammates Mitch Keller (2023), Jared Jones (2024) and Paul Skenes (2024).

AGAINST THE PHILLIES: Ashcraft pitched 1.1 scoreless innings of relief and earned his first Major League win in his only appearance against Philadelphia (last year on June 8 at PNC Park)...Isaac Mattson earned his first Major League win on June 7 vs. the Phillies...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Mattson and Ashcraft became the second pair of Pirates relievers since at least 1893 to each earn their first Major League win in consecutive team games, joining Rick White & Ravelo Manzanillo (April 15-16, 1994).

AND THE WHIFF: Ashcraft's 36 strikeouts during April ranked sixth in the National League, behind Los Angeles' Tyler Glasnow (41), Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (40), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sanchez (40), teammate Paul Skenes (38) and New York's Nolan McLean (37)...The 36 strikeouts also ranked 12th in all of Major League Baseball.

TRAFFIC CONTROL: Ashcraft has limited opposing hitters to a .179 batting average against (12-for-67) with runners on (opponents are hitting .094 against him w/RISP).

HISTORIC STRETCH: Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO: Ashcraft's 2.52 ERA (82.0ip/23er) over the first 16 starts of his Major League career (since last season on June 23 at Milwaukee) is the ninth-lowest mark by any Pirates pitcher through their first 16 career starts during the Live Ball Era (since 1920), trailing only Red Witt (1.94, 1957-58), Bob Moose (2.20, 1967-68), Paul Skenes (2.30, 2024), Cy Blanton (2.33, 1934-35), Zach Duke (2.35, 2005-06), Hal Smith (2.39, 1932-33), Francisco Cordova (2.41, 1996-97) and Randy Tomlin (2.52, 1990-91).

A BIT OF BOTH: Ashcraft went 1-2 with a 2.16 ERA (33.1ip/8er) in eight starts last season, while also going 3-2 with a 3.22 ERA (36.1ip/13er) in 18 relief appearances...His lone win as a member of Pittsburgh's starting rotation came on August 22 vs. Colorado, when he allowed one hit and struck out six batters over 5.0 scoreless innings.

THREE'S COMPANY: Ashcraft pitched at least 3.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in each of his first six Major League starts, joining Los Angeles' Fernando Valenzuela in 1981 (seven starts) as the only pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that...The streak was snapped last year on Sept. 15 vs. Chicago-NL (gave up three runs).

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: Ashcraft struck out six batters over 3.0 perfect innings of relief during his penultimate appearance last season, which came on September 20 vs. the Athletics...He became the third Pirates reliever during the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that feat, joining Bob Patterson (May 25, 1991 vs. Philadelphia) and Chan Ho Park (October 1, 2010 at Florida)...Ashcraft also joined starter Bubba Chandler, who had six strikeouts and zero walks, as the only pair of Pirates pitchers in the Modern Era to each have at least six strikeouts while also giving up zero walks in the same game.

Has committed just one error across 94 total chances over his 46 Major League games (was a throwing error at first base on 9/24/24 vs. the Brewers). Had his career-high-tying, three-game hitting streak snapped (also 9/27-29, 2024) while starting in center field in the 5-0 loss on 4/26 at Milwaukee. Has made two starts in center field, two starts in right field, one start at first base and one start in left field (last in right field on 5/8 at San Francisco).

His 10 home runs as a center fielder lead the National League and rank second in Major League Baseball, behind only Minnesota's Byron Buxton (15). Is 17-for-53 (.321) with four home runs, 11 RBI and a .942 OPS against left-handed pitchers this season (he went 11-for-108 vs. southpaws last year).

Has become the first Pittsburgh player to be successful in at least each of his first 10 career steal attempts since Chase d'Arnaud in 2011 (11-for-11). Is 23-for-71 (.324) with eight extra-base hits, 11 RBI, seven walks, six steals and 11 runs scored across his last 19 games (since 4/24 at Milwaukee).

His six games with multiple extra-base hits so far this season rank second in Major League Baseball, trailing only Colorado's Mickey Moniak (seven). His 27 RBI out of the No. 2 spot of the lineup are the fourth-most in all of Major League Baseball (Atlanta's Drake Baldwin leads the way w/32 RBI).

Walked and scored a run in Thursday's win vs. Colorado...Has gone 9-for-31 (.290) with two doubles and a solo home run when leading off an inning. Hit his 300th career home run (off Robbie Ray) on 5/8 at San Francisco (he became the 15th Dominican-born player to reach the 300-home run mark). Has recorded 12 of his 14 RBI at PNC Park so far this season...Is 8-for-20 (.400) w/a 1.270 OPS against left-handed pitchers since 4/16 vs. Washington.

#10 BRYAN REYNOLDS (OF)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is 11-for-28 (.393) with a double, two homers and four RBI over his last eight contests vs. Philadelphia...His next walk will be the 400th of his career. His .389 OBP is the fifth-highest mark among all National League batters (his 34 walks are tied for the sixth-most over all of Major League Baseball). His 510 RBI rank first among all Pirates switch hitters (RBI official in 1920)...The Pirates are 14-3 when he has an RBI (last on Thursday vs. Colorado). His third-inning single off Diamondbacks starter Michael Soroka during the team's 1-0 victory on 5/6 was the 1000th hit of his Major League career.
