The Mariners and Athletics meet for their fourth and final series matchup of the season...Seattle swept the last series (3-0) in Sacramento from May 25-27.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin their final road trip of the regular season with the first of 3 games at the Athletics...Seattle will also travel to face the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 9/14-9/16) and Colorado Rockies (3 G, 9/18-9/20) on the trip...the Mariners are coming off a 7-game homestand where they saw the Texas Rangers (2-1) and Athletics (1-3)...tonight's game against the A's will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners secured the series win against the Rangers in yesterday's rubber match by a 4-3 final score...Seattle is 50-22 (.694) when they score 4+ runs and 18-56 (.243) when they score 3-or-fewer runs.

- **Quality Check** - The Mariners starting pitching staff has combined for 63 quality starts this season, the most in the American League and 3rd-most in the Majors behind only the Dodgers (77 G) and Phillies (68 G)...61 of Seattle's 63 quality starts have also come with 2-or-fewer walks allowed, trailing only the Dodgers (66 G) for the most in the Majors.
- **Hold Me Close** - The Mariners are 23-22 (.511) in one-run games in 2026...their 45 such games lead the American League and rank T-4th in MLB this season.
- **On His A-Game** - In 10 career starts against the Athletics, RHP **George Kirby** is 5-1 with a 3.72 ERA (24 ER, 58.0 IP) with 56 strikeouts, 11 walks and a 1.241 WHIP...Kirby will be making his first career start at Sutter Health Park tonight.
- **Muny the Man** - Closer **Andrés Muñoz** secured his 27th save of the season yesterday and has recorded the save in his last 3-consecutive appearances (9/6-c)...Muñoz is currently sporting a career-high 14.08 SO/9 which ranks 2nd in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) behind only Mason Miller-SD (16.58).
- **Happy Birthday!** - Happy birthday to INF **Weston Wilson**, who celebrates his 32nd birthday today.

RALEIGH-ING THROUGH SEPTEMBER...Cal Raleigh yesterday went 1-for-4 with a run scored...over his last 22 games since Aug. 16, he is batting 310 (22x71) with 17 runs, 5 doubles, 9 home runs, 16 RBI and 15 walks, getting on base at a .430 clip and slugging .761 for a 1.191 OPS in 86 plate appearances...Raleigh has reached base safely in his last 12-consecutive games (8/28-c), which also included a career-high tying 9-game hitting streak (8/29-9/9)...among qualified players during Raleigh's hot stretch (8/16-c), he ranks 3rd in the Majors in OPS behind only Mickey Gasper-BOS (1.290) and Rafael Devers-SF (1.235)...he also ranks 3rd in home runs behind Pete Crow-Armstrong-CHC (14 HR) and Devers (11 HR), 4th in slugging percentage and 9th in on-base percentage during the span.

J-ROD'S BIG SWING...Julio Rodríguez gave the Mariners the win yesterday on a 3-run home run in the 7th inning, his 21st home run of the season...it marked Seattle's 12th go-ahead or game-tying homer in 2026...since Julio his MLB debut in 2022, the Mariners have hit 85 game-tying or go-ahead home runs in the 7th inning-or-later, ranking 3rd-most in the Majors behind only the Yankees (91 HR) and Phillies (91 HR)...during that span, Rodríguez has tallied 11 such home runs, ranking T-16th in the Majors, with teammate **Cal Raleigh** ranking T-4th with 14 HR.

SUNNY WITH A CHANCE OF STRIKEOUTS...yesterday RHP **Logan Gilbert** squared off against fellow Stetson University alum RHP Jacob deGrom in an outstanding pitching matchup...Gilbert, who struck out 11 batters over 7.0 innings pitched, and deGrom (12 SO) combined for 23 strikeouts in the game, marking the most combined strikeouts by starting pitchers in a single game since Blake Snell-SF and Chris Sale-ATL also combined for 23 strikeouts on Aug. 12, 2024 (*h/t Sarah Langs*)...it also marked the first time in MLB history that two starting pitchers who entered the Majors from the same college each recorded 10+ strikeouts in the same game (*h/t Sarah Langs & Elias Sports Bureau*)...Gilbert has recorded 10+ strikeouts in 4 games this season, tied with deGrom and Cam Schlichter-NYY for the 4th-most games in the AL.

AROZARENA AT THE PLATE...Randy Arozarena yesterday reached base on a walk and a HBP...he has reached base safely multiple times in 69 games this season, which ranks T-7th in the American League this season (also: Pete Alonso-BAL)...Randy has continued to post a consistent season offensively, batting .272 (140x514) with 94 runs, 29 doubles, 1 triple, 22 home runs, 67 RBI and 21 stolen bases, reaching base at a .372 clip and slugging .461 for an .833 OPS...among qualified left fielders in the AL this season, Randy ranks among the leaders in fWAR (1st, 4.3), bWAR (T-1st, 4.5), OPS+ (1st, 140), wRC+ (1st, 144), home runs (1st), runs (1st), doubles (T-1st), OBP (1st), slugging percentage (2nd) and OPS (2nd).

MO(NTES) POWER...over his first 8 MLB games, **Lazaro Montes** has posted an .806 OPS with 6 RBI and 3-of-5 hits going for extra bases...he recorded a pinch-hit double on Wednesday and on Tuesday hit his first home run at T-Mobile Park, a blast that went a projected 474 feet, the farthest homer at T-Mobile Park in the Statcast Era (2015-c) and tied for the farthest HR in MLB this season with Fernando Tatis Jr.-SD...the homer was hit at 116.1 MPH off the bat, the 3rd-hardest hit HR by a Mariners player since 2015, behind only **Julio Rodríguez** (117.2 MPH, 9/11/22 vs. ATL) and Nelson Cruz (116.8 MPH, 9/27/17 at OAK)...Mike Zunino is the only other Mariners player to hit a ball at least 116.0 MPH off the bat since Statcast began tracking exit velocity.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Logan Gilbert spun another incredible outing yesterday, tossing 7.0 innings and allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 3 hits (1 HR) and 2 walks with 11 strikeouts...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...Logan also struck out 10 batters over 4.2 innings pitched in his start on Sept. 4 against the Athletics in the second game of the recent homestand, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Gilbert became the first Mariners pitcher to record 10+ strikeouts in back-to-back games since James Paxton did so from June 26-July 1, 2018?...Gilbert also became only the 8th pitcher in Mariners history to strike out 10+ batters in 2-or-more consecutive games, joining Jim Beattie (1x), Freddy García (1x), Félix Hernández (1x), Randy Johnson (24x), Mark Langston (5x), Mike Moore (1x) and Paxton (2x).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 11

- **1989** - Mike Schooler collects his club record 27th save (passing Bill Caudill) vs. Boston. He finishes the year with 33 saves.
- **2001** - A national tragedy, a terrorist attack on the World Trade Center, suspends play for the first of 6 days. The Mariners are stuck in Anaheim, and it takes them three days to make it home.
- **2016** - Edwin Díaz recorded his 15th save and is the fifth rookie in Mariners history to record 15 or more saves (Sasaki, 37 in 2000; Farquhar, 16 in 2013; Romo, 16 in 1977; Schooler, 15 in 1988).
- **2023** - **Julio Rodríguez** hits his 30th home run to join the 30 home run, 30 stolen base club...he becomes the 44th player in MLB history, the 2nd Mariners player and just the 4th player age 22-or-younger to join the exclusive club.
- **2025** - **Bryce Miller** becomes the 2nd Mariners pitcher of the season to record 11+ strikeouts and no walks (also: **George Kirby** on June 8 at LAA) after a career-high 11 strikeouts over 5.2 innings pitched. Seattle moved into a tie with the Houston Astros for the top spot in the American League West after a 7-6 walk-off win in 12 innings over the Angels. It marked the latest in a season the Mariners have had a share of 1st place since 2001.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 28th start of the season and 2nd against the Athletics...will be the 140th start of his career and his 11th career start against the Athletics.
 - Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
 - Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
 - Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
 - Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.
- LAST TIME OUT**...L#9 on Sept. 5 vs. ATH in his first start of the month, tossing 6.2 innings, allowing 4 runs (3 ER) on 7 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk while striking out 5 batters...threw 100 pitches and 67 strikes...is his 3rd start with 100+ pitches thrown this season and the 15th of his career.

PREMIUM PERFORMANCE...his last start also marked his 15th quality start of the season, tied for 6th most in the AL...with his quality start against the A's, Kirby became 1-of-9 pitchers with 15+ quality starts in 3+ seasons since 2023...he is also 1-of-6 pitchers with 10+ QS in each of the last 5 seasons since 2022...also marked his 12th QS with 1-or-fewer walks this season...is 1-of-7 pitchers in MLB with 12+ such starts this season...his 66 career such starts are tied for the league lead since 2022 (also: Logan Webb-SF).

THE LAST VS. ATH...will be facing the A's in back-to-back starts...last faced them on Sept. 5, recording a quality start with 5 strikeouts in the outing...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his last 6 games against the A's since May 4, 2023, owning a 3.35 ERA (14 ER, 37.2 IP) with 31 strikeouts to 6 walks for a 5.17 K/BB against the A's which ranks 11th-best in MLB since 2023 (min 20.0 IP).

A+ APPEARANCES...is making his first start at Sacramento in today's game his 10 starts against the Athletics are tied for the 4th most appearances against any opponent over his career (also: BAL)...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 8 of his 10 appearances against the A's including 5 outings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed and 7 quality starts...his 7 quality starts against the team rank T-2nd most in MLB since 2022, matching **Logan Gilbert**...has struck out 9 batters and walked 1-or-fewer in 4 starts and in 2 of his last 4 starts against the A's...the Mariners are 7-3 over his 10 starts against the Athletics.

SHERIFFS IN TOWN...across 47 career starts against AL West teams, Kirby is 28-8 and owns a 2.88 ERA (89 ER, 278.0 IP) with 274 strikeouts to 42 walks (6.52 K/BB)...among all-time MLB pitchers with 200.0+ innings pitched against the AL West, he leads in K/BB and ranks 8th in WHIP (1.04).

MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME...is making his 13th road start of the season and the 70th road start of his career...among pitchers with 50+ career road starts, his 5.46 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road ranks 2nd among all-time MLB pitchers, just trailing **Tarik Skubal's** 5.81 K/BB...ranks 16th in the AL (min. 65.0 IP) in K/BB (3.12) on the road this season...his 1.46 walks-per-nine innings on the road ranks 4th-best all-time (min. 50 GS), trailing **Hall of Famer Cy Young** (1.09), **Deacon Phillippe** (1.34) and **Josh Tomlin** (1.36)...ranks 12th in BB/9 (2.33) on the road in the AL in 2026 (min. 65.0 IP).

ALL IN A DAY'S WORK...on Aug. 25 vs. PHI put together his 6th outing of the season with 3-or-fewer runs allowed over 7.0+ IP, tied for 8th most in the AL this season...his 28 career games are tied for 14th most in MLB since 2022...his last start also marked his 2nd since the start of August with 1-or-fewer runs allowed over 7.0+ IP...is 1-of-12 AL pitchers with multiple such outings over that span...went 7.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 8 vs. MIN for his first 7.0+ inning scoreless outing since Sept. 12, 2025 and the 10th of his career, ranking T-5th most in the AL since 2022...is 1-of-4 pitchers this season with 4+ outings of 7.2+ innings pitched.

MAINTAINING THE RATIO...on Aug. 25 vs. PHI, recorded his 16th career game with 9+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks...his 16 such career games rank 6th most in the AL since 2022...has made 15 starts this season with 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks, including his last start on Sept. 5, to rank T-14th most in the AL...his 77 career games are 11th most in MLB since 2022...ranks 10th among qualified AL pitchers with a 3.59 K/BB this season...his career 5.80 K/BB ranks 3rd-best in MLB all-time (min. 400.0 IP).

PLAYING THE LONG GAME...has pitched into the 6th inning in 20 of his 27 starts this year, T-16th most in MLB, and has cleared the 7th inning in 6 of those starts...recorded his 7th start of the season with 6.2+ IP in his last outing on Sept. 5, ranking T-16th most such starts in MLB...put together his 2nd career complete game this season on April 7 vs. Texas, tossing 8.0 innings to finish the game...is 1-of-9 AL pitchers with a complete game this season...is 1-of-12 pitchers with 5+ games with 1-or-fewer walks allowed over 8.0+ innings of work since 2023, along with **Logan Gilbert** (5 G).
