TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 29, 2006: The Yankees score at least one run in every inning of a 17-6 win vs. Toronto at Yankee Stadium, marking the second such time in franchise history and the sixth in American League history.

April 29, 1995: Andy Pettitte makes his Major League debut at Kansas City, allowing 2ER on 3H in 0.2IP in relief of Melido Perez.

April 29, 1939: Lou Gehrig singles off of Washington's Ken Chase for the 2,721st and final hit of his career. The hit total would stand as the most in Yankees franchise history for over 70 years, until Derek Jeter reached 2,722 career hits on Sept. 11, 2009 vs. Baltimore at Yankee Stadium.

April 30, 2019: At Arizona's Chase Field, CC Sabathia strikes out former batterymate John Ryan Murphy for career strikeout No. 3,000 to become the 17th pitcher and third left-hander in Baseball history to reach the milestone.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their seven-game road trip tonight with the first game of a four-game set at Baltimore (through Thurs.)...are 2-1 on the road trip after winning two-of-three at Milwaukee...after this road trip, will return to the Bronx for a seven-day, six-game homestand vs. Detroit (Fri.-Sun.) and Houston (5/7-9).

- ▶ **Their 19-10 record (.655) is tied with Philadelphia for the third-best record in the Majors**, trailing only Atlanta (19-7, .731) and Cleveland (19-9, .679)...**their 19 wins are tied for the most in the Majors.**
- ▶ Marks the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 19-10 or better to start a season (also went 21-8 in 2010 and '22, 20-9 in 2017 and 19-10 in 2018)...*with a win tonight*, would also mark the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees went 20-10 or better to start a season (went 22-8 in 2022, 21-9 in 2010 and '17, and 20-10 in 2018).
- ▶ The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...marks their longest stretch of the season without an off-day...are 6-4 so far.
- ▶ **Have won seven of their nine series this season (7-1-1).**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees clinched a series win over the Brewers with a 15-5 victory at American Family Field on Sunday...**Yankees batters** scored 15R for their second straight game...**RHP Marcus Stroman** (4.0IP, 6H, 4R/ER, 5BB, 4K, 1HR, 1HP) started and did not record a decision...**CF Aaron Judge** (3-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB) recorded a season-high 3H and tied his season highs in times on base (4) and RBI...hit a solo HR in the first inning and a two-run single in the sixth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 3RBI, 2BB, 1SB) hit a three-run HR in the fifth inning on his 23rd birthday...**1B Anthony Rizzo** (4-for-4, 3R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 2RBI 1BB) recorded a career-high-tying 4H and hit his 300th career home run with a two-run HR in the eighth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 1RBI), **3B/1B Oswaldo Cabrera** (2-for-4, 2R, 1RBI, 1BB) and **C Jose Trevino** (2-for-4, 1R, 3RBI, 1SF) each picked up multi-hit games...**Yankees relievers** allowed just 1R/ER over 5.0 innings (5H, 3BB, 5K, 1HP).

▶ **Improved to 4-0 in rubber games this year.**

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge recorded a season-high 3H and hit a solo HR in the first inning on Sunday at Milwaukee...has homered in back-to-back games for the first time this season and for the first time since 9/1-2/23...*with a HR tonight*, would mark the 11th time in his career he has homered in at least three straight games (last: 3G from 5/28-30/23).

- ▶ **Has 3HR in his last five games (since 4/24).**
- ▶ Over his last six games (since 4/23), is hitting .348/.483/.783 (8-for-23) with 5R, 1 double, 3HR, 7RBI, 5BB/1BB and 1HP.
- ▶ In 95 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .311/.439/.710 (106-for-341) with 94R, 19 doubles, 39HR, 85RBI, 75BB, 4HP, 15F and 55B in that span...**his 39HR are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017**...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.

HIGH VOLTAGE: INF Anthony Volpe hit a three-run HR in the fifth inning on his 23rd birthday on Sunday at Milwaukee...was the first Yankee to homer on his birthday since Aaron Judge (30th birthday on 4/26/22) and was the youngest Yankee to do so since Rusty Torres (23rd birthday on 9/30/71 at Washington-AL)...is one of just three Yankees in franchise history to homer on his birthday at age 23-or-younger, joining Rusty Torres and Yogi Berra (22nd birthday on 5/12/47 at Boston).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 3.08 ERA (263.0IP, 90ER) this year, the second-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.68)...have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 18 of 29 games this year (are 13-5 in those games)...are 16-5 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

- ▶ **Yankees starters** have posted a 3.34 ERA (156.1IP, 58ER) in 29 starts this year, the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.07), Philadelphia (2.36) and Kansas City (2.98)...**have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of their 29 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 17 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 12 starts.**
- ▶ **Yankees relievers** allowed just 1R over 5.0IP on Sunday...their 2.70 ERA (106.2IP, 32ER) this season is the fifth-lowest in the Majors, trailing only Seattle (2.47), Detroit (2.53), Cleveland (2.53) and Minnesota (2.62)...**have posted a 1.19 ERA (22.2IP, 3ER) in their last six games (since 4/23).**

STANTON ISLAND: Since 2019, DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton has hit .337/.410/.558 (58-for-172) with 24R, 8 doubles, 10HR, 35RBI, 22BB and 15F in 45 games vs. the Orioles.

- ▶ In 36 career games at Camden Yards, has hit .326/.401/.514 (47-for-144) with 25R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 20RBI and 18BB...**since 2020, has hit .374/.436/.593 (34-for-91) with 15R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 14RBI and 10BB in 23 games at Camden Yards.**

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have scored 15R in each of their last two games, **marking just the fifth time in franchise history the Yankees have scored at least 15R in back-to-back games**...also 2G from 7/21(G2)-22/2007, 8/25(G2)-26(G1)/38, 5/23(G2)-24/36 and 6/15-17/30...prior to this stretch, had not scored at least 15R in a game since 7/6/22 at Pittsburgh (16-0 win).

- ▶ **Yankees batters scored 36R in their three-game set at Milwaukee, marking just the second time in the last seven seasons (since 2018) the Yankees have scored as many runs in a three-game series** (also 43R in 3G vs. Toronto from 9/15-17/20)...also marked the second time in the last four seasons (since 2021) the Yankees have hit at least 10HR in a three-game series (also hit 11HR in 3G vs. Chicago-NL from 6/10-12/22).
- ▶ **Have hit 15HR over their last six games** (since 4/23) after hitting 3HR in their previous seven games (4/15-22)...have hit at least 3HR in each of their last three games and four of their last five games.
- ▶ Have scored at least 4R in 20 of 29 games this season, at least 5R in 17 games and at least 6R in 12 games...**their 17 games with at least 5R are the most in the AL and tied with Atlanta and Los Angeles-NL for the most in the Majors.**
- ▶ Lead the Majors in walks (128), pitches per plate appearance (4.07) and plate appearances per walk ratio (8.80), are tied for second in home runs (37, second in AL), rank third in on-base percentage (.341, first in AL), fifth in OPS (.751, second in AL) and sixth in runs scored (148, second in AL).
- ▶ **The Yankees are 19-3 (.864) this season when scoring at least 3R**, the best such record in the Majors.
- ▶ Yankees batters are hitting .371/.422/.714 (26-for-70) with 3 doubles, 7HR, 41RBI, 8BB, 1HP and 45F with RISP in their last eight games (since 4/21).

NOBODY BEATS THE RIZZ: INF Anthony Rizzo recorded a career-high-tying 4H and hit his 300th career home run with a two-run HR in the eighth inning on Sunday at Milwaukee...**became the 161st player in Major League history to accomplish the milestone...was the 16th player to accomplish the feat as a Yankee**, joining Giancarlo Stanton, Matt Holliday, Mark Teixeira, Jason Giambi, Ruben Sierra, Cecil Fielder, Darryl Strawberry, Dave Winfield, Graig Nettles, Reggie Jackson, Mickey Mantle, Yogi Berra, Joe DiMaggio, Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth...**became the 12th active player to reach 300 career home runs**, joining Giancarlo Stanton (408), Mike Trout (378), Joey Votto (356), Paul Goldschmidt (342), Nolan Arenado (326), Freddie Freeman (323), Manny Machado (317), J.D. Martinez (315), Bryce Harper (312), Carlos Santana (304) and Andrew McCutchen (302).

- ▶ Has homered in back-to-back games for the second time this season (also 2G from 4/23-24)...*with a HR tonight*, it would mark the 12th time in his career that he has homered in at least three straight games and first since 8/29-9/18/22 (3G).
- ▶ **Has 4HR in his last six games (since 4/23).**
- ▶ Over his last six games, is hitting .458/.480/1.042 (11-for-24) with 8R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 7RBI and 1BB.

THE PRICE IS RIGHT: The Yankees are 15-4 this season when they face a right-handed starting pitcher.

SCHMIDT'S CREEK: RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his sixth start of the season tonight...is 2-0 with a 3.55 ERA (25.1IP, 10ER) with 29K in five starts this year...the Yankees are 5-0 in his starts this year.

- ▶ **Since the start of 2023, his 30 starts of 3R-or-fewer allowed are tied with Blake Snell for the second-most in the Majors**, trailing only Sonny Gray (32)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 25 of his last 28 starts (since 5/19/23).

GLEYBER DAY: INF Gleyber Torres is hitting .333 (8-for-24) with 2R, 2 doubles and 4RBI over his last five games (since 4/24).

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto has reached base safely in 26 of his 29 games this season, hitting .318/.434/.564 (35-for-110) with 21R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 24RBI, 24BB, 25B and 25F...has reached base multiple times in four of his last five games and in 18 of his 29 games this year.

- ▶ Leads the Majors in walks (24), ranks second in times on base (59, first in AL), tied for second in WAR among position players (1.9 - FanGraphs, tied for first in AL), third in OBP (.434, first in AL), tied for fifth in RBI (24, tied for third in AL) and sixth in OPS (.997, second in AL).

HIP HIP JOSE: C Jose Trevino is batting .406/.429/.594 (13-for-32) with 6R, 2HR, 10RBI, 2BB AND 15F over his last 10 games (since 4/13-G1)...matches his most RBI over a 10-game span in his career (also 10RBI in 10G from 5/23-6/7/22).

- ▶ **As a Yankee (since 2022), has hit .333 (48-for-144) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 50RBI, 8BB, 2HP and 25F with runners in scoring position.**

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CLARKE SCHMIDT (2-0, 3.55 ERA)

RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his sixth start of the season in tonight's series opener at Baltimore...the 28-year-old will make the start on regular four day's rest...made his fifth start of the season on Wednesday vs. Oakland and earned his second win of the year (5.1IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP)...marked his seventh straight start with 3ER-or-fewer allowed (since 9/25/23 vs. Arizona)...**since the start of 2023, his 30 starts of 3R-or-fewer allowed are tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Sonny Gray (32)**...in 2023, went 9-9 with a 4.64 ERA (159.0IP, 169H, 91R/82ER, 46BB, 149K, 24HR) in 33 games (32 starts) with the Yankees...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 20 of his final 23 starts (5/19-9/30), 22 of his final 26 starts (5/3-9/30) and 23 of his final 28 starts (4/23-9/30)...tossed at least 5.0 innings in 18 of his final 23 starts (5/19-9/30) and 21 of his final 28 starts (4/23-9/30) after not doing so in his first four starts of the season...has made three career Opening Day rosters (2022-24)...was selected by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his second win of the season on Wednesday vs. Oakland (5.1IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP)...surrendered a three-run home run to Brent Rooker in the sixth inning...marked his third consecutive start with at least 6K (since 4/13-G1)...also marked his seventh straight start with 3ER-or-fewer allowed (since 9/25/23 vs. Arizona).

ON A ROLL: Over his last 29 outings (28 starts) since 5/19/23, is 10-5 with a 3.99 ERA (144.1IP, 144H, 69R/64ER, 42BB, 130K, 19HR).

- ✦ Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in each of his last seven starts (since 9/25/23 vs. Arizona), including 2ER-or-fewer in five of those starts.
- ✦ Going back to last season, the Yankees have won nine of his last 10 starts (since 9/6/23 vs. Detroit), including each of his last seven starts (since 9/25/23 vs. Arizona).
- ✦ The Yankees are 16-5 in his last 21 starts (since 6/29/23 at Oakland)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 19 of those 21 starts.
- ✦ Has allowed 4R-or-fewer in each of his last 13 starts (since 8/20/23 vs. Boston)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 11 of those starts and 2R-or-fewer in six of those starts.

ROAD RULES: Will make his third road start of the season tonight at Baltimore...is 1-0 with a 3.48 ERA (10.1IP, 4ER) and 12K in his two road starts this year.

- ✦ Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 13 of his last 14 road starts (since 5/19/23), including 2ER-or-fewer in eight of those games.
- ✦ Is 6-5 with a 5.08 ERA (95.2IP, 116H, 61R/54ER, 34BB, 94K, 11HR) in 20 career road starts...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 16 of those starts, including each of his last six road starts (since 8/26/23).

VS. BALTIMORE: Will be making his 10th career appearance (fifth start) vs. the Orioles...in nine career games (four starts) vs. Baltimore, is 3-2 with one save and a 4.33 ERA (27.0IP, 25H, 15R/13ER, 13BB/11BB, 21K, 3HR).

- ✦ Made four starts vs. Baltimore in 2023, going 2-1 with a 5.40 ERA (18.1IP, 11ER) and 16K.
- ✦ Has gone 1-1 with a 5.79 ERA (14.0IP, 9ER) and 9K in five career appearances (two starts) against the Orioles at Camden Yards.
- ✦ Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in three of his four career starts against Baltimore.
- ✦ Made his Major League debut at Camden Yards in Game 2 on 9/4/20 in relief (1.1IP, 3H, 2ER, 1BB, 1K, 1HP)...had never pitched professionally above Double-A in his career prior to his debut.

2024: Is 2-0 with a 3.55 ERA (25.1IP, 27H, 11R/10ER, 10BB, 29K, 3HR) in five starts this season...**the Yankees are 5-0 in his starts this year**...the Yankees' five wins in Schmidt's starts are tied for the fourth-most by any team in the Majors in a pitcher's starts this season, trailing only the Phillies' six wins in Ranger Suárez's starts, the Dodgers' six wins in Tyler Glasnow's starts and the Guardians' six wins in Tanner Bibee's starts.

- ✦ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his five starts this season, including 2R-or-fewer in three of those games.
- ✦ Recorded his second win of the season on Wednesday vs. Oakland (5.1IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP).
- ✦ Did not record a decision despite allowing just 1ER over 5.1 innings on 4/19 vs. Tampa Bay (7H, 0BB, 7K, 1HR, 1HP)...tossed a career-high 102 pitches (previous: 99 on 8/26/23 at Tampa Bay and 9/6/23 vs. Detroit).
- ✦ Earned his first win of the season in Game 1 of the doubleheader on 4/13 at Cleveland after allowing 2R/1ER over 5.0IP (3H, 5BB, 7K, 0HR)...his 5BB marked a career high.
- ✦ Made his second start of the season on 4/6 vs. Toronto and did not record a decision after allowing 2ER over 4.1IP (6H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR).
- ✦ Made his season debut on 3/31 at Houston and did not record a decision after allowing 3ER over 5.1IP (7H, 0BB, 5K, 1HR).

FOR STARTERS: Over his 42 career Major League starts (five in 2024, 32 in 2023, three in 2022, one in 2021 and one in 2020), has gone 11-12 with a 4.55 ERA (203.2IP, 220H, 116R/103ER, 63BB, 197K, 28HR)...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 25 of his last 28 starts** (since 5/19/23).

THE RIGHT STUFF: Has limited right-handed batters to a .237/.294/.383 (126-for-532) slash line in his career.

CAREER NOTES: Over his first five seasons with the Yankees (2020-24), has gone 16-15 with two saves and a 4.28 ERA (254.2IP, 260H, 138R/121ER, 89BB, 247K, 33HR) in 72 career games (42 starts).

- ✦ Made his Major League debut in Game 2 on 9/4/20 at Baltimore after never having pitched professionally above Double-A in his career.
- ✦ Did not pitch in 2017 while recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow.
- ✦ Was drafted by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina...in three seasons at South Carolina (2015-17), produced a 15-9 record and 3.21 ERA (229.2IP, 82ER) in 45 games (36 starts).

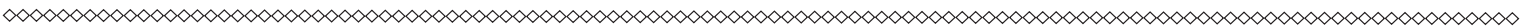
