RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a season-long, 10-game, 10-day homestand against the Nationals (2-1), Royals (2-2), and Diamondbacks (1-0, two to play) tonight at Tropicana Field. They have won three straight games, matching their longest winning streak of June (also June 8-10 vs. BOS), and are 5-3 on the current homestand on the heels of a 1-5 West Coast road trip (June 12-17), are seeking their first four-game winning streak since May 17-22 (5G)...have gone 3-5-2 in their last 10 series since winning eight straight (April 24-May 20)...are 5-3 on a stretch of 23 games in 24 days leading into the All-Star break (June 19-July 12)...are 11-18 since May 24 (14th in AL/17th in MLB) after producing an MLB-best 22-4 record between April 22-May 23...had the best record in the AL for 35 straight days between May 9-June 12, which included eight consecutive days atop the majors from May 18-25...have spent 41 days in first place in the AL East, 59 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 14 consecutive days in second entering play tonight (June 13-pres)...with a Yankees loss at BOS and a win tonight, the Rays could take over the top spot in the division based on winning pct., which would mark their first time leading the AL East since June 12 (40-26).

★ **Junior Caminero** (3R) and **Cedric Mullins** (solo) homered while **Nick Martinez** fell one out shy of a quality start and the bullpen combined for 3.1 scoreless frames in last night's 6-1, series-opening win. It marked their 20th comeback win, tying the Blue Jays and White Sox for second most in the AL to the Athletics (23)...they have come from behind in four of their last six wins (June 14-pres).
★ The Rays have recorded consecutive multi-homer games for the third time this season, joining April 5-6 and March 30-31...their last longer streak was three games from Aug. 22-25, 2025...they are 14-3 in multi-homer efforts and 19-1 when out-homering their opponent.
★ They have plated five runs or more in four straight games, their longest streak since May 15-18 (4G) and tied for their second longest this season behind April 19-16 (6G)...they reached the mark in only four of their previous 18 games entering the streak (June 6-22).
★ The club has scored multiple runs in the opening frame in back-to-back games for the first time since Sept. 2-3, 2025 vs. SEA...its last longer streak was three games from Sept. 23-26, 2023.
★ The Rays MLB-leading 29-12 home record ties 2008 for their second-best start at Tropicana Field in team history behind only the 2023 squad (32-9).
★ Rays starting pitchers have yielded 3 ER or fewer in 13 consecutive outings and 17 of their last 18...their 65 such starts this season rank second in the AL, trailing the Yankees (67GS).
★ **Cole Sulser** is scheduled for his fourth career start and second this season in tonight's bullpen game...Sulser, who worked 2.0 scoreless innings in his other start on April 15 at CWS, has not permitted a run in the previous three starts (5.0IP)...Rays relievers have a 1.80 ERA (15.0IP, 3ER) and 102 (5-for-49) opp. average with 15 SO and 3 BB during the club's three-game winning streak.
★ The Rays are 13-3-1 in the previous 17 series in which they won the opener, including 13-1-1 in their last 15...a win tonight or tomorrow would secure an undefeated homestand in series play (2-0-1).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Earlier today, **C Dom Keegan** was claimed off waivers by the Orioles...Keegan was designated for assignment by the Rays on June 23.

STRIKEOUTS ARE OPTIONAL—Last night marked the eighth time in club history the Rays completed a game without striking out, first since June 15, 2013 vs. KC...they became the majors' first team to accomplish the feat since the Reds on Aug. 30, 2025 vs. STL and the first AL squad since the Red Sox on Sept. 24, 2023 vs. CWS in a rain-shortened, six-inning affair—the last AL team to record 0 SO in a nine-inning (or longer) game was the Blue Jays on May 31, 2023 vs. MIL...Rays hitters recorded only four swings-and-misses in the win, their 12th game with four whiffs or fewer in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008) and third this season along with June 19 at LAD (3) and April 24 vs. MIN (4)...the Rays are responsible for three of the six such games in the majors this season (NYM - 2; CLE - 1).
★ The Rays 18.8 pct. strikeout rate is the lowest in the majors and is on pace to be their best since 2014 (18.1%)...they have struck out five times or fewer in an AL-leading 25 games.

RISP-Y BUSINESS—The Rays are 15-for-42 (.357) with RISP over their last four games and are batting .277 in scoring situations on the year, second in MLB to the Twins (.292)...they have tallied multiple hits with RISP in four straight games, their third-longest streak this season behind runs of seven (May 11-18) and six (April 10-16)...meanwhile, opponents are hitless in their last 18 AB with RISP against Rays pitching.
★ **Yandy Diaz** is 6-for-8 with RISP over his last nine games and is batting an MLB-best .400 (29-for-63) in scoring situations on the year...**Junior Caminero** is 4-for-6 with RISP in his last four games on the heels of a 1-for-16 skid to open the month (June 1-22).

20 FOR 13—**Junior Caminero** clubbed his 20th home run last night (T4th in AL), achieving several milestones in the process...he became the fifth primary third baseman in MLB history to record 20 HR in multiple age-22-or-younger seasons, joining ATL **Bob Horner** (3), BSN/MLN **Eddie Mathews** (3), BOS **Rafael Devers** (2), and WSH **Ryan Zimmerman** (2)...of that list, only Horner and Mathews (both 2) have multiple such seasons with 30 HR or more...Caminero also became the first Ray to record multiple seasons with 20 HR before the All-Star break (23HR in 2025) and the second primary third baseman in club history with multiple 20-HR campaigns overall, joining **Evan Longoria** (9)...it marked his 72nd career home run, surpassing **Albert Pujols** for the third-most homers by a Dominican-born player before turning 23, trailing only **Juan Soto** (98) and **Fernando Tatís Jr.** (81).
★ He has 5 HR in his last four games, matching his total from his previous 38 games combined (May 8-June 22)...this includes 4 HR in his last two contests, tying four others for the most in Rays history across a two-game span (see table on the right).

THE BIG THREE—The Rays 1-3 hitters, **Yandy Diaz**, **Jonathan Aranda**, and **Junior Caminero**, went a combined 4-for-9 with 2 2B, 1 HR, 5 RBI, 2 BB, and 4 R last night...the trio has accounted for 44 of the Rays 69 homers (63.8%) and 153 of their 341 RBI (44.9%)...in the 13 games this season in which those three have occupied the top three spots in the Rays order, as they have in each of the last two games, they have combined for a .357/.452/.643 (56-for-157) line with 12 2B, 1 HR, 36 RBI, 26 BB, 32 SO, and a 1.095 OPS...this includes a combined .433 (42-for-97) average, 20 XBH, and 1.342 OPS over the last eight such games (May 18-pres)...if Caminero (46RBI) records 4 RBI in the next two games, they could become the first trio in club history to each tally 50 RBI at the midway point of the season (through 81G) and the AL's first trio since Baltimore's **Gunnar Henderson** (57), **Adley Rutschman** (55), and **Anthony Santander** (53) in 2024.
★ Caminero is batting .356 (16-for-45) with 1 2B, 6 HR, 16 RBI, and a 1.190 OPS over his last 12 games.
★ Diaz is 17-for-35 (.486) with 4 2B, 6 RBI, 6 BB, 9 R, and six multi-hit efforts during a 10-game on-base streak (June 16-pres)...he has reached base in 37 of his last 38 games (May 12-pres.), ranking second in MLB with a .450 OBP in that span (LAD **Shohei Ohtani** - .466), and 71 of his 76 games overall.
★ Aranda has hit safely in a season-high-tying nine straight games (also: May 20-31), batting .400 (14-for-35) with 3 2B, 1 HR, and 7 RBI during the streak...he has tallied an RBI in four straight contests, one shy of his longest streak this season (5G from April 6-11), and has doubled in a career-high-tying three consecutive games, matching March 29-31, 2025.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE—Through 79 games, **Yandy Diaz's** 139 times on base are already tied with **B.J. Upton** (2008) for the most in club history at the midway point of the season (through 81G). He needs to reach base 14 times over the Rays next 15 games to break Upton's mark of 152 TOB before the All-Star break...his 139 TOB rank fourth in the AL and are good for a pace of 285 TOB over a full season, which would break **Aubrey Huff's** record of 259 TOB from 2003.

DOMESTIC SWEET DOME—**Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely in 24 straight home games (May 5-pres.), the majors' longest single-season streak since SF **Rafael Devers** (24G) from Aug. 11-Sept. 28, 2025...the last longer single-season streak belongs to LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (30G) from July 19-Sept. 21, 2025, and the last Ray with a longer stretch was **Randy Arozarena** (33G) from April 12-June 24, 2023...it marks the eighth-longest single-season streak in Rays history, one shy of **Julio Lugo's** seventh-ranked, 25-game run from June 15-Aug. 15, 2005, and is tied for 14th longest overall (incl. multi-season streaks)...Diaz, who has reached base safely in 27 of 38 home games, is slashing .422/.495/.744 (38-for-90) with 8 2B, 7 HR, 25 RBI, 12 BB, and 22 R at Tropicana Field during the streak, which is the longest single-season streak of his career and the second longest overall behind a 29-game run at the Trop between July 21, 2019-April 28, 2021.
★ His .377 (52-for-138) home average on the year ranks second in the majors to TEX **Josh Jung** (.378).

TROP SHOTS—There have been five fair balls hit off Tropicana Field's four catwalks through eight games of the current homestand compared to three in the Rays first 33 home games...the eight total catwalk collisions through 41 games are already the most in a season since 2022 (8), and the last time there were more was 2019 (10)...the single-season record is 15 catwalks in 2016...for more information on the catwalks, see page 486 of the 2026 Rays Media Guide.

SNAKES IN THE BAY—MLB's 1998 expansion franchises meet for their lone series of 2026 this weekend...this marks the Rays sixth time hosting the D-backs, joining series in 2024 (3-0), 2019 (2-1), 2013 (1-1), 2010 (1-2), and 2006 (3-0)...they won two of three games last year from April 22-24, 2025 at Chase Field, with both wins coming in extra frames...three of the last five meetings between the clubs have been decided in extra innings compared to two of the first 27 matchups...the Rays have won eight of their last nine games vs. Arizona (June 28, 2023-pres.) and have claimed five straight series (2016-pres)...their 21-11 (.656) all-time record vs. the D-backs is their best against any opponent.
★ **Yandy Diaz** is a career .349 (222-for-633) hitter with 9 2B and 7 RBI in 16 games vs. the D-backs...he has multiple hits in each of his last three games against them (April 23, 2025-pres.; 8-for-14/.571).

SCORING CHANGE—Yesterday, MLB announced a scoring change from the Rays 4-3 win on June 21 vs. WSH...in the bottom of the 8th inning, **Chandler Simpson** reached base on what was originally ruled a fielding error on **3B Curtis Mead**...this has been changed to a base hit.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✦ Has hit safely in a season-high-tying nine straight games (June 17–pres.) and 15 of his last 17 (June 7–pres.)...he previously had a season-best 11-game on-base streak (May 18-31) that included another nine-game hitting streak (May 20-31)...they are tied for the third-best hitting streaks of his career, one game shy of a 10-game streak between July 28, 2025–March 29, 2026 and a 13-game streak from June 15-28, 2025. ✦ He has 55 RBI on the season, one of six Rays in team history to reach the mark through the team's first 79 games of a season and the first since Evan Longoria (also 55) in 2010...he is 14 RBI shy of tying Jose Canseco's franchise record of 69 RBI (1999) before the All-Star break with 15 games to go. ✦ He is tied for fourth in the AL and tied for eighth in the majors in RBI...46 of his 55 RBI have come vs. RHP, second most in the majors behind MIA Liam Hicks (47). ✦ Has reached base safely in 29 of his last 34 games (April 20–pres.) at Tropicana Field, hitting .303 (37-for-122) with 6 2B, 6 HR, 25 RBI, and a .914 OPS over that span. ✦ On three separate occasions this season, he has produced streaks of three games or more with multiple hits (last: 3G, June 23-25)...he is tied with LAA Jo Adell, SF Jung Hoo Lee, LAD Shohei Ohtani, and BOS Willson Contreras for the second-most such streaks in the majors, trailing only MIA Otto Lopez (5x). ✦ In May, he led the majors in average (.374/34-for-91) and on-base pct. (.464)...he also ranked highly in OPS (2nd, 1.025) and hits (T2nd)...was the first Ray to lead MLB in average over a month since Yandy Diaz in June 2024 (.400)...his 43 RBI were second most in team history through May (Evan Longoria - 2019, 55RBI). ✦ Went 11-for-19 (.579) with 1 2B and 4 RBI during the Rays homestand between May 1-6 (vs. SF/TOR), including a career-high-tying four straight multi-hit games from May 2-5 (also: May 26-29, 2025)...min. 20 AB, it marked the third-highest average by a Ray on a single homestand behind Yandy Diaz (.591, Sept. 15-21, 2025) and Greg Norton (.588, Aug. 15-24, 2006) from Sept. 15-21, 2025 (Elias).

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✦ Launched his fourth home run in his last two games (June 25–pres.) last night, the fifth time this season he has homered in back-to-back contests and 15th time of his career...he joined Isaac Paredes (June 21-22, 2022), Brandon Lowe (Sept. 30–Oct. 2, 2021), Curt Casali (July 27-28, 2015), and Greg Vaughn (May 18-19, 2002) as the only Rays to have four home runs in a two-game span...his 15 instances of homering in two consecutive games or more are sixth most in franchise history, one shy of B.J. Upton (16x) for fifth most...he homered a franchise-record-tying three times on Thursday vs. KC, becoming the seventh player to turn the trick and the first since Paredes on June 21, 2022 vs. NYY...he joined DET Colt Keith, LAD Max Muncy, LAD Andy Pages, and PHI Kyle Schwarber as the only players with three-homer games in the majors this season. ✦ He has 12 RBI over his last four games (June 23–pres.), the seventh time in franchise history a player has had a dozen RBI or more in any four-game span, the first since he had 13 RBI between May 28-31, 2025...he had 6 RBI on Thursday vs. KC, matching a career high (2x, last: May 29, 2025 at HOU and becoming the second player in team history to have multiple 6-RBI games in a Rays uniform, joining Carlos Peña (3x). ✦ On Thursday, MLB announced he has been named a finalist to start the 2026 All-Star Game, advancing to Phase 2 of fan balloting alongside TOR Kazuma Okamoto...this season, Caminero leads Okamoto in bWAR (2.8), hits (85), doubles (12), home runs (20), walks (46), average (.285), on-base pct. (.379), slugging pct. (.527), OPS (.905), and OPS+ (148)...Caminero is looking to become the first Ray to start back-to-back All-Star Games. ✦ With his three-run homer in the 1st inning yesterday, he became the fifth primary third baseman in the modern era (since 1900) to record multiple 20-HR seasons in age-22-or-younger seasons (2025, 45HR), joining ATL Bob Horner (3x), BSN/MLN Eddie Matthews (3x), BOS Rafael Devers (2x), and WSH Ryan Zimmerman (2x)...he also joined Evan Longoria (9x) as the only primary third basemen in team history to have multiple 20-home run seasons for the club. ✦ In his last 22 games at home, he is slashing .405/510/785 (32-for-79) with 6 2B, 8 HR, 24 RBI, 18 R, and a 1.295 OPS...during that stretch, he has more BB (18) than SO (15). ✦ Min. 100 AB, his .364 (52-for-143) average vs. fastballs leads the AL with 7 2B and 11 HR vs. fastballs. ✦ Paces MLB with an average bat speed of 80.0 mph...leads the majors with 101 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster. ✦ Eight of his 20 home runs have come on pitches outside the strike zone, most in MLB...he is tied for the most home runs in a season on pitches outside the strike zone by a Ray since 2010 with Carlos Peña (2010). ✦ Recorded a career-long 16-game home hitting streak (May 16–June 20), tying the 10th-longest streak in franchise history. ✦ Has reached base five times in multiple games this season (March 26 at STL & June 5 at MIA)...alongside ATH Nick Kurtz (2x) and ATH Tyler Soderstrom (2x), they are the only players in the AL to turn the trick multiple times this season.
