LAST GAME: The D-backs won the series opener, 6-4, last night @ Nationals on Randal Grichuk's eventual game-winning 2-run, pinch-hit double with 2 outs in the seventh.

- **Corbin Carroll** (2-for-4, 2 HR, 3 RBI, BB) recorded his fifth career multi-homer game.
- **Geraldo Perdomo** (3-for-4, 2B, SB) delivered his first 3-hit effort of the season (third multi-hit).
- Josh Naylor paced the D-backs with a first-inning RBI single.
- Justin Martinez logged his first save of 2025...Martinez, Shelby Miller and A.J. Puk combined to work 3.0 scoreless frames with 2 strikeouts and no walks.

**ROSTER MOVES:** Today, the D-backs recalled INF **Tim Tawa** (No. 13) from Triple-A Reno and placed INF **Ketel Marte** on the 10-day injured list (strained left hamstring).

**SLUG OUT OF THE CHUTE:** The D-backs have homered in each of their first 8 games of the season for just the fourth time in franchise history...only 3 other teams have homered in each of their games to begin this season (also: A's in 8 G, Giants in 7 G and Yankees in 7 G).

**TEAM OFFENSE:** Among all teams, the D-backs rank third with a .476 SLG (.621 Yankees, .502 Cardinals) and 33 extra-base hits (35 Cubs, 35 Yankees), tied for third with 51 runs with the Cardinals (63 Cubs, 62 Yankees), fourth with an .835 OPS (.997 Yankees, .879 Cardinals, .846 Phillies), and .359 OBP (.377 Cardinals, .376 Yankees, .373 Phillies).

**LATE-INNING MAGIC:** The D-backs' 25 runs in the seventh-ninth innings lead the Majors, ahead of the Phillies (21), Cardinals (17), Royals (17) and Yankees (15).

**VS. PENS:** The D-backs, among all teams against opposing bullpens, are second with a .313 AVG (.350 Phillies), .412 OBP (.500 Phillies), .912 OPS (1.262 Phillies), tied for second with 35 hits (45 Cubs, 35 Red Sox) and tied for third with 29 runs (33 Cubs, 30 Yankees, 29 Phillies).

**DYNAMIC DOMO: Geraldo Perdomo** ranks among all qualified shortstops in RBI (1st, 11), AVG (T-1st, .379), hits (T-1st, 11), total bases (T-5th, 16) and runs (T-5th, 5).

 Among NL leaders, ranks tied for first in RBI, tied for fifth in hits and sixth in AVG.

**MÁS PERDOMO: Geraldo Perdomo**'s 11 RBI through the team's first 8 games this season are the most ever by a D-backs shortstop and tied for third overall (also: 5 others), behind Chris Young (14 in 2010) and Mark Reynolds (12 in 2008).

**GENO TIME:** Eugenio Suárez ranks among Major League leaders in homers (T-2nd, 5), RBI (T-2nd, 11), extra-base hits (T-4th, 6), total bases (T-6th, 22) and SLG (7th, .786).

#### TRENDING BATS:

- **Geraldo Perdomo**, in 8 games, is hitting .379 (11-for-29)/.927 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 homer and 11 RBI... has hit in 7 of his 8 games, including 3 multi-hit efforts
- **Josh Naylor**, in 8 games, is hitting .310 (9-for-29)/412 OBP with 3 doubles, 4 RBI and 5 walks...has hit in 6 of his 8 games, including 3 multi-hit efforts.
- **Alek Thomas**, in 4 games, is hitting .385 (5-for-13)/.938 OPS with 2 doubles and 5 RBI.

**VS. THE NATS:** Since 2022, the D-backs have gone 15-5 vs. Nationals (8-3 on the road), including 9-1 in their last 10 meetings.

- The D-backs have won 8 of their last 9 games @ Nationals Park since April 20, 2022...as a team, Arizona is hitting .361 (96-for-317)/.362 OBP and owns a 5.89 run/game AVG in that span.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has hit in 11 straight games vs. Nationals dating back to August 18, 2021... is batting .476 (20-for-42)/1.260 OPS with 2 doubles, 3 homers, 6 RBI and 3 walks in that span.
- **Corbin Carroll**, in 13 career games, is hitting .415 (17-for-41)/1.398 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 11 RBI and 8 walks.
- Alek Thomas, in 9 career games, is hitting .346 (9-for-26)/.970 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 triples, 5 RBI and 1 walk.

#### NEXT STARTER: RHP CORBIN BURNES (0-0, 4.15)

- Made his first start of the season and D-backs debut on April 1 @ Yankees (ND; 4 ER in 4.1 IP, 4 H, 3 BB, 8 K).
- Will mark his third career start @ Nationals (last: May 7, 2024).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is in his second season with the D-backs (10th overall in MLB; did not pitch in 2020)...is making his first road start of the season.

- · Signed a 4-year contract in December 2023 (2024-2027) with a conditional option for the fifth year.
- Was a member of the 2018 World Series champion Red Sox.
- Finished tied for sixth in the 2019 AL Cy Young Award vote after going 19-6 with a 3.81 ERA (86 ER in 203.1 IP) and 213 strikeouts.
- From 2018-23, his 63 wins were tied for third most in the AL (also: Justin Verlander), behind Gerrit Cole (86) and Jose Berríos (66).
- Made 2 Opening Day starts during his stint with the Tigers (2022-23).

LAST START: Did not factor in the win in his season debut vs. Cubs on March 30...allowed 3 runs over 5.1 innings with 3 hits, 3 walks and 5 strikeouts.

- · Limited hitters to go 1-for-5 with men on base and 0-for-2 with runners in scoring position.
- Retired 14 of the first 18 batters with 5 strikeouts through the first 5.0 innings, yielding 1 run on 2 hits and 2 walks.

VS. NATIONALS: Is making his fourth career appearance (third start) and first since 2021...all 3 appearances have come @ Nationals.

- In 3 career games, is 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 12.0 IP), 1.00 WHIP, 4 walks and 13 strikeouts.
- In his last start on Oct. 1, 2021, earned the win after working 5.0 scoreless frames with 3 walks and 6 strikeouts.

STELLAR VS. NL EAST: In 13 career games (12 starts), has gone 7-2 with a 3.74 ERA (28 ER in 67.1 IP), 20 walks and 79 strikeouts.

2024 RECAP: Went 3-4 with a 5.04 ERA (28 ER in 50.0 IP), 19 walks and 47 strikeouts over 10 starts in his first season with the D-backs.

- Limited to a career-low 10 starts after beginning the season on the 15-day injured list (left shoulder strain) and being transferred to the 60-day on April 17...was reinstated on Aug. 6.
- Earned the win in his first start of the season and debut as a D-back on Aug. 7 @ Guardians in Game 2 of a doubleheader.
- In his first 3 bids with the D-backs, went 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA (7 ER in 16.0 IP), opponent .294 OBP, 4 walks and 11 strikeouts...the D-backs went 4-0 in his first 4 starts.
- Held lefties to a .222 average (8-for-36) with 8 strikeouts.

**POSTSEASON PRESENCE:** Appeared in the Postseason 3 times with Boston: 2017 Division Series (1 G); 2018 Division Series, League Championship Series and World Series (7 G-1 GS); 2021 ALDS and ALCS (3 GS).

• Was a member of the 2018 World Champion Red Sox and made the start in Game 4 @ Dodgers...posted a no-decision after allowing 4 runs over 5.2 innings with 6 strikeouts in the 9-6 win.

2023 RECAP: In his second season with Detroit, went 13-9 with a 3.30 ERA (56 ER in 152.2 IP), 143 strikeouts, .227 opponent average and 1.15 WHIP over 26 starts.

- Posted career bests in ERA, opponent AVG and WHIP, while tossing 150.0+ innings for the third time in his career.
- Made his second consecutive Opening Day start for the Tigers and led the team in starts, quality starts (14), wins and strikeouts.
- Marked the fourth time in his last 5 seasons to win 13+ games and seventh in his last 8 to notch 20+ starts.
- His 13 wins were the most by a Tiger since Justin Verlander won 16 in 2016.
- Tossed 8.0 shutout innings with 4 hits allowed, no walks and 10 strikeouts in Game 2 of the doubleheader vs. Guardians on April 18...became just the third pitcher in franchise history to throw 8.0+ scoreless frames with no walks and 10+ strikeouts (also: Bill Donovan on June 27, 1908 vs. St. Louis Browns and Max Scherzer on June 17, 2012 vs. Rockies).
- Retired the first 20 batters @ Orioles on April 23 to become the first Tiger to accomplish the feat since Jordan Zimmermann (6.2 IP) @ Blue Jays in 2019.
- Recorded 6 consecutive starts with 5.0+ innings and 1 run or fewer allowed from April 12-May 10, the longest streak of his career... tied Michael Fulmer (May 21-June 17, 2016) and Al Benton (April 19-May 20,1945) for the second-longest streak in Tigers history... over that stretch, went 4-0 with a 0.43 ERA (2 ER in 41.2 IP) and 41 strikeouts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 0.43 ERA tied Doug Fister for the second-lowest by a Tigers pitcher over a 6-start span since 1913, trailing only Al Benton (0.33 ERA in 1945).

NEARLY A NO-NO: Carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning on Sept. 4, 2016 @ Athletics that was broken up by a Marcus Semien 2-out single.

**HOW IT STARTED:** Signed by Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in 2010.

 Made his Major League debut on May 28, 2015 for the Red Sox @ Rangers...became the first pitcher in Red Sox history to pitch at least 7.2 innings and allow no runs, yield 3 hits or fewer and strikeout 7+ in a debut.
