METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Snakes, 7-4, last night...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (2-3)...The Mets continue their penultimate homestand (1-1), a seven-game stand against Arizona (1-1) and Cincinnati (three games).

EN FUEGO: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets will recall LHP Joey Lucchesi to start the game...The lefty has made six appearances for the Mets this season, going 2-0 with a 3.54 ERA (11 ER/28.0 IP) with 10 walks and 22 strikeouts...In 15 games (14 starts) at Triple-A Syracuse this year, Lucchesi is 6-5 with a 4.74 ERA (43 ER/81.2 IP) with 39 walks and 75 strikeouts...In his last start on August 18 in St. Louis, the southpaw hurled 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing four hits, two walks and striking out five.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets are in the midst of their penultimate homestand of the season...The Mets are 36-34 at Citi Field in 2023...This compares to a 30-44 record on the road.

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio has safely hit in eight of his first 10 career games...He is batting .306 (11-36) with two runs, two doubles, one home run, five RBI, two walks and four steals in his first 10 career games...He is one of five players in franchise history to record a hit in each of his first five career major league games.

STEAL THIS ALBUM: The Mets lead the major leagues with a 89.8% success rate in stolen bases this season...The team has stolen 106 bases out of 118 attempts...It's the highest success rate in franchise history...The previous high was 82.3% which was accomplished in 2004.

DINGERS! The Mets have socked 192 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 192 home runs are tied with the 1987 team for the sixth-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 2000 team, which hit 198 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets now feature for players who have hit 20 or more home runs this season: Pete Alonso, Francisco Alvarez, Francisco Lindor and Brandon Nimmo...The 2023 Mets are one of five teams in franchise history to accomplish this feat...This includes the 2019 Mets who had a franchise-high five players who recorded at least 20 home runs.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 20 games, DJ Stewart is batting .342 (25-73) with 13 runs, six doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI and a 1.228 OPS...In 43 games this year, Stewart is batting .281 (32-114) with 16 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 24 RBI, 11 walks, a .357 OBP and a .640 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

100: Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 485 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is second in the majors and in the NL with 105 RBI.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is tied for second in the majors and is second in the National League with 44 home runs...Alonso's 190 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

D-BACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 17-4 over their last 21 games against the Diamondbacks...That span includes an eight-game winning streak from September 9, 2019-May 31, 2021...New York has won the season series against Arizona each season since 2018.

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 32 doubles and 26 home runs this season...He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 26 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season.

LINSANITY: Over his last 73 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .287 (79-275) with 55 runs, 15 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 43 RBI, 30 walks, 20 steals with a .366 OBP, a .509 SLG and an .875 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high 26 bases this season.

I DECLARE FWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks eighth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 5.5 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.3 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (19.2), Mookie Betts (18.5) and Trea Turner (17.0) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 is sixth in the majors.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1997, the Mets scored six runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to tie the game...The team would walk it off in the bottom of the 11th thanks to a three-run homer by pinch hitter, Bernard Gilkey...The Mets climbed back in the ninth, scoring twice thanks to a two-RBI single by Roberto Petagine...Down to their final out, Carl Everett hit a grand slam to tie the game...John Franco earned the win, tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in relief.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies earned an 8-1 game one victory over Reading to take a 1-0 series lead in the playoffs...The team was led by Jett Williams in his Double-A debut and Blade Tidwell on the mound...Williams went 2-4 and scored three runs, reaching base on a double, single, and hit by pitch...Tidwell struck out a Double-A career-high nine batters over 5.0 scoreless innings, while allowing three hits and no walks...He struck out the side in the fifth inning to end his night... The Rumble Ponies continue their series with the Fightin Phils on Wednesday night at Mirabito Stadium.

LUCCHESI NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT IN THE MAJORS: Earned the win after throwing 5.2 scoreless innings on August 18 against the Cardinals at Busch Stadium...Allowed four hits and two walks while striking out five batters in a 7-1 Mets victory.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi has made 15 appearances, 14 of which were starts, this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In those appearances, he has pitched to a 4.74 ERA (43 ER/81.2 IP) and has tallied 75 strikeouts...Lucchesi earned International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 12-18 after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings against the Buffalo Bisons on June 13, during which he allowed two hits while striking out six batters...In his most recent start, Lucchesi threw 4.0 innings on September 6 with Syracuse against the Rochester Red Wings, allowing three earned runs on six hits and three walks while striking out three batters in a 7-6 Syracuse walk-off victory in 10 innings.

TAMING THE SERPENTS: Lucchesi will face the Diamondbacks for the first time this season and the first time since 2021...Has pitched to a 2-5 record with a 4.75 ERA (22 ER/41.2 IP) in nine appearances, eight of which were starts, against the Diamondbacks in his career...Holds a 2-2 record with a 4.78 ERA (14 ER/26.1 IP) at home compared to an 0-3 record with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) on the road against the D-backs...In his last appearance against Arizona on May 8, 2021 at Citi Field, Lucchesi earned the win after tossing 3.1 innings in relief, allowing one run on two hits and a walk while striking out two batters in a 4-2 Mets victory.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made two appearances with Brooklyn (A+) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 7-day IL, both against the Aberdeen IronBirds...Threw 52 pitches in his first rehab start on August 8, allowing one earned run on four hits and a walk while striking out five...On August 13, threw 4.2 scoreless innings, allowing one hit and one walk while fanning three batters in a 63-pitch outing.

CAN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In four away starts in the majors this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 2.41 ERA (5 ER/18.2 IP), tallying 15 strikeouts, and earned both of his wins on the year thus far on the road (April 21 @ SF, August 18 @ STL)...In two home starts this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 5.79 ERA (6 ER/9.1 IP).

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings)

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi—who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college-made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA (19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings...Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his curve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (10-7, 3.07)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.0 innings against Minnesota at Target Field on September 8...Allowed two earned runs on four hits and four walks...Fanned five Twins batters in a 5-2 Mets loss.

HARD TO HIT: This season, Senga has three starts of 7.0 or more innings and two or fewer hits allowed, tied for the second-most such starts in the majors this season and tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan (4, 1970) and Jacob deGrom (5, 2015) have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.
