TIED FOR SECOND PLACE, NL EAST, 4.0 GB

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Phillies, 4-1 on Wednesday night in Flushing...The Mets earned their eighth series win of the season and their fifth series win at home...New York continues a six-game homestand (2-0) against Philadelphia (2-0) and Toronto (three games).

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization...A collection on the Mets Virtual Vault highlighting this year's Mets Hall of Fame 2023 inductees and Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award recipient is now live at metsheritage.com.

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high 14 straight contests, hitting 23 home runs in that span...It is the longest active streak in the majors...The Mets are 24-13 when hitting a home run this season and 9-7 when hitting multiple homers...The 14-game homer streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are going for their third sweep of the season today...It would be their first sweep of the Phillies since a three-game set at Citi Field from May 27-29, 2022.

IF YOU START ME OFF: The Mets are 15-0 this season when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings and 5-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings...The Mets 15-0 record is the best in the majors, followed by the 20-1 mark from the Rays and the 17-4 record from the Diamondbacks...New York's 15 straight such team wins is the longest single-season streak since the Astros went 17 straight in 2021...Courtesy of Elias.

SEEING RED AGAIN: Max Scherzer will make his 30th career start against the Phillies...He is 16-5 with a 2.61 ERA (53 ER/182.2 IP) with 43 walks and 230 strikeouts lifetime against the Phils...His 16 wins are the most for any active pitcher versus Philadelphia and also tied for most in Scherzer's career over a single opponent...He is 16-5 against Miami...In two starts at Citi Field in 2023, Scherzer is 1-0 and has yet to allow a run in 11.0 innings...In 26 career starts at Citi Field, Scherzer is 15-4 with a 1.82 ERA (34 ER/168.1 IP) with 39 walks and 212 strikeouts.

I GOT IT!: Today, Ira Kaplan, guitarist and vocalist for the New York group Yo La Tengo, will throw out an honorary first pitch...A lifelong Mets fan, Ira and his bandmates recently celebrated the release of their 17th album, "This Stupid World."

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won seven straight home games, the longest streak since winning nine consecutive from May 18-June 14, 2022...New York has pitched to a 3.05 ERA (22 ER/65.0 IP) in that span with 15 walks and 59 strikeouts and has hit .253/.328/.427...The Mets have outscored opponents 34-24 in the streak...The Mets have played 23 games at Citi Field, the fewest home games in the majors this season...The team is 14-9 at Citi Field this year...The team won 54 games at home last year.

WEATHER EDUCATION DAY: The Mets and PIX11 will host the 15th annual "Weather Education Day" today for 8,000 students from New York, New Jersey and Connecticut...Students will be treated to a pre-game meteorology lesson starting at 11:00 a.m. by PIX11's weather team of Mr. G. Byron Miranda and Chris Cimino as well as Mets Public Address Announcer...They will discuss weather patterns and phenomenon and tips for sun safety this summer.

ESC KEY: Over his last 13 games, Eduardo Escobar is batting .444 (12-27) with three runs, one double, one home runs, five RBI, two waks with a steal, a .483 OBP and a .593 SLG...In 16 games last month, Escobar slashed .394/.444/.606.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets take on the Phillies for the first time this season...The Mets have won eight of their last nine games against the Phillies at Citi Field.

CANHA I GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha went 2-3 with one run, one home run and four RBI in last night's victory...In his last three games against the Phillies, Canha is .545 (6-11) with three runs, three home runs, nine RBI with a walk and a 1.947 OPS...He is batting .282/.380/.487 with three home runs, 10 RBI and 11 walks in 26 day games this year.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has hit 20 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 46 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 426 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in all 56 of the Mets games this year.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 17-3 (.850) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 12-24 (.333) when their opponent scores first...Since the start of 2022, the Mets are 98-19 when scoring first...Their .838 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 43-13 in the first inning this year.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is batting .299 (23-77) with six doubles, seven home runs, five walks with a .357 OBP and a .649 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 22 games in May, Alvarez hit .292 (21-72) with 11 runs, six doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI, six walks with a 1.029 OPS.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez has hit eight home runs this season...That puts him tied for the fourth-most by a rookie in the majors and third in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's nine career homers (one last year) before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets are second in the major leagues with an 86.4% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 15 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 329 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 26-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 121 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 18 errors in 56 games this year, the fewest errors in the majors...It's the first time in franchise history the Mets enter June with fewer than 20 errors...The previous low was 21 in 2007 and 2022...Courtesy of Sportradar...New York owns a .991 fielding percentage...Their .991 fielding percentage also leads the major leagues.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 7.0 innings against Colorado on May 26...Allowed six hits and no walks while striking out a season-high eight Rockies batters...Scherzer had not completed 7.0 innings since August 28, 2022, also against the Rockies...His 7.0 innings pitched is tied for second-longest outing amongst Mets starting pitchers this season with Joey Lucchesi (4/21 @ SF), Kodai Senga (5/30 vs PHI) and Justin Verlander (5/10 @ CIN), and behind Justin Verlander's 8.0 innings pitched during Game 2 of the doubleheader on May 21 vs. Cleveland.

SEEING RED AGAIN: Max Scherzer will make his 30th career start against the Phillies...He is 16-5 with a 2.61 ERA (%# ER/ 192.2 IP) with 43 walks and 230 strikeouts lifetime against the Phils...His 16 wins are the most for any active pitcher versus Philadelphia and also tied for most in Scherzer's career over a single opponent...He is 16-5 against Miami.

HOME SWEET HOME: In two starts at Citi Field in 2023, Scherzer is 1-0 and has yet to allow a run in 11.0 innings...In 26 career starts at Citi Field, Scherzer is 15-4 with a 1.82 ERA (34 ER/168.1 IP) with 39 walks and 212 strikeouts.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Scherzer whiffed eight batters for the first time this season in his last start...The last time he struck out eight or more batters was September 19, 2022...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his previous eight starts dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 12 punchouts separating the two...With 147 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field...Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)...Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JUSTIN VERLANDER (2-2, 4.80)

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed a season-high-tying six runs on nine hits, one walk and two strikeouts over 5.0 innings on May 27 at Colorado.

AGE IS JUST A NUMBER: On May 21 vs. Cleveland, Verlander earned his second win of the season after tossing 8.0 innings of one-run ball on three hits, zero walks and five strikeouts...At 40 years and 90 days, Verlander became the oldest Mets pitcher to complete 8.0 innings since Bartolo Colon on May 2, 2016 at 42 years and 344 days.
