METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the Rangers, 4-3...The win snapped a three-game losing streak, their longest of the season...With a win today, the Mets would secure their 18th series victory of the season...New York is 17-5-2 in 24 series this year...The Mets are in a stretch of 17 games in 17 days (1-0) to finish out the first-half...The Mets continue a six-day, five-game homestand (1-2) against the Astros (0-2) and Rangers (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets head to Cincinnati for a quick three-game road trip against the Reds.

UMPS CARE: Earlier today, the Mets hosted umpire and U.S. Marine Corp veteran, Collins Halstead at Citi Field in partnership with UMPS CARE, the official charity branch of MLB umpires...Halstead watched batting practice and met with today's umpires...UMPS CARE enriches the lives of children coping with serious illness, and military families by providing unique baseball experiences, offer financial support to children adopted later in life through a scholarship initiative and a leadership program that teaches mentorship through the lens of baseball.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: With the victory last night, Mets Manager Buck Showalter earned his 1,599th career managerial win...The win tied him for 22nd on the all-time win list with Tommy Lasorda...After Lasorda, Fred Clarke is next with 1,602 wins...His 1,599 wins ranks fourth among active managers.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets struck out 14 in last night's victory...It was the 38th time this season that the Mets have struck out 10 or more in a game...That is tied for the second-most in the majors with the Braves...Only the White Sox (39) have recorded more such games...Overall, the Mets rank third in the majors with 715 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 582 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

NEW YORK RANGERS: Starling Marte is a lifetime .383 (31-81) hitter against the Texas Rangers...He has accumulated 17 runs, four doubles, a triple, four home runs, 15 RBI and a walk, a .412 OBP and a .605 SLG in 21 career games...Ender Inciarte has hit 6-19 (.316) with one homer and three RBI in six games against the club...Francisco Lindor is a lifetime .270 (31-115) hitter with 17 runs, six doubles, a triple, four home runs, 15 RBI, 12 walks, a .341 OBP and a .443 SLG in 28 career games against Texas.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has posted a 1-0 record with seven saves, a 0.71 ERA (one earned run/12.2 innings) with nine hits, two walks and 27 strikeouts over his last 13 appearances since May 27...Overall, he has recorded 17 saves this season, tied for the fifth-most in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 61 strikeouts...His 17.52 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 15.00...He has struck out 61 of the 125 batters he faced, good for 48.8%...He is 2-1 with 17 saves, a 2.01 ERA (seven earned runs/31.1 innings), allowing 24 hits and 11 walks...The Mets are 29-3 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played the fifth-fewest home games in the National League and are tied for the third-most road games...By comparison, the Braves are tied for the most home games in the NL...The Mets have won 14 of their last 18 home games...Overall, the Mets are 25-12 at home this year...They are second in the majors and top the National League with a .676 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.40 ERA with 121 walks and 364 strikeouts at Citi Field this year...The Mets own the third-best home ERA in the National League...The team is hitting .256/.334/.391 at home.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The Mets have won five straight one-run games at home...The club's last one-run loss at home came in the second game of a doubleheader vs. St. Louis on May 17...The Mets are 8-3 in one-run games at home and 11-8 overall.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 48 games this season, tied for the most in the National League...Their .623 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 48-29 record through the team's first 77 games...Only the 1986 (55-22) and the 1988 (49-28) teams posted a better record through the first 77 games of the season.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play against the Rangers tonight...The Mets are 4-7 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .508 winning percentage (230-223) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 52 times this year...The Mets have been hit 286 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 63 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 44 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 37 HBP.

OUCH: Brandon Nimmo has been hit by 49 pitches in his career...That is the second-most HBP in team history...Pete Alonso is fourth with 46 HBP...Michael Conforto is the franchise leader with 50 in his Mets career.

RANGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets take on the Texas Rangers for the first time since 2017...The two teams were slated to face each other in 2020.

ONE AWAY: Jeff McNeil is one double away from 100 in his career...He ranks eighth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a .319 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22...He is batting .358 (39-109) with 11 doubles, a triple, two home runs, 31 RBI with a .408 OBP and a .532 SLG with runners on base this year...His .358 average ranks 11th in the majors and eighth in the NL.

HIGH FIVE: Pete Alonso has safely reached base in five straight games, batting .400 (6-15) in that span with two runs, a double, two home runs, three RBI, three walks with a .500 OBP, an .867 SLG and a 1.367 OPS...He has recorded 23 multi-hit games this year, which is tied with teammate Jeff McNeil for the ninth-most in the National League...He has recorded 114 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 51st on the team's all-time list...Next up is Cliff Floyd who recorded 114 multi-hit games in his career.

MV-PETE: Pete Alonso became the third Mets player in team history to record 60 or more RBI before the All-Star break in multiple seasons...He joins Carlos Beltran (2006 and 2008) and David Wright (2006, 2008 and 2010)...The Mets record for most RBI in the first half is 74, accomplished by David Wright in 2006.

MARTE PARTAY: Starling Marte is one double away from 250 for his career...In 46 games since May 1, Starling Marte is batting .304 (56-184) with 36 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, five home runs, 21 RBI, nine walks, five steals with a .344 OBP, a .495 SLG and an .838 OPS.

TOMMY BOY: Tommy Hunter has not allowed an earned run in his first seven appearances with the Mets, dating back to May 7, 2021...He has allowed one unearned run, six hits, three walks and struck out 11 in that span...Prior to Hunter, the last pitcher to start his Mets career with 12 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run was Addison Reed with 14.0 innings from September 1-30, 2015.

LIN THE CITI: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in 19 of his last 22 home games, recording a hit in 17 of those contests...He is batting .269 (21-78) with 18 runs, a triple, three home runs, 20 RBI, 12 walks, four steals with a .379 OBP and a .410 SLG in those 22 games since May 14...Overall, he is batting .261/.366/.425 with 28 runs, two doubles, a triple, six home runs, 29 RBI, 19 walks and six steals in 37 games at Citi Field this year.

LINSANE IN THE MEMBRANE: Francisco Lindor has recorded 56 RBI in 76 games this year...Lindor did not record his 56th RBI until his 118th game last year on September 26...Lindor recorded a total of 63 RBI in 2021...Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break...José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic.

THE GAME OF RISP: The Mets are second in the majors with a .274 average with runners in scoring position...They rank sixth in MLB with a .346 OBP...Jeff McNeil - .383 (23-60), Tomás Nido - .343 (12-35), Pete Alonso - .329 (23-70) and Mark Canha - .300 (18-60) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the major leagues with 51 RBI in RISP situations...He has 10 home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors...Jeff McNeil's .383 average with RISP is tied for eighth in the majors.

SEVEN DAYS UNTIL NO. 17: On July 9, 2022, the Mets will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...In anticipation of the event, the Mets are counting down 17 moments of Hernandez career with the Mets at metsheritage.com...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history.

WILLIAMS NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 2.1 scoreless innings out of the bullpen in the Mets 9-1 loss on June 28 against the Astros...Struck out four batters and issued two walks.

VS. TEXAS: Today, Williams will face the Rangers for the first time in his career... In six career games (four starts) against AL West opponents Williams is 1-2 with a 5.84 ERA (16 earned runs/24.2 innings).

INTER-LEAGUE PLAY: Williams has made twenty-two career outing (19 starts) in inter-league play and is 6-7 with a 4.59 ERA (58 earned runs/113.2 innings)... As a Met, Williams has made four appearances (one start) in inter-league play and has allowed nine runs (seven earned) over 11.0 innings...Williams has lost his last five decisions in inter-league games and has not earned a victory against an inter-league opponent since August 13, 2019 against the Angels as a member of the Pirates.

LAST 10: Williams' last 10 appearances have included five starts and five relief outings...He has thrown 34.2 total innings in that span and has allowed 10 runs on 28 hits with 12 walks and 32 strikeouts...Six of those 10 outings have been scoreless.

HOME/ROAD: This season, Williams has made six appearances (two starts) at Citi Field and is 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA (four earned runs/18.0 innings)...By contrast, Williams is 0-4 with a 4.88 ERA (13 earned runs/24.0 innings) in eight appearances (four starts) on the road.

WITH THE METS: Since being acquired from the Mets on July 30, 2021, Williams has made 24 appearances (nine starts) with the Amazin's...Williams has a 3.39 ERA (28 earned runs/74.1 innings) with 22 walks and 68 strikeouts.

STARTS/RELIEF: With New York, Williams is 1-3 and has a 3.82 ERA (16 earned runs/37.2 innings) with nine walks and 25 strikeouts in nine starts...In 15 relief outings, he is 0-1 with a 2.95 ERA (12 earned runs/36.2 innings).

MEET THE MET: Was acquired from Chicago-NL on July 30, 2021 with INF Javier Báez for minor league OF Pete Crow-Armstrong...Aside from baseball, Williams co-hosts a podcast with former teammate Steven Brault (@podcastIMHO)...He is the co-founder of Project 34; a non-profit that assists with the purchasing of medical equipment and assistive devices that may not be otherwise accessible to a patient, as well as providing grants to individuals to afford physical therapy for optimal function (projectthirtyfour.com)...Wore #34 in Pittsburgh to honor former ASU teammate Cory Hahn, who suffered a career-ending injury in 2011... He has four kids, including the newest addition to the family, a girl in the 2021-22 offseason...Is an avid reader, especially science fiction...Is a big Star Wars fan.

- Ranks eighth in Mets history with 128 homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR list: Michael Conforto (132) and Carlos Beltran (149).
- Became the second-fastest player ever to reach 125 home runs, doing so in his 435th career game with his second career grand slam on June 17 vs. Miami... Only Ryan Howard (405) was faster...Is one of three players with multiple slams this season.
