Fifth Place, NL East, 14.4 GB

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Wednesday, the Mets defeated the Reds, 4-2, at Citi Field...The victory snapped a five-game losing streak...The Mets are 13-12 over their last 25 games...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (1-2) against Cincinnati (1-2) followed by the Marlins (three games)...Following the homestand, the Mets head to the West Coast for the final time this season, a seven-day, six-game trip against the Mariners (three games) and Padres (three games).

METS HALL OF FAME CEREMONY: Outfielder Lee Mazzilli and manager Bobby Valentine will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in a pre-game ceremony on Saturday, May 30 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Mazzilli had two stints with the Mets (1976-1981 and 1986-1989) and combined to slash .264/.357/.396 during his 10 years in Queens...The Brooklyn native was named to the 1979 All-Star team and hit the first home run by a Met during the Midsummer Classic...Mazzilli ranks sixth in franchise history with 152 stolen bases and is tied for fifth in team history with 38 pinch-hits...Valentine ranks third in team history with 536 wins guiding the Mets from 1996-2002. In 1999, he led the Mets to the Postseason for the first time since 1988...The following year, Valentine took the team to the World Series, becoming the first manager in Mets history to lead the team to consecutive playoff appearances...Valentine was a key contributor to the club's immediate volunteer response to the 9/11 attacks.

HOT SOTO: On Wednesday, Juan Soto launched a solo homer to right field in the first inning to put the Mets up 1-0...He has homered eight times over his last 12 games dating back to May 14...It is tied for his most over a 12-game span in his career (last: 8/11-24/24 w/NYY)...The last Met with as many homers over a 12-game span was Neil Walker (8 HR) from April 15-27, 2016...Over the 12-game span he is slashing .386/.471/.932 (17-44)...His eight homers since May 14 lead the majors and his 13 homers this season are tied for the seventh-most in the NL...Over that span he ranks first in slugging and OPS (1.403) and second in total bases among all qualifiers in the majors.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 256 career home runs...That is tied with Juan González for the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 256)...His 256 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 256.

CARSON CONNECTS: Carson Benge is batting .302 (29-96) with 16 runs, five doubles, one homer, 14 RBI, seven walks and a .368 OBP in 25 games this Month...His .302 average leads all rookies this month, while his 29 hits are tied with Travis Bazzana for the most in the Majors...His 14 RBI are tied for the second-most amongst rookies in May.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen combined to throw 8.0 innings and only allowed one earned run on Wednesday night...In 2026, the bullpen has thrown 236.1 innings this season which is the third-most in the NL and they have pitched to a 3.26 ERA (86 ER/236.1 IP).

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 3-7 against the NL East this season...They have posted a 4.79 ERA against the division, while batting .226/.286/.365.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets are hosting the Marlins at Citi Field for the first time this year...They have dropped four of their last five games to the Marlins at the ballpark...Overall, the Mets are 87-61 against the Marlins since the yard opened in 2009.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have tallied 522 strikeouts this season, the fourth-most in franchise history through the team's first 56 games of a season...Only the 2020 team (541) and the 2021 and 2018 teams (534) had more...Their 522 strikeouts are tied for the third-most in the Majors.

THE HUASCAR GOES TO: Six of his seven career appearances as an opener have been scoreless and he has only allowed two earned runs over 8.1 innings...Overall, he has pitched to a 1.67 ERA (5 ER/27.0 IP) over 23 appearances this season...Out of the bullpen, Brazobán is 3-0 with a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 ER) in 19 games...He is seventh in the NL among qualified relievers in ERA and tied for eighth in wins.

HOME COOKING: The Mets are 12-14 at home this year...They have posted a 4.27 ERA, while batting .232/.299/.355 at Citi Field.

MAY FLOWERS: The Mets are 13-12 in May...The team has posted a 3.58 ERA (89 ER/224.0 IP) with 233 strikeouts...Their 233 strikeouts are tied for the third-most in the majors this month...They are hitting .225/.295/.359 in the month of May...Their .225 average is 23rd in the majors.

A.J. STYLES: In 16 games so far into his Major League career, A.J. Ewing is batting .250 (13-52) with six runs, one triple, one home run, four RBI, eight walks, three steals and a .359 OBP...He has safely reached base in 12 of his 16 games this year.

DREAM WEAVER: On Wednesday, Luke Weaver tossed 1.1 scoreless innings in the victory...He recorded at least four outs for the fifth time this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless...Has pitched to a 1.06 ERA (2 ER/17.0 IP) with 20 strikeouts over his last 15 appearances dating back to April 18.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The St. Lucie Mets defeated Bradenton thanks to a dominant performance by Jose Chirinos...He tossed a season-high 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits, walked one and struck out nine...The 21-year-old improved 3-1 on the season with a 2.36 ERA (11 ER/42.0 IP) with 10 walks and 48 strikeouts.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets completed a three-game sweep of the Dodgers with a 5-2 victory at Shea Stadium...Sid Fernandez tossed 8.0 innings and allowed two runs on four hits with two walks and five strikeouts...Ray Knight and Keith Hernandez doubled while George Foster went deep...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

- Made his fourth start of the season on May 27 vs. Cincinnati (1.0 IP, H, 2 K, BB) and he tossed a scoreless inning...Over seven career appearances as an opener he has allowed two earned runs and one hit over 8.1 innings.
- His 1.67 ERA (5 ER/27.0 IP) this season is the 13th-best mark in the majors and the eighth-best in the NL among all pitchers (min. 25.0 IP)...Has held opposing batters to a .160 batting average (15-94), which is the ninth-best mark in the majors (min. 25.0 IP).
- Over eight career appearances against Miami he has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP) and has one career save against the Marlins.
- Recorded two outs without allowing a run on May 24 at Miami (0.2 IP, H)...He hasn't surrendered an earned run in 19 of 23 appearances this season.
- Fired 2.0 innings and earned the win without allowing an earned run in extra innings on May 18 at Washington (2.0 IP, H, R, K, 2 BB)...Since the beginning of last season, he has had 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 innings in which he hasn't surrendered an earned run...His 12 such games are tied for the seventh-most in the NL over that span.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 43 appearances (four starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with eight holds, a 2.91 ERA (17 ER/52.2 IP) and 46 strikeouts.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 23 of his last 27 appearances...He is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (5 ER/33.1 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .154 batting average (18-117) over that span...His ERA is the seventh-best among NL pitchers over that span (min. 30.0 IP).
- Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 21 relief appearances, which is tied for the sixth-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.

- Fired 3.0 innings in relief and allowed one earned run while striking out six (3. IP, 3 H, ER, 6 K, 2 BB)...Marked his second game with six or more strikeouts in relief (also: 7 K, 4/24 vs. Colorado)...Joins Chase Dollander (3) and teammate David Peterson as the only relief pitchers this season with multiple games of six or more strikeouts.
- Allowed one earned run over 3.2 innings in relief on May 22 at Miami (3.2 IP, 4 H, R, ER, 3 K)...Has recorded multiple strikeouts in 11 of his 12 outings this season and has a 10.06 K/9.
- Has thrown 34.0 innings in relief this season, which is the second-most among NL relievers....His 38 strikeouts this season are the third-most among NL relief pitchers.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024 he is 8-3 with a 3.95 ERA (63 ER/143.2 IP) and 165 strikeouts over 29 games (21 starts) at Citi Field.
- Recorded seven strikeouts over 3.1 innings in relief on April 24 vs. Colorado (3.1 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 7 K, BB)...Marked his third career game with seven or more strikeouts as a relief pitcher (also: 8 K, 5/22/23 at Minnesota w/San Francisco and 7/13/25 at Kansas City)...Joins Tug McGraw (5), Nolan Ryan and Skip Lockwood as the only relief pitchers in franchise history with multiple seven+ strikeout games.
- In 45 career games in relief, Manaea is 5-5 with a 4.42 ERA (61 ER/124.1 IP) with 41 walks and 141 strikeouts.
- In 2025, finished the season going 2-4 with a 5.64 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 12 walks and 75 strikeouts in 15 appearances (12 starts).
- Last season was originally placed on the 15-Day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-Day IL on April 29.
- In 2024, he recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL.
- Originally signed by the Mets to a two-year contract as a free agent on January 12, 2024...Opted out of the second year of the deal on November 4....Re-signed by the Mets to a three-year contract on December 27, 2024.

- Fired a scoreless ninth inning and struck out two in his return to a big-league mound on May 26 vs. Cincinnati (1.0 IP, H, 2 K)...Was his first appearance since April 26, 2025 at Washington.
