METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were postponed for the second straight game...The Mets have lost the first four games of the season for the first time since 2005, when they dropped the first five contests of the year...The team continues their opening homestand, a six-game stand (0-4) against Milwaukee (0-3) and Detroit (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets head out on the road for the first time in 2024, visiting Cincinnati (three games) and Atlanta (four games).

CH-CH-CHANGES: Major League Baseball has made the following change: During the game on March 30 vs. Milwaukee, in the top of the first inning William Contreras reached on what was originally scored an infield single... This is being changed to an error on 3B Zack Short...As a result, all three runs in the inning are unearned...Luis Severino's ERA has been lowered to 5.39 ERA (3 ER/5.0 IP).

TWIN BILLS: The Mets played six doubleheaders in 2023...The team split a twinbill on May 1 vs. Atlanta, were swept by the Tigers in Detroit on May 3, took two from the Guardians in New York on May 21, were swept against the Braves on August 12, split a doubleheader on September 27 vs. Miami and swept their final twinbill of the year on September 30 vs. Philadelphia...The Mets have played 30 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors... The Mets have earned at least a split in 28 of those 30 twinbills over the last two years...New York has swept nine of their last 17 doubleheaders, including two this year and six DH sweeps last season.

OUR HOUSER: Adrian Houser is set to make his Mets debut today at Citi Field...He was acquired from the Brewers along with OF Tyrone Taylor in exchange for RHP Coleman Crow on December 20, 2023...In 2023, he pitched to an 8-5 record with a 4.12 ERA (51 ER/111.1 IP), tallying 96 strikeouts and 34 walks in 23 games (21 starts) and posted a 3.99 FIP.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are 0-1 in Interleague Play this year...Last year introduced the new schedule format which had New York playing a total of 46 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets went 19-27 against the American League...Overall, New York owns a 254-255 record in Interleague play.

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: On Monday, Sean Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/2/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut... He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (2008) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut...Credit Elias.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is 6-14 (.429) with three runs, two doubles, one home run, two RBI and one walk with a .786 SLG through the first four games of the season...He has 15 multi-RBI games since May 1, 2023, tied for fifth-most in the majors by a catcher during that span.

TIGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets last played the Tigers at Citi Field from May 24-26, 2019...The Mets have dropped eight of their last 11 games to the Tigers.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets allowed five unearned runs in last night's loss...Overall, the bullpen has posted a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) with six walks and 17 strikeouts...The team's 2.08 ERA is the second-best in the National League...Only Pittsburgh's 1.67 ERA (5 ER/27.0 IP) is lower.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte has safely hit in all four games this season...He is batting .357 (5-14) with three runs, one double, one home run, one RBI, two walks with a .438 OBP and a .643 SLG...He has recorded 338 steals in his career, which places him as the active leader in the majors.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has recorded 206 multi-hit games in his career... That places him 18th on the Mets All-Time list...Next up is Lee Mazzilli who record 207 multi-hit games, followed by Kevin McReynolds with 208 and Félix Millán who managed 211 such games with the Mets.

ONE AWAY: Pete Alonso is one RBI away from 500 for his career...He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 118 RBI last season the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 499 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

MENDOZA LINES: Carlos Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

THIS BUD'S FOR YOU: In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a two-time All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

THE GOOD DOC: On Sunday, April 14 the New York Mets will retire Doc Gooden's number 16... Gooden spent 11 years with the Mets, winning the 1984 NL Rookie of the Year Award while setting a major league rookie record with 276 strikeouts and was the youngest player ever named to an All-Star team at age 19...The following year, Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53)... Gooden was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010...He ranks second in franchise history in wins (157) and strikeouts (1,875) and third in innings (2,169.2), complete games (67), starts (303) and quality starts (209).

HOUSER NEWS & NOTES

DOOGIE HOUSER, NYM: Tonight, Adrian Houser will make his first career start with the Mets...Houser was acquired by the Mets along with OF Tyrone Taylor on December 20 from Milwaukee in exchange for RHP Coleman Crow...The 31-year-old spent the first seven seasons of his big league career with the Brewers and compiled a 31-34 record with 4.00 ERA (240 ER/539.1 IP) over 129 games (97 starts)...The Tahlequah, OK native was originally drafted by the Houston Astros in the second round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Locust Grove High School (OK).

HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL: Over four Grapefruit League starts, Houser went 0-2 with a 5.25 ERA (7 ER/12.0 IP)...Houser's best start of the spring came against the Tigers when he threw 3.1 perfect innings and retired five batters via strikeout.

2023 SUMMARY: Began the season on the 15-Day Injured List with right groin tightness...Made his season debut on May 7 at San Francisco and allowed two runs over 4.2 innings...Did not allow a run over 11.1 innings in back-to-back starts from May 19 - May 24...Threw a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed one run on June 4 at Cincinnati...Made two relief appearances on June 19 and June 23...Matched his career high for the third time with 10 strikeouts on July 22 vs. Atlanta...Landed on the 15-Day Injured List on August 28 with right elbow effusion and was activated on September 14...Over four starts in September/October, went 3-1 with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER/21.0 IP).

TIGER STRIPES: In three career games (two starts) against the Tigers, Houser is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (11 ER/14.2 IP)...Houser last faced the Tigers on June 1, 2021 at American Family Field when he allowed one run and struck out six batters over 5.0 innings in relief.

MY NEW HOUSE(R): Tonight, Houser will make first start at Citi Field as a member of the Mets...In two career starts at Citi Field, Houser is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (6 ER/10.2 IP)...On June 14, 2022 Houser allowed four runs over 4.2 innings and suffered the loss in his first career game at Citi Field...On June 29, 2023, Houser earned the win over the Mets at Citi Field and allowed two runs over 6.0 innings.

OKLAHOMA! Houser is the 18th player in franchise history born in the state of Oklahoma...He will be the first player born in Oklahoma to appear in a game for the Mets since Matt Reynolds in 2016...He is the first Oklahoma native to pitch for the Mets since 2012 when Mets pitching coach Jeremy Hefner made his major league debut...Houser has known Hefner for many years and worked with Hefner during the offseason in Oklahoma.
