STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (1-0, two to play), Mariners (three to play), and Athletics (three to play) tonight at Coors Field...have won 10 of their last 14 games on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...are currently 10-8 on a stretch of 20 games in 20 days to begin the second half (July 17-Aug. 5)...lead the AL with a 66-46 record, fourth in the majors...have spent 79 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 38 consecutive days in first (June 27-pres.)...the 19 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (126), Braves (124), Guardians (95), and Brewers (94)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 77 of those days, already third most in team history behind 2023 (106) and 2021 (81), per Stats Perform...have held a lead between 1.5-3.5 games over the second-place Yankees at the conclusion of each day since the All-Star break (currently 3.5)...entered August in first place for the third time (excl. 2020), joining 2021 (63-42) and 2010 (64-39).
* The Rays claimed the series opener, 13-9, over the Rockies...they played seven runs in the first three frames for the first time since Sept. 3, 2025 vs. SEA (8R)...it marked the 22nd time in franchise history the Rays won after allowing nine runs in a contest (last: May 13, 2025 at TOR - 11-9).
* They returned to a season-high-tying 20 games above .500 for the third time this season (last: Aug. 1, 65-45).
* Catcher **Kenny Piper** made his major league debut, becoming the seventh player in team history to make his major league debut for the Rays behind the plate, the first since **Logan Driscoll** (Sept. 3, 2024 vs. MIN)...joined **Robinson Chirinos** (July 18, 2011 vs. NYY - 2TOB) as the only Rays catcher to start and reach base multiple times safely in his MLB debut.
* **Junior Caminero** became the second player in team history to have a multi-home run game at Coors Field, joining **Jonny Gomes** (June 17, 2007)...see more in "La Maxima" note below.
* This nine-game road trip is tied for their longest this season with their season-opening, nine game trip (March 26-April 5) against the Cardinals (1-2), Brewers (1-2), and Twins (2-1)...it marks their longest road trip of the second half, ahead of an eight-game trip against the Red Sox (0-4) and Blue Jays (3-1) to open the post-All-Star-break schedule (July 17-23).
* With a win tonight or tomorrow, the Rays would earn their fourth series win in their last five tries and improve to 8-3-2 in their last 13 series (June 19-pres.)...paired with July 20-23 at TOR, win back-to-back road series for the first time since April 27-May 13 (3 straight at CLE, BOS, TOR).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays activated **C Liam Hicks** and **RHP Tyler Wells** and optioned **C Kenny Piper** to Double-A Montgomery and **RHP Michael Grove** to Triple-A Durham.
* Hicks is slated to bat in the clean up spot tonight, becoming the first Rays catcher to start in that part of the order since **Danny Jansen** (May 7, 2025 vs. PHI)...the last backstop to turn the trick before Jansen was **Travis d'Arnaud** (Sept. 24, 2019 vs. NYY).

HERE'S FREDDY—Tonight's probable starter, **Freddy Peralta**, is set to make his Rays debut after being acquired on Aug. 2 from the Mets for minor leaguers **OF Aidan Smith** (TB No. 12), **INF Emilien Pitre** (TB No. 15), **RHP Gary Gill Hill** (TB No. 17)...Peralta is set to be the 10th Dominican-born starting pitcher for the Rays, the first since **Diego Castillo** was used as an opener on Aug. 31, 2019 vs. CLE, and the first traditional starter since **Alex Colomé** (July 1, 2015 vs. CLE).
* In five career appearances (four starts) at Coors Field, Peralta has posted a 1.23 ERA (22.0IP, 3ER), the second-best ERA since the ballpark opened in 1995 (min. 20.0IP)...he trails only **WSH/SD Craig Stammen** (1.22).
* Per Elias, Peralta and **Liam Hicks** would be the fifth starting battery pairing to each make their Rays debut in the same game, joining **Andy Sonnanstine/Raul Caranovia** (June 5, 2007 vs. TOR), **Jim Parquette/Javier Valentin** (April 2, 2003), **Tony Saunders/Mike DiFelice** (April 2, 1998), and **Wilson Alvarez/John Flaherty** (March 31, 1998 vs. DET)...each of the 1998 instances came during the club's inaugural series against the Tigers at Tropicana Field.

LA MAXIMA—**Junior Caminero** launched his 31st and 32nd home runs of the season last night, his third multi-home run game of the season and the seventh of his career...he tied **Greg Vaughn**, **Fred McGriff**, and **Randy Arozarena** for the fourth most multi-home run games in franchise history...he is one shy of tying **Brandon Lowe** (8)...his three multi-HR games are one shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Caminero, 2025; B. Lowe, 2021; **Carlos Peña**, 2009 & 2007; **Jorge Cantu**, 2005)...his first blast moved him passed **Kevin Kiermaier** (82) for the 11th-most homers in franchise history...he is one shy of tying Arozarena (85) for 10th most.
* His pair of home runs marked the 76th and 77th home runs between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), surpassing NYY **Joe DiMaggio** (75) for second most in the modern era (since 1900) behind MLN **Eddie Mathews** (87).
* He is pacing for 46 HR—if he were to reach that mark, he would become the first player in team history with multiple 40-HR seasons and join Mathews (1953-54) as the only players in the modern era with multiple such seasons before their age-23 campaign...he would also tie **Carlos Peña's** single-season franchise record (2007).

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 32-1 when out-homer their opponent, 19-10 when home runs are even, and 15-35 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays 970 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era, trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (16-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1994 Montreal Expos (34-27/94)...the Rays have won 19 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.), dropping 22 of the 27 contests they were out-homered during that span, including 10 straight losses (July 5-pres.)...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (30-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated 12 of their 22 runs over the last six games via 8 HR.
* They are 27-5 in multi-homer games, including six straight wins (July 20-pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
* Over their last 34 games since June 25, the Rays pace the AL in multi-homer efforts (17) and are tied with the Tigers (51) for the most home runs over that span.

WINNING IS WINNING—The Rays have won six of their last nine games despite being outscored by opponents, 30-27, over that span...during this stretch, the Rays tallied four shutouts during a seven-game span (July 25-Aug. 1), matching the most over any seven-game stretch in club history along with July 28-Aug. 3, 2012 (4 shutouts in 6G span)...their 10 shutout wins are tied with the Dodgers, Tigers, Marlins, and Red Sox for third most in the majors, trailing the Phillies (14) and Yankees (11)...the Rays entered the month of July with four shutout wins (110th in AL/118th in MLB), but have tallied an MLB-leading six shutouts in their last 30 games since the start of July, two more than any other club in that span (SEA, TOR/PHI/DET - 4).
* Rays pitching has yielded three runs or fewer in 10 of 14 games during the club's 10-4 stretch (July 20-pres.)...among AL teams, only the Red Sox (60G) and Tigers (59) have permitted three runs or fewer more often than the Rays (58G) this season.
* The starting rotation has yielded two earned runs or fewer in 13 of its last 14 outings, pitching to an MLB-best 2.18 ERA (70.1IP, 17ER) over that span.

BAKER THE SAVE MAKER—**Bryan Baker** converted his 20th straight save opportunity Sat. vs. CWS to earn his 31st save, surpassing CLE **Cade Smith** (30) for the major league lead...the 20-save streak is the third longest in franchise history (see table on the right) and MLB's second-longest active streak behind TOR **Louis Varland** (24)...Baker has earned a save in five of the Rays last six wins and six of their last eight (July 22-pres.)...min. 25.0 IP, he leads the majors with a 0.36 ERA (25.0IP, 1ER) and .119 (10-for-84) opp. average since the 20-save streak began on May 17, and only MIL **Jacob Misiorowski** (0.62) has a better WHIP than Baker (0.68) in that time...he has worked a season-high-tying 12 straight scoreless outings (June 27-pres.), matching May 17-June 21...it ties the second-longest streak of his career behind a 15-appearance stretch from April 2-May 4, 2023 and ties the second longest by a Ray this season behind **Kevin Kelly's** 14-appearance span from April 22-May 22.
* Baker is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47) as the only Rays pitchers to lead the majors in saves over a full season...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point from Aug. 1 on, joining **Colomé**, **Fernando Rodney** (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.
* The Rays have won each of the last 18 games Baker has pitched in, tied with Rodney (2013) for the fourth-longest streak in a pitcher's outings in team history, trailing **Emilio Pagan** (25G, 2019), Soriano, (24G, 2010), and Percival (24G, 2008)...across the season, the Rays are 40-5 when he pitches.
* Collectively, the Rays have recorded an MLB-leading 44 saves, their second most through 1112 games in club history (2015, 45SV)...that's good for a pace of 64 saves over a 162-game season, which would establish a team record and tie the third-highest total by any club since saves became an official statistic in 1969 (also: 1988 OAK & 1990 OAK), trailing the 1990 White Sox (68) and 2008 Angels (66).
* The Rays own the majors' best winning pct. in games decided by three runs or fewer (.646/42-23).

TAKE ME HOME, COUNTRY ROADS—The Rays and Rockies continue their three-game set at Coors Field this week, the seventh time in franchise history the Rays have visited the Mile High City...the clubs kicked off the 2025 season against each other at Steinbrenner Field, with the Rays taking two of three contests...dating back to 2013, the Rays have claimed six straight series over the Rockies, going 14-5 during that stretch...they are 7-3-0 all-time in sets against the Rockies, with their last series defeat coming between June 16-18, 2009 (1-2).

TONIGHT’S START—**Freddy Peralta** is slated to make his first career start as a Ray tonight, his 23rd start of the season and 185th (233rd outing) of his career... was traded to Tampa Bay from New York-NL on Sunday in exchange for minor leaguers **RHP Gary Gill Hill**, **INF Émilien Pitre**, and **OF Aidan Smith**...was traded to the Mets from the Brewers on Jan. 21, 2026 and pitched to a 4.99 ERA (113.2IP, 63ER) with 113 strikeouts across 22 starts.

- Since 2023, Peralta's 117 games started are tied for third most in the majors behind **SF Logan Webb** (120) and **TOR Dylan Cease** (118) alongside **CHC Kevin Gausman** and **PIT Mitch Keller**.
- Peralta is set to become the 12th different pitcher to start a game for the Rays in 2026, tied for fourth most in the AL and the most starters used by the club since 2024 (14)...he will also become the 27th pitcher used by the Rays this season.
- Will be pitching on eight days of rest, making his first start since July 26 vs. LAD...in 40 career starts while pitching on six days of rest or more, he is 14-10 with a 3.98 ERA (194.2IP, 86ER).

LAST TIME OUT—Made his final start with the Mets on July 26 vs. LAD, allowing two earned runs on six hits across 4.0 innings pitched (4.0IP, 6H, 3R-2ER, 2BB, 3SO)...allowed a leadoff double to **Shohei Ohtani** in the 1st inning before setting down five of his next six batters faced...surrendered an RBI-double to **Freddie Freeman** in the 3rd inning and an RBI-ground out to **Max Muncy** before stranding Freeman on third base to end the inning...gave up another pair of singles in the 4th inning before **Tommy Edman** scored on an **Eliezer Alfonzo** ground out.

- Has walked a batter in 21 straight starts since April 1, doing so in 21 of 22 starts this season.

AND THE WINNER IS ROCKIE—The veteran right-hander will make his third start against the Rockies in 2026 and the 10th appearance (ninth start) of his career opposite Colorado...in those outings, Peralta is 5-3 with a 3.10 ERA (49.1IP, 17ER), 67 strikeouts, and a .215 (40-for-186) opp. average...earned the win in his most recent start against the club on May 6 at COL (w/ NYM), pitching 5.0 scoreless frames (W, 5.0IP, 4H, 0ER, 2BB, SO).

- Across five career appearances (four starts) at Coors Field, Peralta boasts a 1.23 ERA (22.0IP, 3ER) with 31 strikeouts, a 1.14 WHIP, and .188 (15-for-80) opp. average...it is the second-lowest ERA in the venue's history (min. 20.0IP) behind **Craig Stammen**'s 1.22 clip (37.0IP, 5ER) in 25 appearances (one start) between 2009-22...under the same parameters, his opp. average is the sixth-lowest clip in stadium history.
- Since the start of 2023, Peralta's 2.43 ERA (33.1IP, 9ER) across six starts opposite Colorado ranks fifth in the majors behind LAD **Blake Snell** (1.19), AZ **Merrill Kelly** (1.66), BOS **Ranger Suarez** (2.27), and PHI **Cristopher Sánchez** (2.38).
- In 17 career appearances (13 starts) against NL West foes, he has fashioned a 5-5 record with a 4.58 ERA (74.2IP, 38ER) and 99 strikeouts...in the 13 starts, he has a 5-5 record with a 4.79 ERA (67.2IP, 36ER) and 91 strikeouts...four of those 13 starts have been quality (last: June 3, 2026 at SEA), and he has registered three straight quality starts against NL West clubs since Sept. 16, 2025.

ON THE ROAD, AGAIN—In nine road starts in 2026, Peralta is 2-5 with a 6.31 ERA (45.2IP, 32ER) and 44 strikeouts...has logged a .289 (55-for-190) opp. average and a 1.58 WHIP in those starts with his team going 3-6.

- Across 108 road appearances (87 starts), he is 32-27 with a 4.26 ERA (478.0IP, 226ER), 573 strikeouts, and a .226 (407-for-1800) opp. average...his teams are 53-55 lifetime in his road appearances.
- As a starter, he's gone 29-27 with a 4.14 ERA (443.0IP, 204ER), 521 strikeouts, and a .223 (370-for-1662) opp. average...his teams are 43-44 in such outings.

FASTBALL FREDDY—Since breaking into the majors in 2018, Peralta has recorded a 50.0 pct. usage rate or higher on his four-seam fastball in each season...since the start of 2021, he paces the majors with 517 strikeouts on four-seamers, 38 more than the next closest pitcher, PHI **Zack Wheeler** (479)...from 2021-24, he joined **NYG Gerrit Cole** as the only major league pitchers with three seasons tallying 100 SO or more on four-seamers (2023-24, 2021).

- Since the start of 2019, opponents have registered an average exit velocity of 90.4 mph against Peralta's four-seam fastball, fourth lowest in the majors during that span (min. 1,000BF), trailing **NYG Max Fried** (87.8), **Wheeler** (89.1), and **WSH Trevor Williams** (90.0)

LEFT FOOT CREEP—Since his debut in 2018, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .210 (417-for-1985) batting average, the third-best mark in the majors during that span (min. 2,000BF) behind **NYG Gerrit Cole** (.190) and **DET Justin Verlander** (.198)...in 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 (43-274) batting average, the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher (min. 300 LHB faced) in the expansion era (since 1961)...in 2025 with the Brewers, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

SUCKER FOR STRIKEOUTS—Peralta is on pace to record 162 strikeouts this season...would be his first season tallying fewer than 200 strikeouts since 2022 (86)...he is one of two active pitchers to strike out 200 batters or more in three straight seasons alongside **Dylan Cease** (2021-2025)...his three straight seasons of 200 strikeouts or more are tied with **Mario Soto** for third most by a Dominican-born pitcher behind **Pedro Martínez** (9) and **Juan Marichal** (6).

- Since the start of 2023, Peralta's 727 strikeouts are the third most in the majors, trailing **TOR Dylan Cease** (827) and PHI **Zack Wheeler** (757).
- Since making his MLB debut in 2018, his 10.58 strikeouts per 9.0 innings rank seventh in the majors (min. 750.0IP) behind ATL **Chris Sale** (12.06), LAD **Blake Snell** (11.72), **NYG Gerrit Cole** (11.42), **Cease** (11.22), **TEX Jacob deGrom** (11.13), and **TOR Max Scherzer** (10.96).
