Opening at Home!

Atlanta is set to open its 2026 campaign tonight at Truist Park, in what is just the third Opening Day home game in the 10-season history of the stadium.

The Braves opened at home in 2018 in the second season here at Truist Park, and began their World Series defense with a home opener in 2022.

Since Truist Park opened in 2017, Atlanta's three home games on Opening Day are fewer than all but four teams in the majors. Los Angeles-AL, Colorado and San Francisco all have just two home-game openers in that span, while the Guardians have done so just once.

For context, the Cincinnati Reds have opened at home a majors-most nine times in the 10 seasons since Truist Park opened.

Opening in Interleague!

For the first time in franchise history, Atlanta will open its season with an interleague game as the Braves host the Kansas City Royals tonight.

The Royals are opening with interleague play for just the second time, after hosting the Mets in 2016 in a World Series rematch from the previous autumn.

Atlanta will play 12 of its first 16 games against American League opponents to open the year, with just one of its first five series of the season against a fellow NL club. The Braves will host the Athletics (AL) to complete its opening homestand, before subsequent series against the D-backs (NL), Angels (AL) and Guardians (AL).

The Braves went 22-26 (.458) in interleague play last season, including wins in each of their final four such games. Since Major League Baseball introduced a balanced schedule for the 2023 season, Atlanta's 79-61 (.564) record in interleague play ranks eighth in all of baseball.

Dating to the introduction of interleague play in 1997, Atlanta's 308-291 (.514) mark in such games ranks 10th.

Opening Roster!

The Braves' 26-man roster consists of 13 pitchers, two catchers, seven infielders and four outfielders. The roster includes eight players who will be wearing a Braves jersey for the first time in their career, including 2025 NL All-Star Robert Suarez and 2025 Gold Glove winner Mauricio Dubón.

Thirteen players return from last year's Opening Day roster, including 2025 All-Stars Matt Olson and Chris Sale, who is set to serve as the club's Opening Day starter for the second consecutive year.

The group includes just two players making their first Opening Day roster. RH Bryce Elder breaks camp with Atlanta for the first time in his career despite leading the club in starts over the last three seasons, while RH Didier Fuentes makes his first such roster after debuting with the Braves last June.

The oldest player is the 36-year-old Sale, while Fuentes was the youngest at 20 years, 281 days old. Per Elias, Fuentes is the youngest Braves player to make the Opening Day roster since Jason Heyward did so in 2010 at 20 years, 239 days.

OPENING DAY: The Braves and Royals begin the 2026 season tonight with the opener of a three-game series...This weekend marks the only scheduled games between the two teams this year.

A Since moving to Atlanta in 1966, the Braves have gone 26-34 (.433) on Opening Day, including an even 12-12 (.500) record when starting at home... The .433 winning percentage on Opening Day over this span is the third-worst mark in the National League...Only Philadelphia (24-37, .393) and Miami (13-20, .394) have a lower winning percentage...The Royals, who the Braves host tonight, have played to a 20-37 (.351) record on Opening Day since 1966, the worst mark in the majors.

A The Braves lost to the Padres, 7-4, one year ago today to snap a two-season winning streak on Opening Day...Atlanta has dropped five of its last seven and seven of its last 10 season-opening games dating to 2016.

A KC's Cole Ragans is set to make the third Opening Day start of his career and the first start of his career versus Atlanta...The 6-foot-4, 190-pound Florida native pitched 3.0 innings of relief versus the Braves in 2023 while with the Rangers, and allowed four hits and four runs...Ragans has started the opener for Kansas City in each of the last two seasons, and is 0-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 ER/11.0 IP)...The Royals have lost both such games.

OPENING DAY SALE: LH Chris Sale will start for Atlanta tonight in the seventh Opening Day turn of his career and second consecutive with the Braves...The 6-foot-6, 180-pound left-hander is 3-1 with a 4.00 ERA (16 ER/36.0 IP) over his first six such starts.

A Sale's seven total Opening Day starts are tied for the second most among all active pitchers, trailing just Justin Verlander's 12...Toronto's Max Scherzer has also made seven...Sale also started the opener with Chicago-AL (2013-14, '16) and Boston (2019-19), and is just the 11th pitcher in history to make multiple Opening Day starts for at least three different teams, per Elias...Randy Johnson (Mariners, 1992-96 & '98; D-backs, 1999-2004, Yankees, 2005-06) and Jon Lieber (Pirates, 1995 & '97; Cubs, 2000-02; Phillies, 2005-06) are the last to do so.

A Sale last year finished his 15th major league season and second with Atlanta with a 7-5 record, a 2.58 ERA (36 ER/125.2 IP) and 165 strikeouts in 20 starts and one relief appearance...His 11.82 strikeouts per nine innings led the National League, while his 2.58 ERA was the third lowest in the NL among hurlers with at least 20 starts.

A The Braves signed Sale to a one-year, \$27 million contract extension this spring that will cover the 2027 season, with a \$30 million club option for 2028...Dating to the 2024 season when he joined Atlanta, his 2.46 ERA is the third lowest in baseball among qualified starters, trailing only reigning Cy Young winners Paul Skenes (1.96) of Pittsburgh and Tarik Skubal (2.30) of Detroit.

GOLDEN GRAPEFRUIT WINNER: Atlanta won the finale of its spring training slate on Tuesday and ended its Grapefruit League campaign with a 21-7-2 record...The .750 winning percentage was the best in both the Grapefruit and Cactus Leagues this year, and stands as the highest spring winning percentage for the club in Atlanta franchise history (since 1966).

A The previous record was an 18-7 (.720) spring mark in 1982...The Braves would go on to open the 1982 regular season 13-0 on their way to an NL West title.

A The 2025 Golden Grapefruit winner, the Toronto Blue Jays (18-10-1), would go on to represent the American League in last year's World Series.

ROOKIES OF THE YEAR: Drake Baldwin was named 2025 NL Rookie of the Year after making his major league debut on Opening Day last season, and is one of three such award winners in Atlanta's Opening Day lineup tonight...Ronald Acuña Jr (2018) will lead off for the Braves, while Michael Harris II (2022) will bat ninth.

A Atlanta is the first club with three of their own Rookie of the Year winners in an Opening Day lineup since the 1997 Los Angeles Dodgers, who had four...The Dodgers had five consecutive Rookie of the Year winners from 1992 through 1996, and Eric Karros ('92), Mike Piazza ('93), Raul Mondesi ('94) and Todd Hollandsworth ('96) all started for the club on Opening Day in 1997.

A Three of the last eight NL Rookies of the Year have been Braves...No other NL club has multiple such winners in that span, while Seattle (Julio Rodriguez, 2022; Kyle Lewis, 2020) has two in the AL.

OZZIE ALBIES: Makes his ninth consecutive Opening Day start at second base for Atlanta tonight, batting third...Albies has started at second for the Braves in every season since 2018.

A With the nod, Albies becomes the first second baseman in franchise history to make nine Opening Day starts at the position...Glenn Hubbard made eight Opening Day starts at second over a nine-season span from 1979-1987.

A Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, just three players have made more Opening Day starts at a single position for the club...Chipper Jones made 13 such starts at third, Andruw Jones made 10 in center and Freddie Freeman had 11 OD starts at first.

BETTER START THIS YEAR...: Atlanta dropped each of the seven games on its season-opening road trip to San Diego (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (0-3) last year... It was the Braves' longest season-opening losing streak since dropping each of their first nine games in 2016.

A The Braves beat the Marlins, 10-0, in their home opener on April 4 last year to win their first game... Atlanta was the last team in baseball last year to win a game.

Today's Game

- Makes his seventh career Opening Day start and second straight with Atlanta.
 - Was the Opening Day starter for Chicago (AL) in 2013-14, '16, Boston in 2018-19 and Atlanta in 2025.
 - His seven Opening Day starts will be tied for the second-most among active pitchers with Toronto's Max Scherzer...Trails only Detroit's Justin Verlander's 12 season openers.
- Went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA in five Grapefruit League starts this spring, striking out 15 over 19.2 innings with just one walk...Allowed one run over 6.0 innings in his final spring outing on March 21 at Boston.
- Posted a 2.46 ERA (83 ER/303.1 IP) with 390 strikeouts in 50 appearances (49 starts) over his first two seasons with Atlanta (2024-25).
 - Signed a one-year, \$27 million contract extension with Atlanta on February 24, 2026, keeping him under club control through 2027 with a team option for 2028.
 - Since joining the Braves in 2024, Sale's 2.46 ERA is the third lowest in the majors among qualified pitchers...Trails only Cy Young Award Winners Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes and Detroit's Tarik Skubal.
- Reached the 2,500-strikeout milestone on May 29, 2025, striking out Philadelphia's Edmundo Sosa in the sixth inning...Became the 38th pitcher in baseball's Modern Era (since 1901) and the 40th in MLB history to reach the mark...Set a new record as the fastest to reach 2,500 strikeouts in terms of innings pitched (2,026.0 IP), breaking Hall-of-Famer Randy Johnson's previous mark of 2,107.2 IP.
- Was named an All-Star for the ninth time in his career and second straight in the National League in 2025.
 - Is 13-10 with a 2.66 ERA (56 ER/189.2 IP) in 36 career appearances (25 starts) against Kansas City...Spent five seasons with Chicago (AL) in the AL Central alongside the Royals (2012-16)...Has struck out 189 batters against 35 walks in those outings.
 - Threw a shutout against Kansas City on June 5, 2019 while with Boston, striking out 12...Pitched his second career immaculate inning in that game.
- Sale's career rate of K/9 (11.13) and K/BB ratio (5.29) are both the highest marks in baseball history among pitchers with at least 2,000.0 innings pitched.
- He's logged 91 games with 10 or more strikeouts throughout his career; eighth-most in MLB history.
 - Has 20 career games with at least 10 strikeouts and zero walks issued...Also the eighth most such games in baseball history dating to 1901.
 - Needs two more such games to tie six-time All-Star Curt Schilling for seventh most on the all-time list.
- His career ERA of 3.01 ranks 11th lowest in baseball history dating to the Live Ball era among pitchers with as many games pitched and as many starts.
- Celebrates his 37th birthday on Monday, March 30.

2025

- Went 7-5 with a 2.58 ERA (36 ER/125.2 IP) and 165 strikeouts in 21 games (20 starts) in his second season with Atlanta.
 - Pitched to a 2.72 ERA with a 51:6 strikeout-to-walk ratio over his final 36.1 innings after returning from the injury.
- Missed 62 games after landing on the 15-day injured list on June 21 with a fractured left rib cage...Posed a 1.75 ERA in six appearances since being activated.
- Recorded his 2,500th career strikeout on May 29 against Philadelphia - the fastest pitcher to reach the milestone in innings pitched (2,026.0 IP), breaking Hall-of-Famer Randy Johnson's previous mark (2,107.2 IP).
- Was named to the NL All-Star team for the second consecutive season.
- Sale went 2-0 with a 1.11 ERA in five starts during the month May...His ERA was the fourth lowest in the majors during that span.
 - Dating to 1913 when earned runs became an official statistic, Sale's career 2.35 ERA in May is the lowest among pitchers with at least 50 starts...Edging out Hall-of-Famer Pedro Martínez's 2.36 ERA in May.
- Sale's last outing before landing on the injured list came on June 18 against New York (NL)...He finished one out short of a shutout, holding the Mets to five hits and one walk over 8.2 scoreless innings with seven strikeouts, earning his fifth win of the year.
 - Threw 116 pitches in his start, the most since also throwing 116 on July 23, 2019 against Tampa Bay with Boston...It was the 36th career outing with as many pitches thrown.
- Made his first relief appearance since May 8, 2012 while with Chicago (AL) in the season finale on September 28 against Pittsburgh, striking out nine over 5.2 innings to earn the win.

Career Recap

- Awards:** NL Cy Young (2024), Rawlings Gold Glove (2024), NL Comeback Player of the Year (2024), AL All-Star (7x, 2012-18), NL All-Star (2024-25), and World Series Champion (2018).
- In his 16th major league season, Sale was selected to seven consecutive AL All-Star teams from 2012-2018, was selected to the NL All-Star team in 2024 & 2025, and has eight career Top 10 finishes in Cy Young voting, winning the award with Atlanta in 2024.
- In his first year with Atlanta and 14th major league season, Sale was named the National League Cy Young Award winner, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award recipient, a National League All-Star, a First-Team All-MLB Nomination and the National League Comeback Player of the Year, going 18-3 with a 2.38 ERA (47 ER/177.2 IP) and 225 strikeouts.
 - Led the National League in wins, strikeouts and ERA...Became the first pitcher in Braves franchise history to win the triple crown and first in the National League since Clayton Kershaw with Los Angeles in 2011.

Aaron Bummer • LHP • 6-3 • 215 • 32 yrs • #49

- Saves/Opp:** 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 0/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0
- Appeared in 42 games in his second season as a Brave, pitching to a 3-2 record and a 3.81 ERA (23 ER/54.1 IP) with 51 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP, his lowest since 2020...Was placed on the injured list on August 24 due to left shoulder inflammation and missed the remainder of the season.
 - Ranked in the 99th percentile in baseball with a barrel rate of just 3.2% in 2025...He allowed just five barrels in 156 batted balls...His seven total barrels and 2.3% barrel rate allowed since joining the Braves in 2024 are both the best in the majors (min. 400 batters faced).
 - Opponents hit ground balls off him 55.8% of the time last season (league average 42.4%)...That rate ranked in the 94th percentile for the season...Since his debut in 2017, Bummer's career ground ball rate of 64.2% is highest in the majors (min. 350 games).
 - Tossed his curveball a career-high 35.1% of the time in 2025, the most of any major league pitcher with at least 900 total pitches last season...Utilized a curveball for the first time in 2024 at a 2.3% clip.

Didier Fuentes • RHP • 6-0 • 170 • 20 yrs • #72

- Saves/Opp:** 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 0/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0
- Currently ranks as the Braves' third best prospect according to *MLB Pipeline*.
 - In four appearances this spring, two starts, Fuentes went 3-0 with a 0.66 ERA (1 ER/13.2 IP), allowing four total baserunners while striking out 18.
 - Made four starts with Atlanta in 2025, his debut season, going 0-3 with a 13.85 ERA and 12 punchouts.
 - Made his major league debut on June 20 against Miami at 20 years and three days old, becoming the youngest starter to make their MLB debut for Atlanta since Mike McQueen, October 2, 1969 (19 years, 33 days-old).
 - Fanned six across 3.2 innings in his Truist Park debut on July 2 vs. Los Angeles-AL...Is the youngest pitcher and second-youngest player (Juan Soto, 19) to play at Truist.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 35 yrs • #26

- Saves/Opp:** 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 0/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0
- In his third full season with Atlanta, appeared in a career-high 70 games and went 29-for-34 in save opportunities...Pitched to a 3.21 ERA (24 ER/67.1 IP)...Ranked fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors in saves.
 - Among active pitchers with as many appearances since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022 (222 apps.), Iglesias owns the best WHIP (0.94) and second-best ERA (2.35, 57 ER/218.2 IP)...Houston's Bryan Abreu is the only pitcher with a better ERA (2.25).
 - Ranks second among Braves pitchers in franchise history (min. 100 G) in WHIP and ERA+ (180), third in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.88), fourth in hits-per-nine-innings (6.5) and fifth in ERA and saves (97).
 - Did not allow a run in 42 of 45 appearances from June 9 until the end of the season...Led major league pitchers in this span (min. 40.0 IP) in hits-per-nine-innings (4.15) and saves (21), tied for the most fWAR among relievers (1.5) and ranked second in ERA (1.25, 6 ER/43.1 IP) and WHIP (0.69).
 - Racked up 13 or more consecutive scoreless appearances three times in 2025, the first Braves pitcher to record three such streaks in a season since Jonny Venters in 2011 (also three).
 - Became the 40th pitcher in history, and fifth active, with 250 saves when he converted on September 16 versus Washington...Is tied with Edwin Diaz for the fourth-most saves (253) among active pitchers.
 - Was named the NL Reliever of the Month for August for the third consecutive season after converting all 10 of his save opportunities and allowing a 0.69 ERA (1 ER/13.0 IP) in the month...Since his debut in 2015, Iglesias' 2.09 ERA (37 ER/159.1 IP) in August is the lowest among major league pitchers with at least 150.0 IP.

Tyler Kinley • RHP • 6-4 • 220 • 35 yrs • #45

- Made 49 appearances with Colorado to the tune of a 5.66 ERA (30 ER/47.2 IP) in 2025 before being acquired by Atlanta on July 30...Pitched to a 5-0 record with a 0.72 ERA (2 ER/25.0 IP), a 0.68 WHIP and 22 strikeouts in 24 outings with Atlanta to conclude the season.
 - Allowed a run in his third appearance with the Braves, August 5, and then allowed one additional tally over his final 21 games...Strung together a career-high scoreless streak of 19.1 innings between runs.
 - From his Braves debut on July 31 until the end of the season, Kinley led major league pitchers (min. 25.0 IP) in ERA and ranked third in WHIP and opponent's batting average (.126).
