TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final road trip of the season with the 2nd of 3 games against the Oakland Athletics (1-0)...following an off day Thursday, the Mariners will also visit the Texas Rangers (3 G, 9/22-24) on the current road trip...the Mariners are coming off a 2-4 homestand against the Los Angeles Angels (2-1) and the Los Angeles Dodgers (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **Mariners.com** with **Rick Rizzo** and **Dave Sims** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night's game against the A's by a 5-0 score...the Mariners are 19-13 over their last 32 games, 27-16 over their last 43, 29-17 over their last 46, 32-18 over their last 50, 35-20 over their last 55 and 44-26 over their last 70 games...the Mariners are 63-24 when scoring at least 4 runs and 19-44 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 41-33 at T-Mobile Park and 41-35 on the road this season...they are 27-26 in day games and 55-42 at night.

- **Winners** - The Mariners have clinched their 3rd-consecutive winning season and 6th in the last 10 years...marks the 3rd time in franchise history Seattle has had 3+ consecutive winning seasons (also: 1995-97 and 2000-03)
- **Leaders** - **Julio Rodríguez** (5.9 fWAR, 3rd among OF), **Cal Raleigh** (4.3 fWAR, T-2nd among C), **J.P. Crawford** (4.3 fWAR, 7th among SS) and **Matt Brash** (2.0 fWAR, 4th among RP) all rank in the top 10 in the Majors at their position in fWAR this season
- **Yard Work** - The Mariners have hit 196 home runs this season, 13th-most in the Majors...Seattle has hit 200+ home runs in a season 7 times: 1996-99, 2016-17 and 2019.

PLAYOFF PICTURE...the Mariners enter play today tied for 2nd place in the AL West, 1.5 games back of division-leaders Houston Astros and tied with the Texas Rangers for the 3rd AL Wild Card...Seattle is 1.0 game back of the Toronto Blue Jays for the 2nd AL Wild Card...the Astros have 11 games remaining (2 vs. BAL, 3 vs. KC, **3 at SEA** and 3 at ARI), Texas has 12 games remaining (2 vs. BOS, **3 vs. SEA**, 3 at LAA and **4 at SEA**) and Toronto has 12 games remaining (3 at NYY, 3 at TB, 3 vs. NYY and 3 vs. TB).

THE J-ROD SHOW IS MUST-SEE TV...since July 1, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .339 (97x286) with 48 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 17 home runs, 57 RBI and 18 stolen bases, getting on base at a .386 clip and slugging .598 (.984 OPS)...since Aug. 4, he is batting .386 (64x166) with 31 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 41 RBI and a 1.168 OPS...overall this season, Julio leads the American League in hits (174), while ranking among the league leaders in total bases (2nd, 103), RBI (3rd, 99), extra-base hits (T-4th, 67), runs (5th, 95), stolen bases (3rd, 36), OPS+ (T-5th, 132) and fWAR (3rd, 5.9).

- **Keeping It 100** - Rodríguez is 1 RBI away from a 100-RBI season...Julio would join Alex Rodriguez-SEA (1998) & Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (2019) to become just the 3rd player age 22-or-younger with a 30/30 season and 100 RBI in the same year...Julio would join Ken Griffey Jr. (2x, 1991-92) and A-Rod (2x, 1996, '98) as the only Mariners with 100+ RBI in age 22-or-younger seasons.
- **Playing the Hits** - J-Rod leads the AL in hits this season with 174, ranking ahead of Marcus Semien-TEX (173 H) and Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (166 H)...if he finishes with the league lead in hits, he will become just the 3rd player in franchise history to lead the AL in hits, joining Alex Rodriguez (1998) and Ichiro Suzuki (7x, 2001, 2004, 2006-10) and just the 9th player age 22-or-younger to lead the AL in hits...he would join Ty Cobb-DET (3x, 1907-09), Dick Wakefield-DET (1943), Harvey Kuenn-DET (1953), Al Kaline-DET (1955), George Brett-KC (1975), Rickey Henderson-OAK (1981), Cal Ripken Jr.-BAL (1983) and Alex Rodriguez-SEA (1998).
- **Milestone Man** - Is the first player in MLB history with 50+ doubles, 50+ home runs and 50+ stolen bases through a player's first 2 MLB seasons...Rodríguez is 2 home runs away from 60+ in each category...Julio also has 11.7 bWAR over his first 2 MLB seasons, T-10th most over a player's first 2 seasons in MLB history, and the 5th-most since 2000.

TEO THE TERRIFIC...**Teoscar Hernández** had his 30-game on-base streak snapped in Sunday's game (8/15-9/16)...the streak was the longest by a Mariners player this season, surpassing **Julio Rodríguez** (27 G, July 1-Aug. 2), the longest on-base streak by a Mariners player since Robinson Canó's 34-game on-base streak from April 30-June 5, 2016, and the 28th streak of at least 30 games in franchise history...Since August 1, Teo is batting .320 (55x172) with 21 runs, 11 doubles, 9 home runs and 30 RBI, getting on base at a .355 clip and slugging .541 (.896 OPS).

STEADY SHORTSTOP...**J.P. Crawford** went 1-for-2 with 1 run, 1 RBI and 3 walks in last night's game...he has set career-highs in home runs (15), RBI (55) and walks (83) and is on pace to set career-highs in on-base percentage (.381), slugging (.425) and OPS (.806) this season...J.P. is batting .321 (18x56) with runners in scoring position and 2 outs this season, and .692 (9x13) with the bases loaded...among qualified MLB shortstops this season, Crawford ranks 7th in fWAR (4.3), 2nd in wRC+ (131), 2nd in OBP and 5th in OPS.

CAL RALEIGH IS QUITE A CATCH...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** has 16 home runs over his last 50 games (7/22-c) batting .258 (47x182) with 30 runs, 8 doubles, 33 RBI and a .896 OPS during that span...he leads Major League catchers with 28 home runs overall this season and leads AL catchers in fWAR (4.3) trailing only William Contreras-MIL (4.7 fWAR) for the MLB lead among catchers...with 2 more homers this season, #29 would become the 29th catcher in MLB history (min. 60% of games at catcher) with a 30+ home run season...Cal is 1 extra-base hit away from breaking a tie with Mike Zunino (50 in 2017) for the franchise record for most extra-base hits in a season by a catcher.

THE 100 RBI CLUB...**Julio Rodríguez** (99 RBI), **Teoscar Hernández** (89 RBI) and **Eugenio Suárez** (89 RBI) all have a chance to reach 100 RBI this season...they could become just the 7th trio of Mariners with 100 RBI in a season and the first since Bret Boone, Mike Cameron and Edgar Martinez in 2001...only 18 different players in franchise history have had 100 RBI in a season, most recently done by Mitch Haniger (100 RBI) and Kyle Seager (101 RBI) in 2021.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Luis Castillo** has had a Cy Young Award caliber season, going 13-7 with a 3.08 ERA (62 ER, 181.1 IP), 199 strikeouts, 47 walks and a 1.042 WHIP, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...that among qualified AL starters, Castillo ranks 3rd in ERA, 4th in wins, 4th in strikeouts, 5th in innings, 1st in opponent average (.211/142x674), 2nd in WHIP and 8th in fWAR (3.3), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that with 1 strikeout in tonight's game, Castillo would become the 8th pitcher in franchise history with a 200+ strikeout season?...he would join Randy Johnson (6x, 1991-95, 1997-98), Félix Hernández (6x 1009-14), Mark Langston (4x, 1984, 1986-88), **Robbie Ray** (2021), James Paxton (2018), Erik Hanson (1990) and Floyd Bannister (1982)...**AND FINALLY**...Castillo has a chance to become the 3rd pitcher in franchise history to strike out 200+ with an ERA under 3.00, joining Hernandez (3x, 2009-10, 2014) and Johnson (2x, 1995 and 1997).

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 30-year-old right-hander is set to make his 31st start of the season, 2nd against the Athletics...he is also making his 179th Major League start and 5th career start against Oakland.
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
- Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati)
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.

LAST TIME OUT...W#13 in last start on 9/13 vs. LAA...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 3 hits and 3 walks with 8 strikeouts.

FAMILIAR FOES...in 9 games started against an AL West opponent this season Castillo owns a 3.23 ERA (20 ER, 55.2 IP) with 11 walks and 61 strikeouts...he has faced each AL West team at least once this season and will make his 2nd start against the Athletics this season tonight...the rest of Castillo's starts this season will also come against division rivals.

OFF TO A GOOD START...his 268 strikeouts through his first 40 Mariners starts are the most in Mariners history through a pitchers first 40 starts...he ranks ahead of Félix Hernández (233).

INNINGS EATER...has made 9 starts this season where he has pitched at least 7.0 innings...his 9 starts of 7.0+ innings pitched are tied for the most in a season in his career...he currently is tied for the 7th most 7.0+ innings pitched games in the majors this season and has the 2nd most on the Mariners...he ranks behind **George Kirby** (10).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...was named to his third All-Star team on July 2 (also: 2019, 2022)...he was joined by teammates **George Kirby** and **Julio Rodríguez**.

MAKING THEM EARN IT...has allowed 62 earned runs through 30 starts this season which is the 4th fewest in the Major Leagues (min. 30 GS)...his 3.08 ERA (62 ER, 181.1 IP) ranks 6th in the Major Leagues among qualified pitchers...he currently ranks behind Kodai Senga-NYM (2.95).

KEEPING THE BASES CLEAN...has allowed 200 runners to reach base safely through 30 starts this season which is the 2nd fewest in the Major Leagues (min. 30 GS) behind **Logan Gilbert** (199)...he also ranks among Major League leaders (min. 100.0 IP) in opponents average (10th, .211/142x674) and WHIP (3rd, 1.042).

SEASON-HIGH PUNCHIES...set a new season-high in strikeouts with 11 against the Twins on July 19...this marked the 3rd time this season and the 18th time in Castillo's career that he has recorded 10+ strikeouts in a game (last: 6/6 vs. LAA)...his career-high in strikeouts in a single game is 13 which he achieved on 8/5/19 vs. LAA.

1,000 AND COUNTING...recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in his outing on 5/22 against Oakland after striking out Shea Langeliers to begin the 5th inning...Castillo finished the night with 8 strikeouts.

DOMINATE THE ZONE...recorded 32 strikeouts in August which is just 7 away from matching his career high for the month...his career-high in strikeouts in a single month is 50 which he achieved in March/April 2019...Castillo has now recorded at least 30 strikeouts in each month this season...this marks the second time in his career where he has recorded 30+ strikeouts in each month he has pitched in a season (also: 2019).

KEEPING THEM IN THE YARD...gave up his first home run of the season on 4/28, breaking a 5-game span of allowing no home runs...this was his longest span of games to start a season without giving up a home run in his career.

NEARLY PERFECT...carried a perfect game into the 7th inning in his start against Colorado on 4/16...earned his second win of the season after pitching 7.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits while striking out 9 batters...the last Mariners pitcher to throw a perfect game was Félix Hernández on 8/15/12.

HOT START...did not allow a run in either of his first 2 starts to begin the season, becoming just the third Mariners pitcher to do that, joining Félix Hernández (2007) and James Paxton (2017).

PREVIOUSLY ON OPENING DAY...became just the 3rd Mariners starter to hold the opponent scoreless in an Opening Day start, joining Félix Hernández (2007, 2013 & 2018) and Randy Johnson (1995)...he is the first player in franchise history to toss 6.0+ scoreless innings while allowing 1-or-fewer hits on Opening Day...his game score of 76 was the highest of any Opening Day starter this season.

FOR OPENERS...made his 3rd career Opening Day start on 4/30 vs. CLE and his first with the Mariners, becoming the 18th different pitcher to start on Opening Day in franchise history.
