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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (65-69) vs. SAN DIEGO PADRES (71-62)
August 26, 2026 - Petco Park - San Diego, CA - 1:10 PDT - Game #135/Road #69
RHP Bubba Chandler (6-8, 4.38 ERA) vs. RHP Randy Vásquez (9-6, 4.19 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have gone 2-3 in the first five games of this season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, August 21-23), San Diego (2-0, Monday-Wednesday) and St. Louis (Friday-Sunday), including a 1-0 win on Tuesday night at Petco Park...Won four of six games on their recent homestand vs. Boston (2-1, August 14-16) and Detroit (2-1, August 17-19)...Have hit 158 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (1167) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (657) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (696) and Chicago-NL (695), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs in 2025 (are looking to be the fourth team in Major League history to finish top three in the league in runs the year after finishing last in the league in runs and the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915).

GATEWAY TO THE WINS: Pittsburgh will have the day off on Thursday in St. Louis before starting a three-game series at Busch Stadium (Friday-Sunday)...The Pirates have won or split each of their last two series in the "Gateway to the West"...They split a four-game series from August 25-28, 2025, while also winning two of three games there earlier this season from May 19-21...Pittsburgh is looking to win or split three straight series in St. Louis for the first time since winning two of three contests from September 4-6, 2015, winning two of three contests from May 6-8, 2016 and winning three of four contests from July 4-7, 2016.

SWEEP DREAMS: The Pirates can pick up their fifth series sweep with a win today at Petco Park...They swept three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, May 1-3 vs. Cincinnati, May 29-31 vs. Minnesota and July 11-12 vs. Milwaukee...This would be Pittsburgh's first road sweep since sweeping a three-game series from July 28-30, 2025 at San Francisco...It would also mark the Pirates' first sweep of the Padres since sweeping a three-game series from June 27-29, 2023 at PNC Park...Pittsburgh has not swept the Padres in San Diego since doing so in a three-game series from April 29-May 1, 2003 at Qualcomm Stadium...The Pirates have secured their first series victory vs. the Padres since winning two of three games from July 24-26, 2023 at Petco Park.

SHUT 'EM DOWN: Pittsburgh earned its eighth shutout and first on the road since May 20 at St. Louis (7-0) with Tuesday's 1-0 win at San Diego...The Pirates' 27 shutouts since the start of last season are the third-most in Major League Baseball, behind only Detroit (31) and Philadelphia (29)...Tuesday's win was only Pittsburgh's fourth 1-0 win against San Diego in 525 all-time meetings...The Pirates also did that on June 7 (G2), 1972 at San Diego Stadium (18 innings), May 14, 1978 at San Diego Stadium and June 7, 1991 at Three Rivers Stadium...It was their third 1-0 win of the year (also May 3 vs. Cincinnati and May 6 at Arizona).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz hit the game-winning home run with his two-out, solo shot (off Mason Miller) in the ninth inning of Tuesday's 1-0 win at San Diego...It was his first career go-ahead home run in the ninth inning or later and the fourth by a Pirate this year, along with Bryan Reynolds (May 29 vs. Minnesota, walkoff) and Brandon Lowe (June 16 at the Athletics/August 19 vs. Detroit, walkoff)...It was the first time the Pirates broke a scoreless tie with a go-ahead home run in the ninth inning or later since Corey Dickerson hit a one-out, solo homer in the ninth inning of a walkoff win on April 26, 2018 vs. Detroit (it was the first time they did that on the road since Neil Walker hit a one-out, solo homer in the 11th inning of a 1-0 win on May 28, 2013 at Detroit).

ONE-RUN FUN: The Pirates have won back-to-back games by one run (Monday-Tuesday at San Diego) for the fifth time and first since July 26 vs. Chicago (NL) and July 27 vs. Arizona...They last did that in three straight games from June 6-8, 2025 vs. Philadelphia...They last did that in three straight away games in 2016 (August 16-17 at San Francisco and August 25 at Milwaukee)...They have not done that in three consecutive team games all on the road since doing it in four straight contests from June 10-14, 1992.

GOING THE EXTRA MILE: Bryan Reynolds posted the 411th extra-base hit of his Major League career with his first-inning double (off Michael King) on Tuesday at San Diego, surpassing National Baseball Hall-of-Famer Lloyd Waner for 16th place in franchise history (since 1887)...National Baseball Hall-of-Famer Fred Clarke ranks 15th on the list with 427 extra-base hits...Reynolds, who has played in 143 straight team games (since last year on September 19 vs. the A's), is four hits shy of 1100 for his Major League career.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Chandler had a no-decision after allowing four runs and striking out six batters over 4.0 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 5-4, 10-inning loss on August 21 at Los Angeles (NL)...His first-inning home run allowed to Max Muncy was his first home run allowed since the third inning on July 5 at Washington (Luis García Jr.), snapping a 32.2-inning homerless streak...He has gone 3-0 with a 3.28 ERA (35.2ip/13er) and 35 strikeouts in his last seven starts, dating back to his start on July 11 (G2) vs. Milwaukee.

AGAINST THE PADRES: Chandler lost a 5-0 decision after allowing three runs across 4.1 innings in his only career start against San Diego, which was on April 6 at PNC Park.

THREE’S COMPANY: Chandler won each of his first three starts this month (August 3 at Milwaukee, August 8 vs. New York-NL and August 14 vs. Boston) before having a no-decision in his last start on August 21 at Los Angeles (NL)...The only Pirates pitcher to win four straight starts this year was Braxton Ashcraft (June 17-July 4)...Chandler’s streak was the longest by a Pirates rookie starter since Nick Kingham (July 8-21, 2018).

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Chandler’s 114 strikeouts this season are the fifth-most among Major League rookies, trailing only New York (NL)’s Nolan McLean (168), Cleveland’s Parker Messick (156), Boston’s Payton Tolle (141) and Cleveland’s Foster Griffin (135).

RIGHT ON: Chandler has limited right-handed hitters to a .219 batting average against (47-for-215) and a .600 OPS this season...The only righthanders to take him deep were Chicago (NL)’s Dansby Swanson (April 12) and San Francisco’s Heliot Ramos (May 10).

WHAT A RELIEF: Chandler allowed just one hit and struck out seven batters over 5.1 innings out of the bullpen on June 7 at Atlanta...He became only the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 5.0 innings, strike out at least seven batters and allow one or zero hits in an appearance...Chandler joined Bill Swift, who did that over his 7.1 innings out of the bullpen on July 28 (G2), 1935 vs. St. Louis.

GIMME FIVE: Chandler struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.0 innings on May 22 at Toronto...He joined Erik Bedard (May 3, 2012 at St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings...Chandler also became one of 11 Major Leaguers (since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero earned runs in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings (he was only the fourth rookie to accomplish that).

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee’s Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona’s Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit’s Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.
