**THE PIRATES...** finished the season with a 76-86 record and fifth place finish in the N.L. Central...Won 15 games in their last at bat (their most since having 16 last at bat wins in 2021)...Played in 51 one-run games, which were the most for the team since also playing in 51 in 2018...Recorded 12 shutouts, which were tied for the sixth-most in the National League...Used a total of 56 players (tied for the 10th-most in MLB) and had a total of seven players make their MLB debuts.

**TEAM LEADERS:** **Bryan Reynolds** led the team in batting (.275), home runs (24), RBI (88) and runs scored (73)...**Oneil Cruz** paced the team in doubles (34) and stolen bases (22) while **Andrew McCutchen** produced the most walks (58)...**Paul Skenes** led the pitching staff in ERA (1.96) and strikeouts (170)...**Mitch Keller** led the staff in innings pitched (178.0) while Skenes and Keller shared the team lead in wins (11)...**David Bednar** led the team in saves (23).

**AWARD WINNERS:** The Pittsburgh chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America named **Andrew McCutchen** as the winner of the Chuck Tanner Award (most cooperative with the media)...**Paul Skenes** was named the winner of the Steve Blass Award as the club's best pitcher while **Bryan Reynolds** was tabbed as the Roberto Clemente Award winner as the team MVP.

**SUCCESSION OF SOUTHPAWS:** The Pirates faced five straight opposing left-handed starters to begin the season for the first time in club history...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, there has been only one other instance since divisional play began in 1969 of a team facing five-or-more left-handed starters to begin a season (the 1983 Mariners faced seven straight opposing southpaws to begin the season).

**TAKING OFFENSE:** The Pirates scored six-plus runs in each of their first five games, which marked the first time the team has accomplished that since at least 1900...Prior to this year, Pittsburgh's longest such streak was in its first four games of the 2003 season...Entering this season, the last Major League team to do this was the Houston Astros in 2021 (also first five games)...The last team to score six-plus run in their first six games of a season was the 1998 Cleveland Indians...The record for most games with six-plus runs to start a season since 1900 was the 1962 St. Louis Cardinals, who did so in their first seven games of the season.

**BACK-TO-BACK IN EXTRAS:** **Bryan Reynolds** and **Ke'Bryan Hayes** hit back-to-back home runs in the 10th inning on April 27 at San Francisco...It marked the fourth time in franchise history the Pirates hit back-to-back home runs in extra innings and the first time since May 24, 2017 at Atlanta (**David Freese** and **Jose Osuna**).

**HISTORIC BATTERY:** **Yasmani Grandal** caught **Aroldis Chapman** in the eighth inning of Pittsburgh's win on May 5...It marked the first time the Pirates have ever had a battery combo of Cuban-born players.

**LONG BALL STORY:** The Pirates homered five times in their 10-9 win over the Cubs on May 11...That marked just the second time in franchise history the Pirates scored 10+ runs in a game with all the scoring coming via home run (two 3-run homers, one 2-run, and two solo)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the only other instance of this happening came on August 16, 1947 vs. St. Louis (7 homers).

**MAKING BO DEREK PROUD:** The Pirates went 15-0 in their first 15 games when recording 10 or more hits...That is a club record for the longest such streak to start a season, surpassing the 1939 club that started 14-0 when recording 10-plus hits to start the season.

**RBI STREAK:** **Nick Gonzales** recorded a career-high four RBI on May 24, which was the third straight game for a Pirate to knock in four runs (also **Bryan Reynolds** and **Joey Bart**)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked just the third time since 1920 that the Buccos had a player record four-plus RBI in three consecutive days...It also happened in five straight days from September 12-16, 1978 (**Dave Parker, Bill Robinson, Phil Garner, Phil Garner, Dave Parker**) and August 2-4, 1928 (**Glenn Wright, Glenn Wright** and **George Grantham** and **Glenn Wright**).

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Pirates tied a club record with seven home runs hit against the Mets at PNC Park on July 5 (fifth time)...It also marked the first time the team hit multiple grand slams in a seven-homer performance, and the first time it hit two grand slams in a game since April 16, 1996.

**ROWDY & B-REY:** **Rowdy Tellez** and **Bryan Reynolds** each had two home runs, including a grand slam, on July 5...They are the first pair of teammates in MLB history to hit multiple home runs and a grand slam each in the same game.

**SLAMMERS:** The Pirates tied a club record with seven grand slams hit during the season (also 1978 and 1996)...**Joey Bart** and **Bryan Reynolds** hit two apiece and the others were hit by **Rowdy Tellez, Jack Suwinski** and **Edward Olivares**...With Reynolds and Bart hitting two apiece, this marks the first time since 2000 that the Bucs had multiple players with multiple grand slams in a single season (**John VanderWal** and **Aramis Ramirez**).

**FULL HOUSE:** The Pirates sold out all three games of their weekend series against the Phillies from July 19-21...The last time the club sold out three consecutive games was from August 20-22, 2015, doing so in each of the first three games of a four-game series against the Giants...The last time the Pirates sold out each game of a three-game series came against the Dodgers from August 7-9, 2015...A total of 116,935 fans attended the series against the Phillies in July, falling 1,389 shy of the PNC Park attendance record for a three-game series - 118,324 against Boston from June 24-26, 2011.

**PIRATING:** The Pirates stole 106 bases in 125 attempts for a success rate of 84.8 (second-best rate in MLB behind the Dodgers' 85.5)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, that marks the highest stolen base pct. for the team (since CS officially began being recorded in 1951)...The previous high was 76.2 (160-for-210) in 1997.

**MR. JONES AND ME:** **Paul Skenes** (170) and **Jared Jones** (132) became the second set of Pittsburgh rookie teammates to strike out 100 or batters in the same season...The only other time the Bucs had two rookies reach 100 strikeouts in a season came in 1993 when **Steve Cooke** (132) and **Paul Wagner** (114) accomplished the feat.

**DYNAMIC DUO:** The Pirates became just the ninth National League team since 1900 to have two rookie pitchers (**Paul Skenes** and **Jared Jones**) each record at least 125 strikeouts in the same season...According to StatsPerform, the Pirates became the first team in MLB history to have two rookies average at least a strikeout per inning in the same season (minimum 20 starts each).

**56 BUCS:** A total of 56 players appeared in at least one game for the Pirates this season, compared to 58 in 2023 and a club-record 68 in 2022...Among all Major League teams in 2024, the Marlins used the most different players (70) while the Cardinals trotted out the fewest (44).

**THROUGH THE GATES:** The Pirates had a season attendance of 1,720,361 in 2024 at PNC Park, which was an increase of 89,737 from a year ago.

**THE STREAK:** **Bryan Reynolds'** 25-game hitting streak was tied for the fifth-longest in team history since 1900 according to the Elias Sports Bureau...The only Pirates with longer hitting streaks, which includes spanned seasons, are **Charlie Grimm** (30 games in 1922-23), **Danny O'Connell** (26 games in 1953), **Kenny Lofton** (26 games in 2003) and **Dick Groat** (26 games in 1961-62)...**Freddie Lindstrom** hit safely in 25 games in 1933 while **Clyde Barnhart** had a 25-game streak in 1925...It was also a club record for the longest by a Pirates switch hitter and was the longest in MLB this season.

**CRUZ CONTROL:** **Oneil Cruz** became the first Pirates player since Starling Marte in 2019 to hit at least 20 home runs and steal at least 20 bases in the same season...Cruz became the 10th different player in Pirates history to achieve a 20-20 season (18th instance overall).

**CUBAN MISSILES:** **Aroldis Chapman** finished with the most strikeouts (98) among relief pitchers in the National League...Chapman's 98 punchouts were the most ever in a single season by a Pirates left-handed reliever...He also finished tied for the MLB lead in saves for the month of September with nine.

**CUTCH:** **Andrew McCutchen** hit 20 home runs for the 10th time in his career...McCutchen's eight seasons of 20-plus home runs are the second-most in team history behind Willie Stargell (15)...McCutchen finished the 2024 season ranked fourth in team history in home runs (235), sixth in RBI (818), fifth in extra base hits (609), 10th in hits (1667), ninth in games played (1578) and 11th in runs scored (935).

**David Bednar • RHP • 30 yrs old • #51 • Service Time (4.076)**

- Was Pittsburgh's nominee for the Roberto Clemente Award for the third consecutive year.
- Missed most of spring training due to tightness in his right latissimus dorsi.
- Made the Opening Day roster for the fourth straight year...Made season debut in a non-save situation on 3/30 at Miami and retired all three batters he faced.
- Suffered a blown save, but also picked up the win in his second outing on 3/31 at Miami; surrendered a solo home run to pinch-hitting Nick Gordon with one out in the ninth inning.
- Picked up his first save on 4/4 at Washington.
- Gave up four runs in 0.1ip and suffered his third straight blown save and first loss on 4/9 vs. Detroit; also hit two batters in a game for the first time in his career.
- Recorded saves in back-to-back games on 4/22-23 vs. Milwaukee.
- Appeared in his 200th career game on 4/26 at San Francisco and surrendered a three-run walkoff homer in a 3-0 loss.
- Gave up a two-run homer, but picked up his fifth save on 4/27 at San Francisco.
- Appeared in his 100th career game at PNC Park and picked up his second win on 5/4 vs. Colorado; became the 15th player with 100 career games pitched at PNC Park.
- Picked up his seventh save on 5/11 vs. Chicago (NL), moving him ahead of Matt Capps and into eighth place on the Pirates all-time saves list with 68.
- Pitched in his third straight game while earning his eighth save on 5/13 at Milwaukee.
- Suffered his third loss in a 1-0 setback on 5/18 at Chicago (NL).
- Moved into sole possession of seventh place on the club's all-time saves list (71) while earning his 10th save on 5/19 at Chicago (NL).

**Paul Skenes • RHP • 22 yrs old • #30 • Service Time (0.142)**

- Was selected to his first All-Star team; the first Pirates rookie pitcher to ever be named to an All-Star Game, and the first Pirates rookie to get the nod since Tony Womack in 1997 (fourth Bucco rookie overall).
- Became the first-ever No. 1 overall pick to make the All-Star Game the season after his draft year.
- Was named Baseball America's Rookie-of-the-Year; the second Pirates player to win the honor (also Andrew McCutchen in 2009).
- Was named the unanimous winner of the Steve Blass Award (team's top pitcher) by the local chapter of the BBWAA.
- Ranked first among all qualified N.L. rookies in ERA, batting average against and WHIP; tied for second in wins and ranked second in strikeouts and winning percentage (.786).
- Was a non-roster invitee during spring training, where he went 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (3.0ip/3h/1r/1er/0bb/3so) in two games (one start).
- Started the MLB Spring Breakout game on 3/14 and pitched a scoreless inning (2 Ks).
- Began regular season with Indianapolis, where he went 0-0 with a 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/17h/4r/3er/8bb/45so) in seven starts.
- Made his first start on 3/30 at Louisville and pitched 3.0 perfect innings with five strikeouts (46 pitches).
- Struck out six batters and gave up one hit in 3.0ip while making his second start on 4/5 vs. Memphis (44 pitches).
- Whiffed eight batters in 3.1 scoreless innings on 4/12 at Toledo (55 pitches/36 strikes).
- Made his fourth start on 4/18 vs. St. Paul and had eight strikeouts in 3.1 scoreless innings of work (65 pitches).
- Had his streak of 13.2 scoreless innings snapped in his fifth start on 4/24 at Omaha, after allowing two runs (one earned) in 4.1ip (71 pitches).
- Tossed 6.0 scoreless frames and struck out seven batters in a no-decision vs. Buffalo on 4/30 (75 pitches/53 strikes).
- Pitched on four day's rest for the first time as a pro when he made his start on 5/5 vs. Buffalo; surrendered his first home run and two

- runs total in 4.1ip while throwing 66 pitches (no-decision).
- Posted a 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/4r/3er), 45 strikeouts and a .179 batting average against (22-for-123) in his seven starts with Indianapolis.
- Was selected to the Major League roster on 5/11.
- At the time of his promotion, he had the seventh-lowest ERA (0.99) among all full-season minor leaguers and ranked first in the International League in ERA and WHIP (0.91), third in strikeouts (45) and third in batting average against (.175).
- Made his Major League debut on 5/11 vs. Chicago (NL) and was charged with three runs in 4.0+ innings of work while striking out seven (he left the game with a 6-1 lead after allowing the first two runners to reach base in the 5th).
- Threw 17 pitches 100 mph or faster in the game on 5/11, including a 101.9 mph pitch that was the fastest recorded by a Pirates pitcher in the pitch tracking era (since 2008)...Those 17 pitches were also the most registered by a starting pitcher in a game in 2024.
- His seven strikeouts in his debut were the second-most by a Pirates starter 21 years old or younger in their Major League debut, behind only Nick Maddox, who struck out 11 in his MLB debut at age 20.
- Made his Major League debut just 307 days after being selected No. 1 overall in the 2023 draft, making him the quickest top pick to reach the Majors in 35 years (RHP Ben McDonald of the Orioles made it to the Majors in 1989 in the same year he was drafted).
- The last Pittsburgh player to make his MLB debut within a year of being drafted was Barry Bonds (Bonds was drafted in 1985 and made his big league debut in 1986).
- Made his second start on 5/17 at Chicago (NL) and struck out 11 batters without allowing a hit in 6.0ip to earn his first Major League win.
- Became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to strike out 11 batters in a game at Wrigley Field in Pittsburgh's 1,017th game there.
- Became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to strike out the first seven batters of a game, two shy of the Major League record of nine set by Miami's Pablo Lopez on July 11, 2021...Previous to that, German Marquez (Sept. 26, 2018), Jacob deGrom (Sept. 15, 2014) and Jim DeShaies (Sept. 23, 1986) had each recorded a game of eight consecutive strikeouts to open a game.
- Became just the fourth Pirates pitcher to strike out at least 10 in a game before his 22nd birthday; joining Bob Moose (four times), Nick Maddox and John Candelaria, who was the most recent pitcher to do so in 1975.
- Became the fourth rookie pitcher all-time to record an outing of 6.0+ IP, 0 hits allowed and 10+ strikeouts and the first since Chris Heston's no-hitter on June 9, 2015 vs. New York (NL)...Houston's Don Wilson (June 18, 1967 vs. Atlanta) and Texas' Jim Bibby (July 30, 1973 at Oakland) were both 9.0-inning no-hitters as well.
- Gave up one run in 6.0ip and left with 5-1 lead, but had a no-decision on 5/23 vs. San Francisco (Giants scored five runs in the 8th).
- Gave up two runs and whiffed nine batters in 6.0ip while winning his second game on 5/29 at Detroit (game 2).
- Produced two games with 9+ strikeouts and 3 or fewer hits within his first four Major League appearances, joining Bobby Witt in 1986 and Freddy Peralta in 2018 as the only pitchers since 1900 to accomplish this feat.
- His nine strikeouts on 5/29 also came on his 22nd birthday; the Pirates franchise record for most strikeouts by a pitcher on their birthday (previous high was eight by Vic Lombardi on September 20, 1949).
- Improved to 3-0 with a victory over the Dodgers at PNC Park on 6/5 (5.0ip/3er - 93 pitches).
- Became the fourth pitcher in Pirates history to win at least three of his first five career starts and have 30 or more strikeouts; the others are Nick Maddox (1907), Cy Blanton (1934) and John Candelaria (1975).
- Struck out eight batters while pitching 6.1 scoreless innings (103 pitches) in a no-decision on 6/11 at St. Louis.
- Became the second MLB pitcher since 1901 to have 45-plus strikeouts and six or less walks over his first six career appearances, joining Masahiro Tanaka with the Yankees in 2014.
- Also became the first Pirates pitcher since Jose DeLeon (July 23 to August 15, 1983) to start his career with three wins in his first six starts and record 45 or more strikeouts.
- Improved to 4-0 with a victory over the Reds at PNC Park on 6/17 (6.0ip/1er - 96 pitches).
- Gave up one run and struck out eight in 7.0ip, but had a no-decision on 6/23 vs. Tampa Bay.
- With 61 strikeouts and eight walks through his first eight appearances, became the only National League pitcher since 1901 to record 60+ strikeouts and fewer than 10 walks through his first eight career appearances; the only other Major League pitcher to accomplish this feat was Masahiro Tanaka of the Yankees in 2014 (66 strikeouts, seven walks).
- Gave up one run and struck out nine batters in 6.0ip, but had a no-decision on 6/29 at Atlanta.
- Became the first pitcher in Major League history to strike out 70 batters and allow fewer than 12 runs in his first nine games.
- Gave up two runs in 7.0ip and won his fifth decision on 7/5 vs. New York (NL).
- Recorded seven or more strikeouts in nine of his first 10 career outings, setting the Major League record for most such games within a player's first 10 career games.
- Threw 7.0 no-hit innings and struck out 11 batters while winning his sixth decision on 7/11 at Milwaukee; was removed after throwing 99 pitches.
- Joins Nolan Ryan in 1973 as the only pitchers in MLB history to have two starts in the same season with at least 11 strikeouts over 6.0-or-more no-hit innings.
- Is one of only four pitchers since 1893 with 10 strikeouts and zero hits allowed in multiple outings in a single season (also Nolan Ryan in 1973, Max Scherzer in 2015 and Justin Verlander in 2022).
- Entered the All-Star break with a 6-0 record, a 1.90 ERA (66.1ip/14er), 0.92 WHIP, 89 strikeouts and 13 walks in 11 starts; the strikeout total is the fifth-most in MLB history (since 1901) through 11 starts.
- Started the All-Star Game on 7/16 at Texas; threw 16 pitches while retiring three of the four batters he faced.
- Became one of five rookie pitchers to start the All-Star Game, joining Hideo Nomo (1995), Fernando Valenzuela (1981), Mark Fidrych (1976) and Dave Stenhouse (1962).
- His 11 starts prior to the break match Mark Fidrych in 1976 for the fewest in a career entering an All-Star start (Fidrych also made two relief appearances).
- Suffered his first loss on 7/23 vs. St. Louis after giving up two runs in 8.1ip and dropping a 2-1 decision; the longest start by a Pittsburgh rookie since Zach Duke went 8.1 innings on August 1, 2005.
- Won each of his first six decisions - the first Bucco starting pitcher to do so since Zach Duke in 2005 (Emil Yde has the "record" of seven straight in 1924).
- Also set Pirates mark for most starts (11) before suffering first career loss (since mound was moved to current distance in 1893).
- Pitched 9.0 consecutive hitless innings over two starts on 7/11 (7.0ip) and 7/23 (2.0ip).
- Struck out seven or more batters in nine consecutive starts from 5/29 thru 7/23 - a franchise record...The nine-game streak matches the MLB record for a rookie, done by both Dwight Gooden with the Mets in 1984 and Brandon Beachy with the Braves in 2011.
- Gave up two runs (one earned) in 6.0ip on 7/29 at Houston (no-decision).
- Struck out his 100th career batter in his 13th start on 7/29; just the sixth player all-time since 1893 to reach 100 strikeouts in 13 or fewer games and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in 2014.
- Left the game on 8/4 vs. Arizona with a 4-1 lead and a runner on base in the sixth inning, but had a no-decision (5.1ip/2er - 100 pitches).
- Posted a 1.99 ERA after 14 starts, making him one of five players in Pirates franchise history to have a sub-2.00 ERA through 14 starts with the team.
- Walked a career-high four batters and gave up two runs in 6.0ip while winning his seventh game and snapping Pittsburgh's 10-game losing streak on 8/16 vs. Seattle.
- Struck out nine batters over 6.0 scoreless innings while winning his eighth game on 8/22 vs. Cincinnati.
- Gave up three runs (two earned) in 5.0ip and left with 10-3 lead, but had a no-decision on 8/28 vs. Chicago (NL).
- Tied Cy Blanton's franchise record from 1935 for most strikeouts by a rookie in a season since 1900 (142) while winning his ninth decision on 9/3 at Chicago (NL)...Also matched career high with four walks.
- Won his 10th game while striking out nine batters and allowing one run in 6.0ip on 9/9 vs. Miami - also set the club rookie record for most K's in a season.
- Became the fifth pitcher in MLB history to have 150 or more strikeouts within his first 20 starts, joining Kerry Wood (17 starts), Hideo Nomo (17), Dwight Gooden (19) and Mark Prior (20).
- Gave up one run and struck out seven batters in 6.0ip, but suffered his third loss on 9/16 at St. Louis.
- Became the first pitcher in MLB history to have a sub-2.20 ERA and 150-plus strikeouts in their first 21 games.
- Went 0-2 in three starts against the Cardinals despite posting a 1.31 ERA (20.2ip/3er); the St. Louis starting pitchers combined to hold the Pirates scoreless in their 19.0ip while the Pirates scored a total of three runs overall in the three games.
- Gave up two hits and struck out nine batters in 5.0 scoreless innings while winning his 11th game on 9/22 at Cincinnati.
- Became the first pitcher in the Modern Era with 150 strikeouts and an ERA under 2.00 in his first 22 career games.
- Since the earned run became an official stat in 1913, the only pitcher to record a lower ERA than that over their first 22 appearances

that were all starts was Steve Rogers in 1973-74 (1.95).

- Made his final start on 9/28 at New York (AL) and retired all six batters he faced.
