METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets won 3-1 yesterday...New York is 3-2 on its final first-half trip to Baltimore (1-2) and Kansas City (2-0)...New York is 7-3 in its last 10 games...The Mets are 22-27 on the road this year...The .449 winning percentage is the 11th-worst in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE: The Mets are 16-16 in Interleague play this season as opposed to 39-25 against the NL.

SWEEPS: New York is looking to complete its first-ever three-game sweep of the Royals...The Mets swept a two-game series from KC in 2016 at Citi Field...The Mets are seeking their seventh swept this season.

FIRST-HALF DUBS: New York collected its 55th win prior to the All-Star break yesterday...That is the third-most wins in franchise history in the first-half behind 59 wins in 1986 and 58 victories in 2022.

PITCHING IN: If Sean Manaea appears today, he will become the 37th different pitcher the Mets have used this season which is the most pitchers that any team in the majors has used this year...It will be tied for the second-most in franchise history with 2023 and 2024...The Mets used 42 pitchers in 2021.

FOUR STARS: Major League Baseball named LHP David Peterson to the NL All-Star team...He is the fourth member of the Mets named to the team, joining Pete Alonso, Edwin Diaz and Francisco Lindor...The last time the Mets had four All-Stars was in 2022 when Alonso, Diaz, Jeff McNeil and Starling Marte were on the squad.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On Sunday, Major League Baseball announced that first baseman Pete Alonso and RHP Edwin Diaz will join starting shortstop Francisco Lindor on the National League All-Star team...The 95th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 15 in Atlanta...Alonso was named to the All-Star team for the fifth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history – two more than Keith Hernandez...Alonso becomes the sixth player in franchise history to be named to five or more All-Star teams, joining Tom Seaver (nine), David Wright (seven), Mike Piazza (seven), Darryl Strawberry (seven) and Carlos Beltrán (five)...Diaz was named to an All-Star team for the third time in his career and second as a member of the Mets (also in 2022)...He was an American League All-Star in 2018 with Seattle...Lindor was announced as the National League starting shortstop on July 2...Lindor will make his first trip to the Midsummer Classic as a member of the Mets and his fifth overall after making four straight American League All-Star teams with Cleveland from 2016-19.

GRAND GROUP: Four players in franchise history have played in 1,000 or more games, hit 100 or more homers and walked 500 or more times...Darryl Strawberry, Howard Johnson, David Wright and Brandon Nimmo.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo's 18 home runs are his most prior to the All-Star Break in any season...Over the last 43 games, Nimmo is batting .309 (51-165) with 27 runs, eight doubles, 10 homers, 26 RBI, 13 walks, nine stolen bases and a .915 OPS.

23 AND YOU: Juan Soto's 23 homers are tied for the most in his career prior to the All-Star break...He had 23 first-half homers last year.

COULD IT BE THREE: Soto has homered in consecutive games...His career-high is a homer in three straight games, done four previous times, last, September 1-3, 2023.

WALK THIS WAY: Juan Soto has drawn 77 walks, the most in team history prior to the All-Star Game...John Olerud is second with 74 walks in 1999...Soto had 83 free passes in 2023 with San Diego, the most prior to the break for him...The last players other than Soto with more walks in the first half was Mike Trout with 84 and Bryce Harper with 78 free passes in 2018.

ONLY JUAN: Since May 30, Juan Soto is tied for first in the majors with 36 runs scored, first with a .468 OPS and second with a 1.164 OPS, third with a .696 slugging percentage and fourth with 15 homers during that span.

JUAN-DERFUL: Overall, Soto leads the majors with 77 walks, is third in the majors with a .400 OBP, fourth with 70 runs scored, tied for seventh with a .915 OPS and tied for ninth with 23 homers.

21 FOR THE POLAR BEAR: Pete Alonso hit a game-tying two-run homer in the eighth-inning Tuesday...It was his 21st of the year...He has three homers in his last seven games...Alonso has six seasons of 20 or more homers, tying Mike Piazza and David Wright for the second-most such seasons in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is first with eight seasons with 20 or more homes.

KEEPIN' IT 200: Francisco Lindor collected his 200th career stolen base yesterday...He is one of nine active players with 200 or more stolen bases...He joins Roberto Alomar and Carlos Beltrán as the only Puerto Rico-born players with 200 homers and 200 stolen bases.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to *Elias*, Francisco Lindor has hit 258 home runs and stolen 198 bases as a *shortstop*...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

PEAK PETE PERFORMANCE: Alonso is second in the majors with 26 doubles, tied for eighth in the NL with 21 homers, sixth with a .906 OPS, ninth with a .372 OBP and for ninth with a .533 slugging percentage.

2.0 INNING EDWIN: Edwin Diaz collected his third career 2.0-inning save yesterday...His others are August 4, 2022 vs. Atlanta and Sept.ember 22, 2024 vs. Philadelphia.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Diaz has recorded 19 saves in 20 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Diaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for third in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors with 19 saves...He has not allowed a run in 25 of his last 26 games dating back to April 26 with 38 strikeouts covering 27.0 innings.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty is hitting .288 (15-52) with four doubles, one homer, six RBI, a .356 OPS and a .779 OPS in his last 18 games dating to June 23.

DON'T STEAL THIS ALBUM: Among catchers with 250 or more innings behind the plate this year, Torrens ranks second in the majors with 40.0 percent caught stealing (18 SB, 12 CS, 427.2 IP)...Only Salvador Perez is better (50.0 percent caught stealing, 9 SB, 9 CS, 428.0 IP).

FUTURE IS TODAY: RHP Jonah Tong tossed a 1-2-3 inning in yesterday's Futures Game in Atlanta...He had one strikeout...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Carson Benge went 0-1...The Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State.

REEDING RAINBOW: Reed Garrett has not allowed an earned run in 13 Interleague appearances this season (13.0 IP) and in each of his last 17 games against American League teams (17.0 IP, dating back to 8/30/24)...His 17 such games are the second-longest such streak by a Mets pitcher vs. Interleague opponents, trailing only Armando Benitez's 23 game stretch from 7/18/99-6/10/02.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed a season-high five runs over 5.0 innings in the Mets' 7-6 over Baltimore on July 8...Allowed seven hits, issued one walk and struck out five batters...Marked the first time Holmes did not issue multiple walks in a start since June 7 at Colorado (0 BB).

THE GAME OF RISP: This season, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .162 (11-68) average with runners in scoring position, the seventh-best mark in the majors (min. 65 batters faced w/RISP)...Out of the 11 hits Holmes has allowed this season with runners in scoring position, only two have gone for extra bases...He is one of 12 pitchers in the majors to allow two or fewer extra-base hits with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.3% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 65.9% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.5% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

VS. KANSAS CITY: In 10 career regular season games against the Royals, Holmes is 2-2 with a 6.10 ERA (7 ER/10.1 IP)...In last year's ALDS with the Yankees, Holmes appeared in all four games against the Royals and did not allow a run over 5.0 innings...Holmes earned the win in Game 1 of the ALDS at Yankee Stadium after he did not allow a run over 1.2 innings.

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last 11 starts, Holmes has allowed 11 home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In 161 career road outings, Holmes has pitched to a 4.23 ERA (98 ER/208.2 IP)...In 105 road games since 2022, Holmes has posted a 2.94 ERA (46 ER/140.2 IP), a 3.94 earned run average improvement from his first 56 career road games...Since 2022, Holmes ranks 20th in the majors in road ERA (min. 100.0 IP).

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established career highs in both innings (98.1) and strikeouts (81)...He has also earned a career-high-tying eight wins...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 9-6 with a 3.89 ERA (49 ER/113.1 IP) in 22 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances

of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazerowski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazerowski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
