**RHP Carlos Carrasco (3-3, 5.35) vs. LHP Brennan Bernardino (1-0, 2.48)**

**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets earned a win in the resumption of Friday night's game, before falling to the Red Sox in the nightcap yesterday...The Mets have won four of their last six games...New York is 4-8 in rubber games this year...The team is seeking their 13th series victory of the season...The Mets continue a five-game, six-day road trip (1-1) to Boston (1-1) and The Bronx (two games).

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** INF/OF Ronny Mauricio smashed a walk-off, two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning to give Syracuse an 8-7 win over the Buffalo Bisons...Over the last 11 games, he is 13-48 with six runs, one double, five home runs, three RBI with a .904 OPS... In 85 games at Triple-A this season, Mauricio is batting .295/.340/.511 with 51 runs, 25 doubles, two triples, 16 home runs, 56 RBI, 15 steals and an .852 OPS...He is first among Triple-A hitters in total bases (182), second with 105 hits, fourth in doubles (25) and tied for fourth with 43 extra-base hits...He is ranked as the second-best prospect in the organization according to MLB.com.

**ON THE UP:** Over his last three games, Pete Alonso is 5-12 with three runs, two doubles, one triple and an RBI...Over the last six games, Brett Baty is 6-24 with five runs, one doubles, two home runs and five RBI.

**MILESTONES:** Pete Alonso is one double away from 100 for his career.

**DR. ROBERTSON:** David Robertson converted his 14th save of the year in game one yesterday...He is 4-2 with a 2.08 ERA (10 ER/431. IP) with 13 walks and 48 strikeouts in 39 games this year...He is holding lefties to a .190 (15-79) average this year...His 14 saves rank ninth in the National League...His 171 career saves are the eighth-most among active players.

**SHIPPING UP TO BOSTON:** The Mets face the Red Sox for the first time since 2021, when they played a pair of home and away games from April 27-28 at Citi Field and September 21-22 at Fenway Park... The Mets have dropped six straight to the Red Sox and eight of the last 10...Overall, New York is 8-11 at Fenway Park (during the regular season. The Mets went 2-1 at Fenway during the 1986 World Series)... Omar Narvaez has hit .346 (9-26) with three runs, one double, three home run and three RBI in nine career games at the yard...Pete Alonso has homered thrice in six career games in Boston.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets hit the road for the first time in the second-half...New York is 23-30 on the road this season...The team's 53 road games are tied for the most in the National League and are tied for second in the majors.

**GOOD TIMES ROLL:** Brandon Nimmo has hit 15 home runs in 96 games this season...Nimmo's career-high is 17 home runs, which he accomplished in 140 games in 2018...The left-handed hitter smacked 16 home runs in 151 games last season.

**DOING THE SPLITS:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .287 (60-245) with 28 runs, eight doubles, three triples, six home runs, 28 RBI, 29 walks, a .377 OBP, .440 SLG and an .817 OPS on the road...This compares to a .226/.332/.451 slashline with 18 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .250 (52-208) with 36 runs, 14 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 42 RBI, 20 walks, a .323 OBP, a .510 SLG and an .833 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .195/.301/.371 with 14 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

**IF YOU START ME UP:** The Mets are 29-6 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

**REX SOX-METS NOTES:** The Mets snapped a six-game losing streak to the Red Sox...New York is looking for their first series victory over Boston since they swept a two-game series from July 27-28, 2020 at Fenway Park.

**JULY! JULY! JULY!** The Mets are 10-6 through 16 games in this month...The team's .625 winning percentage is tied for eighth in the majors and is fourth in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.52 ERA, the second-lowest ERA in National League in July...Only the Mariners (3.21 ERA) and Brewers (3.51) have a lower mark in July... The Mets have hit 23 homers this July, tied for the sixth-most in the Senior Circuit.

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The Mets are in a stretch of eight consecutive games against American League opponents...They are 3-2 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 13-12 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 248-239 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

**INTERLEAGUE PETE:** Pete Alonso has hit 37 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 37 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

**ALL-AMERICAN:** Jeff McNeil has batted .316 (108-342) with 45 runs, 16 doubles, seven home runs, 43 RBI, 23 walks with a .367 OBP and a .424 SLG in 92 career games against the American League...McNeil's .316 average ranks fifth among active players in Interleague games.

**SECOND HALF SQUAD:** The Mets are 274-240 in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .533 winning percentage during that span is the fifth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.628), St. Louis (.598), Chicago (.577) and Milwaukee (.535).

**BROOKS WAS HERE:** Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.77 ERA (2 ER/23.1 IP) over 28 games...In seven games this month, Raley has yet to allow a run, allowing only three hits and striking out seven in 6.0 innings...Raley has 19 holds, tied for the second-most in the NL and tied for the fifth-most in the majors.

**STEAL MY SUNSHINE:** New York has been successful in all 16 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 77 steals in 84 attempts...Their 77 steals are tied for 10th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL...The team's 91.7 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 51 of their last 52 stolen base attempts.

**YOU CAN CALL ME AL:** Francisco Alvarez is tied for the lead all major league catchers in home runs and is tied for second among all rookies in homers...He is tied for second in home runs in the majors this month with seven...Only San Diego's Manny Machado has hit more with 10 dingers.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 4.2 innings against the Chicago White Sox at Citi Field on July 18...Allowed four earned runs on six hits and two walks while striking out five batters in an 11-10 Mets victory.

**KNOCKING THEIR SOX OFF:** Carrasco will face Boston for the first time this season...Carrasco will be making his ninth appearance and seventh start against the Red Sox in his career...In his last start against Boston on August 22, 2018 at Fenway Park while with Cleveland, he suffered the loss after throwing 3.2 innings, during which he allowed six runs, five earned, on eight hits and a walk while fanning six batters...His one career win against the Red Sox came on June 4, 2014, after throwing 2.0 hitless innings in relief in extra innings, striking out four batters...Throughout his career against Boston, Carrasco has pitched to a 7.47 ERA (26 ER/31.1 IP) and holds a 1-3 record...Carrasco holds an 0-2 record with an 8.15 ERA (16 ER/17.2 IP) on the road compared to a 1-1 record and a 6.59 ERA (10 ER/13.2 IP) when at home.

**MILESTONES & MEMORIES:** Carrasco will make his 250th career start today, becoming the 22nd active pitcher and seventh Venezuelan pitcher to reach that milestone...With 4.0 innings on June 30, Carrasco became the 21st active pitcher to reach the 1500.0 inning milestone...Is also on the precipice of 300 career games with 296...Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

**COOKIE CRISP:** In his start against the Giants on June 30, Carrasco tallied a season-high 18 whiffs and six whiffs on four-seam fastballs...According to Baseball Savant, Carrasco also currently stands in the 81st percentile in curve spin.

**COOKIE'S COMEBACK:** In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.

**WINNER, WINNER:** Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of eight Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,500.0 career innings pitched on July 6 vs. Arizona...Carrasco is currently ranked seventh among Venezuelan-born pitchers with 1513.2 career innings pitched.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: JUSTIN VERLANDER (4-5, 3.47)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win after throwing a season-high-tying 8.0 innings against the White Sox at Citi Field on July 19...Allowed one earned run on three hits and one walk while fanning seven batters in a 5-1 Mets victory.

**INCREDIBLE IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** In 62 career Interleague starts, Verlander is 40-12 with a 2.65 ERA (120 ER/407.1 IP)...In Interleague play history, Verlander has the most wins, the second-most strikeouts (446) trailing only Max Scherzer (469) and the fourth-lowest ERA among qualifiers.
