METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Angels, 3-2, yesterday...The Mets are 12-3-1 in home series this season...New York improved to 20-13 in one-run games...The Mets have won three straight games after losing three straight...The Mets are in their first homestand after the All-Star break, a six-game homestand (3-2) against the Cincinnati Reds (1-2) and Los Angeles Angels (2-0)...New York is off on Thursday before their final west coast swing of the season, a six-game trip against the Giants (three games) and Padres (three games).

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are seeking their seventh sweep of the season today...New York has never swept the Angels...The Mets are on a three-game winning streak...The team has posted a 2.67 ERA (8 ER/27.0 IP) in that span.

SAFE AT HOME: The Mets lead the majors with an 89.0% stolen base rate...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the NL and second-fewest in the majors (Detroit, 10)...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 13 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 11 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

INTERLEAGUE: The Mets are 18-17 in Interleague play this season as opposed to 40-26 against the NL.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have posted a 36-16 record at home...Their .692 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors...Their home record is tied with the 1986 for the best through the club's first 52 home games of a season in franchise history...Their 36 wins are tied for the most in The Show...New York has posted a 3.19 ERA at home this year, which is the fourth-best in MLB and third in the NL.

OUCH: Mets batters have been hit by 58 pitches this season, which is tied with the Twins and the Mariners for the most in the majors...Nimmo has been plunked 85 times in his career which is the second-most in franchise history.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 20 saves this season, tying his season total from 2024...He is one of 11 pitchers in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Díaz owns a 14.0 scoreless streak dating back to June 6...He has allowed just one earned run over his last 29 appearances, posting a 4-0 record with 14 saves and a 0.30 ERA since April 23...His ERA over those 29 games is tied for the best 29-game span of his career (also: 0.30 ERA over 29 games in 2022)...He is one of three Mets relievers to ever record as low of an ERA in a 29-game single-season.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Pete Alonso has appeared in a franchise-record streak of 355 consecutive games played...It's the second-longest active streak in the majors.

ANGELS-METS NOTES: The Mets earned their first series win against the Angels since June 10-12, 2022 and their first at Citi Field since May 19-21, 2017.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in 16 straight games...He is batting .305 (18-59) with 12 runs, three doubles, three homers, 13 RBI, seven walks, four steals, and a .900 OPS over that span...In 44 games since the start of June, Nimmo has hit .293/.364/.503 with 25 runs, eight doubles, nine homers, 27 RBI, 15 walks, 10 steals and an .867 OPS.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has hit 11 home runs this season, which ties a career-high...In 47 home games he is hitting .290 (38-131) with 22 runs, four doubles, one triple, 25 RBI, 10 home runs...In 17 games this month, Baty is batting .279 (12-43) with nine runs, two doubles, three homers, six RBI, six walks, and an .895 OPS.

JUAN OF A KIND: Since May 30, Juan Soto has hit .297/.444/.639 (46-155) with 38 runs, five doubles, 16 home runs, 34 RBI, 40 walks and six stolen bases...In that span, he is first in MLB in walks and OBP, tied for second in runs and OPS (1.083), tied for fourth in home runs, tied for seventh in total bases (99) among qualified hitters.

WALK THIS WAY: Soto has recorded 82 walks in 101 games this season...That is the most in the majors...He is seeking to become the second player in franchise history to record 100 or more walks in a single-season...John Olerud recorded 125 walks in 162 games during the 1999 season.

DON'T STEAL THIS ALBUM: Among catchers with 250 or more innings behind the plate this year, Luis Torrens ranks second in the majors with 41.9 percent caught stealing (18 SB, 13 CS, 435.2 IP)...Only Salvador Perez is better (50.0 percent caught stealing, 9 SB, 9 CS, 428.0 IP).

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to *Elias*, Francisco Lindor has hit 258 home runs and stolen 198 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one hit and one earned run over 4.0 innings in his first start of the season and his Citi Field season debut...Has only allowed one run in both of his appearances this season...He has struck out 13 batters over his first 7.1 innings this season...He has a 15.95 K/9 over those two appearances.

VS. ANGELS: Over 13 starts and 14 appearances against the Angels he has a 3-4 record and a 4.11 ERA (33 ER/72.1 IP)...Each of his last four appearances (three starts) against the Angels have been 4.0+ innings and he has allowed one earned run in each of those contest.

HERE COMES THE HEAT: So far this season Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 70.1% of the time and he has picked up eight of his 13 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 35.6% whiff rate compared to his 25.7% whiff rate on his four-seamer last season.

IN THE CITI: In 19 career appearances (17 starts) at Citi Field he has posted a 3.39 ERA (38 ER/103.2 IP) and has a 7-2 record...Last season he went 6-2 with a 3.30 ERA (33 ER/90.0 IP) at home and his last loss at Citi Field came on June 1 against Arizona...Over his last nine home starts last season he went 6-0 and recorded a 2.73 ERA (19 ER/62.2 IP)...The Mets were 11-4 in games he started at Citi Field last season.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

RIGHTY DOMINATION: Last Season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250. It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

SINK OR SWIM: Last season, Manaea threw his sinker 44.7% of the time, the highest usage rate of any of his six pitches in his arsenal...The southpaw had a run value of 15 with his sinker, which was the fifth-best mark in the majors... He also had 71 strikeouts via the sinker, which was the highest mark in the majors.

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 77-63 record, a 4.00 ERA (529 ER/1191.2 IP), and 1122 strikeouts in 230 games and 199 starts...His 1122 career strikeouts are the 15th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Entered in the seventh inning on July 21 against the Angels with two runners and stranded both of them (0.2 IP, K)...Has stranded 23 of 26 inherited runners this season...His inherited runners scored percentage (11.5%) is the fourth-best mark in the majors and the best in the NL among qualified relievers.
- Earned his 11th hold of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 20 vs. Cincinnati (1.0 IP, H, K)...24 of his 38 relief appearances this season have been scoreless.
- In 13 games against Interleague opponents this season he has posted a 1.45 ERA (3 ER/18.2 IP) and held opponents to a .164 (10-61) batting average.
- Earned his second save of the season and his career on July 8 at Baltimore (1.0 IP, K)...Five of his last seven appearances have been scoreless.
- Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 4 vs. New York-AL (BB, 3 K)...Was his fifth appearance this season recording at least three strikeouts and his first since June 3 at Los Angeles-NL.

- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...He allowed 14 earned runs over 13 appearances in the month of June (9.95 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA).
- This season, has gone 5-2 with two saves, 11 holds and a 3.86 ERA (21 ER/49.0 IP) through 41 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .211 average (35-166)...Right-handed hitters have batted .186 (18-97) against him compared to a .246 average against left-handers (17-69)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .136 average (11-81)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth-best in franchise history through as many games.
- 12 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...11 of those appearances have been scoreless, which is tied for the 10th-most among Major League relievers...Has posted 10 scoreless relief appearances of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the fourth-most such outings among Major League relievers...His seven scoreless outings of 2.0+ innings are tied for the seventh-most and he is of 13 relievers to post such numbers.

- Was placed on the 15-day injured list on July 4 (retro. July 1) with an illness and was activated prior to today's game...Threw 3.0 scoreless innings over three rehab assignments with Triple-A Syracuse and FCL Mets.
