TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 2 (0-1) of a best-of-3-game Wild Card series vs the **National League West Division Champion Dodgers**...this playoff series marks the Reds' first appearance in the Postseason since the 2020 Wild Card Series vs **Atl** (0-2), and their first Postseason berth in a full season since the 2013 Wild Card Game at **Pit**, a 6-2 loss.

**ROSTER:** The Reds finalized their Wild Card Series roster by deactivating **RHP Brady Singer** and **RHP Zach Maxwell**...the full WC roster is on page 4.

**POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE:** 10 Reds on the active roster entered this Wild Card Series with Postseason experience, including **Gavin Lux** (30g), **Emilio Pagan** (11g), **Jose Trevino** (11g), **Nick Martinez** (7g), **Austin Hays** (5g), **Zack Littell** (5g), **Miguel Andujar** (4g), **Santiago Espinal** (2g), **Brent Suter** (2g), and **Will Benson** (1g).

GAME 1 SUMMARY (10-5 DODGERS WIN):

- Reds pitchers allowed 5 home runs in a Postseason game for the first time in club history.
- Marked just the second time in club history that Cin allowed at least 10 runs in a Postseason game (also: Game 5 of the 1961 World Series, 13-5 loss vs **NYN** on 10/9/61).
- RHP Hunter Greene's** 3.0 innings pitched marked the shortest start for a Cin pitcher since **RHP Johnny Cueto** threw 8 pitches in 0.1 innings in Game 1 of the 2012 NLDS at **SF** on 10/6/12.
- Cin plated 5 runs in a Postseason game for the first time since the 9-0 win in Game 2 of the 2012 NLDS on 10/7/12 at **SF**.
- 2b Matt McLain** and **1b-LF Spencer Steer** had 2 hits apiece to become the first pair of Reds teammates to each have multiple hits in the same Postseason game since the 13-inning, 1-0 loss in Game 1 of the 2020 Wild Card Series on 9/30/20 at **Atl** (**Joey Votto** 2h, **Nick Castellanos** 3h, **Aristides Aquino** 2h, **Nick Senzel** 2h).
- Cin drew 5 walks in a Postseason game for the first time since the 10-1 win at **LAD** in Game 3 of the 1995 NLDS on 10/6/95 (5bb).
- The Redlegs were held to just 2 extra-base hits or fewer in a Postseason game for the first time since the 5-0 loss in Game 2 of the 2020 Wild Card Series on 10/1/20 at **Atl** (0 XBH).
- Reds batters struck out 12 times in a Postseason game for the first time since Game 2 of the 2020 Wild Card Series at **Atl**.

**TAKE A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE:** For the first time in franchise history, the Reds clinched a playoff berth on the final day of the regular season (*Elias*).

- The Reds and **Mets** entered Sun's regular season finale vying for the National League's final Wild Card spot...both teams finished the year with identical 83-79 records but Cin earned the trip to the **Postseason** by virtue of winning 4 of 6 vs **NYM** during the regular season.
- Following the 5-4 loss to the **Mets** on 9/5, the Reds trailed **NYM** and **SD** by 6.0 games for the final WC position with 21 games remaining.
- Since then, the Reds went 13-8 while the **Mets** finished 7-14.
- The Redlegs climbed to within a half-game of that last spot on 8/22 before losing 10 of 13 to fall 6.0 games off the pace...they entered the 9/23 game vs **Pit** tied with **NYM**, marking the first time after the All-Star break that they held a Postseason position.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both **SF** and **AZ** during a 3-11 run.
- The Reds and **Mets** finished the 1999 season with matching 96-66 records and tied for that year's final WC spot...the **Mets** defeated the Reds, 5-0 at **Cinergy Field** in a 1-game playoff on 10/4 (game 163) to eliminate Cin from contention...had today's tiebreaker rules applied that year, the Reds would've earned the Postseason berth.

**OUR PAL SAL:** **INF Sal Stewart** made his Postseason debut in Game 1 of the NL Wild Card Series at **LAD**...at 21 years, 297 days, became the youngest Reds position player in club history to appear in a Postseason game (*Elias*).

- Became the youngest Red to play in a PS game in any capacity since **RHP Manny Sarmiento** (20y/253d) in Gm 4 of the 1976 NLCS vs **Phi**.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds and **Dodgers** are meeting in the Postseason for the second time...the Redlegs swept **LAD** in 3 games in the **1995 National League Division Series**.

- LAD** won 2 of 3 at **Great American Ball Park** this year from 7/28-7/30.
- The **Dodgers'** 3-game sweep of Cin from 8/25-8/27, 2025 ended the Reds' streak of not having been swept in 43 straight series dating back to September 2024.
- The **Dodgers** are 457-417 vs Cin in the regular season since they moved to **Los Angeles** in 1958.
- Cin and **LAD** combined for 14 National League West titles during the 25 seasons in which both clubs competed in the division (1969-1993).

**DOWN 0-1:** Only 2 teams have lost Game 1 of a best-of-3 Postseason series and went on to win the series (2020 **SD** over **StL** & 2020 **Oak** over **CWS**).

- The Reds are 4-8 all-time in Postseason series after losing the first game of the series (*Elias*).

**TERRY’S TEAM:** Terry Francona is managing in his 12th Postseason.

- Is 44-35 (.557) in the Postseason with **Bos** (2004, 2007-09), **Cle** (2013, 2016-18, 2020, 2022), and **Cin** (2025).
- Won the World Series twice with **Bos** (2004 & 2007) and managed in the Fall Classic again with **Cle** in 2016.
- His 44 Postseason wins match Hall of Famer **Jim Leyland** for seventh-most in Major League history.
- Is now the 12th different manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason.
- Is the fifth manager in club history to manage the Reds to the Postseason in his first year at the helm, joining **Lou Piniella** (1990), **John McNamara** (1979), **Sparky Anderson** (1970), and **Patrick Moran** (1919)...also reached the Postseason in his first year as manager with **Bos** (2004) and **Cle** (2013)...is only the third skipper in Major League history to accomplish this feat with 3 different franchises, joining **Joe Torre** (1982 w/ **Atl**, 1996 w/ **NY Yankees**, 2008 w/ **LAD**) and **Dusty Baker** (2003 w/ **Chc**, 2016 w/ **Wsh**, 2020 w/ **Hou**)...courtesy *Elias*.
- Earlier this season, became the 13th manager in Major League history to reach 2,000 career wins.

**EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS:** The Reds entered the 2025 season as a long shot to clinch a Postseason berth.

- ESPN's** preseason preview projected the Reds to finish 76-86 with a 14.6% chance of making the playoffs.
- FanGraphs** forecasted a 78-83 record with a 20.2% Postseason chance.
- PECOTA** simulated a 74-88 record with a 4.6% playoff chance.

**TROUBLE OUT WEST:** Since joining the National League's West Division in 1969 and through the 2025 season, the Reds have posted a 486-546 (.471) regular season record in **California**...this includes games at **Dodgers**, **Giants**, **Padres**, **Angels**, and **A's**.

- Cin went 3-2 in series and 6-9 in games played this season in **CA (LAA, SF, LAD, SD, Ath)**...entered this year having lost each of their previous 4 series and 9 of their previous 13 games in the **Golden State**.
- 2025 marks the Reds' 16th losing season in **California** since 2000, having posting winning records in the **31st state** in 2023, 2018, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2001...finished with a tying record in 2014 and 2004.
- The Reds suffered just 2 series sweeps this season, both in **California** (at **LAD** 8/25-8/27 & 9/12-9/14 at **Ath**).
- The Reds are 8-2 all-time in Postseason play in **California**.

**NO SWEEP TILL BROOKLYN:** The Reds were swept in the 3-game series at **Dodger Stadium** from 8/25-8/27...it was the first time Cin was swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at **Cle** (2g), a span of 43 straight series without getting broomed.

- The 43-series sweepless streak ranks as the fourth-longest in franchise history (*Elias*).
- The Reds entered that **Dodgers** series having not been swept in any of their previous 42 series played in 2025...it was the longest in-season run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without being swept.
- On 8 occasions during the streak, avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a series (4/23 at **Mia**, 5/15 vs **CWS**, 6/22 at **StL**, 7/2 at **Bos**, 7/23 at **Wsh**, 7/30 vs **LAD**, 8/17 vs **Mil**, 8/24 at **AZ**).
- Cin had been the only ML team not to have been swept to that point.
- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series this season at **Great American Ball Park**.
- Went an entire season without being swept at home for the sixth time in franchise history (not counting the 2020 COVID-19 season).
- Only the Reds teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being swept (*Elias*).

**HOUSEKEEPING:** The Reds went 45-35 (.563) in 80 games this season at **Great American Ball Park**...it was their fourth-best record in stadium history (beginning in 2003), behind only the 2012 (50-31, .617), 2013 (49-31, .613) and 2010 (49-32, .605) clubs.

- The Reds played 1 "home" game at **Bristol Motor Speedway** on 8/3 (completed on 8/4; 4-2 loss vs **Atl**).
- In 80 home dates this year, the Reds attracted 2,079,931 fans to **GABP**...marked the first time Cin drew over 2M fans in 3 straight seasons since doing so in 6 consecutive seasons from 2010-2015.
- Reds pitchers posted a 3.88 ERA this season at **GABP**, the fifth-lowest staff ERA in the ballpark's 23 seasons and the lowest since 2020 (3.84).
- The Reds spent 15 hours, 37 minutes in weather delays this season at **GABP** and 19 hours, 49 minutes total.

**LATE & CLOSE:** In Late and Close situations from 3/27-6/2, the Reds went 20-26 (.435) and slashed .169/.252/.241 with 3 HR...since then went 46-37 (.554) in Late and Close situations and slashed .255/.339/.406 with 18 HR (*Late and Close refers to game situations in the 7th inning or later with the batting team tied, ahead by 1, or with the tying run on base, at bat or on deck*).

- 7/31: Acquired from the **Athletics** INF/OF **Miguel Andujar** (ahn-DOO-har) in exchange for **RHP Kenya Huggins**.
- 7/30: Acquired from the **Pirates** 3B **Ke'Bryan Hayes** (key-Bryan, #3) in exchange for **LHP Taylor Rogers**, **SS Sammy Stafura**, and cash considerations.
- 7/30: Acquired from the **Rays** **RHP Zack Littell** (lih-TELL, #52) in exchange for **LHP Adam Serwinowski** and **RHP Brian Van Belle**.

**NATIONAL LEAGUE ALL-STARS:** SS **Elly De La Cruz** and LHP **Andrew Abbott** both appeared in MLB's All-Star Game on 7/15 at **Atl's Truist Park**.

- Abbott** on 7/8 was named to the NL All-Star team as a replacement for **LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto**...it marked his first career All-Star selection and he became the first Cin LHP selected as an All-Star since **Aroldis Chapman** in 2015.
- Abbott** pitched a perfect 6th inning in the National League's 7-6 win (**Jazz Chisholm Jr** lineout, **Riley Greene** flyout, **Randy Arozarena** ground out; 13 total pitches).
- De La Cruz** was selected as an All-Star for the second consecutive season, becoming the first Reds player to earn back-to-back honors since **Joey Votto** in 2017 & 2018.
- Was the sixth Reds shortstop to make consecutive All-Star Games, the first since **Barry Larkin** (1988-91, '93-'97, '99-2000).
- De La Cruz** joined **Johnny Bench** (4, 1968-71), **Frank Robinson** (3, 1956-59), and **Vada Pinson** (2, 1959-60) as the only players in Reds history with multiple All-Star selections before turning 24.
- De La Cruz** entered the game as a defensive replacement for **NYM's SS Francisco Lindor**...he went 0-for-2 with a strikeout.

**PRONUNCIATION:** Last name is pronounced "lih-TELL".

**POSTSEASON:** Will make his sixth career Postseason appearance, his first career Postseason start.

- LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in the 3-1 win on 9/26 at Mil (4.2ip, 3h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 3k, 0hr, 85TP).
- Allowed 5 of his 20 batters to reach.
  - Issued 2 walks in a game for the first time since 8/22 (3bb).
  - Finished the regular season with 496 career strikeouts.

- SEPTEMBER 20 vs CHC:** Earned the 6-3 win on 9/20 vs Chc (5.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 4k, 2hr, 73TP).
- Extended his single-season career high with his 10th win.
  - Retired 13 of his final 15 batters...the 2 that reached came via HR (Michael Busch in the 3rd inning & Reese McGuire in the 5th inning).
  - Allowed 4 of his 19 total batters to reach.
  - Reds were leading 3-2 when he exited after the 5th.

- SEPTEMBER 15 at STL:** Did not factor in the decision in the 11-7 win on 9/15 at StL (5.2ip, 5h, 4r/4er, 0bb, 3k, 0hr, 86TP).
- Was his seventh consecutive outing without a decision.
  - Was the fifth time over his last 7 apps that he allowed 3 or more runs.
  - Was his 13th start without issuing a walk.
  - Retired 12 straight from the 2nd inning to the 6th...set down the first 2 batters he faced in the 6th but allowed each of his next 4 to reach (3r), which proved his ouster.

- SEPTEMBER 9 at SD:** Did not factor in the decision in the 4-2 loss on 9/9 at SD (6.0ip, 2h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 4k, 0hr, 94TP ).
- Marked the third time in his career that he pitched as many as 6.0 innings in a game while allowing 2 hits or fewer (9/19/04 vs Bos & 9/13/24 at Cle).
  - Allowed just 4 of his 22 batters to reach.
  - Retired 11 in-a-row from the 1st inning through the 4th...retired each of his last 5 batters.
  - Hit a batter for the first time since 6/22.
  - Was his 17th quality start of the season, his fourth in 7 starts for the Reds.
  - Threw first-pitch strikes to 15 of his 22 batters.

- SEPTEMBER 3 vs TOR:** Did not factor in the decision in the 13-9 loss on 9/3 vs Tor (4.1, 7h, 5r/5er, 1bb, 6k, 4hr, 88TP).
- Didn't hold a 5-run lead...all 5 of his runs came via HR.
  - His 4 HR allowed matched a season high for the third time (6/11 at Bos & 4/10 vs LAA).

- AUGUST 29 vs STL:** Did not factor in the decision in the 7-5, 10-inning loss on 8/29 vs StL (7.0ip, 6h, 4r/3er, 0bb, 4k, 2hr, 97TP).
- Was his 12th start in which he didn't issue a walk and his ninth in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings without a BB.
  - Was his 30th career quality start (16th this season, 3rd for the Reds).
  - Allowed 4 runs (3er) on 6 hits and 2 home runs over the first 3 innings...retired each of the final 14 batters he faced.

- AUGUST 22 at AZ:** Did not factor in the decision in the 6-5, 11-inning loss on 8/22 at AZ (3.0ip, 4h, 4r/3er, 3bb, 3k, 1hr, 77TP).
- Was his shortest start since a 2.0-inning effort for TB at Atl on 6/14/24.
  - Marked the third time this season he walked 3 or more batters (last: 7/30 at NYY).

- AUGUST 16 vs MIL:** Did not factor in the decision in the 6-5, 11-inning loss on 8/16 vs Mil (6.0ip, 4h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 3k, 87TP).
- Was his 15th quality start of the season, his second with the Reds...was his 29th career quality start.
  - Was the 18th time this season in which he walked 1 or none.

- AUGUST 10 at PIT:** Did not factor in the decision in the 14-8 win on 8/10 at Pit (4.2ip, 9h, 4r/4er, 0bb, 3k, 83TP).
- Was his shortest start since 4/10 vs LAA (4.0ip).
  - Was his 11th start in which he didn't issue a walk.
  - With 1 out in the 5th, allowed an RBI-groundout to the last batter he faced, Jack Suwinski...was replaced by Scott Barlow who struck out Jared Triolo to end the inning and strand a runner at third.
  - Threw first-pitch strikes to 16 of his 24 batters.
  - Was his second straight homeless app...allowed just 1 HR in first 3 apps with the Reds.
