Brewers are 95-53 (.642) since 2022 during Interleague Play, trailing only the Dodgers (91-48, .655)..... the team has gone 21-15 (.583) during Interleague Play this season, including 9-1 in the last 10 games with 6 consecutive wins.

That's a Fact, Jack!

Jackson Chourio enters the day on a 14-game hitting streak, tying a career high (3/29-4/12).....Chourio is batting .364 (20-for-55) with 3 HR and 12 RBI and a .390 OBP/.582 SLG/.972 OPS during this streak

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is game 4 (3-0) of a 6-game road trip to Los Angeles-NL (3-0) and Seattle (3g) coming out of the All-Star break....following this trip and an off day on Thursday, the team returns to American Family Field for a 6-game homestand against Miami (3g) and Chicago-NL (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE STANDINGS (125 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 11*, SECOND: 57, THIRD: 43, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently tied with the Cubs for first place (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).

AT HOME: The team is 33-17 at home, going 12-4-0 in series play.....are 21-8 in the last 29 home games, including 10-1 in the last 11 with a season-high 6 straight wins.

ON THE ROAD: The team is 26-23 on the road, going 7-7-2 in series play.....are 16-5 in the last 21 road games with 4 straight wins....have had a pair of season-high 5-game road winning streaks (5/25-6/2 and 6/19-7/2).

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn ...Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23. replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

COACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), EDACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).....first base coach Julio Borbón, lead hitting coach Allerand and hitting coach First Theirs are all in their first seasons on the staff. LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 15 replay challenges this season, going 9-6.....their last challenge (won) came on 7/7 vs. Los Angeles-NL as an out call at third base involving Isaac Collins was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees [6]....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseaso eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons [2017-24].....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 725 wins since 2017 [4th in MLB/2nd in National League].

WOODRUFF AT A GLANCE: Brandon Woodruff, 32, will be making his third start of the season.....Woodruff last started on 7/12 vs. Washington and had no decision in a 6-5 win (4.1ip, 5h, 2r, 2er, 0bb, 10k, 2hr, 81 pitches).....he produced the 20th double-digit strikeout game of his career.....he made his season debut on 7/6 at Miami and earned a 3-1 win (6ip, 2h, 1r, 1er, 0bb, 8k, 1hr, 70 pitches).....Woodruff missed the entire 2024 season as he recovered from right shoulder surgery.....he is 16-3 with a 2.36 ERA over his last 34 starts dating back to May 2022 (202ip, 140h, 56r, 53er, 47bb, 245k).....he was selected by Milwaukee in the 11th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Mississippi State University.....he is signed through the 2025 season with a mutual option for 2026.

SORRY I'M LATE: Woodruff's return to a Major League mound was delayed twice while on rehab assignment.....the team returned Woodruff from rehab assignment at Triple-A Nashville on May 12 due to right ankle tendinitis and again on June 5 due to a right elbow contusion suffered in a start on 6/3 vs. Gwinnett (struck by line drive).

SIMPLY THE BEST: Woodruff is the all-time franchise leader with a 3.09 ERA (min. 500ip).....his 806 strikeouts rank seventh in franchise history.....Corbin Burnes ranks sixth (870).....4 47-26, his .644 career winning percentage ranks second in franchise history (min. 50 decisions), trailing only Brent Suter (36-19, .655).

CAREER: Has gone 47-26 with a 3.09 ERA in 132 games/117 starts (690.2ip, 237er).....is in his ninth Major League season, all with the Brewers (2017-25).....was a 2019 and 2021 All-Star.....underwent surgery on 10/13/23 to repair the anterior capsule in his right shoulder, performed by Dr. Keith Meister.....missed the entire 2024 season.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 26-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 66 games/59 starts (353.2ip, 111er).....is 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA in 1 start this season (4.1ip, 2er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 21-17 with a 3.36 ERA in 66 games/58 starts (337ip, 126er).....is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA in 1 start this season (6ip, 1er).

CAREER vs. MARINERS: Woodruff has never faced the Seattle, Washington, Mariners.
