STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their eight-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (0-4) and Blue Jays (1-0, three to play) tonight in Toronto...marks their first time playing back-to-back four-game series since Aug. 18-25, 2022 at Tropicana Field (vs. KC: 3-1; vs. LAA: 4-0) and first time doing so on the road since July 12-18, 2019 (at BAL: 3-1; at NYY: 1-3)...snapped a season-high five-game losing streak last night, which was their longest since April 2-8, 2025 (also 5G — excl. multi-season streaks)...entering the skid, went 13-4 in their previous 17 games (June 24–July 11), second best in the majors over that span to the Red Sox (13-3)...marked their first road win since July 3 at HOU, snapping a season-long six-game losing streak away from home...overall, lead the AL with a 57-42 record, fourth best in the majors...are currently 1-4 on stretches of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17–Aug. 5)...have spent 65 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 23 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.)...have held a 1.5-game lead in the division for the last two days, their smallest since June 28 (1.0)...marks the latest into a season they have led the AL East since winning the division in 2021.

- ✦ The Rays homered three times and did not allow an extra-base hit for the sixth time this season (last: July 8 vs. NYY) in last night's 7-1, series-opening win...the six-run margin matched their third-largest victory this season (4x, last: 10-4 on June 30 at KC), trailing only home wins over the Royals (13-2 on June 25) and Orioles (16-6 on May 18).
- ✦ They permitted one or zero runs for the 22nd time, tied for third most in the AL behind the Red Sox (26G) and White Sox (23G) and their most such efforts within their first 100 games since 2021 (23G).
- ✦ It marked the Rays fifth straight win in **Nick Martinez's** outings, matching the club's longest streak of team wins in a pitcher's starts this season (also: **Shane McClellan**, 5GS from April 25–May 18)...Martinez turned in the Rays first quality start since July 8 vs. NYY (McClanahan), snapping a season-high-tying eight-start drought without one (also: April 14-21)...he tied Cy Young frontrunners **MIL Jacob Misiorowski** and **NY Yankees** **Cam Schlichter** for the major league lead with his 18th start yielding three runs or fewer.
- ✦ The 3 HR matched the Rays total from their first six meetings with the Blue Jays combined...the club has homered in 20 of its last 26 games (June 21–pres.), leading the AL with 41 HR and 13 multi-homer games in that timeframe...this comes after the Rays produced the majors' fewest homers (60) and multi-homer efforts (14, tied with BOS) over their first 73 games through June 20.
- ✦ Tampa Bay relievers have thrown 7.0 straight scoreless frames and have a 1.78 ERA (30.1IP, 6ER) across the last eight games...tonight, the bullpen looks to go three straight games without allowing a run for the first time since May 3-6 (season-high-tying 4G streak).
- ✦ The Rays are 0-6-9 in their last 15 four-game series (June 7, 2024–pres.), including 0-1-2 this season...it marks their second-longest streak of winless four-game series in club history (15) behind an 0-15-7 span (22) from 2002-04...they need to win two of the next three games for their first victory in a four-game set since May 13-16, 2024 at BOS.
- ✦ With a 6-1 lead in the 13-game season set, the Rays need to win only one of their final six meetings with the Blue Jays to clinch their ninth consecutive season series win over Toronto...see more in the "O, Canada" note below.

TIME FLIES WHEN YOU'RE HAVING FUN—**Yandy Diaz** is slated to appear in his 1,000th career game this evening...he would become the 24th Cuban-born player to appear in 1,000 major league games and the sixth Cuban-born, primary corner infielder/DH, joining **José Abreu** (2014-24), **Kendrys Morales** (2006-19), **Yonder Alonso** (2010-19), **Rafael Palmeiro** (1986-2005), and **Tony Pérez** (1964-86)...he would become the 16th player to appear in his 1,000th game while donning a Rays uniform, first since **David Peralta** on Sept. 22, 2022 vs. TOR (see table on the right)...911 of his MLB contests have come with the Rays, three shy of matching **Kevin Kiermaier** (914G) for fifth most in franchise history (see table on the right)...he is also two home runs shy of tying **Ben Zobrist** (114HR) for sixth on the club's all-time list and four extra-base hits away from tying **Aubrey Huff** (309XBH) for fifth.

✦ With 996 hits in his Rays career, he is approaching Zobrist (1,016 hits) for third on the Rays all-time list...**Carl Crawford** (1,480) and **Evan Longoria** (1,471) rank first and second, respectively.

✦ Tonight marks the Rays 100th game of the campaign...Diaz is set to become the 13th player in the modern era (since 1900) to play his 1,000th career game in his team's 100th game of a season, including the seventh AL player along with **NY Yankees** **Mark Teixeira** (July 28, 2009 at TB), **OAK Jermaine Dye** (July 28, 2004 vs. SEA), **TEX Mark McLemore** (July 24, 1997 at CWS), **DET Lance Parrish** (Aug. 2, 1985 vs. MIL), **NY Yankees** **Graig Nettles** (July 27, 1975 vs. BOS [G2]), and **BOS George Burns** (Aug. 3, 1922 at DET [G1]).

SWEET (VICTORY)—**Victor Mesa Jr.** has homered in a career-high three consecutive games, the longest active streak in the majors...it ties **Cedric Mullins** (June 28–July 2) for the second-longest streak by a Ray this season, trailing **Junior Caminero's** club-record-tying six-game run from June 25–July 1...Mesa Jr. has gone deep five times in his last nine games, going 9-for-25 (.360) with 1 2B, 6 RBI, 1 BB, 1 SB, and a 1.385 OPS (July 7–pres.), tied with **BOS Willyer Abreu** and **SD Ty France** for the second-most long balls in the majors over that span behind **PIT Esmerlyn Valdez** (7)...he entered that timeframe with 4 HR in his first 44 career games.

✦ Mesa Jr.'s 8 HR are the most by a Ray through his first 37 games with the franchise since **Isaac Paredes** (11) in 2022 and the most by a Rays outfielder over such a span since **Randy Arozarena** (9) from 2020-21.

HES THE CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 20 of his last 24 games, batting .348/.383/.461 (31-for-89) with 6 2B, 2 3B, 3 RBI, 5 BB, 5 SO, 9 R, and 10 SB in that span (June 19–pres.)...he paces the AL in stolen bases over that timeframe, ranks second in average, and is tied for fifth in hits...the 24-game span has raised his batting average from a season-low .259 to .282...this hot stretch comes on the heels of a 3-for-44 (.068) slump in his previous 16 games (May 30–June 17).

✦ With 97 hits, Simpson is three shy of becoming the fourth Ray to tally 100 hits or more in each of his first two major league campaigns...he would join **Evan Longoria** (2008-09), **Aki Iwamura** (2007-08), and **Rocco Baldelli** (2003-04).

STARTING FROM THE BOTTOM—The 6-9 spots in the Rays lineup are slashing a combined .281/.345/.435 (.223-for-794) with 23 HR and 111 RBI in wins, including a .283 (62-for-219) clip with runners in scoring position, compared to .180/.262/.250 (104-for-577) with 7 HR and 38 RBI in losses (170/23-for-135 with RISP)...the club's 6-9 hitters lead the majors with a .511 slugging pct., an .857 OPS, and 13 HR (1st with MIA) over 17 games during July...they also pace the AL in average (.279), third in MLB to the Pirates (.305) and Padres (.294)...this comes after the group tallied an MLB-low 11 HR across the Rays first 82 games through the end of June, slugging a majors'-worst .325 in that timeframe.

✦ With **Victor Mesa Jr.** and **Nick Fortes** going deep last night, the Rays recorded multiple homers from the 6-9 spots in the lineup for the sixth time this season, five of which have come within the club's last 19 games since June 28 (once in first 80 games: June 14 at LAA).

O, CANADA—The Rays and Blue Jays meet for the third of four sets in 2026 this week after the Rays won each of the first two series, claiming five of six matchups...they won their first five games vs. Toronto for the first time and need to go 1-5 or better over the final six meetings to clinch their ninth consecutive season series win (2017–pres.), 11th in 12 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (since 2015), and 17th in 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...their current eight-season streak is tied for their longest over a single opponent in franchise history, matching another eight-year run over the **Angels** (2016-24) and is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the majors by one team over a single opponent, trailing **ATL** over **MIA** (11), **CHC** over **PIT** (11), and **NY Yankees** over **KC** (11, including 2026).

✦ The Rays have won five of their last six series at Rogers Centre (Sept. 29, 2023–pres.) after taking two of three games here from May 11-13.

✦ Rays pitchers have turned in a 2.66 ERA (64.1IP, 19ER) through seven matchups with the Jays...it would mark their fourth-lowest single-season ERA against an AL East foe, trailing only 2021 vs. NYY (2.29), 2012 vs. TOR (2.40), and 2012 vs. BAL (2.54).

✦ Last night's win snapped a season-high five-game losing streak vs. AL East opponents and an eight-game road losing streak against the division, the latter of which was their longest skid since June 24–Aug. 8, 2016 (also 8G)...it marked their first road win in an AL East venue since May 22 vs. NYY (4-2)...the Rays are still 6-10 in their last 16 intradivision games on the heels of a 14-2 start.

✦ Since the start of 2025, the Rays are 26-16 vs. the AL East at home (14-2 in 2026) compared to 14-28 on the road (6-10 in 2026).

✦ **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in each of his 13 career games at Rogers Centre, going 20-for-56 (.357) with 2 2B, 3 HR, and 12 RBI...it marks the third-longest career-opening streak in this ballpark's history, one shy of the record (14 games) shared by **TB Tommy Pham** (2018-19) and **CAL KC Wally Joyner** (1989-92).

✦ **Jonathan Aranda** has 25 RBI in his last 22 games vs. the Blue Jays (Oct. 1, 2023–pres.), batting .333 (27-for-81) with a 1.059 OPS in those games...he has hit safely in seven straight games at Rogers Centre (Sept. 26, 2025–pres.), slashing .370/.441/.704 (10-for-27) with 3 HR and 10 RBI in those contests.

TONIGHT’S START—**Drew Rasmussen** will toe the rubber tonight for his 19th start of the campaign and 149th career appearance (100th start)...has made the ninth-most starts in franchise history (99GS), trailing sixth-ranked **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (both 108GS)...leads AL arms in walks per 9.0 innings (1.54) and WHIP (0.95), and ranks highly in opp. on-base pct. (2nd, .253), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 5.76), opp. AVG (T3rd, .209), and opp. SLG (5th, .341).

★ Is 10-0 in his career when pitching on six days of rest or more...is the only active major league pitcher with 10 wins or more and zero losses in such starts in their career.

★ With 0.2 IP and 2 SO today, Rasmussen would record his third season with 100.0 IP or more and 100 SO or more, joining 2025 and 2022.

★ He is one of 14 AL pitchers with 10 quality starts or more this season and has the second most among Rays arms since the start of 2021 (30QS) behind **Shane McClellan** (40QS).

★ Since 2021, his 2.88 ERA is fifth best among all major league pitchers (min. 500.0IP), behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.68), ATL **Chris Sale** (2.78), MIL **Brandon Woodruff** (2.79), and PHI **Zack Wheeler** (2.83).

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen took the loss after allowing a career-high six earned runs over 2.1 innings in a 12-4 loss on July 9 vs. NYY (L, 2.1IP, 7H, 6ER, HR, 2SO)...did not allow a baserunner over the first two frames...yielded all seven hits, including two doubles and a two-run homer to **Ben Rice**, while facing eight batters in the 3rd inning...was pulled from the game with runners on first and third, with his sixth and final run of the day scoring on a sacrifice fly off **Cam Booser**.

★ His 2.1 innings pitched were his fewest in a start since 2.0 scoreless innings in a 6-5 loss on Sept. 25, 2025 at BAL...the seven hits and six runs he permitted in the 3rd inning were both the most in any frame of his career.

RUNNING THROUGH THE SIX—Across 13 career appearances (11 starts) opposite the Blue Jays, Rasmussen is 3-4 with a 3.00 ERA (63.0IP, 21ER), a 1.13 WHIP, and a .235 (53-for-226) opp. AVG...this includes a 3.20 ERA (59.0IP, 21ER) across the 11 starts, with five being quality, all of which have come since being acquired by the Rays in June 2021...logged quality starts in both of his outings against Toronto this season on May 5 at Tropicana Field and May 11 at Rogers Centre, tossing a combined 12.0 scoreless innings with 11 strikeouts...the Rays have won three straight Rasmussen starts against the Blue Jays dating back to May 23, 2025, but are 6-5 in his career.

★ He is 11-8 with a 2.58 ERA (188.2IP, 54ER) over 44 career appearances (34 starts) vs. AL East foes, including 10-7 with a 2.69 ERA (170.1IP, 51ER) in the 34 starts...his 2.58 ERA is the second-lowest mark against the division among active major league pitchers (min. 150.0IP) behind NYY **Max Fried** (2.40).

★ Is 6-2 with a 2.69 ERA (67.0IP, 20ER) in 14 career road starts against AL East clubs, with both losses coming against the Blue Jays...has posted a 4.88 ERA (24.0IP, 13ER) in five career starts at Rogers Centre.

ROAD RAS—Rasmussen is making his 10th road start this season...is 2-2 with a 3.02 ERA (50.2IP, 17ER), a 0.87 WHIP, and a .198 (37-for-187) opp. AVG in the previous nine road outings...he has gone 5.0 IP or more with 3 ER or fewer in seven of the nine starts.

★ He has allowed four runs or fewer in 25 of his last 26 road starts (April 30, 2023-pres.), with 19 of those 25 being 5.0 innings or more...across those 26 starts, he has an 8-3 record, a 2.71 ERA (139.1IP, 42ER), and 133 strikeouts to 25 walks.

★ Since the start of the 2022 season, his 2.97 road ERA (224.1IP, 74ER) is the second best in the AL behind DET **Tarik Skubal** (2.90) among pitchers with 200.0 innings pitched or more.

DON’T WALK THIS WAY—Rasmussen’s 4.3 pct. walk rate is the lowest among qualified major league pitchers, ahead of teammate **Nick Martinez** (4.4%)...he has yielded two walks or fewer in each of his last 20 starts dating back to Sept. 19, 2025 vs. BOS...has walked just 20 batters in that span, good for a 4.8 pct. walk rate, which is fifth lowest in the majors (min. 400BF) behind PHI **Cristopher Sánchez** (4.4%), Martinez (4.6%), COL **Kyle Freeland** (4.6%), and LAD **Justin Wroblewski** (4.8%).

JUNE BOOM!—Rasmussen was named AL Pitcher of the Month in June after pitching to a 3-2 record with a 0.82 ERA (33.0 IP, 3 ER), 39 strikeouts, 4 BB, 1 HR, and a 0.61 WHIP while holding opponents to a .142/.192/.195 (16-for-113) slash line over five starts...he paced AL pitchers in ERA, WHIP, opp. average, opp. on-base pct., opp. slugging pct., opp. OPS, strikeout rate (32.5%), strikeout-to-walk ratio (9.75), and home runs per 9.0 IP (0.27)...his five quality starts tied BOS **Sonny Gray** for most in the AL.

★ The right-hander’s 0.61 WHIP was the lowest during any single month in franchise history (min. 30.0IP), surpassing **Ryan Yarbrough** in August 2019 (0.63) and was the best mark by an AL pitcher since DET **Tarik Skubal** in May 2025 (0.59)...under the same parameters, it marked the best WHIP during June by any pitcher in the modern era (since 1900), eclipsing the previous record established by SEA **Logan Gilbert** in June 2024 (0.62).

★ His 0.82 ERA was third lowest during any month in Rays history (min. 30.0IP), trailing **Chris Archer** in July 2013 (0.73) and **Rich Hill** in May 2021 (0.78)...it marked the best ERA during a month by an AL pitcher since TEX **Nathan Eovaldi** in July 2025 (0.59).
