METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Nationals, 7-0, to earn their first shutout of the season yesterday...The Mets have won three straight games and five of their last six...New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break...They are 8-6 in that span...The Mets close out the first-half with a six-game homestand (3-0) against Nationals (3-0) and Rockies (three games)...New York returns from the All-Star break with a four game set in Miami beginning on Friday, July 19.

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: Over his last five starts, Sean Manaea has gone 2-0 with a 1.57 ERA (5 ER/28.2 IP) with 14 walks and 27 strikeouts...The Mets are 4-1 in that span...He has posted a 0.50 ERA (1 ER/18.0 IP) with 10 walks and 14 strikeouts over his last three starts and the Mets are 3-0 in that span...Entering today, Manaea has not allowed a run over his last 8.0 innings dating back to July 2...In 10 starts under the lights this year, Manaea is 3-1 with a 2.98 ERA (18 ER/54.1 IP) with 23 walks and 45 strikeouts...This compares to a 2-2 record with a 4.11 ERA (16 ER/35.0 IP) with 16 walks and 42 strikeouts in seven daytime starts.

WINNING! The Mets are two games above .500 for the first time since April 24 (13-11)...Their season-high is four games above .500 following a victory on April 20 (12-8)...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets have gone 23-10...Their 23 wins are tied with the Astros for the most in the majors in that span, as is their .697 winning percentage.

ROTATE THE BOARD! Over the last six games, the Mets starting pitchers have posted a 1.53 ERA (6 ER/35.1 IP) with 13 walks and 28 strikeouts...The Mets are 5-1 in that span...In 11 starts in July, the rotation has posted a 2.67 ERA (20 ER/67.1 IP) with 23 walks and 41 strikeouts...Their 2.67 ERA is the fourth-lowest in the majors and second-lowest in the National League in July.

JUST THE TWO OF US: Brandon Nimmo moved to the two spot for the first time on June 13 vs. Miami...He has appeared in 25 games in the two-hole and the Mets are 17-8 in that span...Nimmo is batting .333 (32-96) with 27 runs, seven doubles, nine home runs, 30 RBI, 13 walks, three steals with a .423 OBP, a .688 SLG and a 1.111 OPS when batting second this season.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has collected 62 RBI in 87 games this year...He recorded a career-high 68 RBI in 152 games last season...Entering June, Nimmo was batting .214/.350/.378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 33 games since then, he is batting .308/.388/.600 with 30 runs, nine doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 33 RBI, 14 walks, four steals with a .988 OPS...He has safely reached base in 23 of his last 24 games, posting a .430 OBP in that span...He has brought his OPS up from .728 on May 31 to .831 entering today.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 49 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .292/.361/.515 with 37 runs, 18 doubles, nine home runs, 28 RBI, 16 walks, 10 steals with an .876 OPS...Francisco Lindor has posted a 3.2 fWAR since May 1...That is third in the National League in that span, behind only Shohei Ohtani (3.3 fWAR) and Bryce Harper (3.2 fWAR)...It is eighth in the majors in that period...In 63 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .272/.335/.486 with 11 home runs and 37 RBI...The Mets are 27-21 when Lindor bats first this season.

fWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor ranks ninth in the major leagues and fourth in the National League with a 3.7 fWAR...Brandon Nimmo is 19th in the majors and 11th in the NL with a 3.1 fWAR...Nimmo's 3.1 fWAR is third among NL outfielders behind only Jurickson Proffar (3.2 fWAR) and Christian Yelich (3.2 fWAR).

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 11-2 over their 13 games at Citi Field...The team has homered in all but two of those games, hitting .284/.371/.530 in that span with 31 doubles, two triples, 24 homers, 55 walks with a .900 OPS...The Mets pitching staff has posted a 3.48 ERA (46 ER/119.0 IP) with 50 walks and 115 punchouts...New York is 24-25 at home this year (24-24) at Citi Field...Their 3.58 ERA at home is eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL...The Mets went 43-48 at home in 2023.

RECORD SCRATCH: The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500...The team is 7-4 in this stretch...The Mets are 29-20 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

AM I SEEING DOUBLE?: Francisco Lindor has recorded 26th this season and 100 as a Met...That places him second in the majors...Lindor has recorded 25 or more doubles in three straight years...Since he entered the league in 2015, Lindor has collected 291 doubles...His 291 doubles are the 17th-most by a Puerto Rican born player...Next up is Jose Valentin (302).

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Congrats to Pete Alonso who was named to the 2024 NL All-Star team...The 94th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 16 in Texas...Alonso, 29, was named to the All-Star team for the fourth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history – one more than Keith Hernandez...Alonso, who was also an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023, becomes the 11th Met to be named to four or more All-Star teams.

DERBY DAY: Alonso will participate in the 2024 Home Run Derby...A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffey Jr.)...He will be the sixth player to compete in the HR Derby at least five times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six) and Albert Pujols (five).

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Brandon Sproat will represent the New York Mets at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game...Sproat, who was promoted to #98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games (12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season...He is a combined 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (14 ER/73.2 IP) with 28 walks and 85 strikeouts...In eight starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (11 ER/48.1 IP) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts...The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington.

MEET THE METS: Following a loss on May 29, the Mets have played 37 games, going 25-12 in that span...Their 25 wins are tied for the most in the majors, as is their .677 winning percentage...The Mets have hit .275/.343/.486 in that period with 86 doubles, eight, 56 home runs, 118 walks and an .829 OPS...They have outscored their opponents 219-171 during those 37 games...Their 219 runs are the second-most in the majors in that span, while their 5.92 runs/game leads MLB.

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut...He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit *Elias*.

WRITING A CHECK FOR 10K: On June 1 vs. Arizona, Manaea recorded 10 strikeouts...It was his eighth career game with double-digit strikeouts and his first since May 14, 2022 at Atlanta when he was a member of the Padres...It was the first double-digit strikeout performance by a Mets pitcher this season and the first since Jose Quintana's 10-strikeout performance on September 23, 2023 at Philadelphia.

SUCCESSFUL SEAN: In his first two starts as a Met, Manaea allowed one run over 11.0 innings...He joined Harry Parker, Masato Yoshii, Dillon Gee and Chris Bassitt as the only starters in franchise history to allow one or zero runs through their first two career starts with the Mets...Manaea allowed only four hits in his first two start with the club, tied with Rick Reed, Bruce Chen and Kazuhisa Ishii for the fewest hits allowed by a Met in their first two games with the club (Min. 10.0 IP)...His 14 strikeouts are tied with Bassitt, Steven Matz and Kodai Senga for the fifth-most in franchise history by a pitcher through in their first two games with the club...Only Pedro Martinez (21), Aaron Harang (18), Matt Harvey (18) and Pedro Astacio (16) had more strikeouts through their first two games as a Met.

HOMER HAPPY: Over his last nine starts, Manaea has allowed six home runs over 48.0 innings...In his first eight starts of the season, the southpaw allowed one homer over 41.1 innings...His 0.22 HR/9 rate during his first eight starts of the season, was the sixth-lowest rate in the majors during that span (Min. 40.0 IP).

SWEEPIN SAMOAN: At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal...Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering...Through his first 16 starts of the 2024 season, opposing batters are 8-53 with 28 strikeouts in at-bats ending with the pitch...His 48.3 K% with the pitch is eighth-best in the majors, while his 44.6 whiff% is tied for 12th-best mark in the majors this season (Min. 25 Plate Appearances).

SINK OR SWIM: This season, Manaea has held batters to a .217 (30-138) average on his sinker...Manaea has thrown the pitch 40.3% of the time, the highest usage rate of any of his six pitches in his arsenal...The southpaw has a run value of 11 with his sinker, tied for the second-best mark in the majors and his 32 strikeouts via the sinker are tied for ninth-most in the majors.

NO HITS FOR YOU: On April 20, 2018, Manaea threw a no-hitter against the Red Sox in Oakland...The southpaw walked two and struck out 10...It was the 12th no-hitter in Athletics history and the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Oakland...According to *Elias*, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in major league history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season.

TOMORROWS STARTER: RHP CHRISTIAN SCOTT (0-2, 4.15)

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 5.2 innings on July 8 vs. Pittsburgh at PNC Park and recorded a no decision...Allowed one hit, issued one walk and recorded three strikeouts.

WHAT A DEBUT: Christian Scott made his major league debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay...He recorded a no decision in the Mets 3-1 loss, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts...He became the third Mets player to make his major league debut this year...Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.

- Was named a National League All-Star for the fourth time on his career on July 7. Is the 11th player in franchise history to be selected to four or more All-Star Games and is the eighth position player in franchise to be selected to four or more All-Star Games.
- Went 2-3 with a double and a run on July 5 at Pittsburgh. Was his 21st double of the season, matching his total from 2023.
- Launched a two-run homer in the 10th on July 2 at Washington. Has five career home runs in extra-innings tied with Kevin McReynolds for second-most in Mets history. Only Howard Johnson (Nine) has more.
- Laced a game-winning double in the ninth on June 18 at Texas. Has 79 game-winning RBI, fifth-most in franchise history.
- Has 547 RBI, seventh-most in franchise history. Carlos Beltrán (559) is next.
- Picked up his second three-hit game of the season on June 17 vs. Texas (Also: 4/13 vs. Kansas City. Has 28 multi-hit games, ninth-most in the NL and tied for 15th-most in the majors.
- Went 2-5 with a two-run homer and a two-run single on June 16 vs. San Diego. Was his ninth career five-RBI game, the second-most such games in franchise history behind David Wright (10). Are the second-most such games since 2019 behind only Nelson Cruz (10).
- Has 10 home runs and 17 doubles over his last 55 games dating to May 7. His 17 doubles during that span are tied for the fifth-most in the majors, while his 27 extra-base hits during that span are tied for the 14th-most in the majors.
- Is sixth in the NL and tied for 15th in the majors with 18 home runs. Also ranks tied for ninth in the NL in doubles (21), tied for ninth in extra-base hits (39) and tied for 15th in total bases (159).

- Hit safely in a career-best 10 straight games from June 15-28. Batted .515/.595/.939 with three home runs, five doubles, 10 RBI and seven runs during the stretch. Was the longest hitting streak by a Mets catcher since Wilson Ramos' 26-game hitting streak from August 3 - September 3, 2023.
- Went 2-5 with a go-ahead double in the sixth and an RBI triple in the 10th. Was his first career triple.
- Posted a 1.23 OPS in June. Is the highest OPS by a catcher younger than 23 in a month (Min. 50 Plate Appearances) since Johnny Bench in June 1970 (1.208). Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.
- Went 3-3 with a home run, a double, a walk, three RBI and three runs on June 26 vs. Yankees. Was the third time in his career reaching base four times in a game.
- Has 30 home runs, the fourth-most by a catcher before turning 23. The only catchers with more homers prior to turning 23 are Johnny Bench (87), Iván Rodríguez (37) and Darrell Porter (31).
- Is batting .346/.429/.577 with 15 RBI and 11 extra-base hits in 26 games since returning from the IL on June 11. His 1.006 OPS during that span is the 11th-best in the NL and the 16th-best in the majors during that span (Min. 75 Plate Appearances).
- Recorded a game-tying two-run double in the eighth on June 18 at Texas as part of a three-hit night. Went 3-5 with two RBI on June 17 vs. Texas. Is the first Mets catcher with back-to-back three-hit games since Paul Lo Duca (4/4-4/6/07) and the first catcher age 22 or younger with back-to-back three-hit performances since Salvador Pérez (9/17-9/20/11).
