TAKING OUR WORK HOME: The Detroit Tigers tonight return to Comerica Park to start a six-game homestand with the first of three games against the Minnesota Twins as the Tigers continue a stretch of games that sees them play 13-of-16 games at home through next Sunday ... the Tigers have won their last four games at home and 13 of their 18 series played in this ballpark this season.

- Tied with the Toronto Blue Jays for the best record in the American League, the Tigers are now 65-48 through 113 games this season, their best mark since going 68-45 in 2013 ... overall, the Tigers have now won 65 of their first 113 games only six times in the last 42 seasons (2025, 2013, 2006, 1988, 1987 and 1984) and just 20 times in 125 seasons of franchise history.
- The Tigers have posted a 99-67 (.596) record since the beginning of August 2024, good for the best record in the American League and 1.5-games behind the Los Angeles Dodgers (100-65) for the best record in all of baseball ... the Tigers are 4.5 games up on the Astros (94-71), the next-best A.L. club in this past little-more-than-a-calendar year.
- The Tigers have 25 games remaining in August, 22 of them against teams that have a record
 of .500 or lower ... starting tonight, the Tigers play 13-straight games against sub-.500 teams
 before hosting the Astros for three games from August 18-20.

CENTRAL STATIONED: Tonight marks the beginning of an A.L. Central overture that sees the Tigers play 16 of their next 25 games within their division to close out the month of August ... this homestand concludes with a few of the outliers when Detroit hosts the Los Angeles Angels for three games starting Friday (all nine non-Central games are against A.L. West foes).

- The Tigers are 99-67 since August 1, 2024, good for a 15.5-game lead on the next best A.L. Central club in that span, the Cleveland Guardians (83-82) ... Detroit's 15.5-game lead in its division since last August 1 is by far the largest in all of baseball and way more than double the next-biggest lead held by Houston at +6.0 games in the A.L. West in this span.
- The Tigers maintain an 8.0-game lead in the A.L. Central, the largest lead within any of the six divisions in baseball and more than double the next-largest division lead in baseball.

HOME RULE: With a 5-1 record at home, Casey Mize is one of only six A.L. pitchers who have five or more wins with one loss or less at home this season, and two of them are with the Tigers: Mize, Tarik Skubal (8-1), Chris Bassitt (8-0), Max Fried (5-1), Adrian Houser (5-0) and Framber Valdez (5-1).

One of only 13 pitchers in the A.L. to reach nine wins this season, Mize this year has matched
the nine career wins he had going into the 2025 campaign in his first 61 career appearances
(59 starts).

THE DEPARTMENT OF GLEYBER: Gleyber Torres has posted an .807 OPS this year, the best OPS by a second baseman in the majors this season ... Torres also leads major league second basemen with a .373 on-base percentage, leads A.L. second basemen with 56 runs scored, ranks second among A.L. second basemen with a .276 batting average and is second in the majors with 54 RBI (the major league leaders have 55 RBI).

TELL IT TO THE JUDGE: Riley Greene joins New York's Aaron Judge as the only two players in all of baseball to reach 23 doubles, 26 homers and 84 RBI this season ... Greene has those exact totals through 113 team games, which puts him on pace for 33 doubles, 37 homers and 120 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

DYNAMIC DUO: Riley Greene (26 homers, 84 RBI) and Spencer Torkelson (23 homers, 63 RBI) are the only teammates in the American League to reach 23 homers and 63 RBI this season and are one of only three teammates to do so in all of baseball this year, joining Chicago's Seiya Suzuki (26/81) and Pete Crow-Armstrong (27/76); and New York's Juan Soto (25/63) and Pete Alonso (24/86).

CASH IS GREENE: Riley Greene became the first Tigers left-handed hitter with 26 homers by the end of July in 63 years when Norm Cash had 30 homers through the end of July in 1962 ... Greene and Cash, who also had 27 homers thru the end of July in 1961, are the lone left-handed batters in Tigers franchise history with 26 homers by the end of July in any single season.

- Greene was the first Tigers left-handed hitter with 84 RBI by the end of July since Rusty Staub had 86 RBI through July 31, 1978 ... only seven left-handed hitters in Tigers history have reached 84 RBI by the end of July: Riley Greene (2025), Rusty Staub (1978), Norm Cash (1961), Vic Wertz (1949 and 1950), Goose Goslin (1936), Bobby Veach (1921) and Ty Cobb (1911).
- Greene already has the most homers by a Tigers left-handed hitter in a single season since Prince Fielder hit 30 homers in 2012.

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers are tied for the best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +80 overall run differential, trailing only the Yankees (+92) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +108 edge on the second-place Guardians (-28), are +91 on the third-place Royals (-11) and are +114 on the fourth-place Twins (-34).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers have gone first-to-third base on a single 91 times this year, the most in all of baseball ... Detroit's 54 percent extra-bases-taken-rate also leads the majors.

- Enters tonight's game having allowed 13 runs (11 earned) over his last three starts (8.2 innings)...this follows a stretch of five straight games going at least five innings and allowing two or less earned runs from June 11 July 5.
- Named a 2025 All-Star for the first time in his career on July 11, becoming the sixth Tigers' player to be named to the team.
- Placed on the 15-day IL on May 10 (retro May 9) with a left hamstring strain...was activated and made his first start back against Cleveland on May 24.
- Became the first Tigers pitcher to win four games in April since Jordan Zimmerman won five games in 2016...went 4-1 with a 2.12 ERA
 (6 ER/24.1 IP) in five starts in April.
- In his first MLB action since 2022, Mize appeared in 22 games (20 starts) and posted a 2-6 record with a 4.49 ERA (51ER/102.1IP) and 78 strikeouts last season.

- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals this season prior to the trade, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
- Named to the National League All-Star team last year, a season in which he collected a career-high 38 saves, second-most in the N.L., with a 3.68 ERA (26 ER/36.2 IP) in 65 relief appearances...the 2024 campaign marked his fourth in a row with 65 or more relief outings.

- Has not allowed a run in five straight outings dating back to July 19...tossed two or more innings in four of the five, topping out at 3.1 frames on July 29 against Arizona.
- Allowed 13 runs (six earned) over nine games in June, giving up 16 hits and eight walks while striking out 12...did not record an out in
 his final two outings of the month.
- Has made three starts this year including two in a row on June 10 & 13, allowing one earned run over 6.1 innings in those three
 contests...Detroit has won all three games.
- Made his Major League debut on Aug. 4, 2024, vs. Kansas City, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and giving up two hits with three strikeouts...became the first Tigers reliever to throw 3.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut since Sandy Báez did so on June 4, 2018, vs. New York (AL).
