Miami (2 to play) tonight at loanDepot Park are 4-3 in their last seven games on the Miami ( 2 to play) tonight at loanDepot Park....are 4-3 in their last seven games on the heels of a season-high six-game losing streak....however, they have lost nine of their last位 the midst of a stretch of four of days over 19 games in 20 days from June $7-26$.

Tampa Bay avoided a sweep on Sunday at Oriole Park despite allowing a seasonhigh 15 hits...it marked the Rays first win in which they allowed 15+ hits since April 4, 2023 at Washington ( 16 H ) and their sixth such victory over Baltimore in franchise history (last: 15H, Aug. 6, 2021)...it marked Tampa Bay's most hits allowed since Sept. 29, 2023 at Toronto (16H)
The Rays snapped a six-game losing skid vs. AL East opponents, which was their longest since March 30-April 8, 2018 ( 8 G ).
Tampa Bay has trailed at some point in each of its last 14 games, going 5-9 during that stretch...the Rays 10 wire-to-wire victories are tied with Los Angeles-AL for third fewest in the AL, ahead of Chicago-AL (8G) and Oakland (9G)...their last wire-to-wire win came on May 17 at TOR (4-3).
The Rays 25 road games played are tied with Baltimore for the fewest in the majors... 18 of their 25 ( $72.0 \%$ ) contests on the road have been decided by two runs or fewer, the highest percentage in MLB.
According to Elias, Tampa Bay has the toughest remaining strength of schedule in the majors, with its opponents posting a .539 winning pct....the next closest teams are Toronto (.518) and Cleveland (.516).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS-Yesterday, Tampa Bay reinstated OF Josh Lowe(right oblique strain) from the 10-day IL and optioned INF Jonathan Aranda to Triple-A Durham.

Lowe has tallied at least one hit and one run scored in each of his first four career
games vs. Miami... with one hit and one run tonight, he would join WSH Jeimer
Candelario (May 16 -June 17, 2023) as the only players to accomplish the feat in each of their first five career games against the Marlins.
PEP IN HIS STEP-Ryan Pepiot is the third Ray to record 6.0+ scoreless innings in each of his first two road starts in a season, joining Tyler Glasnow (2019) and Chris Archer
 PIT Deacon Phillippe (1902)...no pitcher since 1901 has turned in $6.0+$ scoreless, walkless frames in each of his first three road starts of a season

BEND(IX) BUT DON'T BREAK-The Rays 16 comeback wins are fourth most in the AL behind Baltimore/New York (both 19G) and Detroit (17G)

Each of Tampa Bay's last five victories have been come-from-behind wins...it marks the first time they have accomplished the feat since another stretch of five comback wins from Sept. 18-30, 2022 (Elias).
Per Elias, the Rays have not held a lead entering the 7th frame in 14 straight games, their longest single-season streak since Aug. 1-15, 1998 (14G)...the longest Tampa Bay ranks among MLB leaders in wins when trailing after six (T2nd, 6), seven (1st, 6) and eight (T3rd, 3) innings
SOUTHPAW SUCCESS-The Rays will face a left-handed starter for the 15th time tonight, going $9-5$ in the 14 previous matchups...they have won each of their last four games against left-handed starters (May 30 vs. OAK; May 11 vs. NYY; May 3 vs. NYM; June 2 at BAL)...Tampa Bay has faced a LH starter just four times in its last 36 games since April 23 compared to 10 in its first 24 games.

Since the beginning of 2023, the Rays are 33-16 (.673) when facing left-handed starters.
Isaac Paredes went 11 -for- 35 (.314) with 3 2B vs. left-handed pitching through
May 11, but has gone 1 -for-11 (.091) since...the one hit was a two-run homer off OAK Hogan Harris on May 30.
DOWN TO THE WIRE-The Rays are 12-4 (.750) in one-run games, tied with the Mariners (12-4/750) for the best mark in the majors... Tampa Bay's 21-9 (.700) record in games decided by two runs or fewer leads MLB, ahead of Philadelphia (16-8/667) and
 but are tied with Colorado and Miami for the second-most losses by 3+ runs (22) behind the White Sox (28).

The Rays have won each of their last six one-run games, their longest singleseason streak a seven-game run from Aug. 10-Sept. 2, 2019.

TWO-OUT TROUBLES-The Rays staved off a series sweep on Sunday at Baltimore despite allowing Orioles hitters to go 8 -for- 16 (.500) with two outs, compared to .292 (7-for-24) with zero and one outs...Tampa Bay pitching has allowed opponents to hit . 249 Colorado outs this season, the fourth-high

Rays hitters are batting 219 with two outs, the fourth-lowest clip in the AL, ahead of Chicago-AL (.184), Oakland (.204) and Seattle (.206).
BASEPATH BATTLE-Tampa Bay has stolen an AL-best 60 SB, ranking fifth in MLB behind Washington (94SB), Cincinnati (88SB), Milwaukee (79SB) and Philadelphia (69SB)...however, the Rays have been caught stealing an MLB-high 27 times, ahead of Los Angeles-AL (24CS) and have the third-worst stolen base pct. (69.0\%) in the majors, ahead of Los Angeles-AL (67.1\%) and San Francisco (65.5\%).

The Rays have been caught stealing four times at third base, tied with Milwaukee
for the most in the majors...they are the only team to have multiple players thrown out twice at third base (José Caballero \& Jose Siri).
Tampa Bay pitching has allowed 52 SB, fifth most in MLB behind New York-NL
(68SB), San Francisco (63SB), Washington (58SB) and Chicago-AL (56SB)...Rays relievers have allowed 36 SB , tied with the Mets for the most in the majors.
CITRUS SERIES-Tampa Bay and Miami kick off a four-game season series tonight at loanDepot Park...the Marlins travel to St. Petersburg from July $30-31$ to close out the season set...the Rays went 3-1 vs. the Marlins last year, including a two-game sweep in since 2019 posting a $23-7$ (767) record during that stretch the Rays have won 21 of 24 games against the Marlins since the start of 2019.

TONIGHT'S START-Pepiot will take the mound for his 10th start of the season tonight, including his third on the road...was on the 15-day IL from May 6-22 (lower left leg contusion) after being struck by a 107.5 mph comebacker off the bat of NYM Starling Marte on May 5...has a 6.17 ERA (11.2IP, 8ER) in three starts since being reinstated, but has held opponents to a . 195 (8-for-41) average...is seeking his first win since April 29 at MIL... has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his nine starts.

LAST TIME OUT-Fell one out shy of a quality start, but did not factor into the decision of the Rays 4-3 walk-off win over the Athletics on May 29 (5.2IP, 3H, 2ER, BB, 7SO)...yielded a sac-fly in the 4th inning and departed with runners at the corners in the 6th, one of which scored following his departure...of his 7 SO, a season-high five came on his changeup, his second most in any outing of his career, trailing Sept. 26, 2023 at COL (8).

GONE FISHING-Pepiot is $2-0$ with a 1.50 ERA (18.0IP, 3ER) across three outings (2GS) against the Marlins, including a 0.75 ERA (12.0IP, 1ER) and 0.42 WHIP in two games (1GS) in 2023...in his most recent outing, he allowed just one baserunner across a career-high 7.0 IP in a 10-0 Dodgers win at loanDepot Park on Sept. 7, 2023 (7.0IP, H, OR, 3SO)...he was the only NL pitcher to record a road start of $7.0+$ IP with one baserunner or fewer in 2023...the outing capped a stretch in which he turned in a 0.86 ERA (21.0IP 2ER), 0.52 WHIP and .127 ( 9 -for-71) opp. average in his first four starts following his Aug. 19 season debut.

This will mark his fourth career appearance (3GS) and third start against Miami, matching Arizona for his most against any club in both categories.

ROAD DOG-Pepiot has won both of his road starts (April 7 at COL \& April 29 at MIL), holding opponents scoreless across a combined 12.0 IP...he has retired 35 of 40 BF across those outings, posting a 0.42 WHIP while striking out 18 against zero walks...he is the third Ray to record 6.0+ scoreles innings in each of his first two road starts in a season, joining Tyler Glasnow (2019) and Chris Archer (2015)... he is the fifth pitcher since 1901 to accomplish the feat without issuing a walk, joining DET Tarik Skubal 2024). MIL Corbin Burnes (2021). SF Johnny Cueto (2018) and PIT Deacon Phillippe (1902) no pitcher since 1901 has turned in 6.0+ scoreless, walk less frames in each of his first three road starts of a season.

WHIFF YOU PLEASE-Min. 700 swings, Pepiot's 30.8 pct. whiff rate ranks fourth in the AL, trailing DET Jack Flaherty (35.2\%), TEX Dane Dunning (31.3\%) and KC Cole Ragans (31.1\%)...he had a 32.7 pct. whiff rate prior to his IL stint (7GS) compared to 23.1 pct. since his return (2GS)

TRAFFIC CONTROL-Min. 40.0 IP, he ranks among MLB leaders in hits per 9.0 IP (3rd, 5.44), opp. average (5th, .175) and WHIP (8th, 0.95)...his . 160 opp. average against right-handed hitters ranks fourth (min. 75AB) behind PHI Zack Wheeler (.127), NYY Luis Gil (.130) and ATL Max Fried (.144)...he has allowed three runs or fewer and three hits or fewer in six consecutive starts-excluding openers, it marks the longest streak in club history

The 1-3 spots in the opposing order are batting a combined . 230 (14-
for-61) against him...4-9 hitters are batting . 141 (14-for-99), including a 1-for-16 (.063) clip and . 275 OPS vs. cleanup hitters.

HEAT CHECK-Pepiot has held opponents to a 6-for-73 (.082) clip on his four-seamer, recording 30 of his 51 SO on the pitch...the .082 average is the lowest mark on any individual pitch in MLB (min. 60 AB ending with pitch) He has produced a 37.6 pct. whiff rate on the four-seamer, the second-highest mark on any MLB pitcher's fastball (min. 200 swings), trailing only OAK Mason Miller's four-seamer (45.3\%).
HUNG OUT TO DRY-The Rays have been outscored, 44-29 (-15), in Pepiot's outings, tying Zach Eflin for the lowest team run differential in any Rays pitcher's starts...he has received three runs of support or fewer in each of his nine starts-in his career as a starter, Pepiot is 6-0 with a 2.83 ERA (60.1IP, 19ER) when receiving just two or more runs of support (12GS) and 1-3 with a 4.84 ERA (35.1IP, 19ER) with one or zero runs (7GS).
MEET ME IN THE MIDDLE-He has been at his best in the middle frames of his outings, posting a 1.44 ERA (25.0IP, 4ER) and 0.68 WHIP in innings 2-4 while pitching to a 6.75 ERA (21.1IP, 16ER) and 1.27 WHIP in all other frames.
