# ATLANTA BRAVES (1-1) at TORONTO BLUE JAYS (1-0)

TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Blue Jays today meet for the first of two times this spring...The clubs will play again on Sunday, March 22 at CoolToday Park...Atlanta and Toronto do not meet in the regular season.

A The two teams played four times in the 2019 regular season, two in each city...The Braves won three of the four games, taking both games in Atlanta, and splitting the two games in Toronto.

CAMP BREAKDOWN: The Braves have 68 active players in camp, 34 of whom are pitchers ( 12 left-handers and 22 right-handers)... Atlanta also has 16 infielders, 11 outfielders and seven catchers in camp... There are 28 non-roster invitees ( 10 infielders, 10 pitchers, five outfielders and three catchers)... The club had 60 players in camp last season.

A The Braves signed nine players to major-league contracts this winter...Atlanta signed C Travis d'Arnaud, LH Cole Hamels, OF Marcell Ozuna and LH Will Smith... Those four players have combined for seven All-Star appearances (Hamels - 4, Ozuna - 2, Smith -1)...Atlanta also re-signed RHs Chris Martin and Darren O'Day, along with C Tyler Flowers, INF Adeiny Hechavarría and OF Nick Markakis.

A Atlanta has five of MLB.com's Top 100 prospects in camp...OFs Cristian Pache (No. 13) and Drew Waters (No. 26) are tabbed as the club's top two prospects...RH Ian Anderson (No. 37), RH Kyle Wright (No. 52) and C Shea Langeliers (No. 70), three first-round draft selections, are also with the major-league club this spring.

97 WINS: The Braves finished with a record of 97-65 last season, the franchise's 12th 95 -win season since Major League Baseball went to a 162game schedule for both leagues in 1962...The 97 victories were the club's most since 2003 ( 101 wins) and the fifth most in baseball in 2019.

A The 12 total 95 -win seasons since 1962 are tied for the most in the National League with Los Angeles, who also had one last season...The only team in baseball with more such seasons than the Braves is the Yankees, who have won at least 95 games 23 times since the advent of the 162-game schedule for both leagues in 1962.

19 IN '19: The Braves clinched the 19th division title in franchise history this season, beating San Francisco, 6-0 on September 20 at SunTrust Park to win the National League East...The 19 division titles are tied for the most in major league history with New York (AL)...This season also marks the franchise's 25 th postseason berth in the modern era and its second straight.

SILVER SLUGGERS: OF Ronald Acuña Jr., 2B Ozzie Albies and 1B Freddie Freeman each won a National League Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger award last season, the first such honor of their careers... Atlanta was the only team in the majors to have three recipients.

A The only previous year in which the Braves had three Silver Slugger winners was 2003, when P Mike Hampton, C Javy Lopez and OF Gary Sheffield were all recognized.

A Acuña Jr. and Albies were the first teammates in major league history age 22 or younger to win Silver Sluggers in the same season.

NEW HOME: After spending the last 22 springs training at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex in Lake Buena Vista, Fla., the Braves are spending their first full-time season at their new state-of-the-art facility, CoolToday Park...Atlanta played their final spring game here last season, beating Tampa Bay, 4-2, on March 24 in front of 7,067 fans.
A CoolToday Park will feature six full and two half practice fields, a 55,000 square-foot clubhouse, 6,200 fixed seats and 1,000 berm seats.

A The Braves have called Florida home for each of the last 74 springs (since 1946)...Atlanta is tied for the longest consecutive run of training in Florida of any team in baseball...The Cardinals, Phillies and Tigers have also trained in Florida in each year since 1946.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP Mike Foltynewicz is set to make his spring debut tomorrow in North Port against Minnesota... Foltynewicz made 21 starts with Atlanta last season, going 8-6 with a 4.54 ERA ( $59 \mathrm{ER} / 117.0 \mathrm{IP}$ )...After returning from an option on August 5, he posted a 2.65 ERA over his final 11 starts of the season.

- Last season was his first full season in the majors...Ranked second in the N.L. with 17 wins, pitching to a 4.02 ERA (74 ER/165.2 IP) in 33 games. His 17 wins were the most in the N.L. by a left-hander, and the second most in the majors...Boston's Eduardo Rodríguez won 19 games.
Fried won the most games by an Atlanta southpaw since Hall-of-Famer Tom Glavine won 18 games in 2002.

Ian Anderson • RHP • 6-3•170•21 yrs•\#78

- Rated by MLB.com as Atlanta's top pitching prospect, and the 37th overall prospect in the game.
- Split last season between Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett, going 8-7 with a 3.38 ERA ( 51 ER/135.2 IP) in 26 starts...Struck out 172 batters, the fourth most in the minors.
- Pitched in two games last spring...Allowed one earned run in 3.0 innings.
