TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS:

- Optioned to AAA-Louisville RHP **Jose Franco** (postgame, 4/9).
- Recalled from Louisville RHP **Kyle Nicolas** (#62).
- Yesterday the Reds rejected the return of Rule 5 selection RHP **Roddey Muñoz** from the **Astros**...**Muñoz** cleared waivers and remains with **Hou**.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs **Grace McNamee's Angels** and the first game of a 7-day/6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game set vs the **Giants** (Tue-Thu).

- The Reds are coming off their first road trip of the season in which they swept the **Rangers** (3-0) and split with the **Marlins** (2-2).
- Following Thu's game vs **SF**, the Reds will head back on the road for a 6-game trip at **Min** (3g, 4/17-4/19) and **TB** (3g, 4/20-4/22).

REDS UNVEIL CITY CONNECT 2.0: The Reds yesterday unveiled their newest **City Connect** uniform, which will debut on-field tomorrow vs **LAA**.

- The uniforms feature red jerseys and pants accented by dark red piping and sleeves, black numbers, white lettering and red socks...a red cap, which also features pinstripes, showcases the stylized "C" logo.
- The Reds will wear the new **City Connect** uniforms at **Saturday home games**...due to its popularity amongst players and fans, the **City Connect** 1.0 black uniform will continue to be worn on **Fridays at GABP**.

OUR PAL SAL: 1b Sal Stewart has hit safely in 10 of his 13 games this season and reached base in 12 of 13 (16-for-44, .364/.473/.727)...he's been on base 26 times, which ranks T3rd in the majors.

- **Stewart** leads all Major League rookies with 16 hits, 8 extra-base hits, and 32 total bases (10bb, T1st; 4hr, T2nd).

IT AIN'T OVER TILL IT'S OVER: The Reds have produced 2 comeback wins this season (3/29 vs **Bos** & 4/7 at **Mia**)...had 40 comeback victories in 2025.

- The 6-3 win in 10 innings on Tue, the Reds rallied for their first win when trailing by 2 or more runs in the 9th inning or later since 3/31/24 vs **Wsh** (down 5-3 in the 9th, won 6-5)...it was the first time the Reds did such a thing on the road since 8/26/23 at **AZ** (down 4-2 in the 9th, won 8-7 in 11 innings).
- Tue's win was also the Reds' first victory in which they were held scoreless *and* trailed by multiple runs through 8 innings since 7/12/22 at **NYN** (down 3-0 in 9th, won 4-3).

WINS OVER RUNS: The Reds have won 8 of their first 13 games despite ranking last in the majors with 39 runs scored...this is the first Cin team in *any* 13 game span to score 39 or fewer runs and win 8 times since the 2012 club did it from 9/19-10/2 (13 games, 8 wins, 39 runs).

- The last Major League team to win 8 times in any 13-game span while scoring 39 runs or fewer was the 2025 **Orioles** (8w/38r, 9/5-9/18).
- 7 of Cin's 8 wins this season have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the most such wins in the majors this year.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.

SERIES NOTES:

- The Redlegs are 14-11 all-time vs the **Angels**, including 8-3 here at **Great American Ball Park** and 6-8 at **Angel Stadium of Anaheim**.
- The Reds' 10-game winning streak vs **LAA** dating back to 8/5/19, was snapped in the clubs' final meeting of 2025 (8/20, 2-1 at **Angel Stadium**)...it's Cin's longest winning streak ever vs an AL opponent.
- In 2013 the Reds and **Angels** played the first interleague **Opening Day** game in Major League history, a 3-1 **Angels** win in 13 innings in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opener (Cin pitchers 17, **LAA** pitchers 13).
- **OF Mike Trout** led off the 2015 All-Star Game at **GABP** with a home run off RHP **Zack Greinke** and became the first player ever to win the ASG's MVP award in consecutive years.

EL CABALLO DE HIERRO: SS Ely De La Cruz has appeared in each of Cin's last 231 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have avoided being swept in 33 consecutive home series (min. 1g) dating back to 2024...it's the longest such streak since 9/19/11-9/25/13 when the Reds avoided being swept at **Great American Ball Park** in a franchise-record 52 consecutive home series.

- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series last year at **GABP**...only the Cin teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being broomed.

OFF THE BENCH: Reds substitutes have combined to bat .318 with a .875 OPS over the season's first 13 games (7-for-22, 1hr, 4rbi, 6k).

- In 2025, Reds in-game replacements batted .180 (28th in the majors), with a .266 OBP (28th), a .212 SLG (29th), and a .478 OPS (29th)...Cin was the only team in the majors last year not to produce a HR off the bench.

LEAVING RUNNERS ON: Reds batters rank third in the majors with 102 runners left on base (**Hou** 112, **NYM** 105)...Cin is 1 of 3 teams in the majors to have stranded at least 10 runners on 4 different occasions (**LAA** 4, **Sea** 4).

THE NEW GUYS: New additions to the Reds' roster in 2026 include: **OF JJ Bleday** (free agent, currently at AAA-Louisville), **LHP Brock Burke** (trade w/ **LAA** & **TB**), **LHP Caleb Ferguson** (free agent, currently on IL), **RHP Pierce Johnson** (free agent), **1b Nathaniel Lowe** (free agent), **OF Dane Myers** (trade w/ **Mia**), **RHP Kyle Nicolas** (trade w/ **Pit**), and **3b/DH Eugenio Suárez** (free agent).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 2-1 win at Tex on 4/5 (6.0ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 9k, 1hr, 87TP).

- Tied his career high with 6.0 innings pitched (3x).
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 18 of his 24 batters.
- Was the first time as a Major League starting pitcher that he pitched into the 7th inning (7 pitches).
- Had his career-high 14.2 scoreless innings streak snapped after allowing a game-tying solo homer to Joc Pederson in the 7th inning.
- Turned it over to Pierce Johnson and Sam Moll in the 7th with no outs and a runner on first (Evan Carter single)...the relievers combined to strand the runner.

MARCH 30 vs PIT: Earned his first Major League win in the 2-0 victory vs Pit on 3/30 (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP).

- Was his 2026 season debut...became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with 5.0+ scoreless innings pitched, and fewer than 2 hits with at least 7 strikeouts in his season debut (last: Brady Singer in 2025).
- Carried a no-hitter into the 5th inning before allowing a single to Spencer Horwitz to lead off the inning...at 4.0 innings, marked the longest no-hit bid of his big league career.

SPRING RECAP: Went 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA in 6 spring starts for the Reds (17.0ip, 14h, 9r/9er, 7bb, 22k, 3hr, 288 TP).

- Last pitched on Tue in the Brewers' 4-1 exhibition win at American Family Field (5.0ip, 4h, 2r/2er, 0bb, 7k, 1hr, 68TP).

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: In Mon's 2-0 win vs Pit, RHP Chase Burns earned his first career win (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP) and RHP Connor Phillips picked up his first career save (1.0ip, 0h, 2bb, 1k).

- Burns and Phillips became the eighth pair of Reds teammates since saves became an official stat in 1969 to earn their first win and save, respectively, in the same game...the last duo to do it was RHP Julian Aguilar and RHP Casey Kelly on 8/24/24 at Pit.

73 STRIKEOUTS: His 73 strikeouts over his first 10 Major League starts are the most by a Reds pitcher to begin his career since Gary Nolan (87k, 1967).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: On 6/24 vs NYY made his Major League debut after having his contract selected from AAA-Louisville earlier in the day...became the first Major League starting pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) to strike out the first 5 batters he faced in his Major League debut...struck out 8 batters total that day, becoming just the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 8 strikeouts in his Major League debut.

PERSONAL: Was born in Italy where his parents were stationed with the US Navy...his sister was born in Japan...grew up in Hendersonville, TN which is about 20 miles northeast of Nashville...pitched collegiately at Tennessee (2022-2023) before transferring to Wake Forest (2024)...graduated from Beech High School in Hendersonville, TN where he was selected by Baseball America as a 2021 First Team High School All-American...his father, David, played college football at Division II North Greenville College.

ACQUIRED: Was selected by the Reds in the first round (second overall) in the 2024 First-Year Player Draft...was signed by Eddie Lehr.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the 2-0 win on Mon (4/6) at Mia (6.2ip, 3h, 0r, 1bb, 4k, 93TP).

- Was his first Major League victory and first quality start since 9/29/23 at StL, a span of 920 days.
- Tied his career high with 6.2 innings pitched (3x)...marked the first time in his Major League career that he ever pitched 6.2 shutout innings.
- Allowed 4 of his 24 batters to reach.
- Turned it over to Brock Burke in the 7th inning with 2 outs and a runner on first...Burke fanned Xavier Edwards.

MARCH 31 vs PIT: Suffered the 8-3 loss on 3/31 vs Pit (4.2ip, 6h, 6r/6er, 2bb, 3k, 3hr, 94 TP).

- The 3 home runs allowed were a career high...5 of the 6 runs allowed came via HR.
- 4 of the 6 runs allowed came with 2 outs, including back-to-back homers in Pit's 5-run 2nd inning (O'Hearn 3-run HR, Reynolds solo HR).
- Was his first Major League appearance since 9/17/24 at Atl, a span of 560 days...missed all of last season as he recovered from left elbow reconstruction surgery (10/9/24).
