THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY
SEPT. 25

1986 - RHP **Mike Scott** clinches the NL West Division title for the Astros in historic fashion by hurling a 2-0, no-hit victory over the Giants in the Dome. Scott, who tallied 13 strikeouts in the win, would go on to win the NL Cy Young Award later that season, finishing with an 18-10 while leading the Majors in both ERA (2.22) and strikeouts (306)

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Houston Astros will continue their final road trip of the regular season with the second game of a four -game series against the Athletics at Sutter Health Park in West Sacramento, CA...**RHP Hunter Brown** (6-3) will be on the mound for the Astros, opposite **LHP Jacob Lopez** (6-5) and the Athletics.

THE DIESEL: Astros ace **RHP Hunter Brown** has posted a 5-2 record and a 2.76 ERA (19ER/62IP) in his last 11 starts (since July 25), pitching through the 5th inning in all 11 outings...Brown, who finished third in the AL Cy Young Award voting last season, has been limited this season, missing over two months due to a lengthy stint on the IL (April 1-June 15) with a right shoulder strain...in 10 career starts vs. the Athletics, Brown has recorded a 2.86 ERA (18ER/56.2IP) with 67 strikeouts.

THE POSTSEASON CHASE: The Astros and Rangers are locked in a tight race down the stretch for the AL West with the two teams having the same record with three games left to play...the Astros own the tiebreaker over the Rangers with a season series victory (9-4 record).

NEXT GAME

VS. THE ATHLETICS: This is the final series between the Astros and Athletics this season, with the two clubs last seeing each other from Aug. 21-23 at Daikin Park...the Astros have gone 5-5 vs. the Athletics this season...the Astros also own an overall regular season record of 125-111 against the Athletics, including a 60-60 record on the road.

ROAD WARRIORS: Tonight is the fourth game of a six-game road trip for the Astros...since going 1-9 on the first road trip of the 2026 season, the Astros have gone 39-29 (.574) on the road since April 14, which ranks third in the AL in that span, behind the Red Sox (43-28) and the Yankees (42-30).

LAST NIGHT'S GAME: The Astros defeated the Athletics, 7-5 at Sutter Health Park last night...the Astros offense combined to hit five home runs between **CF Lucas Spence** (3x4, 3 HR, 5 RBI), **3B Isaac Paredes** (1x4, HR, RBI) and **1B Christian Walker** (2x4, HR, RBI)...**RHP Miguel Ullola** allowed one hit and struck out three in three scoreless innings to earn his second win of his career.

GOIN' DEEP: The Astros have hit 218 homers as a team this year and have hit 200-plus homers in a single season for the 10th time in franchise history (last, 222 HR in 2023)...the Astros rank second in the AL in home runs this season behind only the Yankees (223).

TWO-OUT MAGIC: The Astros lead the American League in two-out runs with 311 on the season, trailing only the Cubs (331) in the Majors...**3B Isaac Paredes** leads this effort, as he holds the Major League lead with 45 two-out RBI, directly ahead of **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** and **STL 1B Alec Burleson** (44 RBI).

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Last night's victory was the 254th win for Astros Manager **Joe Espada** tying him with **Hal Lanier** for the ninth-most managerial wins in Astros franchise history...Espada owns a 254-228 record with the Astros.

THE CASE FOR THE MVP: **DH Yordan Alvarez** is a solid candidate for the AL MVP Award...Alvarez leads the American League in OPS (1.032), slugging percentage (.600), OBP (.432), batting average (.315), total bases (333), walks (108), IBB (33), wRC+ (181), OPS+ (190) and extra-base hits (75)...he also ranks tied for second in home runs (41), second in RBI (102), tied for second in hits (175), fourth in runs (101), and tied for third in doubles (33).

TRIFECTA: **CF Lucas Spence** went 3x4 with three home runs and five RBI last night vs. the Athletics...he became the third player in Major League history to hit their first three career home runs in the same game, joining **STL Joshua Baez** (Aug. 15, 2026) and **CWS C Seby Zavala** (July 31, 2021)...Spence is the second rookie in Astros franchise history to record a three-homer game, joining **DH Yordan Alvarez** (Aug. 10, 2019 at BAL)...it was the first three-homer game by an Astro this season (last, **IF Jose Altuve** on Sept. 5, 2023 vs. TEX).

STRONG SEPTEMBERS: **3B Isaac Paredes** has a 1.009 OPS this month to go along with a team-leading 20 RBI, which ranks second in the AL...**C Yainer Diaz** is also having a strong September, as he's hitting .343 (24x70) with four homers, 10 RBI and a .956 OPS in 20 games (17 starts) this month.

POSTSEASON CREDENTIALS: All media who wish to cover potential Astros postseason home games in the Wild Card Series and ALDS must apply for credentials on MLB's credentialing system...the events are now open with a deadline set for Sunday, Sept. 27...ALCS and World Series credential applications are also live online.

THE FIREMAN: **LHP Josh Hader** has converted 26 consecutive save chances to open his season, which is the Astros record...should Hader finish the season without a blown save, he would become the seventh pitcher in MLB history to post 26-plus saves without a blown save...the last Major Leaguer to do so was **RHP Ken Giles** in 2018 (26 SV).

NO. 200: **1B Christian Walker** recorded his 200th home run of his career on Tues. night at SEA with a three-run home run in the third inning...became the 34th active player in the Majors to record 200 career HRs.

LAST START, SEPT. 20 vs. ATL: For his 2nd consecutive start, he struck out exactly 10 batters in exactly 5.0 innings....was scoreless in his 5.0 innings and allowed just 3 hits and 2 walks...did not factor into the decision of the Astros' 4-2 loss to the Braves.

ELIAS SAYS: Brown is the 1st MLB player since at least 1893 (first season current mound distance established) to strike out 10+ batters in 5.0-or-fewer innings in back-to-back starts, per Elias.

DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 10+ batters in consecutive starts for the 1st time in his career and is the 2nd Astro to do so this season (also, **RHP Tatsuya Imai** from June 19-25)...is 1 of 5 pitchers in Astros history to record multiple outings of 10+ strikeouts in 5.0-or-fewer innings, and trails only **RHP Nolan Ryan** (3) for the most such outings by an Astro...is the only player in Astros history to log multiple such outings in a single season...is 1 of 3 MLB players to log multiple such outings this year, joining **MIL RHP Jacob Misiorowski** (3) and **TOR RHP Dylan Cease** (2)...with 10+ strikeouts tonight, Brown would record the 14th instance of an Astros pitcher logging 10+ strikeouts in 3 consecutive outings and would be the 1st to do so since RHP Gerrit Cole (9 cons. times from Aug. 7-Sept. 29).

THE DIESEL: The Astros 2026 Opening Day starter, Brown has been limited to 19 Major League starts on the season due to a 2-plus month-long IL stint (April 5-June 16) due to a right shoulder strain...the Astros have gone 9-10 in his 19 starts...owns a .213 opponent average and has fanned 120 in his 102.0 innings pitched on the season.

THE TURNAROUND: Has returned to form as the Astros ace over his last 11 starts, posting a 5-2 record with a 2.76 ERA (19ER/62IP), 77 strikeouts, a .216 opponent batting average and a 1.16 WHIP dating back to his start on July 25 at CWS...prior to this run, he struggled in his first 6 starts back from the IL, posting a 5.22 ERA (17ER/29.1IP) from June 16-July 19.

700 PUNCHIES: Recorded his 700th career strikeout on Sept. 20 vs. ATL...became the 20th pitcher in Astros history to record 700 strikeouts with the club...is also the 2nd pitcher in Astros history to reach 700 strikeouts within their first 119 apps., joining **RHP Lance McCullers Jr.**, who recorded 733 strikeouts within his first 119 appearances.

VS. ATH: Set to make his 2nd start vs. the A's this season and the 11th of his career, which will match the Rangers for his most starts vs. any opponent...faced the A's on Aug. 22 at Daikin Park (5.2IP/1ER) and took a no-decision in the Astros' 4-3 loss...owns a career 2.86 ERA (18ER/56.2IP) with 67 strikeouts vs. the A's...will be making his 2nd career start at Sutter Health Park, with the other coming almost a year to the day (Sept. 24, 2025).

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Had one of his best starts of the season on July 25 at CWS, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts while allowing just 2 hits and no walks...was the 1st start of his career in which he tossed 7.0+ scoreless innings while allowing 2-or-fewer hits without issuing a walk...also was outstanding in his start on Aug. 28 at NYM, allowed 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 10 strikeouts in 6.2 innings.

SAVANT SAYS: Among all Major League pitchers, he ranks in the 95th percentile in average exit velocity (86.2) and 96th percentile in groundball percentage (56.7)...also ranks in the 92nd percentile in xBA (.197) and the 78th percentile in extension (6.8)...his 86.2 mph average exit velocity ranks 4th-lowest among MLB starters (min. 100 IP).

FOUR SEAMS: Has held opponents to a .156 batting average (14x90) with his 4-seam fastball and has tossed the pitch at a 30.8-percent rate, the highest of all his pitches...his .156 opponent average with his 4-seamer would be the lowest single-season mark of his career, ahead of a .167 opponent batting average vs. the pitch in his debut 2022 season.

ALL-STAR SEASON: A 2025 All-Star, Brown finished third in the AL in Cy Young voting last season after turning in the best year of his career with a 12-9 record, a 2.43 ERA (50ER/185.1IP) and posting a 1.03 WHIP...in 2025, Brown held opponents to a career-low .201 average and posted 206 strikeouts in 185.1 innings pitched...his 2.43 ERA ranked 10th all-time among Astros starters and was the second-lowest by an Astros starter in the last 20 seasons (since 2005)...among AL starters, he ranked first in opponent SLG (.318) and second in ERA (2.43)...lastly, by reaching 206 strikeouts, he became the 18th pitcher in club history to reach 200 strikeouts in a season.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: By finishing third in the AL Cy Young voting in 2025, the Astros were granted a compensation pick immediately after the first round of the 2026 draft (No. 28 overall)...the Astros earned the pick through the Prospect Promotion Incentive (PPI), which was ratified into the latest CBA...the PPI rewards teams for promoting their best prospects to the big leagues at the start of the season, having them accrue one full year of service time and then having them factor into a major award that season or prior to qualifying for arbitration...the Astros used that selection on **RHP Jack Radel** out of Notre Dame.
