**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed a well earned day off yesterday...On Tuesday, th team fell to the Yankees, 4-2...The club will play 17 of its next 23 games in New York City...The Mets are coming off a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (18-9)...The Mets are 62-12 when scoring first this season...New York is 28-8-3 in 39 series this year...Tonight, the Mets return home on Thursday for an 11-day, 10-game homestand, the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (four games), Dodgers (three games) and Nationals (three games).

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have lost back-to-back games...The team is seeking to avoid a three-game losing streak, which would match the longest of the season...They lost three games from June 26-29 and from July 17-23...The only season in which the Mets never had more than a three-game losing streak was 1972...That season their longest losing streak was three games...The Dodgers (two games) and Athletics (three games) did not have losing streaks longer than three games in 2020...Prior to that, the last such team was the 2018 Red Sox (three games)...The last such National League. team prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)...Courtesy of Elias.

**LIGHTS OUT:** Through his first four starts of 2022, Jacob deGrom struck out 37 batters and owns a 0.51 WHIP...It's the second straight year deGrom has fanned at least 37 batters and held a WHIP of 0.55 or lower through his first four starts...He had 50 punchouts and a 0.55 WHIP through four starts in 2021...All other pitchers in major league history have combined for three such starts to a season....Corbin Burnes (40 strikeouts, 0.33 WHIP) and Joe Musgrove (37 strikeouts, 0.54 WHIP) both did it last year as well...Pedro Martinez (38 strikeouts, 0.52 WHIP) did it as Met in 2005.

AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH: In his first month back in over a year, deGrom leads the majors in several categories...He ranks first in strikeout rate (45.7 percent), WHIP (0.51), K/BB (37.00) and OBP (.148)...He also leads the majors in pitches per inning (13.1)... Only two pitchers have more strikeouts than deGrom's 37 this month: Charlie Morton and Blake Snell, who each have 38.

I CAN ONLY COUNT TO THREE: DeGrom enters tonight's start riding a 35-start streak of allowing three earned runs or fewer...Only three starters (plus Ryne Stanek, an opener) have had longer a streak...Jim Scott (1913-1914) had 39 straight starts with 3 ER or fewer allowed...Ray Washburn (1968-1970) had a 38-start streak...DeGrom can tie Claude Osteen's 36-start streak (1965-1966) tonight.

THE FANS ARE TRUE TO THE ORANGE AND BLUE: Tuesday night's contest against the Yankees delivered 817,516 Total Viewers on SNY - making it the most viewed New York Mets game in the 17-year history of the station...The game eclipsed the previous high of 806,047 Total Viewers on September 28, 2008, the last game at Shea Stadium...The ratings peaked at 9:15 p.m. with 974,888 viewers in that quarter hour...The game also garnered 3.1 million live minutes streamed on the SNY App, +100% over the season average.

**CITI SLICKERS:** With a win at home today, the Mets would secure at least a .500 record at Citi Field this year...New York has won eight of their last nine games at Citi Field and 12 of their last 14 at home...Overall, the Mets are 40-19 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .678 winning percentage at home...The team's .678 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 (55-26, .679) and 1986 (55-26, .679) teams had a better record at home...The Mets have posted a 3.12 ERA with 167 walks and 583 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

**AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS:** The Mets will face the 54-71 Rockies today...24 of the their 37 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500... The Mets are 31-12 against teams with a record below .500 this year...Their .712 winning percentage against teams with a losing record ranks fifth in the majors and third in the NL.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST**: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 135 consecutive days...According to Elias, It's tied for the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

Their .266 average is the best in the majors, while their .335 OBP ranks second and their .421 SLG ranks fifth...Jeff McNeil is batting .324/.372/.486 against righties this year...His .324 average is third in MLB and second in the Senior Circuit. ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets won the season series against the Rockies in 2019 and 2021, going 4-2 and 5-2, respectively.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has recorded 136 home runs thus far is in his career... He ranks sixth in MLB history in home runs through a player's first four career seasons... This includes the 60-game COVID-19 shortened 2020 season...Only Ryan Howard (153) and Aaron Judge (138) have hit more home runs through their first 500 career games.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** The Mes are batting .272 with runners in scoring position this season...Their .272 average is third in the majors as is their 294 hits, while their 426 RBI with RISP are second...Pete Alonso has hit 12 home runs and 74 RBI with RISP...His 12 home runs with RISP are the most in the majors, while his 74 RBI ranks second in the majors and tops the National League...The single-season franchise record for home runs with RISP is 15 by Todd Hundley in 1996...Three players have recorded 13 home runs with RISP - Carlos Beltran (2006), George Foster (1983) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)...The single-season franchise record for RBI with RISP set by David Wright with 91 in 2006.

**JUICY J:** Jeff McNeil is batting .313 (35-112) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year..That is the fourth-best mark by a lefty this year in the majors...He leads the majors in batting average with a .414 (36-87) mark in the month of August...In 23 games this month, he is batting .414/.441/.632 with 13 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and three walks.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets are 21-11 in the second-half...The team's 21 wins are the tied for the third-most in the majors, and their .656 winning percentage ranks fourth... The team is batting .274/.344/.442 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and in average and are fourth SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 157-118 following the break.

**M-V-PETE:** Pete Alonso has collected his 24 game-winning RBI this year, tying a Mets single-season record also held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 10 of the Mets' 21 second-half wins.

**LIFE IN THE FAST LANE:** Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 97 strikeouts...That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 49.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in a season in major league history...Aroldis Chapman currently owns the record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 4, 2012 in 51.0 innings...Armando Benítez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings... Courtesy of Elias.

**BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS:** Diaz has struck out 51.3% of batters faced (97/189), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 49 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.70 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 28 saves, a 1.46 ERA (8 ER/49.1 IP), allowing 29 hits and 15 walks...The Mets are 43-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

**COOKIE'S KIDS PROGRAM:** Throughout this season, Carlos Carrasco is partnering with Northwell Health to meet with pediatric cancer patients and their families and share His inspiring story of overcoming cancer...Earlier today, Carrasco visited patients at Cohen Children's Medical Center and gifted them with Mets swag and Cookie's Kids T-shirts.

**PROM SERIES:** Prom Series is an organization founded by former Met Daniel Murphy and his wife, Tori...Run by Major League Baseball Wives, Prom Series hosts teens from foster care agencies for an unforgettable night at MLB stadiums...Tonight, girls from Graham Windham foster care agency underwent a full night of shopping for brand new back to school clothes, got their hair and makeup done, and spent the evening getting the big-league treatment...They also received customized Mets jerseys and hats, brand new school supplies from the Amazin' Mets Foundation, and tickets to enjoy tonight's game in their own suite.

**AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH:** In his first month back in over a year, deGrom leads the majors in several categories...He ranks first in strikeout rate (45.7 percent), WHIP (0.51), K/BB (37.00) and OBP (.148)...He also leads the majors in pitches per inning (13.1)...Only two pitchers have more strikeouts than deGrom's 37 this month: Charlie Morton and Blake Snell, who each have 38.

**THIS NOTE ROX:** DeGrom has a lifetime 1.17 ERA (8 ER/61.1 IP) against Colorado over nine starts...That is the lowest mark ever against the club among the 184 pitchers who have thrown 50.0 innings or more vs. the Rockies...He has been even more dominant at home against Colorado, owning a 0.88 ERA when facing the Rockies at Citi Field... He faced the Rox twice last year and allowed one earned run in 11.0 innings with 23 strikeouts and one walk...The Mets won both games.

**SINCE 2020:** Has a 1.72 ERA (35 ER/183.1 IP) in 31 starts over the last three seasons... Has 287 strikeouts and 30 walks in that span...His ERA is the best in MLB (min. 162.0 IP) in that span by more than half a run...He also leads the majors in WHIP (0.70), K/9 (14.09) and K/BB ratio (9.57).

**IN deCITI:** Has allowed more than three earned runs only once in his last 34 starts in Queens, posting a 1.59 ERA (38 ER/214.2 IP) at home since May 1, 2019...He had a 1.20 ERA (8 ER/60.0 IP) in 2021...His 2.09 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings) and the fifth-lowest since ER became an official stat in 1913...The four pitchers with a better home ERA all had their careers end before 1930.

**THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE:** Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.95 ERA in 95 starts... That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP)...Justin Verlander is second with a 2.39 ERA, while teammate Max Scherzer has posted a 2.68 ERA since 2018...Since 1920, only three other starting pitchers have held an ERA of 1.95 or lower over a span this long: Sandy Koufax, Greg Maddux and Clayton Kershaw.

**200 CLUB:** On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his fourth win in as many starts, which is the longest such streak of his career...Bassitt went 6.0 innings allowing two runs on seven hits...He struck out only four batters but did not allow a walk for the fourth time this season.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Bassitt has won four consecutive starts for the first time in his career... He has allowed two runs or fewer in all four starts and has a 0.69 ERA (2 ER/26.0 IP) in that span...The Mets are 5-1 in his six starts since the All-Star break, a period in which Bassitt has gone 4-1 with a 1.85 ERA (8 ER/39.0 IP).


