

## HOUSTON ASTROS (33-28) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (23-39) June 5, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #63/Home #32 LHP Framber Valdez (5-4, 3.12 ERA) vs. RHP Mitch Keller (1-7, 3.73 ERA)

THE PIRATES: shut out Houston, 3-0, on Wednesday during the second game of this nine-game homestand...Went 3-3 on their recent road trip to Arizona (2-1) and San Diego (1-2) from May 26-June 1...Are 5-9 during interleague play this season...Have gone 11-13 since Don Kelly managed his first game on May 9...Have posted the second-best fielding percentage (.992) in all of Major League Baseball since Kelly took over (New York-AL has a Major League-best .995 fielding percentage during that time)...Have played in 11 one-run games since Kelly became manager (have a 5-6 record in those games).

**FIRING BLANKS:** Pittsburgh recorded its seventh shutout of the season on Wednesday vs. Houston, tied with Kansas City and St. Louis for third-most in all of Major League Baseball...Only San Diego (10) and Cleveland (eight) have more shutouts...Pirates pitchers posted 12 shutouts last season, but didn't notch their seventh shutout until July 24 (first shutout didn't come until May 4).

**MASTERFUL MIKE:** Mike Burrows tossed 5.1 scoreless innings while allowing just five hits (zero walks) and recording six strikeouts on Wednesday vs. Houston (threw only 70 pitches)...It was tied for the second-longest outing of his professional career, trailing only an outing of 7.0 scoreless innings for Double-A Altoona on May 26, 2022 at Harrisburg...He's one of just 10 Pirates rookies (11 instances) since at least 1901 to pitch 5.1-plus scoreless innings with six-plus strikeouts while issuing zero walks in an outing.

**A CALL TO ARMS:** The Pirates have posted a 3.19 ERA (211.2ip/75er) since Don Kelly managed his first game on May 9 vs. Atlanta...That's the sixth-lowest ERA in all of Major League Baseball in that span, behind San Francisco (2.54), Texas (2.64), New York-NL (2.82), Tampa Bay (2.85) and Minnesota (3.08)...Pittsburgh has also surrendered the second-fewest home runs (14) in that stretch (San Francisco, 13).

**ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER:** Mitch Keller has held right-handed hitters to a .258 slugging percentage, trailing only New York (NL)'s Kodai Senga (.252) for the lowest mark among qualified National League pitchers (Paul Skenes, .279, ranks fourth)... In his last five starts (since May 7 at St. Louis), Keller has a 2.90 ERA (31.0ip/10er).

**PLAY RENEGADE:** David Bednar converted his seventh straight save opportunity to begin the season in Wednesday's shutout win vs. Houston...Since the start of the 2022 season, Bednar's 88 saves are tied for eighth-most in all of Major League Baseball (Houston's Josh Hader, 119, ranks second on that list)...In his last 20 games (since April 19 vs. Cleveland), Bednar has a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 26 strikeouts.

**PHILTHY NUMBERS:** Pittsburgh will continue its nine-game homestand with three games vs. Philadelphia this weekend...In 72 games against their cross-state rival at PNC Park since the stadium opened in 2001, the Pirates are 43-29 (have also won three of the last four series played here).

**22 CLOSING IN ON 2200:** Andrew McCutchen comes into tonight's game two hits shy of 2200 for his career (he would become the 190th player in Major League Baseball history to record at least 2200 hits)...McCutchen has recorded 1713 hits as a member of the Pirates, the ninth-most in team history...His 240 home runs with Pittsburgh are tied with Roberto Clemente for third-most in team history, while his 2198 career hits are third-most among active players.

**POUR SOME SHUGART ON ME:** Chase Shugart stranded his inherited runner on Wednesday vs. Houston and has now stranded each of his 13 inherited runners this season...He is the only Major League pitcher with at least 13 inherited runners that hasn't allowed an inherited runner to score...Since breaking into the big leagues with Boston in 2024, he's allowed only one of his 16 inherited runners to score...His .195 (17-for-87) batting average against this season is the sixth-lowest among all qualified Major League rookie relievers.

**STARTING OFF:** The 29-year-old Keller is in his seventh Major League season...He signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 23, 2024... He earned Opening Day honors in both 2023 and 2024, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16... He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Keller allowed three runs on three hits and two walks (one strikeout) over 6.0 innings on May 30 at San Diego, losing a 3-2 decision at Petco Park...Across his last five starts (since May 7 at St. Louis), Keller has posted a 2.90 ERA (31.0ip/10er).

**<u>AGAINST THE ASTROS</u>**: Keller has faced Houston once in his career, coming on April 11, 2023...In that start, a 7-4 Pittsburgh win (Ji Hwan Bae hit a walkoff, three-run homer), he had a no-decision while allowing two runs (seven strikeouts) in 6.0 innings.

**<u>RIGHT AT HOME</u>**: Keller has 364 career strikeouts here at PNC Park, trailing only Paul Maholm (383) and Francisco Liriano (371) for the most in stadium history...Keller's 73 starts here trail only Maholm (100) and Zach Duke (82) for the most among all pitchers.

<u>**K IS FOR KELLER:**</u> Keller enters the action tonight with 743 strikeouts, 18th-most in Pirates history...Howie Camnitz ranks 17th with 806 (Bob Friend ranks first with 1682).

**KEEPING THINGS CLOSE:** Keller has pitched in six one-run games this season, including each of his last two starts and three of his last four starts...Keller has gone 1-2 with a 2.17 ERA (37.1ip/9er) and 29 strikeouts across those six one-run contests.

**STAYING IN THE PARK:** Keller has allowed only 0.51 home runs per 9.0 innings pitched this season, good for third-best among all qualified National League pitchers (seventh in MLB)...Paul Skenes (0.54) is fourth and 10th, respectively, on those lists.

**IN NEED OF SUPPORT:** The Pirates have scored one or zero runs while Keller was in the game in eight of his 12 starts this season...Keller's 2.19 average runs of support while in the game this season are the fewest among all qualified Major League pitchers.

**THE 700 CLUB:** With his strikeout of St. Louis' Pedro Pagés in the seventh inning of his start on April 9, Keller notched his 700th career strikeout...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest pitcher in club history to reach 700 strikeouts with Pittsburgh by innings (718.1)...The previous record was held by Bob Veale (740.0 innings)...Per Elias, he also became the third-fastest pitcher in team history to reach the 700-strikeout mark with Pittsburgh by games (136), behind only Gerrit Cole (126) and Veale (135).
