## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (33-29) vs. HOUSTON ASTROS (28-35)

June 4, 2026 - Daikin Park - Houston, TX - 7:10 CDT - Game #63/Road #30

RHP Jared Jones (0-0, 10.38 ERA) vs. RHP Kai-Wei Teng (3-3, 2.57 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** had their four-game winning streak (since May 29 vs. Minnesota) snapped with Wednesday's 11-9 loss at Houston...Will play one more game at Daikin Park before heading to Atlanta for a three-game series from Friday-Sunday at Truist Park...Went 5-2 on their recent seven-game homestand vs. Chicago-NL (2-2, May 25-28) and Minnesota (3-0, May 29-31)...Have scored the fourth-most runs in Major League Baseball (320), behind Washington (331), Los Angeles-NL (328) and Atlanta (327)...Have 62 steals, tied with Milwaukee for the second-most in all of MLB, behind Miami (71).

**JUST PEACHY:** Pittsburgh will head to Atlanta for a three-game series (Friday-Sunday) at Truist Park following tonight's game in Houston...The Pirates won four of six games against the Braves last season (they won two of three games from May 9-11 at PNC Park and two of three games to end the season from September 26-28 at Truist Park)...It was their first season series victory over the Braves since 2017 (5-2)...The series win in Atlanta was Pittsburgh's first in the city since June 5-7, 2015 at Turner Field (2-1).

**ASTROWORLD:** The Pirates would capture their third straight series victory in Houston with a win tonight (they won two of three games here from June 25-27, 2019 and two of three games here from July 29-31, 2024)...Pittsburgh has never won three straight series here at Daikin Park, which opened in 2000...The Pirates also won back-to-back series here from May 2-August 14, 2005, April 2-August 26, 2007 and June 14-July 17, 2011...Their only streaks of at least three straight series wins in the city of Houston came from Aug. 16, 1965-May 24, 1967 (five), June 14, 1971-July 6, 1972 (four) & June 14, 1976-May 15, 1977 (three).

**PRIME NINE:** Pittsburgh has scored at least nine runs in four straight games (since May 30 vs. Minnesota), marking the first time the Pirates have done that since also doing it in four straight games from August 16-18 (G1), 1928...Their only such streaks of at least five games during the Modern Era (since 1901) came from September 4 (G1)-6 (G2), 1901 (six games) and August 28-September 1, 1925 (five games)...Pittsburgh's 10 games with at least nine runs rank tied for fourth in Major League Baseball.

**K COLLECTORS:** Pirates pitchers have struck out at least nine batters in eight straight games (since May 26 vs. Chicago-NL) for the third time in the Modern Era (since 1901), along with Sept. 20-27, 2016 and Sept. 17-25, 2022...Their 90 strikeouts during the streak are tied with August 7-20, 2020 and Sept. 8-15 (G2), 2015 for their third-most in any eight-game span in the Modern Era, trailing Sept. 5-12, 2014 (93) and Sept. 9-16, 2015 (92)...Pittsburgh's 569 strikeouts this season rank fifth in Major League Baseball, behind only Cleveland (588), New York-NL (577), Milwaukee (575) & Philadelphia (574).

**WE HAVE LIFTOFF:** Henry Davis (grand slam) and Nick Gonzales (two-run) connected for home runs on Wednesday at Houston...Pittsburgh has homered in 10 straight games (since May 24 at Toronto) for the first time since June 21-30, 2022...The Pirates' only such streaks of at least 11 games in the Modern Era (since 1901) came from July 1-9, 1966 (12 games), June 19-July 3, 1994 (13 games), June 23-July 3, 2012 (11 games) and August 5-18, 2015 (12 games)...Pittsburgh has also hit multiple home runs in five straight games (since May 29 vs. Minnesota) for the first time since August 22-26, 2014...The Pirates' only such streaks (within a single season) of at least six games during the Modern Era came from July 1-4 (G2), 1966 (six games) and May 23-31, 2006 (eight games)...Davis' grand slam was the first of his career and was the first by a Pirate vs. Houston since Jack Wilson on August 14, 2005 (off Mike Burns) at then-Minute Maid Park.

**GOOD AS GONZO:** Nick Gonzales went 2-for-5 with a double, a home run and three RBI on Wednesday night at Houston...He has gone 9-for-17 (.529) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven runs scored over his last four games (since May 30 vs. Minnesota).

**INDISPENCEABLE:** Spencer Horwitz went 3-for-5 on Wednesday night at Houston...He is batting .345 (30-for-87) with five doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks, a .422 OBP, a .563 slugging percentage, a .985 OPS and 13 runs scored over his last 25 games, dating back to May 6 at Arizona...Horwitz' batting average during that stretch ranks third in all of Major League Baseball (minimum 100 plate appearances)...He is trailing only Los Angeles (NL)' Shohei Ohtani (.383) and the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (.348).

June 4, 1986: Barry Bonds, who connected for the first home run of his Major League career with a solo shot (off Craig McMurty) in the fifth inning, finished a triple shy of the cycle after going 4-for-5 with a double, a home run, four RBI and three runs in the Pirates' 12-3 win over the Braves at Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium. Jim Winn secured the save after pitching 3.1 perfect innings to finish the game.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh's 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)... It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (was reinstated from the 60-day injured list on May 29).

**MAKING A COMEBACK:** Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

**ON THE MEND:** Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakeland), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

**2024 IN REVIEW:** Jones went 6-8 with a 4.14 ERA (121.2ip/56er) and 132 strikeouts in 22 starts during his rookie season (2024)...His 132 strikeouts ranked sixth among all Major League rookies (his teammate, Paul Skenes, ranked fourth with 170 strikeouts).

**STRIKE 'EM OUT:** Jones' 98 strikeouts prior to the 2024 All-Star break were the most by any Pirates rookie prior to the break, surpassing Cy Blanton (79) in 1935...He led the South Atlantic League in strikeouts (142) while he was w/High-A Greensboro (2022).

**HISTORIC OUTING:** Jones allowed just one baserunner (it was a fifth-inning double to Elias Díaz) while striking out 10 batters over 7.0 scoreless innings on May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado...He became the first and only Pittsburgh pitcher to have an outing of at least 7.0 scoreless innings, one/zero hits allowed, zero walks surrendered and 10 strikeouts.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Jones struck out at least seven batters in each of his first five Major League starts (March 30-April 22, 2024)...He joined Pittsburgh's Jose DeLeon (July 23-August 10, 1983), Washington's Stephen Strasburg (June 8-28, 2010) and New York (AL)'s Masahiro Tanaka (April 4-27, 2014) as the only pitchers to accomplish that.

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** Jones struck out 10 batters over 5.2 innings of work in his Major League debut on March 30, 2024 at Miami...He became the first Pirate with at least 10 strikeouts in his Major League debut since Tim Wakefield on July 31, 1992 vs. St. Louis (he was the first National League pitcher to do that since Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta on May 13, 2018 at Colorado)...Jones' 10 strikeouts in his debut were one shy of the franchise record in a debut, set by Nick Maddox (1907) & matched by Dick Hall (1955).

**KEEPING UP WITH THE JONES':** Jones is a 2020 graduate of La Mirada (CA) High School/was committed to pitch at the University of Texas at Austin before being selected by Pittsburgh in the second round of the First Year-Player Draft...His father, Keith, was selected by Arizona in 1997 and played two seasons with the organization.
