METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Angels, 7-3, last night...The Mets are seeking their 14th series victory of the season...New York is 13-3-2 in 18 series this year...The Mets continue their final series of a 10-game, 11-day California road trip (4-4)...They have faced the Dodgers (2-2), Padres (1-2) and Angels (1-0)...Following this trip, the Mets are off on Monday before they return home for a seven-game homestand against the Brewers (three games) and Marlins (four games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Mets Owner & CEO Steve Cohen celebrates his birthday today... In addition, José Reyes celebrates his 39th birthday today...Reyes spent 12 years with the Mets and hit .282/.334/.433 with 108 home runs and 521 RBI...He is the team's all-time lead with 408 steals...He stole a single-season franchise record 78 bases during the 2007 season.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco is tied for the major league lead with seven wins this season...He is 7-1 with a 3.52 ERA (25 earned runs/64.0 innings) with 13 walks and 61 strikeouts this season...He has earned a win in each of his last four starts and has won six straight decisions...Over his last seven starts, his 6-0 with a 3.00 ERA (14 earned runs/42.0 innings) with nine walks and 38 punchouts.

MISSING THREES: The Mets snapped their two-game losing streak last night...New York has not lost three straight this season...According to Elias, the only other time the Mets have gone 60 or more games into a season without a three-game losing streak was in 2006 (first three-game losing streak came in 78th game of the season).

IT'S BEEN AWHILE: The Mets are facing the Angels for the first time since May 19-21, 2017 at Citi Field and play for the first time in Angel Stadium since April 11-13, 2014... The Mets were slated to play the Angels in California from August 18-20, 2020... Francisco Lindor has hit three doubles and five home runs in 16 career games at the ballpark.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play against the Angels tonight...The Mets are 2-2 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .511 winning percentage (228-218) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

HANG 10: The Mets collected 13 hits in last night's win...The Mets are 18-3 when recording 10 or more hits this season...Their 18 wins when recording 10 hits is second in the majors...The Cardinals are 20-3 with 10+ hits in a game this season. The Mets have scored 10 or more runs in eight games this year...That is second in the majors and tied with the Nationals for the most in the NL...The Mets are 7-1 in such games.

RIGHT AWAY: The Mets are batting .272/.340/.418 against right-handed pitchers this year...Their .272 average and .340 OBP against righties is the best in The Show... Jeff McNeil tops the NL with a .345 (49-142) average against right-handed pitchers... Pete Alonso is 10th in the NL with a .297 (51-172) mark, while Starling Marte is 12th in the Senior Circuit with a .292 (45-154) average...The Mets are 28-11 when facing a right-handed pitcher this year.

ROAD WARRIOR: Pete Alonso is batting .273/.324/.531 with nine home runs and 31 RBI on the road this year...He owns a lifetime .942 OPS on the road...His .942 OPS is the highest in franchise history (min. 900 PA)...His .581 SLG on the road is also the best in franchise history...In 2022, his nine road homers are tied for fourth in the majors and are tied for the most in the NL...His 31 RBI on the road are second-most in the majors and top the NL.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil's .337 road batting average is the third-best in the Senior Circuit and seventh in the majors...Over his last eight games, Jeff McNeil is batting .379 (11-29) with four runs, a double, two RBI, a walk, with a .419 OBP and an .833 OPS...He ranks eighth in the majors and third in the National League with a .318 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22...He is hitting .345 (49-142) with 11 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 10 walks with a .394 OBP and a .500 SLG against right-handed pitchers this season... His .345 average against righties is fourth in the majors and is the best in National League.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has 21 multi-hit games this year which is third in the majors and the most in the National League...He has collected 131 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 36th in franchise history...Joel Youngblood and Ken Boswell are tied at 34th with 132 multi-hit games...Pete Alonso has recorded 106 career multi-hit games, placing him tied for 53rd with Asdrubal Cabrera in team history...Dave Kingman is 51st with 107 multi-hit games.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets ranked third in the majors with 539 strikeouts this season... Only the Milwaukee Brewers (574) and the Atlanta Braves (549) have struck out more batters this year...New York owns a 3.08 strikeout per walk ratio this year...That is the third-best in the NL behind only the Dodgers (3.48) and Giants (3.11).

ANGELS-METS NOTES: The Mets are making just their fourth appearance at Angel Stadium...It's the first appearance since April 11-13, 2014 (1-2)...The have also played at the ballpark from June 16-18, 2008 (2-1) and June 13-15, 2003 (2-1)

STRIKE THAT: The Mets batters have struck out 448 times this year...That is the seventh-fewest strikeouts in MLB and the third-fewest in the NL...They have struck out 19.5% this year...The Mets are one of six teams who have struck out less than 20% this season...Their 19.5% strikeout rate is third in the majors and second in the NL.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a major league leading 40 times this year...The Mets have been hit nine times in the last nine games...The Mets have been hit 274 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 60 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 42 HBP and Jeff McNeil is ninth at 36 HBP.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets the majors with a .292 average with runners in scoring position...They rank third in MLB with a .362 OBP and fourth with a .456 SLG in those situations...Tomás Nido leads the club, hitting .423 (11-26) in those situations...Jeff McNeil - .388 (19-49), Mark Canha - .348 (16-46), J.D. Davis - .348 (8-23), Pete Alonso - .346 (18-52), and Francisco Lindor - .310 (18-58) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the majors with 41 RBI in RISP situations and has nine home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors.

TWO-OUT POWER: New York leads the majors with 114 two-out RBI this year...The club's .249 batting average with two outs is sixth in the majors.

FOGO POWER: Eduardo Escobar is on a four-game hitting streak, batting .500 (8-16) with five runs, two doubles, a triple, a home run and six RBI in that span...Over his last 17 games, Escobar is batting .338 (24-71) with 12 runs, six doubles, a triple, three home runs, 15 RBI with a .577 SLG and a .906 OPS...He is batting .328/.362/.641 against left-handed pitching this season.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last 11 games, Tomás Nido is batting .364 (12-33) with six runs, a double, six RBI, three walks with an .811 OPS...Over his last 20 games, he is batting .300 (18-60) with six runs, two doubles, eight RBI, five walks with a .354 OBP...He has raised his batting average from .188 to .255 in 24 games since May 1.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 20-13 on the road this year...Their .606 road winning percentage is the fifth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...They did not record their 20th road win until July 18 in 2021 (20-28)...New York is batting .259/.328/.398 away from Citi Field...Their .259 road average ranks second in the majors, while their .328 OBP ranks fourth.

BY THE WAY: New York has won 39 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .650 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the best in the NL...The team has posted a 39-21 record through the team's first 60 games...Only the 1986 (44-16) team posted a better record through the first 60 games of the season.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: Over his last 14 games, J.D. Davis is batting .333 (16-48) with nine runs, four doubles, six RBI, four walks with a .389 OBP, a .417 SLG and an .806 OPS in that span...Over his last 23 games, Davis is batting .269/.337/.359...He owns a .302/.387/.444 slashline in 22 road games, compared to a .170/.264/.213 slashline in 16 games at Citi Field in 2022.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the ninth-most in the majors...He is second in the major leagues and first in the NL among relievers with 43 strikeouts...His 16.35 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...He has struck out 43 of the 94 batters he faced, good for 45.7%...He is 2-1 with 11 saves, a 2.28 ERA (six earned runs/23.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are 23-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets... That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodríguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Diaz is 10-14 with 74 saves, a 3.76 ERA (71 earned runs/170.0 innings) with 69 walks and 281 strikeouts... His 281 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors... Only Liam Hendriks (308) and Josh Hader (301) have struck out more...Additionally, his 279 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 287...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Earned the win after tossing 7.0 innings of two-run ball with five hits and 10 strikeouts on June 6 at San Diego...Was his 27th career outing with double-digit strikeouts and his first as a Met...Last struck out 10 or more batters in a game on September 20, 2020 at Detroit while with Cleveland...Marked his third outing of at least 7.0 innings this year, tied with Max Scherzer for the most on the club.

WINNER, WINNER: Has won six consecutive decisions for the first time since winning a career-high 10 contests from August 27, 2017-April 23, 2018...The six-game winning streak matches his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...His seven wins on the year are tied for the most in the majors...The last Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season was Zack Wheeler (seven) from July 14-August 25, 2017.

THAT'S QUALITY STUFF: Registered his fourth quality start of the season in his last outing on June 4...Tallied three quality starts through his first six games of the year for the first time since he registered three straight to begin the 2020 season (July 26-August 6, 2020)...Notched just two such starts last season...Earned back-to-back quality starts on May 3 (G2) and May 10, his first time since finishing the 2020 season with six in a row.

ANGELS IN THE OUTFIELD: Will be facing an American League West opponent for the second time this year, after having not seen the division since 2019...Is 19-11 with a 3.79 ERA (111 earned runs/263.2 innings) in 49 career games (38 starts) against the AL West...His 3.79 ERA is his best against any division in which he has appeared in at least 20 games...Last faced Los Angeles-AL on September 11, 2019 on the road while with Cleveland...Earned the win through 1.2 innings of scoreless, hitless relief...Last made a start against the Angels on July 26, 2017, allowing two runs on six hits (one home run) and two hit batters with eight strikeouts through 6.1 innings of the no decision...Has not made a start at Angel Stadium of Anaheim since August 4, 2015...Is 3-0 with a 2.02 ERA (11 earned runs/49.0 innings) in 11 career games (five starts) against Los Angeles-AL in his career...According to *Sportradar*, among active players with a minimum 40 innings against the Halos, only Chris Sale (1.06) has a lower ERA.

WALK THIS WAY: Did not issue a free pass in his last start after allowing a career-high-tying five walks on June 1...His 1.83 walks per 9.0 innings and 4.9 percent walk rate remain the fourth-best marks in the National League...Also owns a 4.69 strikeout-to-walk ratio, fifth-best in the NL...His five contests without a walk are tied for the second-most among major league starting pitchers this season...Issued just eight walks through his first nine starts to begin the year before that June 1 outing...Issued a walk his first time through the batting order in that appearance for the first time this season...Was the only starter in the majors (min. 4 GS) without a walk in such a situation entering the game.

TOUGH COOKIE: Pitched with his father in attendance for the first time in his major league career on June 1 vs. Washington, earning the win...He did not allow a run through 11.0 innings from May 3-10, his longest such streak since also doing so in 11.0 straight innings from September 15-25, 2020...Has multiple scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings (also, April 10-21) in a single season for the first time since 2019.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco needs four wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER [3-2, 3.28]

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss on June 7 at San Diego, allowing four runs on five hits (one home run) and two walks with four strikeouts through 6.0 innings...The Mets have been shut out in each of his last two starts.

NO FLY ZONE: Walker has allowed just three home runs in 46.2 innings this season, good for a 0.58 HR/9 ratio...That ranks 19th in the majors and 10th in the NL among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings...His 29.2 homerless innings streak spanning five starts from May 12-June 2 came to an end in his last outing.

- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (six) and is tied for second in games with multiple RBI (13) this season...He is the first player since Carlos Lee in 2005 with at least six 4+ RBI games in his team's first 55 contests...The only players with more through 55 team games are Juan Gonzalez (eight in 1998), Jimmie Foxx (seven in 1938) and Lou Gehrig (seven in 1930)...All three of those players finished the season with at least 157 RBI.
- Hit two homers and drove in five on June 4 at Los Angeles-NL...Was his 13th career multi-homer game (tied for most since 2019).
- Has a 1.377 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 18-52 (.346/.473/.904) with two doubles, nine homers, 41 RBI and 15 walks.
- After putting up a .744 OPS in April, owns a .991 OPS since May 1 (10th-best in MLB)...Set a Mets record with 30 RBI in May...Willie Montañez (1978) had the old mark with 28 RBI in May...He is the seventh Met with 30+ RBI in a calendar month.
- Hit his third career walk-off home run on May 19 vs. St. Louis to help the Mets win a four-game series.
