RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals play the finale of a three-game weekend series with the division-rival Milwaukee Brewers this afternoon at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals have tallied back-to-back one-run wins over the Brewers after starting 0-5 in one-run games ... The Cardinals fly to the Queen City after today's game for a four-game series with the division-rival Cincinnati Reds at Great American Ball Park.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in 4th place in the National League Central Division, 4.5 games behind first place Chicago ... The Cardinals (+4) Brewers (+11), and Rays (+12) are the only three MLB teams with losing records and positive run differentials.

BOTTOMS UP: The Cardinals have won three straight series vs. the Brewers, including six of their last eight games overall (Aug. 21, 2024-present).

- A win today would give St. Louis its 2nd series sweep of the season (March 27-29 vs. Twins) and first of the Brew Crew since Sept. 20-23, 2021 at Milwaukee (4g) ... The last Redbirds sweep of the Brewers in St. Louis was April 22-24, 2019 (3g).

- The Cardinals own the most wins against the Brewers (246-197, .555) since St. Louis and Milwaukee began regular season play in 1997, and since the Seattle Pilots joined MLB as an expansion team in 1969, only the Minnesota Twins (255-242, .513) have more wins over Pilots/Brewers than St. Louis.

NADO'S WALK-OFF WINNERS: Nolan Arenado yesterday notched his 12th career walk-off RBI (4th with St. Louis) and 6th career walk-off home run (3rd with St. Louis) ... Arenado is responsible for the last three Cardinals walk-off victories:

- April 26, 2025 vs. Milwaukee - solo homer off Trevor Megill
- Aug. 28, 2024 vs. San Diego - single off Robert Suárez
- Aug. 21, 2024 vs. Milwaukee - grand slam off Trevor Megill

HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT: St. Louis is 10-4 (.714) at Busch Stadium this season, the 9th-best home winning pct. in MLB (Mets lead at 12-1, .923 at Citi Field) ... With a win this afternoon, the Cardinals will boast their best home start through the first 15 home games since 2019 (11-4, .733).

THERE GOES THE PERFECT GAME: Leadoff hitter **Lars Nootbaar** has drawn 10 walks to open games this season, breaking **Davey Lopes's** (1975 Dodgers) MLB single-season record in the months of March/April.

- The single-season Major League record for leadoff walks in any month is held by **Eddie Yost** aka "The Walking Man" with 12 in August of 1952 with the Washington Senators.
- 1951 **Eddie Stanky** holds the Cardinals single-season record of leadoff free-passes (27).

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Cardinals lead Major League Baseball in Outs Above Average (17), Runs Prevented (14) and Fan-graphs' Defensive Runs Above Average (9.4), while ranking 3rd in Defensive Runs Saved (15), T-3rd in fielding percentage (.989), and 5th in Groundball Out Pct. (77.6%).

IT IS YOUR BIRTHDAY: Happy 50th birthday to Cardinals Hall of Famer **Chris Carpenter** ...Other notables born on this date include **Corey Seager** (31), **George Gervin** (73), **Casey Kasem** (1932-2014), **Enos Slaughter** (1916-2002), **Rogers Hornsby** (1896-1963), and **Ulysses S. Grant** (1822-85).

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (April 27, 2005): Leadoff hitter **Mark Grudzielanek** becomes the 16th Cardinal to hit for the cycle and the third to accomplish the rare feat at home in a 6-3 win over the Brewers at Busch Memorial Stadium ... Grudzielanek led off the game with a homer, singled in the 2nd inning, hit a ground-rule double in the 4th, and then finished the cycle with a triple in the 6th inning.

MILWAUKEE CONNECTIONS

Ryan Helsley (April 16, 2019) made his MLB debut at Milwaukee.

Trevor Megill was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign to return to Loyola Marymount Univ.

Willson Contreras's younger brother, **William**, is also a catcher for the Brewers.

Caleb Durbin played college baseball at Washington University in St. Louis (2019-21).

Late Brewers broadcaster **Bob Uecker** played two seasons (1964-65) with St. Louis...won the 1964 World Series...traded by the Milwaukee Braves to St. Louis for **Jimmie Coker** & **Gary Kolb** (Apr. 9, 1964).

Connor Thomas was selected by St. Louis in the 5th round of the 2019 MLB Draft...pitched five seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (2019-24)...selected by Milwaukee in the 2024 Rule 5 Draft (Dec. 11, 2024).

José Quintana made one postseason and 12 regular season starts for the Cardinals in 2022...acquired at the 2022 MLB Trade Deadline with **Chris Stratton** from Pittsburgh in exchange for **Johan Oviedo** and **Malcom Nuñez**.

Hall of Famer **Ted Simmons** played five seasons with Milwaukee (1981-85), where he was a two-time AL All-Star and faced off against St. Louis in the 1982 World Series...traded to Milwaukee with **Rollie Fingers** & **Pete Vuckovich** for **David Green**, **Sixto Lezcano**, **Dave LaPoint** & **Lary Sorensen**.

Ricky Horton made five starts for the Denver Zephyrs (AAA) in the Brewers organization in 1990.

Brewers Media Relations Intern **Owen Buescher** previously work as a 2024 Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate...graduated from Belleville (Ill.) West High School and the University of Missouri (2020-24).

KMOX broadcaster **Matt Pauley** hosted Brewers pre- and postgame shows for parts of six seasons (2017-22)...was radio play-by-play voice of the Univ. of Wisconsin-Green Bay women's basketball team.

Steve Dillard, father of Brewers broadcaster **Tim Dillard**, was hitting coach for the Single-A Quad Cities Swing/River Bandits from 2006-07 and hitting coach for the High-A Palm Beach Cardinals in 2007...later piloted Quad Cities in 2008-09, where he managed infielder **Oliver Marmol**.

Brewers broadcaster **Jeff Levering** previously worked three seasons (2010-12) as broadcaster for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played in 73 games for Milwaukee in 2010.

Cardinals Dir. of Medical Ops/Head Athletic Trainer **Adam Olsen** is a native of Green Bay...graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Has entered his 8th season in Major League Baseball and his 1st to begin a season with the Cardinals. Has previously pitched for the Nationals (2017-22) and White Sox (2024).
- Making his 6th start of the season (3rd at home) with earlier home starts against the Twins (3/29) & Astros (4/15).
- Is working on 5 days rest today; is 7-14 career with a 5.09 ERA (203.1 IP/115 ER) in 39 career starts on 5 days rest.
- His 3.30 ERA over the past two seasons (2024-25) ranks 19th in MLB among qualifying pitchers (204.1 IP/75 ER); Is ranked 2nd among that group with his 1.88 Home ERA (86.1 IP/18 ER) in 15 starts.
- Is 2-3 with 2.76 ERA in 8 career starts at Busch Stadium, including a 2-3 mark with 1.89 ERA (33.1 IP/7 ER) in his 6 starts as a Cardinal at Busch Stadium with no HR's allowed.
- Owns the majors 13th-best qualifying ERA (1.50) dating to his 4/9 start, but is the only pitcher in that grouping who has not yet received credit for a win in that span.**
- Leads the team with 14 walks in his 27.0 IP for an NL-high 4.67 walks/9 IP mark; has walked 3+ batters in each of this last four starts.
- The Cardinals have gone down to defeat in each of this last four starts since he recorded a 5-1 win in his 2025 season debut on 3/29 vs. MIN.

LAST TIME OUT: Worked 6.0 IP for the 3rd-straight start and for the 4th time in his 5 starts this season last Mon. (4/21) at ATL. Allowed just 2 runs and left the game with a 3-2 lead, but took a no-decision after the Braves plated 5 runs in their 8th and held on for a 7-6 win.

2025/CAREER NOTES:

- Followed up his 6.0 no-hit inning effort on 4/9 at PIT with 6.0 solid innings (season-high 96 pitches) on 4/15 in his Jackie Robinson Day start vs. HOU; allowed just one run, and was saddled with the 2-0 defeat in a match-up with the Astros Hunter Brown.
- His 6.0 no-hit innings on 4/9 at PIT represented the deepest that he had carried a no-no at the MLB level (previous best was 3.0 IP - last on 6/18/21 vs. NYM).
- Exited his 4/4 start vs. BOS after 3.0 innings in the Red Sox home opener at Fenway Park in a 13-9 loss allowing six runs on five hits. Was his most runs allowed as a member of the Cardinals in 12 starts. Previous high was five runs at CHI in his first start with St. Louis in 2024.
- Started the Cardinals 2nd game of season (3/29 vs. MIN) and allowed just one run on two hits in his 6.0 IP (73 pitches), earning the 5-1 win.
- Went 2-5 with a 3.72 ERA in his 10 starts with the Cardinals last season and had a 7-4 mark with 3.11 ERA in 21 starts for the White Sox.
- Was acquired by the St. Louis Cardinals with OF Tommy Pham in a three-team/nine-player trade from the Chicago White Sox which included the Los Angeles Dodgers on July 29, 2024.
- The White Sox were 27-81 at the time he was traded; 7 of those 27 wins (26 pct.) belonged to Fedde.
- Posted a 1.94 ERA in 13 home starts in 2024 between Guaranteed Rate Field (CWS) and Busch Stadium (STL). Ranked 2nd in MLB** behind only Reynaldo Lopez (1.78) of Atlanta.
- Had four scoreless starts of 5.0 for the White Sox at home. Posted an 0.95 ERA over his first six starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, lowest by a White Sox pitcher in his first six home starts since Tommy John recorded a 0.76 ERA in 1967.
- Played one season for NC Dinos of the KBO League in 2023 where he led the league in wins (20), ERA (2.00), strikeouts (209) and WHIP (0.95) over 30 starts covering 180.1 innings pitched.
- Earned the 2023 Choi Dong-won Award, annually awarded to the best pitcher in the KBO League.
- Was a member of the 2019 Washington Nationals World Championship squad, making 12 starts and 21 appearances during the regular season. Did not make the postseason roster but traveled with the team on the Taxi Squad.
- Played high school baseball at Las Vegas High School where he was teammates with Bryce Harper. Compiled a 14-8 record over his three-year varsity career.
- Was a two-sport athlete, starring as an All-State honoree in soccer. Helped LVHS to the 2009 Nevada High School State Championship, defeating Bishop Gorman 4-3 in a shootout.
- Played college baseball at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. Was 8-2 with a 1.76 ERA (76.2 IP) over 11 starts with 82 strikeouts during his junior season in 2014.
- Drafted by the Washington Nationals in the first round (18th overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft out of UNLV.

FEDDE vs. MILWAUKEE:

- Is making his 7th career appearance and 6th start against the Brewers, and his 2nd as a member of the Cardinals.
- 2-2 career against the Brewers with a 4.82 ERA, with his last win coming in 2022 while pitching for the Washington Nationals.
- Is 4-4 with a 5.04 ERA in 22 career games (21 starts) vs. N.L. Central clubs, while his teams have lost seven consecutive games that he has started dating back to a win over the Cardinals on 5/4/24 while he was pitching for the White Sox.
- Fedde was last credited with a winning decision against an NL Central team on 6/10/22 vs. MIL at Nationals Park, holding the 'Crew to four runs on five hits in an 11-5 blasting backed by a four-hit performance from Nelson Cruz with a home run and three RBI.
- Started against the Brewers on 5/31/24 while with the White Sox in Milwaukee and took a no decision in a 12-5 loss as the Brewers scored eight unanswered runs off the 'Sox 'pen after he departed after 5.0 innings (9 H, 4 R) with a 5-4 lead.
