**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Diamondbacks, 10-5, yesterday at Citi Field...New York is seeking their seventh series victory of the season and third at home...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games and are in the midst of 26 games in 27 days...New York is 6-16 in that span...The Mets finish a 10-game homestand (3-6) against San Francisco (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (0-3) and Arizona (2-1)...Following this series, the Mets head to Washington D.C. for a three-game set against the Nationals...The team is off next Thursday before heading across the pond to face the Phillies for a two-game set.

**LOUS GEHRIG DAY:** June 2 was chosen specifically as the date for Lou Gehrig Day as it marks when Gehrig became the Yankees' starting first baseman, thus cementing the start of his incredible streak of consecutive games played...The date also signifies the day he passed from complications of Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), otherwise known as Lou Gehrig's disease...The focus of Lou Gehrig Day is to remember the legacy of Gehrig and all those lost to the disease that bears his name; raise awareness and funds for research of ALS; and celebrate the groups and individuals who have led the pursuit for cures...Uniformed personnel from both team's will wear the #4 logo in honor.

**ROSTER MOVES:** Following yesterday's game, LHP Josh Walker was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...RHP Drew Smith was reinstated from the 15-Day IL.

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Mets have homered in four straight games and in 11 of their last 13 games...New York has hit 20 home runs in that span...Overall, the Mets have hit 63 home runs this season, which is fourth in the National League.

**SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT:** Francisco Lindor is on an 11-game hitting streak...He is batting .383 (18-47) with five runs, five doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, three walks, two steals with a .420 OBP and a .617 SLG in that span...In 15 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Lindor is hitting .323/386/500 with eight runs, five doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, four walks, two steals with an .886 OPS.

**OPEN THE LINDOR:** After batting .032 (1-31) in his first 8 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .261/317/458 with 22 extra-base hits, 28 RBI and eight steals over his last 50 games since April 7.

**DIAMONDBACKS ARE FOREVER:** Francisco Lindor owns a lifetime .384/434/697 slashline with 23 runs, seven doubles, three triples, six home runs, 18 RBI and 10 walks in 25 career games against Arizona...His .384 batting average is his highest against any single opponent.

**I HATE SNAKES:** Starling Marte has hit .343/386/592 with 35 runs, 18 doubles, four triples, eight home runs, 37 RBI and 12 walks in 47 games against the Diamondbacks.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets are 12-20 at Citi Field this year...After starting the season 0-5 at Citi, the team is 12-15 at the ballpark...New York has posted a 3.49 ERA (119 ER/307.0 IP) at home this year, the third-lowest mark in the National League.

**D-BACKS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 21-5 over their last 26 games against the Diamondbacks...That span includes an eight-game winning streak from September 9, 2019-May 31, 2021...New York has won the season series against Arizona each season since 2018.

**ESQUIRE MARTINEZ:** J.D. Martinez has safely hit in 14 of his last 15 games...He is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .292 (7-24) with four runs, two doubles, two home runs, four RBI, with three walks and a .992 OPS in that span...Overall, he is batting .280 (33-118) with 10 runs, eight doubles, five home runs, 14 RBI and nine walks in 32 games this year...He has hit 320 home runs in his career...That is eighth among active players.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** The St. Lucie Mets blanked the Blue Jays, 8-0 last night in Dunedin, FL...LHP Zach Thorton earned the win, hurling 6.0 scoreless innings and allowing only four hits, one walk and struck out four...He improved to 2-2 with a 3.93 ERA (16 ER/36.2 IP) with 15 walks and 26 strikeouts in 10 games (five starts) this year...He was selected in the fifth round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Grand Canyon University.

**ON THE MARK:** In 16 games this year, Mark Vientos is batting .340 (18-53) with nine runs, four doubles, four homers, nine RBI with four walks, a .386 OBP and a .642 SLG...He is 12-27 against left-handed pitchers this year with six extra-base hits.

**BEAR NECESSITIES:** Pete Alonso has hit 205 home runs in his career...His 205 home runs are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Aaron Judge is second with 195 dingers, followed by Matt Olson (186) and Kyle Schwarber (185)...Alonso's 527 RBI are also the most in baseball in that time frame...He is followed by Matt Olson (518) and Jose Ramirez (495).

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** One day after Johan Santana's no hitter, on June 2, 2012, R.A. Dickey threw a complete game shutout against the Cardinals...The knuckleballer allowed seven hits and struck out nine...HE improved to 8-1 on the season with a 2.69 ERA...The Mets won 5-0 thanks to an offensive performance from The Captain...David Wright went 2-4 with one run, one RBI, one walk, a double and a home run.

### QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed three runs over 6.0 innings the second game of a doubleheader on May 28 vs. Los Angeles-NL...Allowed eight hits, recorded three strikeouts and did not issue a walk...Recorded back-to-back quality starts for the first time season.

**8.0 IS GREAT:** Threw a season-high 8.0 innings on April 28 vs. St. Louis in the Mets' 4-2 walk-off victory...Was his longest start as a Met and his longest start since September 17, 2022 vs. Cincinnati with St. Louis (Also 8.0 IP)...Was the longest start by a Met since Justin Verlander threw 8.0 innings on July 19 vs. Chicago-AL.

**OPENING UP:** Quintana took the mound for Opening Day on March 29 vs. Milwaukee at Cii Field...He became the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He was the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

**PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN:** In March of 2024, the Colombian-born Quintana passed his naturalization test in Miami to become an American citizen.

**METS DEBUT SEASON:** After starting his first season with the Mets in 2023 on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage, Quintana made his first start for the club on July 20, 2023, against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...The southpaw finished the last season 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) in 13 starts.

**300 CLUB:** In his start on September 17, 2023, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed pitchers with 300 or more career starts.

**HOT STREAK:** Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12, 2023, at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias.

**LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS:** Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,592) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,944), Chris Sale (2,189), Madison Bumgarner (2,070).

**YOU GOTTA MAKE 'EM EARN IT:** Quintana allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 19 starts from July 23, 2022 to August 23, 2023...Is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1, 2023.

**A PERFECT 10:** The lefty pitcher struck out a season-high 10 batters on September 23, 2023 in Philadelphia...The fifth highest amount of strikeouts he has ever recorded in a game throughout his career...Was his first double-digit strikeout game since August 13, 2019 when he struck out a career-high 14 batters.

**ON THE LEADERBOARD:** Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September...It was the lowest ERA in any month in his career...Since 2022, Quintana has allowed 15 home runs, tied for the lowest total during that span (min 150.0 IP).

**2023 REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP:** Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (0-2, 1.69)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Recorded his longest outing of the season, working 7.0 scoreless innings against the Dodgers on May 28...Allowed just three hits and three walks, while recording a season-high nine strikeouts.

- Hit safely in nine straight games from May 15-25. Was tied for the second-longest hitting streak of his career.
- Has 527 career RBI, eighth-most in franchise history. Edgardo Alfonzo (538) is next.
- Hit his 200th career home run on April 27 vs. St. Louis. Joined Darryl Strawberry (252), David Wright (242) and Mike Piazza as the only Mets with 200 or more homers. Reached 200 home runs in 710 career games. Only Ryan Howard (658 games), Aaron Judge (671 games) and Ralph Kiner (706 games) have reached the 200-career home run mark in the fewer games. - Was named NL Player of the Week for the period ending April 14. Batted .429 (9-21) with four homers, seven RBI, eight runs and seven walks during the week. Was his fourth career NL player of the week selection (Also: 6/24/19, 9/26/22 and 7/31/23).
- Went 3-3 with a two homers and three RBI on April 13 vs. Kansas City. Was his 20th career multi-homer game, the third most such games in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry (22) and David Wright (21). Are tied with Kyle Schwarber for the second-most such games since 2019. Only Aaron Judge (28) has more.
- Hit a game-tying solo home run in the ninth inning in the second game of a doubleheader on April 4 vs. Detroit. Is the third player in major league history to record 194 or more home runs and 500 or more RBI within their first 690 games joining Ralph Kiner and Ryan Howard. Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein. - Launched a solo homer on May 22 at Cleveland. Was his first road home run since May 21, 2023 at Cincinnati.
- Hit safely in seven straight games from May 13-20, tied for the third-longest hitting streak of his career.
- Went 2-2 with a game-tying RBI single in the eighth and a double in the 11th on May 16 at Philadelphia.
- Scored three runs on May 2 vs. Chicago-NL, including the walk-off run in the 11th.

- In 23 career games against Arizona, owns a 1.131 OPS. Is the third-highest such mark among active players (Min. 75 plate appearances vs. ARI).
- Has hit safely in his last 11 games dating back to May 21 and is batting .383/.420/.617 with two homers, five doubles and seven RBI during that span. His 18 hits since May 21 are the fourth-most in the majors during that span, while his 29 total bases are the eighth-most in the majors during that time frame.
- Went 4-4 with a home run and an RBI single on May 30 vs. Arizona. Was his 10th career four-hit game and second this season.
- Among shortstops, is tied for third in the majors in homers and tied for fifth in RBI (Min. 80% games at SS).
- Since moving to the lead-off spot on May 18, is batting .333/.385/.517.
- Launched a solo home run on May 10 vs. Atlanta. Was his 700th career RBI.
