RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and New York Mets play the second game of a four-game weekend series tonight at Busch Stadium ... St. Louis opened its homestand by taking two-of-three from the Oakland Athletics ... The current seven-game homestand features teams with lowest (\$56.8 million) and highest (\$330.6 million) Opening Day payrolls.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter the day in 5th place in the NL Central, 11.0 games out of first place and 9.0 games back in the NL Wild Card chase ... St. Louis has spent 102 of 137 days in last place on this season's MLB schedule (April 26-May 19, May 29-July 7 & July 28-present) ... This season is the Cardinals slowest start since 1995 when they were 50-72 (.410) after 122 games ... St. Louis needs to go 27-13 (.675) over the remaining 40 games to finish at .500.

WINNING TIME: The Cardinals have announced they that have selected the contract of SS **Masyn Winn** from Memphis (AAA) and placed OF **Lars Nootbaar** (lower abdomen contusion) on the 10-day injured list ... The 21-year-old Winn, who was the Cardinals 2nd round draft choice (54th overall) in 2020, is currently ranked by MLB Pipeline as the organization's top prospect (16th overall prospect) ... The right-handed hitting Winn is batting .288 with an .833 OPS, 18 home runs, 61 RBI and 17 stolen bases in his first season of play at Triple-A ... His minor league-leading 99 runs scored has established a new Memphis Redbirds (1998-present) single-season record, while his 128 hits rank tied for 2nd among all Triple-A players.

WINSANITY: **Masyn Winn** (age 21-150) tonight becomes the youngest Cardinal to make his MLB debut at starting shortstop since **Garry Templeton** (age 20-138) on Aug. 9, 1976 vs. Houston at Busch Stadium II ... Winn is also the first Cardinal to make his MLB debut at starting shortstop since **Aledmys Diaz** (April 5, 2016 at Pittsburgh) and first to do so in front of the home crowd in St. Louis in the last 47 seasons since Templeton (Aug. 9, 1976).

BIRDS EYE VIEW: **Richie Palacios** became the newest Cardinal to sport glasses in a game, joining notables INF **George "Specs" Toporcer** (1921-28), OF **Chick Hafey** (1924-31), OF **Bill Virdon** (1955-56), 2B **Julián Javier** (1960-71), RHP **Dick Hughes** (1966-68), C **Dave Ricketts** (1963-69), 1B **Dick Allen** (1970), 2B **Cookie Rojas** (1970), C **Darrell Porter** (1981-85), RHP **Tom Henke** (1995), 3B **Chris Sabo** (1995), RHP **Joe Kelly** (2012-14), LHP **Brett Cecil** (2017-18), and LHP **Tyler Webb** (2018-21).

FIRST TIMES A CHARM?: Dating back to 2022, the last four Cardinals to make their MLB debuts as a starter in the lineup have each reached base safely in the first career plate appearance: RF **Juan Ypez** (double, May 4, 2022 at Kansas City); RF **Alec Bursleson** (walk, Sept. 8, 2022 vs. Washington); RF **Jordan Walker** (single, March 30, 2023 vs. Toronto); and DH **Luken Baker** (single, June 4, 2023 at Pittsburgh).

REHABBING REDBIRDS: All-Star closer **Ryan Helsley** (right forearm tightness) is scheduled to resume his injury rehabilitation assignment tonight at Memphis (AAA) ... On the shelf since June 10, Helsley has previously made three rehab appearances at Springfield (AA) in August ... RHP **Jake Woodford** (right shoulder strain) continued his injury rehabilitation assignment last night at Memphis (AAA), throwing 40 pitches over 1.2 innings.

GO DIRECTLY TO JAIL. DO NOT PASS GO: Cardinals outfielders have gunned down 24 baserunners this season, 3rd-most in Major League Baseball behind the Rockies (25) and Royals (30) ... **Jordan Walker**, who has three assists in his last eight games, is averaging 93.6 mph on outfield throws, 12th-fastest among all MLB players (Colorado's **Nolan Jones** leads at 98.4) and tops among all Cardinals since *Statcast* began tracking (2020-23) ... Walker's five outfield assists this season tie **Lars Nootbaar** for the team lead.

NEW YORK CONNECTIONS

Steven Matz was originally selected by the Mets in the 2nd round of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Ward Melville High School in East Setauket, NY and pitched parts of his first six seasons (2015-20) in New York...was born in Stony Brook, NY.

Tommy Edman doubled off **Steven Matz** for his first career MLB hit (June 14, 2019 at Citi Field).

Adam Wainwright (Sept. 11, 2005 at Busch II), **Brendan Donovan** (April 25, 2022 at Busch III), and **Masyn Winn** (Aug. 18, 2023 at Busch III) made MLB debuts against the Mets.

Richie Palacios was born in Brooklyn...2015 graduate of Berkely Carroll School in Brooklyn ...favorite professional NY teams are Giants and Brooklyn Nets...favorite athlete growing up was Derek Jeter, and attended his last Yankees home game.

Cardinals Bench Coach **Joe McEwing** played five seasons with the Mets (2000-04)... appeared in 11 games with the Mets during the 2000 postseason as the club reached the World Series...originally traded by St. Louis to New York in exchange for **Jesse Orosco** (March 18, 2000)...played college baseball at the County College of Morris in Randolph Township, NJ, where his uniform is retired.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **José Oquendo** played the first two seasons MLB career with the Mets...traded by New York with **Mark Davis** to St. Louis for **John Young** and **Angel Salazar** (April 2, 1985).

Adam Ottavino was selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (#30 overall) of the 2006 MLB Draft... pitched parts of six seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (2006-11)...made his MLB debut with St. Louis in 2010.

José Quintana made one postseason and 12 regular season starts for the Cardinals last season... acquired at the 2022 MLB Trade Deadline with **Chris Statton** from Pittsburgh in exchange for **Johan Oviedo** and **Malcom Nuñez**.

Rafael Ortega was claimed off waivers by St. Louis in 2014 and played two seasons (2014-15) in the Cardinals minor league organization.

Sam Coonrod was born in St. Louis...graduated from nearby Carrollton (Ill.) High School...pitched three seasons at Southern Illinois University-Carbondale (2012-14).

Mets Pitching Coach **Jeremy Hefner** pitched his final professional season (2016) in the Cardinals minor league organization.

Mets First Base Coach **Wayne Kirby** played in 98 games for Memphis (AAA) in 1998, where he was teammates with **Ron "Pop" Warner** and **Joe McEwing**...traded by St. Louis to the Mets for **Shawn Gilbert** (June 10, 1998).

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for and managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Mets (1975-77 & 1977-81).

Mets Clubhouse Operations Coordinator **Scott Keltner** previously worked in the Cardinals organization in the Busch Stadium (2016-21) and AutoZone Park (2014-15) visiting clubhouses.

Cardinals Hall of Famer & Mets broadcaster **Keith Hernandez** was selected by the Cardinals in the 42nd round of the 1971 MLB Draft...played 10 seasons in St. Louis (1974-83)...won the 1979 NL MVP Award...named to two National League All-Star teams and won six Gold Gloves.

Tyler Megill's older brother, **Trevor Megill**, was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign, returning to Loyola Marymount (Calif.) University.

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** was born in nearby Poughkeepsie, N.Y....graduated from F.D. Roosevelt High School in Hyde Park.

Cardinals reporter **Jim Hayes** was born in New York City and raised in nearby Nyack, NY...graduated from SUNY-Geneseo.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jason Isringhausen** was selected by the Mets in the 44th round of the 1991 MLB Draft...pitched parts of four seasons in New York (1995-97, 1999, 2011).

Cardinals AGM/Player Dev. **Gary LaRocque** previously served as Scouting Dir., AGM & VP/ Player Dev. and Scouting with the Mets from (1998-2005)...appointed VP of Pro Scouting in 2006.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Second year player and former Cardinals 1st round draft pick (2019, 19th player overall) is making his 2nd start of the 2023 season and the 3rd of his young career.
- Is facing the NY Mets for the 1st time in his career.
- His two prior MLB career starts came on 6/13/22 vs. PIT (ND) and 8/6/23 vs. COL (L, 1-0). Has recieved zero runs in support in his two career starts for St. Louis.
- Matched season-high with 4.0 IP on 8/11 at KC in relief of Wainwright, yielding 1 run. Retired 11 of his last 13 batters faced, struck out 5, and had season-high 73 pitches.
- Made 2nd career start on 8/6 vs. COL & established career-high in strikeouts (8) and season-highs at the time in innings (4.0) and pitches (60).
- The eight strikeouts were the most by a Cards left-hander making his 2nd career start in franchise history.
- Recalled on 8/1 from Memphis (AAA) - his 3rd stint with the Cardinals this season.
- Appeared in just four games between St. Louis & Memphis (AAA) in July.
- Has appeared in 11 games (9 starts) at Memphis & made 17 relief appearances (1 start) for St. Louis this season, totaling 59.1 IP overall in 2023.
- Earned his 1st win since 4/14 vs. PIT on 7/19 vs. MIA, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings on 29 pitches.
- Induced 2 GIDP in 2.0 IP or fewer on 7/19 vs. MIA; 1st Cards pitcher to do so since Luke Weaver on 8/17/17 at PIT.
- Was 1-4 with a 8.66 ERA at Memphis, striking out 41 batters over 34.1 IP while issuing 39 walks.

CAREER

- On June 3, 2022 in his MLB debut at Wrigley Field, he became the first Cardinal to wear uniform No. 57 in nearly 20 years since the death of pitcher **Darryl Kile**, 6/22/02.
- Became the 8th pitcher in MLB history to qualify for a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut and first since **Bob Stanley** (4.0 IP) for Boston at Cleveland Municipal Stadium on April 16, 1977. The last Cardinals pitcher was **Billy Muffett** (4.0 IP) vs. Philadelphia on August 3, 1957.
- Threw 74 pitches in relief in his Major League debut, becoming the 55th pitcher in MLB history to throw over 70 pitches in a relief appearance in his first MLB game. It marked the 2nd-most pitches by relief pitcher in his MLB debut in 2022 behind the Cubs' **Anderson Espinoza** (5/30/22 [2] vs. MIL) with 84, and most by a Cardinals relief pitcher in his MLB debut since pitch counts became tracked in 1988.
- Joined current Cardinals broadcaster **Brad Thompson** (5/8/2005 vs. SD) as one of four pitchers with what would qualify as a save of 3.0 innings or more in Cardinals history (**Billy Muffett** 1957 & **Paul Derringer** 1931).
- Was the first left-handed pitcher drafted by the Cardinals in the first round since **Marco Gonzales** (2013).

LAST TIME OUT

- Came on in the relief of Adam Wainwright in 2nd inning last Fri. (8/11) at Kauffman Stadium with no outs and the Cardinals trailing 8-0. Allowed solo HR to Savlador Perez, then retired 11 of this last 13 batters faced.

- Earned his lone win against the Mets on April 20, 2019, at Busch Stadium, allowing two runs over 8.0 innings. Faced the Mets again in 2022 at Busch Stadium and left after both he and Max Scherzer pitched 7.0 scoreless innings each for no decisions, as the Mets won late 5-2 with five runs in the 9th inning.
