RAYS REPORT—The Rays conclude their pre-All-Star-break schedule this afternoon, closing out the third and final leg of a 10-game road trip (2-7) against the Twins (1-2). Tigers (1-2) and Red Sox (0-3, one to play)...have lost three straight, five of six, seven of nine, 10 of 13 and 11 of their last 15 games on the heels of an MLB-best 25-9 stretch (May 20-June 26)... are still 28-20 in their last 46 games since May 20, fifth in MLB behind the Brewers (32-15). Blue Jays (33-16). Astros (31-17) and Cubs (29-18) and 41-32 in their last 73 contests since starting 9-14... are 3-6-1 in their last 10 series after going 7-1-1 in their previous nine (May 9-June 8)...have dropped five straight series for the first time since June 18-July 4, 2024 (six straight)...marks their first time losing their final five (or more) series before the All-Star break since 2005 (final five)...have fallen out of a Wild Card spot for the first time since entering play on June 5 (0.5 GB)... will enter the All-Star break fourth in the AL East for the second straight season (48-48 in 2024)... have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 32 in fourth and four in fifth.

The Rays fell, 1-0, yesterday, their fifth time being shut out this season, fifth most in the AL... Garrett Crochet became the first pitcher to throw a complete game shutout opposite Tampa Bay since Marcus Stroman on March 29, 2023 at CHC and the first left-hander since Reid Detmers during his no-hitter on May 10, 2022 at LAA.

Tampa Bay was out-hit, 5-3... only the Rangers (12G) and Guardians (11G) have been held to three hits or fewer more often than the Rays (10G).

The setback secured the Rays first season series loss to the Red Sox since 2018 snapping a club-record streak of six straight season series wins (2019-24).

The Rays five-game losing streak vs. the Red Sox is their longest since since Sept. 13, 2020-June 22, 2021 (5G)... their last longer skid came from March 30-April 8, 2018 (6G).

WHATS AT STAKE—The Rays need to win today to avoid:

*Their fourth time being swept this season, joining April 4-6 at TEX, April 29-May 1 vs. KC and May 6-8 vs. PHI...it would mark their first time being swept in a fourgame set since June 7-10 vs. BAL and first on the road since June 17-20, 2021 at SEA.

Their 19th time being swept at Fenway Park, first since Oct. 3-5, 2022 and first in a four-game series since May 25-28, 2006...it would mark their fifth time being swept by the Red Sox in a four-game set, regardless of venue, also joining May 3-6, 2002 and Sept. 9-12, 2002 at Tropicana Field and Aug. 29-Sept. 1, 2005 at Fenway.

Being swept in their final series before the All-Star break for the first time since July 8-10, 2016 at BOS as part of a six-game skid heading into the break.

IRON MEN—Today, Ryan Pepiot is set to become the fourth Rays pitcher and third traditional starter to make 20 starts before the All-Star break, joining Blake Snell (2018, 20GS), Dayid Price (2014, 20GS) and Ryne Stanek (2019), who started 25 games as an opener before the break...entering play today, all five members of the rotation have made 19 starts, the most before the All-Star break in Rays history...they joined the 2018 Astros (Cole/Keuchel/McCullers Jr./Morton/Verlander) as the only clubs to have five pitchers make 19 starts before the Midsummer Classic since the contest first took place in 1933 (Stats Perform)...entering this season, only 16 pitchers in Rays history (22x) had reached the mark before the ASG—from 2020-24, Zack Littell (2024, 19GS) was the only one to turn the trick...including Joe Boyle's spot start on April 13 vs. ATL, the Rays have used six starting pitchers, second fewest in the majors behind the Angels (five).

ONE-RUN WOES—Each of the Rays last four meetings with the Red Sox have resulted in one-run losses, matching the longest streak vs. any opponent in team history...it ties streaks against the Red Sox (March 30-April 5, 2018) and White Sox (April 11-Aug. 5, 2018 vs. CWS). six of the Rays eight losses this month have come by one run, the most in the majors...their 18 one-run defeats this season are tied with the Yankees for third most in the AL behind the White Sox (21) and Red Sox (19) and are third most before the All-Star break in franchise history, trailing 2018 (21G) and 2003 (19G)...the Rays five 1-0 defeats lead the majors and match 2012 for the most over a full season in franchise history.

If they were to fall by one run today, it would mark the sixth time in the Wild Cardera (since 1995) a club was swept in a four-game series, with each loss coming by one run (Stats Perform)...the last occurrence was the Cubs from Sept. 19-22, 2019 vs. STL

LATE-INNING LETDOWNS—The Rays have held a multi-run lead in six of their eight losses in July...entering the month, they led by multiple runs in only five of their first 38 setbacks and they had 13 blown lead losses all season...despite the recent skid, the Rays 19 blown lead losses on the year are still tied for fourth fewest in the AL, more than only the Tigers (13) Astros (14) and Blue Jays (16), the bullpen has gone 1-8 with a 7.18 ERA (52,21P, 42ER) during the team's 4-11 stretch since June 27, the most losses and highest ERA in MLB over that span

SIMPLE CHAN—Chandler Simpson's career-best 15 game hitting streak is the longest by a rookie in franchise history. he is batting 389 (21-for-54) with 22B, 13B, 3 RBI, 4 BB, 3 SO and 7 SB during the streak, which is the second-longest active run in MLB behind NYY Cody Bellinger (17G) and ties the longest by any rookie this season, matching ATH Jacob Wilson (15G, March 27-April 12)...the last rookie with a longer streak was BAL Colton Cowser (17G) from July 19-Aug. 4, 2024...Simpson has stolen 26 bases, third in the AL and one shy of the Rays rookie record for a full season set by Rocco Baldelli in 2003 (27SB).

** Simpson's 15-game streak would be the longest active run heading into the All-Star break in Rays history, surpassing Carl Crawford's 11-game streaks in 2006 (June 27-July 9) and 2005 (June 28-July 10), according to Stats Perform.

SPREAD THE WEALTH—Jonathan Aranda is 1 RBI shy of becoming the fourth Ray this season to collect 50 RBI, joining **Junior Caminero** (60), **Yandy Díaz** (53) and **Brandon Lowe** (50)...it would mark the first time four Rays have had 50 RBI before the All-Star break.

20-20 VISION—With 19 doubles and 23 homers, 22-year-old Junior Caminero needs one double to become the first player in franchise history with 20 doubles and 20 homers before the All-Star break, since 1901, five players have turned the trick at age 22 or younger: ATL Ozzie Albies in 2018 (29/20), WSH Bryce Harper in 2015 (21/26), LAA Mike Trout in 2014 (26/22), STL Albert Pujols in 2002 (25/21) and CIN Johnny Bench in 1970 (23/28).

SHINING STARS—Four Rays were selected to represent the club as All-Stars: 1B Jonathan Aranda, 3B Junior Caminero, 2B Brandon Lowe and RHP Drew Rasmussen...Aranda, Caminero and Rasmussen are first-time All-Stars, while Lowe was selected for the second time in his career, joining 2019...it marks the fourth time in franchise history, the Rays have had four or more All-Stars, joining 2023 (Arozarena/Diaz/Franco/McClanahan), 2010 (Crawford/Longoria/Price/Soriano) and 2009 (Bartlett/Crawford/Longoria/Peña/Zobrist)... on Wednesday, it was announced Caminero will be the ALs starting third baseman, in place of CLE Jose Ramírez... he will be 22 years, 10 days old when the All-Star Game takes place on July 15 in Atlanta, which would make him the third-youngest third baseman to start the Midsummer Classic since the contest's inception in 1933, older than only the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews in 1953 (21.274) and CLE Buddy Lewis in 1938 (21.330).

**Caminero is also set to become the fourth Ray to participate in the T-Mobile Home Rum Derby, joining Randy Arozarena (2003), Carlos Peña (2009) and Evan Longoria (2008).

DRAFT DAY—The 2025 First-Year Player Draft will begin tonight at 6:00 p.m. on ESPN and MLB Network, with the Rays holding five picks on day one: No. 14 (round one), No. 42 (Competitive Balance Round A), No. 53 (round two), No. 67 (Competitive Balance Round B) and No. 86 (round three)...the Rays No. 14 overall selection is their highest since holding the No. 4 pick in 2017...the Rays have taken a position player with their first selection in five straight and nine of the last 11 seasons...last year, they selected OF Theo Gillen out of Westlake (1x.) High School, who is rated as the club's No. 2 prospect (MLB.com).

The draft will resume tomorrow, Monday, July 14, at 11:30 a.m. for rounds 4-20.

According to MLB.com, each of Tampa Bay's top three prospects, five of the top seven and eight of the top 12 are Rays draftees.

A GLIMPSE INTO THE FUTURE—Yesterday, RHP Brody Hopkins (Rays No. 6 prospect, MLB.com) worked a clean 6th inning for the AL a 4-2 loss to the NL in the 2025 Futures Game in Atlanta, throwing eight of his nine pitches for strikes...he was the first Rays prospect to pitch in the contest since Taj Bradley started in 2022.

TODAY'S START—Ryan Pepiot (PEP-ee-oh) closes the Rays pre-All-Star break schedule with his 20th start of the season and eighth on the road...marks the 56th start (63G) of his career and 24th away from home (27G)...marks his sixth career start opposite the Red Sox...has a 2.60 ERA (52.0IP, 15ER) and 0.96 WHIP in his last nine outings...is seeking his first road win since April 26 at SD...acquired from the Dodgers along with OF Jonny DeLuca for RHP Tyler Glasnow, OF Manuel Margot and cash considerations, Dec. 16, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT—Pepiot did not factor into the decision of a 4-2 loss on July 8 at DET in the fifth game of the current road trip (6.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 3BB, 6SO, HR)...retired the side in order on seven pitches in the opening 3BB, 6SO, HR)...retired the side in order on seven pitches in the opening frame, including a pair of three-pitch strikeouts...set down seven straight Tigers to open the game before a hit-by-pitch with one out in the 3rd... did not allow a hit until Spencer Torkelson's solo homer with one down in the 4th...ran into trouble in the 5th a walk and another HBP to open the frame, but allowed only one run to score on a Colt Keith game-tying RBI-single...Jake Mangum threw out a runner at third on the play before Pepiot induced an inning-ending fly out...he walked the leadoff man in the 6th, but concluded his outing with a fly out followed by a GIDP.

Four of his six strikeouts came on his changeup—he registered six whiffs on the pitch...the Tigers went hitless against his fastballs, going a combined 0-for-11 against his cutter (0-for-5), four-seamer (0-for-4) and sinker (0-for-2).

He has thrown quality starts in consecutive outings for the first time since logging a career-high six straight from May 8-June 5.

FENWAY FILES—Pepiot is seeking his first career win opposite Red Sox, having gone 0-3 with a 4.91 ERA (25.2IP, 14ER) across five previous starts against Boston, all Rays losses…excluding his start against them earlier this season on April 15 in Tampa (6.0IP, 6ER), Pepiot has registered a 3.66 ERA (19.2IP, 8ER) in his other four starts against Boston…the five starts are his most against any opponent in his career…he has recorded 13.0 strikeouts per 9.0 IP vs. the Sox, his highest mark against any AL club.

*Pepiot is 2-5 with a 4.43 ERA (44.2IP, 22ER) in eight starts against AL East opponents this season, and the Rays are 2-6 in those games…in 11 starts outside the division, he is 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA (63.2IP, 18ER)—Tampa Bay has won six of those 11 games.

THE OPENER...AND THE CLOSER—This marks the second straight season Pepiot has started the Rays final game before the All-Star break—last year, he retired 18 of 21 batters faced in a 2-0 win over the Guardians on July 12, 2024 at Tropicana Field (W, 6.ZIP, 2H, 0R, 4SO)...he is the first pitcher to start for the Rays on Opening Day and in the club's last game before the All-Star break since **Chris Archer** in 2017.

BUILT DIFFERENT-Today, Pepiot is set to become the fourth Rays pitcher and third traditional starter to make 20 starts before the All-Star break...he will join Blake Snell (2018, 20GS), David Price (2014, 20GS) and Ryne Stanek (2019), who started 25 games as an opener before the break...entering play today, eight major league pitchers have already logged 20 starts.

ROAD WOES—The Rays have lost each of Pepiot's last six road starts after winning his first on April 26 at SD (4-1)...he is 0-3 with a 4.15 ERA (30.1IP, 14ER) during the streak, which is the longest in a Rays pitcher's starts since dropping six straight Aaron Civale road outings from April 21–June 18, 2024...the last longer streak was a seven-game skid in Matt Moore's road starts from April 22–July 9, 2018...he averages 3.47 runs of support per 9.0 IP on the road compared to 5.63 at Steinbrenner Field.

* Since the six-start skid began on May 2, Pepiot has gone 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (44.0IP, 10ER) in eight home starts, with the Rays winning six of those games.

PEP RALLY—Since allowing a career-high-tying six runs on April 15 vs. BOS, Pepiot has permitted four runs or fewer in 15 straight starts, going 5-4 with a 2.92 ERA (86.1IP, 28ER), 1.03 WHIP and .205 (62-for-302) opp. 5-4 With a 2.92 ERA (86.1IP, 28ER), 1.03 WHIP and 2.205 (62-for-302) opp. average...he has allowed three runs or fewer in 14 of those 15 outings and two runs or fewer in 10 of them...min. 75.0 IP, he ranks among AL leaders over that span (since April 20) in opp. average (8th), WHIP (8th), opp. on-base pct. (10th), opp. OPS (12th, .649) and ERA (12th).

He has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 31 of his last 33 starts dating back to June 26, 2024...his 3.03 ERA (172.0IP, 58ER) in that span is sixth in the AL (min. 150.0IP)

in the AL (min. 150.0IP).

STRIKEOUT STUFF—He has collected 51 SO (11.97 SO/9.0IP) while generating a 31.4 pct. whiff rate in seven starts since June 1...through the end of May, he had 56 SO (7.20 SO/9.0IP) with a 22.4 pct. ...on the season, Pepiot's 224 whiffs lead the Rays staff and are T11th in the AL.

FEELING THE LOVE—The Rays have backed him with 28 runs of support (9.28 RSA) over his last five starts...the club has averaged 6.2 runs per game in that span, outscoring opponents...entering this stretch, they provided him with more than four runs of support in only two of his first 40 starts with the Rays since he joined the club ahead of the 2024 campaign...in his career, the Rays are 13-3 when providing Pepiot with three runs of support or more (6-2 in 2025) compared to 8-21 with two runs or fewer (2-9 in 2025).

THINK FAST—Across his last 10 starts, opponents are 13-for-74 (.176) with 27 SO and a 29.1 pct. whiff rate against Pepiot's four-seam fastball... min. 70 AB, it is the fourth-lowest mark on any AL pitcher's four-seamer in that span, trailing SEA Bryan Woo (.141), TEX Jacob deGrom (.156) and SEA Luis Castillo (.165)...through his first nine starts, those marks stood at .311 (23-for-74), 22 SO and 22.7 pct. ...since he joined the Rays ahead of the 2024 season, opponents are hitting .206 (76-for-369) in at-bats ending with his four-seam fastball, the seventh-lowest mark on any AL pitcher's four-seamer over that time frame (min. 300 A.R.) four-seamer over that timeframe (min. 300AB).

REVERSE, REVERSE—Pepiot has limited left-handed hitters to a .169 (30for-177) average, the third-lowest mark among qualified right-handers behind CLE **Gavin Williams** (.146) and PHI **Zack Wheeler** (.168)...lefties are 13-for-87 (.149) with 37 SO against him over his last nine starts.

* RHH are batting .269 (58-for-216) against Pepiot, but this includes a 20-for-94 (.213) clip across his last nine starts (.321 in first 10GS).

TOP HEAVY—The first three spots in opposing lineups are batting .283/.337/.520 (43-for-152) against Pepiot, but 4-9 hitters have produced a .187/.270/.349 (45-for-241) line...this includes a .143 (6-for-42) average against cleanup hitters, tied with TOR José Berríos for fourth lowest among qualified pitchers, trailing NYM David Peterson (.111), DET Tarik Skubal (.115) and MIL Freddy Peralta (.133).
