TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of this 3-game series vs Steve Blass' Pirates and the final game of the 2019 championship season...Reds starting pitcher RHP Tyler Mahle today is celebrating his 25th birthday.

SERIES NOTES: With last night's 12-inning, 4-2 win the Reds snapped their 11-game losing streak at PNC Park dating back to an 8-6 win on 6/17/18, including this season's 8-game losing streak...are 3-16 here the last 2 seasons...the losing streaks are the Reds' longest overall and single-season losing streaks at PNC Park and their longest losing streak in Pittsburgh since a 21-game road skid from 8/12/1936 - 4/24/1938...that losing streak was ended on 6/28/1938 by Johnny Vander Meer in the same month he became the first, and still only, pitcher in history to throw no-hitters in consecutive apps...from 4/4-4/7 the Pirates swept a 4-game series from the Reds for the first time since 7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium and did it in Pittsburgh for the first time since 8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field...from 3/31-4/5 the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in 3 consecutive games (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since 7/31-8/2, 1931 (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin).

ALL-DECADE TEAM: Among all Major League players with at least 500 apps beginning in 2010, Joey Votto ranks first in walks (1,046), first in on-base percentage (.428), second in batting average (.306, Miguel Cabrera .317), third in OPS (.944; Mike Trout 1.000, David Ortiz .945), third in WAR (52.2; Trout 72.5, Robinson Cano 54.3), third in doubles (327), ninth in hits (1,532) and 10th in games (1,410).

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (132), HR (46, Major League record), RBI (128), batting average (.300) and slugging percentage (.576)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 132-90, and are 36-16 (.692) when leading after the first inning...6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning...Eugenio Suárez leads the Major Leagues with 15 HR in the first inning, a franchise record, while José Iglesias leads the National League in first-inning batting average (.433) while ranking second in both slugging percentage (.733) and on-base percentage (.452).

GENO: 3B Eugenio Suárez ranks second in the Major Leagues with a career-high 49 HR, a record for a player from Venezuela and the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position...Suárez' 49 HR are the most by a third baseman since NYY's Alex Rodriguez in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base...Suárez' 49 HR are the most by a Reds batter since George Foster established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break Suárez leads the Major Leagues with 29 HR, a new club record for HR in the second half of a season (27, Ted Kluszewski, 1954), and leads the National League in slugging percentage (.692)...Suárez is trying to become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since Foster hit 40 HR in 1978...with a club record 52 HR in 1977, Foster is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

RUTHIAN: In the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi, Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth (6/13/1921 vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...played center field in the top of the ninth.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 104 of the Reds' 161 games (72g at P, 18g in CF, 8g in LF, 4g in RF, 13g as pinch runner, 6g as a pinch hitter)...in 5 of the last 13 games was the Reds' starting center fielder...he is a career .235 hitter (31-132) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 24 RBI, 5 stolen bases and a .710 OPS...this season as a pinch hitter is 1-6 with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5-for-26 (.192, 7 RBI) with 3 HR, on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 409.2 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 400 innings also to play CF at some point in his career...Mahay played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 400th inning in 2007 for the Braves.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...on Thursday at Great American Ball Park he called his final game...Brennaman joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...Brennaman is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully (67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck (48, 1954-2001) & Mike Shannon (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrín (47, 1973-2019).

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with RALLY...today is celebrating his **25th birthday**...already is in his third Major League season...this afternoon is making his sixth start for the Reds since he was promoted on **9/1** as 1 of 5 September callups (5gs, 0-2, 7.25)...is starting in place of **RHP Trevor Bauer**, who for the second consecutive day was scratched because of illness...**Mahle** this season has left **14 runners on base**, and **11 scored**...in his **last 4 starts** allowed **14** of his **17 runs** via **home runs**...from **7/22-8/21** was on the **10-day injured list** with a **left hamstring strain**...on **8/16** and **8/21** made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on **8/22**...made 1 more start for the Bats before he was promoted on 9/1 to start the day game of the doubleheader at StL...in consecutive starts on **5/2** and **5/7**, suffered the 1-0 loss **at NYM** in which **Noah Syndergaard** became just the seventh pitcher in **Major League history** to homer in a 1-0 complete game and then a 2-0 loss **at Oak** in which **Mike Fiers** threw his **second career no-hitter**...in those 2 games, Reds batters combined to go **4-for-57** (.070)...made his second straight Opening Day roster...started the Reds' sixth game of the season.
