ELIMINATED

Yesterday the Redlegs were eliminated from **NL Central Division** title contention...were eliminated last season on **9/10**...were trying to become the **first team** ever to **win a division** after **losing at least 100 games** the season before (62-100).

FROM 100 TO POSTSEASON

The Reds are trying to become the **third team** ever to make the playoffs following a **100-loss season** (2017 Twins, 2020 Marlins) and the **fourth Postseason team** with a **losing home record** during the regular season (**1981 Royals**, 19-28; **2001 Braves**, 40-41; **2020 Marlins**, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

The Reds finished **62-100** (.383) in **2022** and are **79-76** (.510) so far **this season**...among all **Major League** teams from **2022** to **2023**, the Reds tie the Rangers for the largest increase in **wins** (+17) and have the second-largest increase in **winning percentage** (+.127, Tex +.136)...courtesy @EliasSports.

ROLLER COASTER

From **4/24-7/31** the Reds went **52-34** (.605), the second-best record in the **Major Leagues** behind the **Braves** (53-29, .646)...through games of **July 31**, the Reds led the **NL Central** by 1.5 games over the **Brewers** and by 5.0 games over the third-place **Cubs**...followed that **3-month hot stretch** with a **10-17 August** and **began September** in **third place**, 6.0 games behind the **Brewers** and 3.0 games behind the **Cubs**...are **10-10** so far in **September** and **lost their last 3 games**.

- The Reds today sent to Louisville on a rehabilitation assignment **IF Matt McLain** (right oblique strain)...he missed the last 23 games.
- Prior to tonight's game, **Dave Barlage** of Great American Ball Park partner **SBM Management Services** will be recognized as the **Reds Way All-Star** for September...**Dave** has worked at Riverfront Stadium/Cinergy Field and GABP since **1993**.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Jimmy Trdinich's Pirates** and **Game 5** (1-3) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that included a **2-1 series loss** to the Twins and Thu's day off.
- Following this series, the Reds will finish the season with a 5-game road trip to **Cle's Progressive Field** (2g) and **StL's Busch Stadium** (off day, 3g).

SERIES NOTES

- The Reds are **4-7 vs Pit** this season.
- Beginning in 2021 at **Great American Ball Park**, the Reds are **14-9 vs Pit** with a **139-85 advantage** in runs scored...the Reds have won **19** of the **last 29 games vs Pit** at GABP.

ROTATION

- Rookie pitchers** have made **56 starts** for the Reds, including **14** of the Reds' **20 games** so far in **September**...**rookie pitchers** are projected to start **19** of the Reds' **27 games** in **September/October**.
 - LHP Brandon Williamson** (21gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville, is 0-1, 9.00 in 2 starts in September.
 - LHP Andrew Abbott** (20gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 0-1, 5.40 in 4 starts in September.
 - RHP Connor Phillips** (3gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 1-0, 5.74 in 3 starts in September.
 - RHP Lyon Richardson** (4gs), who began the season at Class A Daytona, went 0-1, 8.68 in 2 starts in September.
 - RHP Carson Spiers** (2gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 0-1, 9.00 in 2 starts and 1 relief appearance in September.
 - RHP Fernando Cruz** (2gs), who last year at age 33 made his Major League debut with 14 apps, started Tue's 7-0 loss vs Min.
- Richardson, Abbott, Spiers, Williamson** and **Phillips** made their **Major League debuts** this season, along with fellow starter **RHP Levi Stoudt** (2gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville.

ROSTER NOTES

- 65 players** have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, the most of any team in the Major Leagues this season and **1 player** shy of the single-season club record established in **2022**.
- 40 pitchers**, including position players **C Luke Maile** (4 times) and **IF Jason Vosler** (twice), have appeared in **at least 1 game** for the Reds, a new **single-season club record** (38 pitchers, 2022).
- 17 pitchers** have **started at least 1 game** for the Reds, tying the **single-season club record** (2003, 2022)...**17 starters** tie the Dodgers for most in the National League...the Athletics lead the Major Leagues with **24 starters**.
- The Reds have **9 rookies** on today's roster.
 - RHP Fernando Cruz**, **IF Elly De La Cruz**, **IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand**, **IF Noelvi Marte**, **IF/OF Spencer Steer**, **LHP Andrew Abbott**, **RHP Daniel Duarte**, **RHP Connor Phillips** and **LHP Brandon Williamson**.
- Had a season-high **12 rookies** on the 27-player roster for the **8/23** day/night doubleheader at LAA.
- 16 Reds players** made their **Major League debuts** this season, the most of any team in the majors...listed below in the order in which they debuted:
 - RHP Casey Legumina**, **RHP Levi Stoudt**, **IF Matt McLain**, **LHP Brandon Williamson**, **RHP Eduardo Salazar**, **OF TJ Hopkins**, **LHP Andrew Abbott**, **IF Elly De La Cruz**, **RHP Ricky Karcher**, **RHP Randy Wynne**, **RHP Jake Wong**, **IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand**, **RHP Lyon Richardson**, **IF Noelvi Marte**, **RHP Carson Spiers**, **RHP Connor Phillips**.
- 23 rookies** played in at least 1 game for the Reds, the most of any team in the Major Leagues and tied for **fourth-most in club history** (**26** in 1909, **25** in 2016, **24** in 1914 & 2017, **23** in 2022).

LET THE KIDS PLAY

- Reds rookies have produced **59 HR**, **211 RBI** and **71 stolen bases**...are the most **HR** and **RBI** by any Major League team's rookies and second-most **stolen bases** total by any team's rookies...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Have established a single-season club record for **HR by rookies**...have produced the Reds' second-most **RBI** (260 in 1935) and second-most **stolen bases** (74sb in 1982) in a season **by rookies**...courtesy @EliasSports.
- With **59 HR** the Reds have established a new franchise record for home runs in a season by rookies (**Spencer Steer** 22, **Matt McLain** 16, **Elly De La Cruz** 11, **Christian Encarnacion-Strand** 9, **Noelvi Marte** 1)...the **2008 team** recorded **54 home runs** by rookies (**Joey Votto** 24, **Jay Bruce** 21, **Chris Dickerson** 6, **Ryan Hanigan** 2, **Paul Janish** 1).
- The Reds are the first team in Major League history with **3 rookies**, in a single season, with at least **10 HR** & **10 stolen bases** each (**Elly De La Cruz**, **Matt McLain**, **Spencer Steer**).
 - For the first time since **1890**, when Cincinnati joined the **National League**, **3 Reds rookies** have produced **at least 10 HR**... **Christian Encarnacion-Strand** has **9 HR**...courtesy @EliasSports.
- On 8/22 at LAA, in his 64th career game, **Elly De La Cruz** recorded his 20th stolen base to become the fastest player since 1900 to accumulate at least **10 HR** and at least **20 steals**...**Barry Bonds** did it in his 65th career appearance, just ahead of Reds rookies **Chris Sabo** (66g) and **Gary Redus** (67g)...courtesy @EliasSports.

Tonight's Pitcher - #34 Connor Phillips, RHP

RED HOTS

- At 22 years old, tonight is making his fourth Major League start.
- Mon vs Min, in his third career start, earned his first Major League win.
 - Became only the fourth Reds pitcher, within his first 3 career apps, to throw at least 7.0 innings with 3 or fewer hits allowed, 2 or fewer runs allowed, 1 or fewer walks allowed and 7 or more strikeouts: Travis Wood (7/10/10 at Phi), Johnny Cueto (4/3/08 vs Ari) and Mo Sanford (8/9/91 at SD).
- Made his first 2 Major League apps on 9/5 vs Sea and 9/13 at Det after he was added to the roster as a substitute player when reliever RHP Fernando Cruz and starters RHP Hunter Greene, RHP Ben Lively & Brandon Williamson went on the COVID-19 injured list.
 - In the 7-6 walkoff win on 9/5 vs Sea made his Major League debut after 66 minor league apps, including 65 starts...was his 12th career appearance and 11th start above Class AA.
 - Struck out his first career batter faced, J.P. Crawford (looking).
 - Allowed all 5 runs on home runs, to Teoscar Hernández (2-run in the first inning) and to Julio Rodríguez (3-run in the fifth inning).
 - Became the sixth of 6 Reds pitcher this season to make his Major League debut in a start (Levi Stoudt, Brandon Williamson, Andrew Abbott, Lyon Richardson, Carson Spiers).
 - Became the 16th of 16 Reds players to make his Major League debut this season, the most of any team in the majors.
 - Became the 23rd of 23 rookies to appear in a game for the Reds, also the most of any team in the Major Leagues, and the 64th of 65 Reds player overall.
- Was returned to Louisville as a substitute player on 9/14, when RHP Ben Lively was reinstated from the COVID-19 injured list.
- Didn't pitch for the Bats before he rejoined the Reds in time to make Mon's start vs the Twins.
- Was a non-roster invitee to 2023 Major League spring training camp.
- Prior to his 9/2 promotion went 4-5, 3.86 with 1 save in 24 starts and 1 relief appearance for Class AA Chattanooga and Class AAA Louisville.
- Began the season at Chattanooga (14gs, 2-2, 2.34)...on 6/28 was promoted to Louisville (11g, 10gs, 2-3, 4.69)...was his first stint at Class AAA.
- His fastball and slider are rated the best in the organization.
- Was selected by the Blue Jays in the 35th round of the June 2019 first-year player draft. Did not sign.
- Was selected by the Mariners in Compensation Round B (64th overall) of the June 2020 first-year player draft...was signed by Derek Miller.
- On 3/29/22 was acquired by the Reds as the player to be named in the 3/14/22 trade in which the Reds sent to the Mariners 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker for RHP Justin Dunn, OF Jake Fraley and minor league LHP Brandon Williamson.
- In 2019 graduated from Magnolia West High School in Magnolia, Texas, where as a senior he was the district's Most Valuable Player while a second-team All-State selection...played 1 season, in 2020, at McLennan Community College in Waco, Texas.
- 6-2, 209...born in Houston, TX...resides in Magnolia, TX.

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #55 Brandon Williamson, LHP

RED HOTS

- Turned 25 years old on the fourth day of the season.
- Tomorrow will make the 22nd start of his Major League career, his third since a 10-day stint on the COVID-19 injured list (9/2-9/11)
 - In his 2 starts since he came off the COVID-19 IL went 0-1, 9.00 (8ip, 13h, 8er, 3bb, 6k, .371baa).
- Twice picked runners off second base, KC's Bobby Witt Jr. (PO/CS 145) and SD's Fernando Tatis Jr. (PO/CS 165).
- Once was called for a pitch timer violation, on 5/22 vs StL (Paul Goldschmidt batting).
- Twice was called for disengagement violations, on 8/7 vs Mia (Jorge Soler batting, Jon Berti to second on the balk) and on 8/29 at SF (Paul DeJong batting, J.D. Davis to second and Patrick Bailey scored on the balk).
- On 5/16 at Col, became only the 10th visiting pitcher to make his Major League debut with a start at Coors Field, the first since Hou's José Urquidy on 7/2/19.
- Became only the fourth Reds pitcher to make his Major League debut with at least 5.2 innings, 2 hits or fewer allowed and at least 6 strikeouts, joining Tom Carroll (7/7/1974 vs StL, 7ip, 2h, 6k), Mo Sanford (8/9/1991 at SD, 7ip, 2h, 8k) and Johnny Cueto (4/3/2008 vs Ari, 7ip, 1h, 10k).
- Began the season at Class AAA Louisville (8gs, 2-4, 6.62, 34ip, 44h, 20bb, 27k, 7hr, 1.88whip, .310baa).
- Was selected by the Mariners in the second round (59th overall) of the 2019 first-year player draft...was an MiLB.com Mariners Org All-Star in 2019 and 2021.
- On 3/14/22 was acquired from the Mariners, along with RHP Justin Dunn, OF Jake Fraley and a player to be named, for 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker.
 - On 3/29/22 the Reds completed the trade by acquiring minor league RHP Connor Phillips as the player to be named.

- First name is TJ, without punctuation...full name is Terry Lee Friedl Jr., initials TJ stand for Terry Jr...last name is pronounced FREE-duhl.
 - Leads the Major Leagues with 17 bunt singles and ranks fourth with 8 sacrifice bunts.
 - Leads the team in outfield assists (8).
 - Is hitting .344 vs LHP, the third-highest batting average of any player in the Major Leagues and the highest in the majors by a lefthanded hitter vs lefthanders.
 - Has a 4-game hitting streak (5-15, .333, 1hr, 3rbi, .444obp, .533slg, .977ops).
 - Hit safely in 10 of his last 12 apps (14-39, .359, 2 3b, 3hr, 8rbi, .457obp, .692slg).
 - From 4/26-9/2 made 79 consecutive starts in CF...in the Reds' 16 games with Harrison Bader on the roster, from 9/1-9/17, made 7 starts in CF, 5 starts in LF and 1 start in RF (9/9 vs StL)...with Bader injured, made each of his last 5 starts in CF.
 - Reached base safely in 103 of his 132 apps...only once all season failed to reach base in any 3-game stretch (7/15-7/17).

- 6 JONATHAN INDIA, 2b** **Homestand: 4gs at 2B, 0-14, 1rbi, 3bb, 1hbp, 1r**
- After 2 rehabilitation apps, on 9/10 was reinstated from the 10-day injured list after missing 39 games with left foot plantar fasciitis.
 - In 10 starts since his return is hitting .105 (4-38, 2hr, 6rbi, 1sb).

- Last name is pronounced MAY-lee.
 - In his last 2 starts went 2-for-5 (1rbi, 1bb, 1r).
 - The Reds went 30-24 in his starts at catcher...won 3 of his last 5 starts and 7 of his last 10 starts...made 1 start at DH (5/24 vs StL).
 - Caught 19 of the 20 games started by rookie Andrew Abbott...missed Abbott's start on 9/16 at NYM, a 3-2 Reds win, while recovering from the hit by a pitch the night before.
 - 6 times started consecutive Reds games (last, Wed vs Min & Fri vs Pit).
 - Caught 1 of the Reds' 6 team shutouts (2-0 win, 6/5 vs Mil).

 - His cousin Michael Mayer, also a graduate of Covington Catholic and a tight end at Notre Dame, was selected by the Raiders in the second round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

- 16 NOELVI MARTE, inf** **Homestand: 2gs at 3B, 1gs at SS, 3-12, 3rbi, 1bb, 1r**
- His 10-game hitting streak beginning 9/5 ties Matt McLain's (5/22-6/1) as the longest by a Reds batter this season (15-36, .417, 1 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, 1sb, .447obp, .528slg, .975ops)...is tied for the longest active hitting streak in the Major Leagues (Mil's William Contreras) and covers 13 apps...it includes a pinch-hit single.
 - His 16-game on-base streak beginning 8/30 is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the Major Leagues (20-56, .357, 2 2b, 1hr, 8rbi, 2sb, .410obp)...is the third-longest on-base streak by a Reds batter this season (Matt McLain 23g, Tyler Stephenson 17g).
 - In September is hitting .377 (20-53, 2 2b, 1hr, 8rbi, 1sb, .421obp).

 - Made his 15 starts at DH (7gs, on 9/3 vs Cubs), LF (4gs, last on 9/10 vs StL), RF (3gs, last on 9/16 at NYM) and 1B (1gs, 9/4 vs Sea).
 - Last played in Wed's 5-3 loss vs Min (pinch hit, walked).

 - On 8/21 reached 16.000 years of Major League Service...was 1 of 5 active players with at least 16.000 years of MLS, joining Miguel Cabrera (20.074), Zack Greinke (19.030), Adam Wainwright (18.000) and Justin Verlander (17.146).
 - Is the National League's 2010 Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star, the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award (2011) and Major League Baseball's 2017 Lou Gehrig Memorial Award winner for exemplary contributions to his community.
 - Received Most Valuable Player Award votes 8 times in the last 13 seasons, 6 times finished among the Top 10 and 3 times finished among the Top 3.
 - 5 times was a finalist for the prestigious Hank Aaron Award, presented to the most outstanding offensive performer in each league...won the award in 2010.
 - 6 times was voted by the Cincinnati chapter of the BBWAA the Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' MVP (unanimously in 2016 and 2017).
