TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 26, 2013: In his final career appearance, Mariano Rivera is removed from the game by Derek Jeter and Andy Pettitte, who come out of the dugout to make the pitching change.

Sept. 26, 1998: David Cone earns his 20th win of the year in his final start of the season, tossing 7.0 shutout innings vs. Tampa Bay in a 3-1 Yankees victory. He finishes 20-7 with a 3.55 ERA, marking the second of two career 20-win seasons (also 20-3 with the Mets in 1988).

Sept. 26, 1961: Roger Maris hits his 60th home run of the season off Baltimore's Jack Fisher in a 3-2 Yankees win, tying Babe Ruth's Major League record.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 27, 1938: An ailing Lou Gehrig hits his 493rd and final major league home run, a solo shot off Senators' right-hander Dutch Leonard. On the same date exactly 15 years earlier (9/27/1923), the Yankees first baseman homered off Bill Piercy at Fenway Park for his first career home run.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin their final road trip of the season with the first game of a three-game set at Toronto (through Thurs.)...will also play a three-game set at Kansas City this weekend...went 3-3 on their final homestand after going 1-2 vs. Toronto and 2-1 vs. Arizona.

- Are 9-5 in their last 14 games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a Major League-best 17-9 (.654) record since 8/28**...are 19-12 in their last 31 games (since 8/23).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees clinched a series win over the Diamondbacks with a come-from-behind 6-4 victory on Monday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Clarke Schmidt** (4.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 3BB, 3K, 0HR, 1HP, 1WP) started and did not record a decision...**C Austin Wells** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his second career HR with a game-tying two-run shot in the fourth inning...**3B Oswald Peraza** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) hit a game-tying solo HR in the seventh inning and drew a bases-loaded game-tying walk in the eighth inning...**CF Estevan Florial** (0-for-2, 1RBI, 1BB, 1SF, 1SB) hit a go-ahead sac fly in the eighth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 1BB) reached base three times...**LF Everson Pereira** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) and **1B DJ LeMahieu** (2-for-5) picked up multi-hit games...**RHP Greg Weissert** (2.0IP, 1H, 3K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief, matching the longest scoreless appearance of his career...**RHP Ian Hamilton** (1.2IP, 2H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HP) earned his third win of the season...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 2K) tossed a perfect ninth inning to record his career-high 22nd save.

RARE OCCURRENCE: The Yankees were eliminated from postseason play on Sunday for the first time since 2016...the Yankees were just one of three teams to make the postseason in each of the past six seasons (2017-22, also Houston and Los Angeles-NL)...over that span, 26 teams missed the playoffs at least twice, 22 teams missed the postseason at least three times, 18 teams missed the playoffs at least four times and 13 teams missed the postseason at least five times during that six-season stretch.

AUSTIN POWERS: **C Austin Wells** hit his second career HR on Monday with a game-tying two-run shot in the fourth inning...six of his 10 Major League hits have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 2HR).

- Recorded multiple hits for the second time in his last four games (since 9/20).
- Is hitting .280/.308/.640 (7-for-25) with 4R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI and 1BB in his last seven games (since 9/16).

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starters** have posted a 2.99 ERA (177.2IP, 59ER) in their last 33 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 32R-or-fewer in 30 of those 33 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 24 of those starts.

- Have posted a 2.05 ERA (30.2IP, 7ER) and 32K in their last five games (since 9/20).

ON A ROLL: **INF Oswald Peraza** hit a game-tying solo HR in the seventh inning and drew a bases-loaded game-tying walk in the eighth inning on Monday.

- Is hitting .290 (20-for-69) with 6R, 6 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI and 3BB in his last 18 games (since 9/2).

GO WITH THE FLO: **OF Estevan Florial** hit a go-ahead sac fly in the eighth inning on Monday...has 6RBI in his last eight games (since 9/15)...has reached base in 10 of his last 11 games (since 9/12-G2).

LEMACHINE: **INF DJ LeMahieu** has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games (since 9/12-G1), batting .325/.413/.400 (13-for-40) with 6R, 3 doubles, 5RBI, 6BB and 1SB in that span.

- Since the All-Star break (since 7/14), is hitting .279/.383/.443 (56-for-201) in 55 games in that span...prior to the break, had batted .220/.285/.357 (61-for-277) in 76 games.
- Has reached base in 19 of his last 21 games (since 8/30), 37 of his last 41 games (since 8/1), 54 of his last 60 games (since 7/4) and 61 of his last 69 games (since 6/23).
- Has reached base multiple times in 21 of his last 39 games (since 8/4) and 27 of his last 49 games (since 7/21).

KING OF THE HILL: **RHP Michael King** will make his eighth start of the season tonight...**as a starter this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.78 ERA (30.1IP, 6ER) and 45K in seven starts...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his last six starts, posting a 1.27 ERA (28.1IP, 4ER) in that span**...over that same stretch, leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in ERA (min. 20.0IP).

- **Has recorded 30K over his last three starts (16.2IP).**
- Since 7/21, has gone 2-3 with a 1.87 ERA (43.1IP, 9ER) and 64K in 16 games (seven starts).
- Set career highs in strikeouts (13), innings pitched (7.0IP) and pitches (101) in his last start on 9/20 vs. Toronto.

GLEYBER DAY: **INF Gleyber Torres** reached base three times on Monday...has reached base multiple times in seven of his last 12 games (since 9/12-G2).

- Is batting .309/.399/.536 (56-for-181) with 30R, 14 doubles, 9HR, 22RBI, 25BB, 2HP and 5SB in 48 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 34 of those games and has reached base safely in 40 of those contests...**his .935 OPS since 8/1 is the seventh-highest in the AL (min. .150PA).**
- Since 7/6, is hitting .305/.373/.510 (79-for-259) with 40R, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 30RBI, 28BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 67 games in that span.
- Has recorded a career-high 64BB this season.
- Has hit .338/.360/.513 (27-for-80) with 11R, 5 doubles, 3HR, 17RBI, 3BB, 2SF and 1HP in his last 20 games against Toronto (since 5/11/22)...in his last 31 games vs. the Blue Jays (since 9/28/21), has hit .319/.341/.529 (38-for-119) with 16R, 7 doubles, 6HR, 23RBI, 4BB, 2SF and 1HP.

BATTERS' EYE: **Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.31 PA/BB ratio and a 4.05 pitches per plate appearance ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

ALL RISE: **OF Aaron Judge was named the American League "Player of the Week" on Monday after batting .529/.619/1.235 (9-for-17) with 4R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI and 4BB in five games from 9/18-24**...led the AL in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage, OPS (1.854) and total bases (21), tied for the lead in extra-base hits (six) and was tied for second in home runs...marked his ninth career weekly honor and second of the season (also 5/15-21)...is one of four Yankees (fifth time) to win the award this year (also Gerrit Cole from 4/10-16, Anthony Rizzo from 5/8-14 and Domingo Germán from 6/26-7/2).

- **Is batting .394/.545/.848 (13-for-33) with 7R, 3 doubles, 4HR, 13RBI and 11BB over his last 10 games (since 9/14-G2).**
- Has reached base in 39-of-84 plate appearances over his last 19G (since 9/5), posting a .464 OBP in that span (18H, 21BB).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 35HR are the fourth-most in the AL and his 83BB rank sixth**.
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, leads the AL with 48BB and ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (57)...is also tied for second in the AL in HR (16) and tied for seventh in the Majors over that stretch.
- **Has hit 35HR in 102 games this season...is just the fourth player in Major League history to hit at least 35HR in a season while playing in 108 games-or-fewer** (the Yankees have six games remaining this season)...joins Albert Belle (36HR in 106G in 1994 with Cleveland), Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland) and Rudy York (35HR in 104G in 1937 with Detroit).
- Has hit 32 career home runs vs. the Blue Jays, his second-most against any club (39HR vs. Baltimore)...**are the most by any Yankee vs. the Blue Jays all-time**...are the third-most HR by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017, trailing his own 39HR vs. Baltimore and Mike Trout's 33HR vs. Seattle.
- Has hit 5HR in his last 5G at Rogers Centre (since 9/28/22).
- Is batting .417/.548/1.000 (10-for-24) with 5R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 8RBI and 7BB in his last 7G vs. the Blue Jays (since 5/15).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MICHAEL KING (4-7, 2.66 ERA)

RHP Michael King will make his 48th appearance (eighth start) of the season tonight at Toronto...the 28-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Saturday's postponement...made his last start on Wednesday vs. Toronto, taking the loss despite allowing just 1ER in 7.0IP (5H, 0BB, 13K)...his 13K marked a career high...in his last six starts (since 8/24), is 1-2 with a 1.27 ERA (28.1IP, 4ER) and 42K in that span...**his 1.27 ERA leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in that span (min. 20.0IP)**...is 4-7 with six saves and a 2.66 ERA (94.2IP, 79H, 31R/28ER, 27BB, 121K, 7HR) in 47 appearances (seven starts) this season...in seven starts this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.78 ERA (30.1IP, 6ER) and 45K...as a reliever this season, is 3-4 with six saves, a 3.08 ERA (64.1IP, 22ER) and 76K in 40 appearances...has thrown 2.0 innings-or-more in 22 of his 47 appearances this season (15 in relief, seven starts), with 13 of those 22 outings being scoreless...his 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 scoreless innings are the most in the AL and tied for the most in the Majors...has recorded at least five outs in 27 of his 47 outings this season (20 in relief, seven starts)...his 20 such relief appearances are tied for the third-most in the AL and sixth-most in the Majors...over five seasons with the Yankees (2019-23), has gone 13-16 with seven saves and a 3.37 ERA (237.2IP, 203H, 99R/89ER, 78BB, 276K, 21HR) in 113 appearances (17 starts)...was acquired by the Yankees from Miami along with 2017-18 signing bonus pool money in exchange for INF Garrett Cooper and LHP Caleb Smith on 11/20/17.

LAST TIME OUT: Last started on Wednesday vs. Toronto, taking the loss despite allowing just 1ER in 7.0IP (5H, 0BB, 13K)...his 13K, 7.0IP and 101 pitches marked career highs.

- ✦ Allowed his only run with an RBI single to Bo Bichette in the third inning.
- ✦ Was his third straight start of eight-or-more strikeouts...marks the longest such streak in his career.
- ✦ **Became the first Yankees starter to record at 13K with no walks allowed in a start since Gerrit Cole on 9/1/21 at Los Angeles-AL (15K, 0BB)...became the 11th Yankees starter to do so in franchise history (15th time).**

FOR STARTERS: Has made seven starts for the Yankees this season, going 1-3 with a 1.78 ERA (30.1IP, 6ER) and 45K.

- ✦ In his last six starts (since 8/24), is 1-2 with a 1.27 ERA (28.1IP, 4ER) and 42K in that span... **his 1.27 ERA leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in that span (min. 20.0IP).**
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his seven starts this season.
- ✦ Has surrendered 1BB-or-fewer in six of his seven starts and OBB in four starts.
- ✦ Earned his first career win as a starter on 9/3 at Houston after allowing just 1ER over 5.0IP (5H, OBB, 4K).
- ✦ In 17 career starts, has gone 1-8 with a 4.43 ERA (69.0IP, 34ER) and 81K.

VS. TORONTO: Has made 17 career appearances (three starts) vs. the Blue Jays, going 2-2 with two saves, a 3.35 ERA (43.0IP, 16ER) and 42K.

- ★ Will mark his fifth outing vs. Toronto this season and second in as many starts...has gone 0-1 with one save and a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP, 2ER) in four relief appearances (one start) against the Blue Jays this year.
- ★ In nine career appearances (two starts) against Toronto on the road, has gone 2-1 with one save and a 4.26 ERA (19.0IP, 9ER).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In 22 appearances (four starts) on the road this season, has gone 2-3 with three saves and a 2.05 ERA (48.1IP, 35H, 11ER, 12BB, 58K, 3HR).

- ★ In four road starts this season, is 1-2 with a 2.30 ERA (15.2IP, 4ER) and 20K.
- ★ Has tossed 1.1IP-or-more in 17 of those outings (13 in relief, four starts).
- ★ 16 of his appearances on the road this season have been scoreless.
- ★ In 53 career appearances (10 starts) on the road, is 4-8 with three saves and a 3.31 ERA (117.0IP, 90H, 47R/43ER, 38BB, 7HP, 127K, 7HR).

KING OF THE HILL: Is 4-7 with six saves and a 2.66 ERA (94.2IP, 79H, 31R/28ER, 27BB, 121K, 7HR) in 47 appearances (seven starts) this season.

- ✦ In seven starts for the Yankees this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.78 ERA (30.1IP, 6ER) and 45K.
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his seven starts this season.
- ✦ Struck out 13 batters without issuing a walk on Wednesday vs. Toronto, becoming the first Yankees starter to record at 13K with no walks allowed in a start since Gerrit Cole on 9/1/21 at Los Angeles-AL (15K, 0BB)...became the 11th Yankees starter to do so in franchise history (15th time).
- ✦ Did not allow a run in eight straight relief outings from 7/21-8/16...recorded 17K over 11.2 scoreless innings during that span.
- ✦ Has thrown 2.0 innings-or-more in 22 of his 47 appearances this season (15 in relief, seven in starts), with 13 of those 22 outings being scoreless...his 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 scoreless innings are the most in the AL and tied for the most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded at least five outs in 27 of his 47 outings this season (20 in relief, seven starts)...his 20 such relief appearances are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded at least 1K in 36 of his 42 relief outings this season...has collected multiple strikeouts in 28 of those appearances...has 3K-or-more in 12 relief outings this season, the fifth-most such games among AL relievers and the seventh-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded multiple strikeouts in a career-high 13 straight games (since 7/28)...has recorded multiple strikeouts in 20 of his last 23 outings (since 6/23).
- ✦ As a reliever, has gone 3-4 with six saves and a 3.08 ERA (64.1IP, 51H, 23R/22ER, 23BB, 76K, 6HR).
- ✦ Has six saves this season after entering 2023 with just one career save...has tossed more than 1.0 inning in four of his six saves this season.

RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 33rd start of the season and the 300th start of his career on Wednesday at Toronto...the 33-year-old will start on extended five days' rest...earned his 50th win as a Yankee on Thursday vs. Toronto after allowing just 1ER in 8.0IP (2H, 0BB, 9K)...**is 14-4 with a 2.75 ERA (200.0IP, 61ER) and 217K in 32 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League and the second-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.25)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 25 of his 32 starts this season, tied with San Diego's Blake Snell for the most such starts in the Majors**...started for the American League in the 93rd Midsummer Classic on 7/11 and retired all 3BF, becoming the 12th pitcher in franchise history (20th time) to start an All-Star Game...was named to his sixth career All-Star team via the player ballot...reached 10 years of Major League service on 5/29...recorded his 2,000th career strikeout on 5/23 vs. Baltimore (Jorge Mateo swinging), becoming the third-fastest pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone (in terms of games and innings pitched)...his Major League-leading 257K last season were the most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history, surpassing Ron Guidry's previous record of 248K in 1978...the six-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-23) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting five times (second in 2021, fourth in 2020, second in 2019, fifth in 2018, fourth in 2015)...in 107 starts with the Yankees, is 50-23 with a 3.12 ERA (655.0IP, 227ER) and 811K...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (28th overall) of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play at UCLA for three seasons (2009-11)...was the first overall pick of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, the 15th pitcher (and 11th right-hander) to be chosen first...is the fifth player selected first overall to play for the Yankees, joining Alex Rodriguez, Darryl Strawberry, Tim Lincecum and Ron Blomberg...signed a nine-year contract extending through the 2028 season with a player opt-out following the 2024 season on 12/18/19.

- Is in his sixth season at the helm for the Yankees (2018-23)...guided the Yankees to a 99-63 mark in 2022 (first place in the AL East) and their first division title since 2019.
