SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost the series-opener, 5-4, vs. Braves in 11 innings.

- ◆ Yilber Diaz debuted with a quality start (1 ER in 6.0 IP, 4 H, 1 BB, 5 K)...retired his first 2 batters faced and gave up a solo homer to Austin Riley in the first inning then retired 16 of his next 20 batters faced (3 1B, 1 BB, 4 K), including 9 straight between the third and fifth innings.
- ♦ Corbin Carroll, Christian Walker, Lourdes Gurriel Jr. and Geraldo Perdomo each had 1 RBI.
- ◆ **Kevin Ginkel** had his seventh straight scoreless outings (8.2 IP, 5 H, 0 BB, 13 K).
- ♦ Ryan Thompson worked a scoreless eighth inning.
- ◆ Eugenio Suárez played in his 1,400th career game.

A MEMORABLE DEBUT: Yilber Diaz (age 23-324d) became the fifth youngest D-back starting pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings in their debut, behind Tyler Skaggs (21-040, 2012), Archie Bradley (22-244, 2015), Bryan Augenstein (22-306, 2009) and Enrique González (23-318, 2006).

- 10th D-back starting pitcher all-time to debut with a quality start (last: Drey Jameson, Sept. 15, 2022 vs. Padres).
- 83 pitches were the fewest among D-back starters all-time in a debut of who threw exactly 6.0 innings in a debut (sixth debut of 6.0 IP; previous low: John Patterson, 85 pitches on July 20, 2002 @ Padres).
- 4 hits tied for the sixth fewest in a D-backs starter's debut (4x; previous low: Archie Bradley, 1 hit on April 11, 2015 vs. Dodgers).

HOME SWEET GALLEN: Zac Gallen has 5 straight quality starts at home, going 3-2 with a 1.71 ERA (6 ER in 31.2 IP), opponent .207 AVG (23-for-111)/.570 OPS, 7 walks and 35 strikeouts.

• His 5-gamer at home is tied for the fifth-longest streak by a D-backs starter (1 of 4) since 2017 behind 8-gamers from him in 2023 and Zack Greinke in 2017, 7-gamer by Patrick Corbin in 2018 and 6-gamer by Patrick Corbin in 2017...all-time Top 3 home streaks are: 13 by Patrick Corbin in 2013, 11 by Randy Johnson in 2000 and 10 by Randy Johnson in 2001.

GINKS LOCKED IN: Kevin Ginkel has an 8-game, 8.1-innings home scoreless streak, since June 4, with opponents batting .300 (6-for-30) with 0 walks and 9 strikeouts.

- ♦ Has not issued a walk in his last 7 games since June 25 (30 BF).
- ♦ Has not issued a walk in 19 of his last 20 games since May 18 (82 BF; 2 BB on June 21 @ Phillies).
- Among all relievers (min. 15 G) since May 18, his 2 walks are tied for fourth fewest (12 pitchers; 3 pitchers with 1 walk).

ALL-STAR STARTER: Ketel Marte is now a 2-time All-Star as the fan-elected NL starting second baseman (besting Luis Arraez/Padres 55% to 45%)...second career All-Star selection/start (also: 2019)...second D-back with multiple fan elections (also: Paul Goldschmidt)...D-backs' eighth fan-elected start for a position player.

WIN THE SERIES: The D-backs have won or split 9 of their last 11 series overall since May 30, going 6-2-2, including 3-1-2 on the road (splits @ Mets and Padres, win @ Nationals, loss @ Phillies, win @ Dodgers, win @ Padres).

.500: The D-backs' 45-45 record entering last night's game had them at .500 for the first time since June 21 (38-38) following a 5-4 win @ Phillies, which was their first time at .500 since April 16 (9-9) following a 12-11 win (10 innings.)

VS. BRAVES: The D-backs are 4-4 in their last 8 games vs. Braves, since Sept. 23, 2021.

- ♦ The D-backs were swept @ Braves from April 5-7.
- ♦ In 2023, split the season series 3-games-to-3.

O IS ROLLING: The D-backs offense in its last 11 games, since June 25, ranks among NL teams in runs (1st, 80), OBP (1st, .341), OPS (1st, .802), times on base (1st, 174), SLG (2nd, .462), AVG (2nd, .270), extra-base hits (2nd, 48), doubles (4th, 27) and home runs (3rd, 18).

• The D-backs offense on the roadtrip, July 2-7 scored 50 runs (8.3 runs per game) while batting .311 (71-for-228)/.959 OPS with 15 doubles, 1 triple, 15 home runs and 24 walks.

DEFENSE RULES: The D-backs defense is among the best in the Majors, ranking tied for first with a .988 fielding pct., with the Rangers, Astros, Braves, while their 39 errors are tied for third fewest, with the Astros, behind the Braves (38) and Rangers (38).

LG2: Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has reached base safely in 16 of his last 17 games, hitting safely in 15 games, with a .352 average (25-for-71)/.947 OPS, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers and 13 RBI.

WHAMO WHACKO WALKER: Christian Walker has reached base safely in 6 of his last 8 home games at a .323 clip (10-for-31)/.548 SLG/.912 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 homer, 7 RBI and 2 walks.

GABI THRIVING IN JULY: Gabriel Moreno, since being reinstated from the injured list on July 2, has hit safely in 5 of his last 7 games at a .385 clip (10-for-26)/1.044 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 home runs, 5 RBI and 2 walks.

GOOD VIBES: Eugenio Suárez has hit safely in 7 of his last 10 games, since June 28, at a .333 clip (11-for-33)/.965 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 home run, 7 RBI and 7 walks.

- Joc Pederson: 199 home runs are 1 shy of 200 career homers.
- **Christian Walker**: 692 hits are 8 shy of 700 career hits...793 games are 7 shy of 800 career games.

 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist, NL All-Star starting pitcher and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA (third time: 2020, '22, '23)...set career highs with 34 starts, 17 wins, 210.0 innings and 220 strikeouts...in 34 starts, was 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Third start back from the injured list.

- In 2 starts on Tuesday's this season, is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER in 12.0 IP)...in 9 starts dating back to the 2023 season, is 6-0 with a 3.29 ERA (20 R-19 ER in 52.0 IP).
- In 7 starts following a loss in 2024, is 3-2 with a 2.86 ERA (11 ER in 34.2 IP).

IL STINT: Placed on the 15-day injured list (strained right hamstring) on May 31 and resintated on June 29.

LAST START: Opened with 3.0 scoreless frames (3 ER in 4.0 IP, 4 H, 3 BB, 4 K) and retired 7 of the first 10 batters faced...finished with a no decision in the 9-3 win @ the Dodgers.

• Recorded his 800th career strikeout in the fourth inning (S. Ohtani).

VS. BRAVES: In 4 career starts (3 quality) vs. Braves, is 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (8 R-7 ER in 25.2 IP).

- Is holding Matt Olson and Marcell Ozuna to a combined .160 AVG (4-for-25).
- Has walked 2 or fewer batters in each of his 4 starts.

HOME COOKIN: In 6 home starts (5 quality), is 4-2 with a 1.72 ERA (7 ER in 36.2 IP), opponent .202 AVG (26-for-129)/.569 OPS, 9 walks and 38 strikeouts.

- This season, has 3 home starts of 6.0+ innings with 0 runs allowed.
- Since 2022, his 14 starts of 6.0+ innings with 0 runs allowed lead the Majors ahead of George Kirby/SEA (10).

AMONG OTHER STARTERS: Since 2019, his 19 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are the most in the Majors, ahead of Blake Snell (18) and Corbin Burnes (17).

• Over his first 8 starts, through May 12, held righties to a .195 AVG (16-for-82)/.544 OPS with 7 walks and 27 strikeouts.

RUNNERS ON BASE: With runners on base over his last 8 starts, has held opponents to a .173 AVG (9-for-52)/.415 OPS with 2 walks and 17 strikeouts.

RISPY BUSINESS: Over his last 4 home starts from April 14-June 29, holding runners in scoring position to a .217 AVG (5-for-23) with 1 walk and 10 strikeouts.

CYYOUNG HOPEFUL: Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).

• 2022: fifth (45 votes) // 2020: tied for ninth (2 votes).

ALL-STAR STARTER: Made his first All-Star team as the NL's starting pitcher...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning (1 H, 0 BB, 1 K) in 2023 at T-Mobile Park.

Third D-backs pitcher to start (also: Randy Johnson '00, '01 and Curt Schilling '02).
