To win the AL East for the fifth time in franchise history and the first since 2021...have secured their spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stretch against the Astros (2-0, one to play), Athletics (three to play), and Red Sox (three to play), today at Tropicana Field...have won six of their last eight, 11 of their last 16, and 13 of their last 19 games (Aug. 23–pres.)...since July 20, the Rays are an MLB-best 33-17 (.660)...four of their five remaining series (including current set) come against opponents currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 4.0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL standings, marking the fifth latest date in franchise history they have led the division, trailing only their division titles in 2021, 2020, 2010, and 2008...have spent 118 days leading the division (78 consecutive days, June 27–pres.), 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...have held the AL's best record for 117 days in addition to leading the AL East for 118 days, both of which are franchise records (Stats Perform).

- ★ The Rays claimed their set against the Astros with a 3-2 victory last night...they are a season-high 30 games over .500 for first time since the conclusion of the 2023 season (99-63).
- ★ **Bryan Baker** converted his 40th save of the season and his 29th straight opportunity (see more in "The Tampa Bay Bake Off" note below).
- ★ The come-from-behind victory was their 38th of the season, most in the AL.
- ★ They have won back-to-back games scoring three runs or fewer for the first time since Aug. 7-8, after scoring five runs or more in each of their previous eight wins (Aug. 28–Sept. 9)...they have won three straight games scoring three runs or fewer once in team history between Sept. 19-21, 2024.
- ★ With a win today, the Rays can claim their 90th win of the season, reaching that total for the 10th time in team history (last: 2023, 99-63)...it would also mark their 50th win at the Trop, their first time reaching 50 home wins in a campaign since 2023 (53-28) when they did so for a third straight season (2021-23).

BUSINESS IS BROOMIN'—With a win today, the Rays would claim their MLB-best 15th sweep of the season, surpassing 2021 (14) for the most in franchise history...since the Rays became a franchise in 1998, only 23 major league teams have swept 15 series or more in a season (last: 2022, LAD - 17; HOU - 15)...the 2018 Red Sox (also 15) are the only AL East team to have swept 15 sets or more in a single season since 2004.

- ★ They have swept the Astros on two previous occasions: between July 10-12, 2015 at Tropicana Field and from June 24-26, 2011 at Daikin Park (then Minute Maid Park).

- 162+**—The Rays have clinched a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in franchise history, sixth in the last eight seasons (2019–pres.), and for the first time since 2023...Sept. 11 marked the earliest date in team history the Rays have secured a spot in the postseason, surpassing 2023 and 2020 (both Sept. 17).
- ★ Their six postseason appearances since 2019 are tied for the third most in the majors over that timeframe with the Astros, Braves, and Yankees, behind the Dodgers (7) and Brewers (7; including this season)...each of the franchise's 10 postseason berths have come since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied for the third most in the majors over that span with the Braves, Cardinals and Brewers, three behind the Yankees (13) and five behind the Dodgers (15).
 - ★ The Rays are 4.0 games in front of the Yankees for first place in the AL East with 14 games to play, seeking their fifth division title in team history and first since winning back-to-back in 2020-21 (also: 2010 & 2008)...the AL East is the only division to have all five teams win a division title since 2018.
 - ★ Entering play today, the Rays are 30-21 (.588) against teams currently in a position to make the postseason...only the Brewers (.623/33-20), Astros (.600/27-18), and Braves (.596/31-21) have better records against the 12 teams currently in qualifying position...the Rays pitching staff has produced a 1.09 WHIP against the other 11 teams currently in the playoff picture, best in the majors.

BRIGHTEST LIGHTS, BIGGEST MOMENTS—**Junior Caminero** launched a two-run, walk-off homer in the 9th inning Fri. vs HOU, his first career walk-off plate appearance...per Elias, it marked the 11th time since 1993 when the first World Series was played that a player hit a walk-off home run on the same day his team clinched a postseason spot and the first since SEA Cal Raleigh on Sept. 30, 2022 vs. OAK (see table on the right)...of the 11 instances, Caminero's came on the earliest date in a season...it was the second instance in franchise history, along with **Evan Longoria's** walk-off in Game 162 on Sept. 28, 2011 vs. NYY to secure a Wild Card spot...the Rays are one of three franchises to have multiple such events, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers and the Milwaukee/Atlanta Braves.

- ★ Caminero's blast marked his 40th of the season, securing the following distinctions:
 - ★ First Rays player in franchise history with multiple 40-homer campaigns after hitting 45 in 2025.
 - ★ Second player in the modern era (since 1900) with multiple 40-home-run seasons in age-22- or-younger campaigns (age as of June 30), joining MLN **Eddie Mathews** (1953-54).
 - ★ The first primary third baseman (min. 50% of games at the position) since COL **Nolan Arenado** (2015-16) to have back-to-back seasons with 40 long balls, and the first AL primary third baseman to turn the trick since LAA **Troy Glaus** (2000-01).
 - ★ Became the 10th Dominican-born player with multiple 40-homer seasons and the second Dominican-born primary infielder to do so, joining his World Baseball Classic manager **Albert Pujols** (6x, 2004-06, 2009-10, 2015).
 - ★ The 10th player in the modern era to reach 92 career HR before his age-23 season, alongside Mel Ott (115), **Eddie Mathews** (112), **Alex Rodriguez** (106), **Tony Conigliaro** (104), **Juan Soto** (98), **Mike Trout** (98), **Frank Robinson** (98), **Bryce Harper** (97), and **Giancarlo Stanton** (93).

THE COUNTDOWN—With 14 games left in the 2026 regular season, the following Rays are within reach of the following accomplishments:

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** (306) is four points behind HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (310) for the AL batting title, attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to pace the AL in average...in doing so, he would become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942, alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983)...only five players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) have hit .295 or better in each of their first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in both seasons), joining CHC **Starlin Castro** (2010-11), NYY **Robinson Canó** (2005-06), STL **Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and Suzuki (2001-02).
- ★ Simpson paces the AL in singles (141) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both categories in the same season: CLE **Amed Rosario** (2022) and KC **Whit Merrifield** (2019)...Simpson needs four singles over the Rays final 14 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).
- ★ Diaz (.301) is on pace to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back seasons with a .300 average or better (min. 502PA)...only **Carl Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005-07 and 2009-10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.
- ★ As a team, the Rays have opened September 7-4 and need to win six of their final 14 games to secure their sixth straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the franchise record for consecutive months going .500 or better (also: July 2019–Sept./Oct. 2020).

THE TAMPA BAY BAKE OFF—**Bryan Baker** converted his 40th save of the season last night, becoming the seventh Ray in team history to reach the mark in a season, joining **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47SV), **Brad Boxberger** (2015, 41SV), **Fernando Rodney** (2012, 48SV), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, 45SV), **Danys Baez** (2005, 41SV), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1999, 43SV)...he has successfully closed 29 straight opportunities without a blown save, the longest streak in the majors this season and the longest in franchise history...since saves became a stat in 1969, only 21 pitchers in AL history have had a streak of 29 saves or longer.

- ★ Baker has converted 24 straight save opportunities at Tropicana Field, tied for the fourth-longest single-season streak in AL history and two games shy of the AL record held by BAL **Zack Britton** (26SV, April 6–Sept. 25, 2016)...Rodney has the longest single-season home save streak at 25 saves between April 7–Oct. 3, 2012.
- ★ Baker is the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point after the calendar flips to September, joining Colomé (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), Soriano (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and Hernández (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.

THE SUN & THE STARS—The Rays and Astros conclude their second set this season today...the clubs met for a three-game series in Houston during Fourth of July weekend, with the Rays losing the set, 2-1...having won this three-game set, the Rays have won five of their last seven sets against the Astros (July 28, 2023–pres.), including a three-game series (2-1) at Steinbrenner Field between May 19-21, 2025.

- ★ Through 13 career games opposite the Astros, **Junior Caminero** has hit .275 (14-for-51) with 3 2B, 6 HR, 15 RBI, and a 1.014 OPS...nine of his last 11 hits against the Astros have gone for extra bases.

- ✧ Is 9-for-29 (.310) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 6 RBI, and a .621 SLG over his last eight games since Sept. 4.
- ✧ Ranks among AL leaders in multi-RBI games (T5th, 23), RBI (T6th, 86), hits (T6th, 150), and multi-hit games (T8th, 40).
- ✧ On Sept. 5 at TEX, recorded his second career go-ahead homer in extras off **Jacob Latz**, joining a 10th-inning walk-off on April 19, 2025 vs. NYY...was the fourth such homer by a Rays LHB vs. a LHP, first since **Jake Bauers** on June 24, 2018 vs. NYY (**Chasen Shreve**)...was the fourth time he homered in back-to-back games, the first since Sept. 26-27, 2024...has 4 HR in his last 16G.
- ✧ Has been thrown 1,582 fastballs, third in the AL behind CLE **Steven Kwan** (1,596) and LAA **Mike Trout** (1,594)...24 of 43 XBH (17 2B, 7HR) have come on fastballs.
- ✧ Across his last 80 games (June 12–pres.), he has multiple hits in 24 contests, tied for seventh-most multi-hit efforts in the AL over that span...produced a career-high-tying four-game multi-hit streak (4x, last: May 25-29) from July 8-11...was the third time he's turned the trick this season, and the only other Rays to do so this season are **Yandy Diaz** (June 17-21) and **Chandler Simpson** (Aug. 8-11).
- ✧ In May, he led the majors in average (.374/34-for-91) and on-base pct. (.464)...he also ranked highly in OPS (2nd, 1.025) and hits (T2nd)...was the first Ray to lead MLB in average over a month since Diaz in June 2024 (.400)...his 43 RBI were second most in team history through May (**Evan Longoria** - 2019, 55RBI).

- ★ Launched a postseason-clinching, walk-off, two-run home run in the 9th inning on Fri. vs. HOU...marked his 40th homer and his first career walk-off plate appearance...is the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-home seasons (also 2025)...became the second player in the modern era (since 1900) with back-to-back 40-HR seasons in age-22-or-younger seasons (also: **MLN Eddie Mathews**, 1953-54) and the first primary third baseman to have back-to-back 40-HR seasons since **COL Nolan Arenado** (2015-16)...is the 12th player in the modern era with 90 home runs or more before his age-23 season.
- ★ Is 9-for-31 (.290) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 4 BB, 5 R, and three multi-hit contests over his last eight games.
- ★ With an RBI-single in the 9th inning on Sept. 4 at TEX, reached the 90-RBI mark for the second straight season...is the sixth player since 2000 to reach 90 RBI or more in multiple seasons by his age-22-or-younger season, and is the first since **Juan Soto** (2019, 2021)...is 5 RBI shy of becoming the 15th player in major league history (last: **Miguel Cabrera**, 2004-05) to tally multiple seasons of 100 RBI or more by his age-22-or-younger season.
- ★ He has an RBI in 14 of his last 23 games (Aug. 19–pres.) and 19 of his last 31 (Aug. 10–pres.)...has four home runs in his last 13 games after a career-high-tying 15-game drought (Aug. 12–28) without a long ball.
- ★ Ranks among AL leaders in home runs (1st, 40), total bases (2nd, 301), SLG (2nd, .532), RBI (3rd, 95), XBH (T3rd, 62), hits (4th, 158), runs (7th, 90), and walks (T9th, 74).
- ★ Had his 15-game hitting streak snapped on Sept. 2 vs. NYM...went 21-for-59 (.356) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, and 8 R during the streak...became the youngest Ray (23.058) to produce a 15-game hitting streak or longer...was the longest streak by a Ray this season.
- ★ Through 148 team games, Caminer is on pace to finish the season with 44 homers and 104 RBI...he would become the 15th player in the modern era (since 1900) to have triple-digit RBI in multiple age-22-or-younger seasons, the first since **FLA Miguel Cabrera** (2004-05)...he has started every game this season and could join **Evan Longoria** (2014) and **Aubrey Huff** (2003) as the only Rays to appear in each of the club's games during a single season.
- ★ His 38 hits of 110 mph or faster this year are the most in the majors...also leads the majors with 183 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster and paces MLB with an average bat speed of 79.6 mph.
- ★ Min. 250 AB, his .328 (89-for-271) average vs. fastballs leads the AL...has tallied 33 of his 61 XBH vs. fastballs (11 2B, 22HR).

- ✳️ Has hit safely in 25 of 40 games since the All-Star break, going 38-for-134 (.284) with 7 2B, 4 HR, 18 RBI, and 11 multi-hit efforts in that span.
- ✳️ Has batted .353 (6-for-17) with 7 RBI as a pinch hitter, the most hits as a pinch hitter by a Ray since **Harold Ramírez** recorded a franchise-record 11 in 2023...his 7 RBI as a pinch hitter are tied for fourth in the majors and his six hits are tied for fifth in the AL.
- ✳️ Min. 100 AB, his .324 (47-for-145) average on the road leads the AL and ranks fourth in MLB...has hit safely in 15 of his last 17 road starts (July 17 [G1]-pres.).
- ✳️ Launched a game-tying, two-run home run in the 9th inning Aug. 30 off of SD **Mason Miller**...he later reached on an error in the 11th inning that tied the game...it is the second time in team history that a player tied the same game twice in the 9th inning or later (**Aubrey Huff** - Aug. 31, 2004 vs. BAL: 9th, HR; 11th, 1B).
