THE PIRATES: have split the first two games of this six-game homestand vs. Boston (1-1, Friday-Sunday) and Detroit (Monday-Wednesday), including a 4-0 loss on Saturday at PNC Park... Won one of three games during their recent road trip (August 11-13) to Miami (their 13-1 win on Thursday at loanDepot park was their largest win since a 14-2 victory on July 5, 2024 vs. New York-NL and their largest road win since a 16-1 victory on April 29 [G2], 2023 at Washington)... Have hit 151 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)... Have the most hits (1105) in Major League Baseball... Have scored the third-most runs (625) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (667) and Chicago-NL (641), after scoring 583 runs all of last year... Have struck out the third-most batters (1158) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (1222) and Milwaukee (1204).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh can pick up its eighth consecutive home series win against an American League opponent for the first time with a win today vs. Boston (interleague play began in 1997)... The Pirates swept a three-game series from July 21-23, 2025 vs. Detroit, won two of three games last year from August 18-20 vs. Toronto, won two of three games last year from September 19-21 vs. the Athletics, swept a three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, won two of three games from April 17-19 vs. Tampa Bay, swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota and won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle... The only previous instance where the Bucs did that in seven straight series came from June 18, 2010-June 24, 2012.

THANKS FOR COMING: The paid attendance of 38,408 fans for Saturday night's game between Pittsburgh and Boston marked the third-largest crowd for a game at PNC Park this year, behind only July 25 vs. Chicago-NL (39,105) and April 3 (Home Opener) vs. Baltimore (38,986)... It was also the 16th regular-season crowd of at least that many fans for any August-October contest during the stadium's history (since 2001) and the first since August 8, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL (38,981).

NEXT UP: Pittsburgh will welcome Detroit to town for three games this week (Monday-Wednesday)... Monday's game will be broadcast on ESPN, marking the Pirates' first home game on ESPN since August 7, 2019 vs. Milwaukee... Pittsburgh will end its season with three games at Comerica Park (September 25-27), marking the third time it ends a year against an American League team (also Sept. 25-27, 2020 at Cleveland & Sept. 27-29, 2024 at New York).

JAKE RAKES: Jake Mangum singled twice on Saturday vs. Boston and is now hitting .449 (22-for-49) in 15 career games against the Red Sox... His batting average against Boston since April 14, 2025 (his first game against the Sox) ranks first in Major League Baseball during that stretch (minimum 45 at-bats)... The Athletics' Jacob Wilson (.327, 17-for-52) is second on that list... Mangum has collected multiple hits in eight of his 15 games against Boston.

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez singled twice on Saturday vs. Boston and has now hit safely in five consecutive games (since August 11 at Miami)... He has gone 7-for-19 (.368) with a double and three RBI during the streak... Valdez' .369 OBP is the fifth-best mark among all Major League rookies, behind Detroit's Kevin McGonigle (.388), Colorado's Cole Carrigg (.373), Colorado's TJ Rumfield (.371) and Chicago (AL)'s Munetaka Murakami (.370)... Valdez' .925 OPS is the highest mark among all Major League rookies.

GO WITH THE FLO: Rafael Flores Jr. singled in the fifth inning on Saturday night vs. Boston and has now hit safely in each of his last three games (since Thursday at Miami)... He has gone 6-for-12 (.500) with three home runs and eight RBI during the streak... Flores Jr. has become the first Pirates right-handed hitter with at least six hits (including three home runs) and eight RBI during a three-game span since Andy LaRoche (September 26-28, 2009).

HOW ACQUIRED: From Miami in a four-player trade on August 3, 2026.

AS OF LATE: Bachar allowed three runs over 3.0 innings of relief in his last appearance, which came in Pittsburgh’s 8-2 loss on Wednesday at Miami (it was his first game back as a visitor at loanDepot park)...He has pitched at least 2.0 innings in each of his first three games with the Pirates (also August 5 at Milwaukee/August 8 vs. New York-NL).

AGAINST THE RED SOX: Bachar pitched a perfect eighth inning in his only career appearance against Boston, which came in Miami’s 2-1, walkoff loss on August 15, 2025 at Fenway Park...He needed just 13 pitches (10 strikes) to retire Abraham Toro (groundout), Ceddanne Rafaela (flyout) & Carlos Narváez (lineout) in that appearance.

I WANT YOU, BACH: Bachar was acquired by Pittsburgh from Miami, in exchange for right-handed pitcher Brandon Bidois, outfielder Brian Sanchez and infielder Hyun Seung Lee, prior to Major League Baseball’s Trade Deadline on August 3...He went 1-2 with two saves, a 3.84 ERA (58.2ip/25er), 61 strikeouts and a .201 batting average against (43-for-214) over his 38 appearances (four starts) with the Marlins this season.

START ME UP: Bachar has a 2.00 ERA (9.0ip/2er) and 11 strikeouts in four starts this year, coming on June 2 at Washington (2.2ip), June 6 vs. Tampa Bay (3.0ip), June 13 at Pittsburgh (2.0ip) and June 19 vs. San Francisco (1.1ip)...He struck out Bryan Reynolds, Tyler Callihan, Jake Mangum and Jared Triolo during his start on June 13 here at PNC Park (that was the only one of the four starts Miami did not win)...Bachar pitched 2.0 innings in his first Major League start, which came last year on Sept. 1 at Washington.

HOME SWEET HOME: Bachar has a 2.37 ERA (30.1ip/8er), 33 strikeouts, a .170 batting average against (18-for-106) and a 0.89 WHIP in 19 home appearances (two starts) split between Miami’s loanDepot park and Pittsburgh’s PNC Park this season... His home batting average against ranks eighth in Major League Baseball (minimum 105 at-bats), behind New York (AL)’s Brent Headrick (.125), Houston’s Steven Okert (.133), Chicago (AL)’s Huascar Brazobán (.147), Milwaukee’s Jacob Misiorowski (.156), Toronto’s Spencer Arrighetti (.156) and Seattle’s Bryce Miller (.162)/Bryan Woo (.164).

YOU GOT THAT RIGHT: Bachar has limited right-handed hitters to a .168 batting average against (18-for-107), a .242 on-base percentage and a .588 OPS so far this season...His batting average against versus right-handed hitters ranks seventh in all of Major League Baseball (minimum 105 at-bats), behind only Texas’ Jacob Latz (.105), Los Angeles (NL)’ Shohei Ohtani (.142), Chicago (NL)’s Ryan Zeferjahn (.151)/ Ben Brown (.157), Tampa Bay’s Drew Rasmussen (.163) and Atlanta’s Dylan Lee (.165).

ROAD TO THE SHOW: Bachar pitched in parts of seven minor league seasons (2016-19 and 2022-24) in San Diego’s organization (there was no minor league season in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and he missed all of 2021 while recovering from “Tommy John” surgery)...He was designated for assignment by the Padres on September 1, 2024 and was claimed off waivers by Miami on September 3, 2024...He made his Major League debut on September 8, 2024 vs. Philadelphia, where he struck out the side (Weston Wilson, Brandon Marsh and Aramis Garcia) in the eighth inning.

BACH-GROUND INFO: Bachar was originally selected by San Diego out of the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, where he played both football (2013-15) and baseball (2015-16), in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft (was rated by Baseball America as the No. 100 draft prospect before the season)...He led the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference w/103 strikeouts as a junior (‘16).
