2025 LOS ANGELES ANGELS SEASON SUMMARY

ANGELS OVERALL: The 2025 Angels completed their 65th MLB campaign with a 72-90 (.444) mark, in fifth place in the A.L. West (-18.0)...Club was 20-29-3 in 52 series...Halos were 39-42 at home and 33-48 on the road...Angels were 23-29 vs. A.L. West, 13-18 vs. A.L. Central, 14-17 vs. A.L. East, and 22-26 in Interleague play...Club went on a season-high eight-game win streak from May 16-23 and the longest losing streak was eight games from Sept. 11-19...Finished under .500 for a 10th consecutive season...The 72 wins on the year were nine more than the 63 wins in 2024, marking the Angels largest year-to-year win improvement since 2014 (98 wins after having 78 in 2013).

TEAM MVP: **Jo Adell** was selected by his teammates as the Angels Most Valuable Player...The Angels MVP is awarded by vote of the players to the Angel who most truly exemplifies the qualities of inspirational leadership, sportsmanship and professional ability... Adell had a team-leading 37 home runs this season which ranked fourth in the American League, while his 98 RBI tied for eighth...He was the A.L. Player of the Week for Sept. 1-7 and matched a franchise record with 11 home runs in June.

NICK ADENHART AWARD: The Nick Adenhardt Award, annually voted on by Angels players, goes to the top pitching performer for the season...2025 recipient was **José Soriano**, who led the Angels pitching staff with 10 wins and compiled 152 strikeouts across his 169.0 IP... Soriano led the Majors with a 65.5% ground ball rate, which was the highest rate for any MLB pitcher since Houston's **Framber Valdez** had a 67.3% rate in 2022... He also induced an MLB leading 30 double plays this season, which were the most for any Angels pitcher since **Scott Schoeneweis** (30) in 2000.

THE MANAGERS: **Ron Washington** began his 10th season as a Major League manager in 2025 and his second with the Angels...The Angels had a 36-38 entering play on June 20 when **Ray Montgomery** took over as acting manager...On June 27, the Angels announced that Washington would remain on medical leave for the remainder of the season and named Montgomery as the Interim Manager...The Angels finished the year with a 36-52 record under Montgomery.

400 HOME RUN CLUB: On Sept. 20 at Colorado, **Mike Trout** became the 59th player all-time to reach 400 career home runs...He is the third player to record his 400th HR in an Angels uniform, joining Hall of Famers **Dave Winfield** (Aug. 14, 1991 at Minnesota) and **Vladimir Guerrero** (Aug. 10, 2009 vs. Tampa Bay)...He is the 20th player to hit each of his first 400 HR with one team and joins **Ken Griffey Jr.** (April 10, 2000) as the only players to hit #400 against the Rockies...He is the third player to reach 400 with exactly 200 HR at home and 200 HR on the road, joining **Fred McGriff** and **Jason Giambi** (ELIAS)...Trout's 400th career home run traveled an estimated distance of 485 ft., which is third-longest of his career in the Statcast Era (since 2015).

RAISING THE BAR: For a second consecutive season, **Zach Neto** set a new single-season Angels record for home runs as a shortstop...His 25 HR in 2025 topped his previous Club record of 23 homers as a shortstop in 2024.

MY NAME IS: The Angels used 65 different players in 2024, which is the third-most in a season in franchise history (Halos used 66 different players in 2022 and 2023)...Additionally, Angels used a Club record 41 different pitchers in 2025.

ROTATION REGULARS: **Kyle Hendricks** (31 GS), **Yusei Kikuchi** (33 GS) and **José Soriano** (31 GS) became the first trio of Angels pitchers to make 31+ pitching starts in a season since 2011 (**Dan Haren**, **Ervin Santana** and **Jered Weaver**)...Hendricks, Kikuchi and Soriano also all pitched 162+ innings this year, which was the first time the Angels had three qualified starting pitchers since 2014 (**Garrett Richards**, **Jered Weaver** and **C.J. Wilson**).

CLUTCH COMEBACKS: The Angels had a Major League leading (and franchise record) 28 wins when trailing or tied after seven innings...The 28 such wins were the most for any team since the 2004 Dodgers and the most by an American League team since the 1984 Blue Jays...Halos also led MLB with 17 wins when trailing or tied after eight innings, which was the second-highest total in Club history (18 wins in 1997)...The nine walk-off wins for LAA were sixth-most in the Majors and the Angels highest total since having 11 walk-offs in 2015.

THE CLOSER: **Kenley Jansen** converted 29 of 30 save chances on the year, including each of his final 14 save opportunities...He finished the year with 476 career saves, which are two away from matching **Lee Smith** (478 SV) for third-most all-time...In his last 36 outings, he had a 1.02 ERA (35.1 IP - 4 ER)...He did not allow a hit in his final 10 appearances (10 IP), which was his longest career streak and he became the first Angels pitcher to make 10 consecutive appearances without allowing a hit since **Mike Morin** (11 G) in 2016.

ALL-STAR YUSEI: **Yusei Kikuchi** was selected to the 2025 American League All-Star team as the Angels representative...It was his second career All-Star selection (also, 2021 with Seattle)...His 115 strikeouts before the All-Star Break were the most for an Angels pitcher since **Shohei Ohtani** had 132 first half SO in 2023 and were the most by an Angels left-hander since **Chuck Finley** (135 SO) in 1998.

HOMEGROWN HALOS: On June 23 vs. Boston, the Angels set a franchise record using eight of their first-round Draft picks in one game (**Zach Neto**, **Nolan Schanuel**, **Mike Trout**, **Taylor Ward**, **Jo Adell**, **Christian Moore**, **Reid Detmers** and **Sam Bachman**)...Per ELIAS, it was the first time any team used eight of their own first-round draft picks (including compensation rounds) in a game since the Brewers on July 3, 1991 (also vs. Boston).

HR DUO: **Jo Adell** and **Taylor Ward** are the third set of Angels teammates to both reach 36+ home runs in a season...They join **Mike Trout** and **Albert Pujols** in 2015 and **Troy Glaus** and **Mo Vaughn** in 2000.

TAYLOR'S VERSION: **Taylor Ward** hit a career-high 36 HR this year, which tied for fifth in the American League...His career-high 103 RBI on the season were sixth in the A.L. and the most in a season for an Angels player since **Mike Trout** had 104 RBI in 2019...Ward became the fourth left fielder in Angels history to have a 100 RBI season, joining **Darin Erstad**, **Garret Anderson** and **Jose Guillen** (min. 70% of games in LF).

HOMERIN' HALOS: The Angels hit 226 HR on the season, which was fourth-most in the Majors...It was also third-most in a season in Club history (236 HR in 2000 and 231 HR in 2023).

ZACH ATTACKS: With 26 home runs and 26 stolen bases on the season, **Zach Neto** became the fourth player in Angels history to have multiple seasons with 20+ HR and 20+ SB, joining **Don Baylor**, **Mike Trout** and **Shohei Ohtani**.

2025 ANGELS SEASON SUMMARY

LET THE KIDS PLAY: A total of nine players made their Major League debuts with the Angels during the 2025 season: **Ryan Johnson, Garrett McDaniels, Michael Darrell-Hicks, José Fermin, Matthew Lugo, Christian Moore, Chad Stevens, Mitch Farris** and **Denzer Guzman**.

HOME SWEET HOME: On Aug. 6 vs. Tampa Bay, **Mike Trout** hit his 200th career homer at Angel Stadium to become the 27th player all-time to have 200+ HR at one ballpark and the first player in MLB history with 200+ HR and 100+ SB at any one ballpark.

LEADING OFF: The Angels established a single-season franchise record with 11 leadoff home runs in 2025...**Zach Neto** hit nine leadoff homers which set a new individual franchise single-season record, and eclipsed the previous mark of seven by **Brian Downing** in 1987...Neto's four leadoff HR in May matched the MLB single-season record for the month, joining **Jose Altuve** (May 2022) and **Shohei Ohtani** (May 2025).

CLOSE CALLS: The Angels went 28-21 (.571) in one-run games in 2025, which tied for the sixth-best winning percentage in the Majors...Halos also had 40 comeback wins, which were third-most among American League teams, and the most for the Angels in a season since 2017 (47 comeback wins).

OUCH: For a third consecutive season, Angels batters set a new single-season Club record for hit by pitches, with 87 HBP in 2025 (previous record was 86 HBP in 2024)...On Sept. 5 vs. Athletics, **Mike Trout** was hit by a pitch for the 106th time in his career, which established a new Angels record...The previous mark belonged to Angels Hall of Famer **Brian Downing** (105 HBP)...On Sept. 7 vs. A's, the Halos were hit by five pitches, which set a new single-game franchise record.

THE INJURED LIST: Angels used the injured list a total of 32 times for 26 different players.

TURNING THREE: In a Freeway Series game against the Dodgers on Aug. 12 at Angel Stadium, the Angels turned the eighth triple play in franchise history and first since Aug. 18, 2023 vs. Tampa Bay...With **Brock Burke** on the mound and runners on first and second base, **Shohei Ohtani** lined out to **Zach Neto**, who stepped on second base and tossed to first to complete the play.

RELIEVER OF THE MONTH: **Kenley Jansen** was named A.L. Reliever of the Month for July...In 11 games, he went 2-0 with five saves, a 0.00 ERA (11.1 IP - 0 ER) and 13 strikeouts...It was his third career monthly honors after winning N.L. Reliever of the Month in June 2017 and July/August 2020...He was the fifth Angels pitcher to win the award, joining **Francisco Rodriguez** (Aug. 2006 and June 2008), **Mike Mayers** (Sept. 2020), **Raisel Iglesias** (July 2021) and **Carlos Estévez** (June 2024).

ORIGINAL STARTING FIVE: The Angels were the only team to use exactly five starting pitchers throughout the first half of the 2025 season (**Yusei Kikuchi, José Soriano, Jack Kochanowicz, Tyler Anderson** and **Kyle Hendricks**)...LAA established a new franchise record for the most games (96) to begin a season using no more than five starters (Halos used five starters through the first 80 games in 1999)...Over the last decade, the only other teams to use five starters through the first 96 games were the 2018 Astros (126 games) and 2016 Cardinals (98 games).

OPENING DAY STAPLE: With his start on Opening Day in Chicago, **Mike Trout** matched **Garret Anderson's** franchise record with his 13th career Opening Day start...It was Trout's first Opening Day start as a designated hitter after making 12 consecutive Opening Day starts in center field from 2013-24.

STRAIGHT TO THE SHOW: With his Major League debut on March 27 at Chicago (A.L.), **Ryan Johnson** became the 24th player in MLB history to go straight from the Draft to the Majors without first playing in the minor leagues...He was the first MLB player to do so since White Sox LHP **Garrett Crochet** in 2020 and joined LHP **Jim Abbott** (1989) as the only Angels to accomplish the feat.

THAT'S RIGHT: The Angels faced a right-handed starting pitcher in a Major League leading 134 of 162 games (82.7%) in 2025...The last team to face a righty starter in more games in a season was the 2002 Braves (138 games).

FREEWAY SERIES SWEEP: The Angels swept all six Freeway Series games against the Dodgers in 2025...It was the second time the Halos swept the Freeway season series (4-0 vs. LAD in 2019)...Dating back to last year, LAA has won seven straight games vs. Dodgers (Halos longest streak ever in series history).

HOMER HISTORY: On April 10 at Tampa Bay, the Angels totaled six home runs, with two each from **Jo Adell, Taylor Ward** and **Mike Trout**...Adell became the third player in Angels history to hit two home runs in the same inning, joining **Kendrys Morales** (July 30, 2012 at TEX) and **Rick Reichardt** (April 30, 1966 at BOS)...It was the third time in Halos history that three players had multiple HR in the same game, previously: July 14, 1990 vs. TOR (**Dante Bichette, Brian Downing** and **Dave Winfield**) and April 21, 2000 at TB (**Troy Glaus, Tim Salmon** and **Mo Vaughn**).

SUDDENLY C-MO: Angels 2024 First Round Draft pick **Christian Moore** made his MLB Debut on June 13 at Baltimore...The Brooklyn native recorded his first career multi-HR game and first career walk-off in the Angels 3-2 win in 10 innings on June 24 vs. Boston...At 22 years, 246 days old, he was the youngest player in Angels history to have a multi-HR game and a walk-off hit in the same game (previous was **Matt Thaiss** – age 24).

FIRST HALF FEATS: **Zach Neto** finished the first half as the only A.L. player with 18 doubles, 15 HR and 17 stolen bases...Just two players all-time reached those totals before the All-Star Break in fewer plate appearances than Neto's 328 PA: **Barry Bonds** (1990 Pirates - 305 PA) and **Reggie Sanders** (1995 Reds - 291 PA)...**Logan O'Hoppe** established a new franchise record for most home runs by a catcher (15) before the All-Star Break.

STRONG START: From March 30 - April 1, **Kyren Paris** became the fourth player in Angels history with a game-tying or go-ahead RBI in the 7th inning-or-later of three straight games, joining **Jared Walsh** (April 3-5, 2021), **Rod Carew** (June 9-11, 1980) and **Willie Smith** (June 22-24, 1964). (**ELIAS**)...Paris was the first player in American League history with 5+ HR and 4+ SB in his first 10 games played of a season and had the highest OPS through 10 games for a player age-23 or younger (min. 25 PA) since **Jimmie Foxx** (1.731) for the 1928 Philadelphia A's.

REID THIS: From May 20 - July 7, **Reid Detmers** had a streak of 22 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run...The streak finished tied for the eighth-longest in Angels history and was the longest since a 25-game streak by **Cam Bedrosian** from June 3- Aug. 2, 2016.

GOING GLOBAL: Over the course of the 2025 season, the Angels used players from nine different countries and territories: United States (47 players), Dominican Republic (6), Venezuela (4), Cuba (3), Colombia (1), Curaçao (1), Italy (1), Japan (1) and Puerto Rico (1).

ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD: **Logan O'Hoppe** was named the Angels nominee for the 2025 Roberto Clemente Award...The award is the annual recognition of a Major League player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy, and positive contributions both on and off the field.

HEART AND HUSTLE AWARD: **Zach Neto** was the Angels recipient of the 2025 Heart and Hustle Award, which is voted on by Alumni and presented to a player who demonstrates a passion for the game of baseball and best embodies the values, spirit and traditions of the game... It was Neto's second time receiving the honors (also, 2023), making him the fourth Angels player to win the award multiple times, joining **Torii Hunter, Mike Trout** and **David Fletcher**.

ACT OF VALOR AWARD: For a third consecutive season, **Zach Neto** was the Angels nominee for the 2025 Bob Feller Act of Valor Award... The award is given annually to a current MLB player, recognizing their support of U.S. military service members and veterans and their active involvement and leadership in their community.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: For the first time since 2011, three Angels affiliates reached the Postseason in their respective leagues...The Arizona Complex League Angels captured their first ever ACL Championship and the first title for an Angels affiliate since Orem won the Pioneer League Championship in 2016...Inland Empire reached the California League Championship Series after finishing the second half with a league-best 42-24 record...The Dominican Summer League Angels qualified for the DSL Playoffs for a third consecutive season.

DRAFT RECAP: The Angels made 21 total selections in the 2025 Draft... With the #2 overall pick, the Angels drafted RHP **Tyler Bremner** from UC Santa Barbara...It was the Angels highest draft pick since taking **Darin Erstad** at #1 overall in 1995...Overall, the Halos picked 14 pitchers and seven position players...Angels nine high school selections were their most in the first 20 rounds of a Draft since 2010.

MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STARS: Six members of the Angels organization were recognized by Minor League Baseball as All-Stars in their respective leagues in 2025:

DEADLINE DEALS: During the week of the Trade Deadline, the Angels acquired LHP **Andrew Chafin** and RHP **Luis García** from Washington in exchange for LHP **Jake Eder** and minor league 1B **Sam Brown**... Additionally, the Angels added INF **Oswald Peraza** from the New York Yankees in exchange for minor league OF **Wilberson De Peña** and international bonus pool space.

ALL-MLB NOMINEES: Five members of the Angels were named as nominees for the 2025 All-MLB Team: **Zach Neto** (SS), **Mike Trout** (DH), **Jo Adell** (OF), **Taylor Ward** (OF) and **Kenley Jansen** (RP)...The selections will be announced on November 13 during MLB Awards Week.

A LOOK TO 2026: The Angels will open the 2026 regular season on Thursday, March 26 at Houston...It will mark the earliest Opening Day in Club history, breaking the previous mark from earlier this year on March 27, 2025 at Chicago (A.L.)...It will be the Angels fourth consecutive year beginning a season on the road and the eighth road opener since 2017...Additionally, it will be the second time the Angels begin a season against the Astros, after starting the 2022 campaign vs. Houston at Angel Stadium...The Home Opener is scheduled for Friday, April 3 vs. Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - LHP YUSEI KIKUCHI

7-11, 3.99 ERA

Went 6-3 with a 2.93 ERA (89.0 IP - 29 ER) and 87 strikeouts in 16 starts at home

- 2025 IN REVIEW:** Led American League with a career-high 33 starts on the season; Made at least 32 starts for the fourth time in his career, and third consecutive season (also, 2024, 2023, 2019)...Was named an A.L. All-Star for the second time in his career (also, 2021) in his seventh Major League season and first with Angels.
- THE ALL-STAR:** Represented the Angels at the 2025 MLB All-Star Game in Atlanta, his second career All-Star selection and first with the Halos...Was previously named an A.L. All-Star with Seattle in 2021.
- STAFF ACE:** Led qualified Angels pitchers in games started (33), innings pitched (178.1 IP), strikeouts (174), strikeout rate (22.5%), and ERA (3.99).
- 1K CLUB:** Struck out his 1,000th career batter on Sept. 6 and became the fourth Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history to reach 1,000 career strikeouts (Yu Darvish, Hideo Nomo, Kenta Maeda)...Notched 900th career strikeout in June 3 start at Boston and became the sixth Japanese-born pitcher to reach the milestone.
- WARPATH:** Produced a career-high 3.3 bWAR in 2025...Accrued 1.9 bWAR in first 13 starts, eclipsing career high (1.8 bWAR) set in 2023 with Toronto (32 starts).
- AT THE BIG A:** Went 6-3 with a 2.93 ERA (89.0 IP - 29 ER) and 87 strikeouts at home this season...His 2.93 ERA at home ranked eighth-lowest among American League pitchers (min. 15 home starts)...Prior to the All-Star Break, Kikuchi went 4-1 with a 1.98 ERA (59.0 IP - 13 ER) and 60 strikeouts in 10 home starts...Prior to joining the Angels in 2025, had made eight starts at The Big A in his career as a visitor and gone 2-2 with a 8.12 ERA (37.2 IP - 34 ER) and 38 strikeouts.
- NO PLACE LIKE HOME:** Had a +2.11 run difference between his ERA at home (2.93) and on the road (5.04) this season, the sixth-largest home-road difference in the A.L. (min. 20 GS)...Halos went 11-5 in Kikuchi's starts at home this season, compared to a 4-13 record in his starts on the road.
- STRANDED:** In his 16 home starts, Kikuchi stranded 83.3% of runners on base and held opponents to a .250 (31/124) average against with runners on, including a .246 (15/61) average with runners in scoring position.
- INTERLEAGUE ACE:** Went 2-0 with a 2.50 ERA (57.2 IP - 16 ER) and 53 strikeouts in 10 Interleague starts this season...2.42 ERA in Interleague play was the fourth-best in American League (min. 8 GS) and eighth-lowest in MLB.
- RELIABLE:** Tied for the MLB lead with 33 starts this season; has made at least 32 starts in three consecutive seasons...Since 2023, his 521.2 IP since the start of 2023 ranks second among LHP in MLB and 11th among active pitchers.
- ONE AND DONE:** Penned two starts where he allowed just one hit this season, on June 6 vs. ATH (W, 7.1 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 5 SO) and Sept. 24 vs. KC (W, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 1 BB, 6 SO)...In June 6 start, set a career-high by retiring the first 13 hitters of the game before allowing a single with one out in the 5th inning.
- QUALITY STARTER:** Made 11 quality starts this season, and held opponents to three-or-fewer earned runs in 25 of 33 starts...Did not allow more than two earned runs in 18 starts on the campaign.
- BREAKING NEWS:** Ranked in the 85th percentile of all qualified pitchers in breaking ball run value (+7) this season...Threw either a slider or curveball with 51.6% of pitches, and held opponents to a .246 (91/370) combined batting average against those pitches this season.

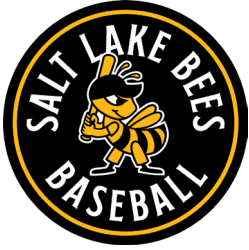
