**METSELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Nationals, 4-3, yesterday...The Mets have won eight of their last 10 games (including the April 11 makeup on August 28)...The Mets are 21-29 (does not include the resumption of the April 11 suspended game on August 28) since the All-Star break...The Mets continue a seven-day, eight-game road trip (3-2) to Washington D.C. (3-2) and Miami (three games)...Following this series, the Mets head back to the New York for their penultimate homestand of the season, a nine-game, 10-day stand against the Yankees (three games), the Cardinals (three games) and Phillies (three games).

**VENEZUELAN SENSATION:** In his last start, Carlos Carrasco passed Wilson Alvarez to move into sixth place all-time for most strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Carrasco is 12 wins away from becoming the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach 100 career wins.

**THREE NIGHTS IN MIAMI:** Michael Conforto is a career .281/.390/.456 hitter with 12 extra-base hits and 19 RBI in 37 career games in Miami...Javier Baez is batting .278/.333/.472 with eight extra-base hits and 10 RBI in 18 games at loanDepot Park...Pete Alonso has hit .269/.426/.635 with six home runs in 16 games at the ballpark.

**SIX OF ONE, A DOZEN OF THE OTHER:** Pete Alonso is on a six-game hitting streak...He is batting .417 (10-24) with four runs, four doubles, a triple, a home run, five RBI, two walks, a .444 OBP and a .792 SLG in that span...He is on a career-high 12-game road hitting streak...Since August 16, Alonso is batting .383 (18-47) with 11 runs, three doubles, two triples, four home runs, 13 RBI, two walks, a .444 OBP, a .787 SLG and a 1.232 OPS.

**30 FOR 20:** Pete Alonso became the ninth Met to record multiple seasons of 30 or more home runs and the first to have done so within his first three seasons... He hit an MLB rookie record 53 home runs in 2019... With one more home run, Alonso will become just the eighth player in major league history to hit 100 or more homers within their first three major league seasons.

**MOVIN' ON UP:** Michael Conforto has hit 129 home runs, which is seventh on the team's all-time list...Carlos Beltrán is next with 149 home runs as a Met...Pete Alonso is tied with George Foster for 15th on the team's all-time home runs list with 99 home runs...Carlos Delgado is 14th with 104 home runs...14 players have hit 100 or more home runs with the franchise...Alonso's 99 home runs are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

**LINSANITY:** Over his last 24 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .284 (23-81) with 16 runs, three doubles, a triple, four home runs, 18 RBI, 10 walks, a .366 OBP, a .494 SLG and an .859 OPS...Over his last six games, Lindor is batting .318 (7-22) with seven runs, two doubles, two home runs, six RBI, two walks and a 1.042 OPS...Among active shortstops, his 151 home runs rank second behind only Colorado's Trevor Story (153).

**A HIT'S A HIT:** Over the last eight games, the Mets are batting .311/.371/.528 with 15 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs and an .899 OPS...The Mets have outscored their opponents 52-33 in that span.

**GIMME A BREAK:** The Mets are batting .253/.323/.414 with 80 doubles, four triples, 60 home runs 192 RBI and 147 walks in 50 games following the All-Star break...This compares to a .232/.311/.375 slashline with 113 doubles, six triples, 90 home runs, 319 RBI and 270 walks in 88 games prior to the break.

**WHO SAYS WINS IN RELIEF DON'T MATTER?:** The Mets bullpen is first in the NL and second in the majors with 42 wins this season...No team in Mets history has earned more wins from the 'pen...The previous team record was 32 wins from relievers in 2006 and 2019...The Rays (2018, 2019, 2021) are the only club to ever have 50 or more wins from the bullpen in a season...Only 15 teams, including the 2021 Mets, since 1901 have gotten as many as 40 wins from relievers...Mets relievers are 42-23 (.646) overall this year...Their .646 winning percentage ranks third in the majors.

**MARLINS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 43-42 since loanDepot park opened in 2012...New York has lost five of their last six games in Miami.

**THE MAGIC MAN:** Since returning from the injured list on August 22, Javier Baez is batting .327 (17-52) with 13 runs, five doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, a .375 OBP, a .654 SLG and a 1.029 OPS...He is 9-18 (.500) with seven runs, two doubles, two home runs, three RBI a 1.494 OPS over the last five games.

**DINGERS!** The Mets have hit nine home runs in their last four games...The Mets have homered in 11 of their last 12 games, including the make up of the April 11 game...The Mets have hit 20 home runs in that span...The Mets are 51-41 when hitting at least one home run this season and 24-12 when hitting two or more.

**WE NEED TO TALK ABOUT KEVIN:** Over his last eight games, Kevin Pillar is batting .478 (11-23) with seven runs, two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, two walks and a 1.625 OPS...In 54 games on the road, Pillar is batting .262/.313/.477 with 14 extra-base hits and 28 RBI...This compares to a .189/.220/.361 slashline with nine extra-base hits and 11 RBI in 49 games at home.

**NL EAST:** The Mets are in a stretch of 14 straight games against division foes... The team is 8-3 in the stretch...The Mets have won 10 of their last 13 games against opponents in the division...They are 33-30 with a 3.75 ERA (220 earned runs/5271 innings) against the NL East this season...They are batting .248/.318/.401 with 65 home runs against the division.

**VILLAR THE WORLD:** Jonathan Villar has reached base safely in each of his last 13 starts...He is batting .415 (22-43) with 10 runs, four doubles, a triple, three home runs, seven RBI, six walks and a 1.173 OPS in that span...In 49 games following the All-Star break, Villar is batting .303/.365/.497 with 22 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 15 walks, 20 RBI and an .862 OPS...This compares to a .236/.318/.438 slashline with 21 extra-base hits and 19 RBI in 69 games before the break.

**FIRST CLASS:** In 40 games batting first this season, Jonathan Villar is hitting .306/.389/.531 with 29 runs, 10 doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 13 RBI, 19 walks with a .920 OPS...The Mets are 25-15 in games Villar leads off...His .306 average when batting first is the seventh-highest mark in the majors.

**WINNING!** The Mets own a 36-26 record with a 3.74 ERA against teams with a record below .500...They are hitting .251/.326/.420 against those teams...This compares to a 33-43 record with a 3.83 ERA and a .231/.307/.366 slash line against teams that are .500 or better.

**WHEN YOU'RE HERE, YOU'RE FAMILIA:** Jeury Familia is tied with Marcus Stroman for the team lead with nine wins...That surpasses his career-high of eight that he set in 2018 between the Mets and the A's...Over his last 14 games, Familia is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (two earned runs/13.0 innings) with five walks and 16 strikeouts...He is 9-3 with a 3.33 ERA (19 earned runs/51.1 innings) with 23 walks and 65 strikeouts in 54 games this year.

**WE LIKE MIKE:** Michael Conforto is batting .267 (8-30) with eighth runs, three home runs, 12 RBI, a .353 OBP and a .567 SLG over his last nine games...He is batting .239/.335/.447 with 25 runs, nine doubles, eight home runs and 23 RBI in 50 games following the All-Star Game...This compares to a .202/.341/.298 slashline with 10 extra-base hits and 20 RBI in 53 games in the first half.

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** On this day in 1984, Doc Gooden and the Mets blanked the Cubs, 10-0, in front of 46,301 fans at Shea Stadium...Gooden threw a complete game shutout on the way to his 15th win of the season...He allowed only one hit, walked four and struck out 11...The Mets put up 10 runs on 12 hits in the game...Mookie Wilson and Darryl Strawberry doubled, while George Foster and Strawberry homered in the win...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at [metsheritage.com](http://metsheritage.com).

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** In his last start, Carrasco threw a season-high 82 pitches in 5.1 inning against the Marlins on September 2....Carrasco allowed three runs on four hits with one walk, and five strikeouts...The righty has allowed one walk or fewer in each of his seven starts this season.

**VS. MARLINS:** Tonight, Carrasco will make his fifth career start against the Marlins and third start against Miami this season...Carrasco is 1-0 with a 2.14 ERA (five earned runs/21.0 innings) with two walks and 25 strikeouts lifetime against the Marlins...This will be the second time in his career that Carrasco will face the Marlins on the road (also: August 4).

**SUCCESS IN SEPTEMBER:** In 58 games (42 starts) in September, Carrasco is 17-16 with a 3.36 ERA (105 earned runs/281.2 innings)...His 17 wins, 58 appearances, 42 starts, 281.2 innings and 319 strikeouts are his highest totals in any month for Carrasco...Since 2014, Carrasco is 15-12 with a 2.85 (70 earned runs/220.2 innings) in 44 games (32 starts) in September.

**2020 REVIEW:** In his 11th big league season, Carrasco finished with a 3-4 record and a 2.91 ERA (22 earned runs/68.0 innings), seventh best in the American League... Carrasco ranked sixth in the AL in strikeouts with (82), eighth in innings pitched (68.0), ninth in opponent average (.221), and 10th in HR/9 (1.06)...In his final six starts of the season, Carrasco went 1-1 with a 1.66 ERA (seven earned runs/38.0 innings).

**CAREER REVIEW:** Prior to joining the Mets, Carrasco pitched in 11 major league seasons, going 88-73 with a 3.77 ERA (520 earned runs/1242.1 innings) in 242 career games (195 starts), all with Cleveland...Carrasco was tied for the American League lead with 18 wins in 2017 and finished 4th in AL Cy Young voting that season... Since 2015, Carrasco is one of ten pitchers to have at least three seasons of 200+ strikeouts (2015, 2017, 2018)...From 2015-2020, Carrasco had 69 wins, tied for the 10th-most during that span.

**VENEZUELAN SENSATION:** In his last start, Carrasco passed Wilson Alvarez to move into sixth place all-time for most strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher... Carrasco is 12 wins away from becoming the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach 100 career wins.

**BETTER AFTER THE 1ST INNING:** Carrasco has a 15.43 ERA (12 ER/7.0 IP) in the first inning this season, the second highest total in the majors (min. seven starts)...Has a 3.74 ERA (9 ER/21.2 IP) in all subsequent innings

**C IS FOR COMMUNITY:** In 2019, Carrasco earned the Roberto Clemente Award for his numerous community endeavors...Formed two foundations in 2016, one in the U.S. and one in his native Venezuela...He and his family have raised nearly \$2.7 million, primarily sending medical supplies to his native Venezuela, the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico...Has donated thousands of books via his book drive in Cleveland and in his offseason home of Tampa, he helps to feed and clothe immigrants from Venezuela...Collected thousands of books through the United Way Stuff The Bus initiative, as well as collecting food items for the Step Up To The Plate. Campaign.

**#59 IS #57:** Carrasco became the 57th player used by the Mets this season, breaking the previous franchise record of 56 players used in 2018...He became the 17th starter used by the Mets this year...Only the 1967 Mets used more starters.
