METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets return to action after the All-Star break...In their last game on Sunday, July 14, the Mets fell to the Rockies, 8-5, at Citi Field...The Mets have won five out of their last six and seven of their last nine...New York returns from the All-Star break with a four game set in Miami followed by a two-game series in The Bronx...The Mets return to Citi Field on Thursday, July 25 for a four-game series against the Atlanta Braves.

WHILE YOU WERE GONE: On Sunday, July 14, RHP Eric Orze was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse and LHP Joey Lucchesi was sent outright to Triple-A Syracuse...LHP David Peterson returned from the Paternity list on Monday, July 15...On Wednesday, July 17, LHP Alex Young was claimed off waivers from the San Francisco Giants and was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...LHP Tyler Jay was designated for assignment.

WINNING! With a win tonight, the Mets would move back to four games above .500, which matches a season-high...The last time the Mets were five games above .500 was on April 23, 2023 (14-9)...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets have gone 25-11...Their 25 wins are the most in the majors in that span, as is their .694 winning percentage.

DINGERS! The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 121 home runs this season...The Mets have five players who have hit 10 or more home runs this year (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, J.D. Martinez, Brandon Nimmo and Mark Vientos)...Only the Padres and Orioles have more with seven players...Last year, the Mets featured eight players with 10 or more home runs, tied for the third-most in franchise history.

20/20 VISION: Francisco Lindor currently sits at 26 doubles, 17 home runs and 18 steals this season...Last year he became the ninth player in franchise history to record 20+ doubles, 20+ homers and 20+ steals in a single season...He is looking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple 20/20/20 seasons joining Howard Johnson (x5, 1987-91), Darryl Strawberry (x4, 1984, 1986-88), Carlos Beltrán (x2, 2007-08) and David Wright (x2, 2006-07).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets have played 43 games on the road entering today...That is tied with the Phillies for the second-fewest in the majors...Only the Rays (42) have played fewer...They are 23-20 away from Citi Field in 2024...Their .535 winning percentage is the fifth in The Show and third in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have hit .267/.328/.441 on the road this year...They rank second in the majors in average and SLG.

WAY, AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: Brandon Nimmo is batting .297/.413/.577 with 35 runs, 10 doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 31 RBI and 23 walks in 39 games on the road this season...This compares to a .211/.318/.358 slashline with 24 runs, eight doubles, one triple, 32 RBI and 26 walks in 51 games at home in 2024.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 16-12 against the National League East this season...They have posted a 4.24 ERA, while batting .258/.321/.423...The Mets have won 12 of their last 16 games against the division...The Mets went 25-27 against the NL East in 2023.

LET'S GO FISHING: J.D. Martinez, a native of Miami, is a .326 (14-43) hitter with four runs, four doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI and eight walks in 11 career games at loanDepot park...Francisco Lindor has hit .286/.377/.438 with 16 runs, seven doubles, three home runs, 15 RBI and 12 walks in 27 games at the yard...Brandon Nimmo has hit .284/.383/.584 with nine doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 27 RBI and 23 walks in 45 games in Miami...Pete Alonso has recorded 19 extra-base hits (12 home runs) with 24 RBI in 38 career games at the home of the Marlins.

JULY! JULY! JULY! The Mets are 9-5 this month...Their .643 winning percentage this month is the fourth-best in baseball and the best in the National League...They have posted a 4.65 ERA, while batting .254/.317/.447 this month...This compares to 16-8 record with a 4.17 ERA and a .280/.356/.504 slashline in June.

RECORD SCRATCH: The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500...The team is 9-5 in this stretch...The Mets are 31-21 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

JUST THE TWO OF US: Brandon Nimmo moved to the two spot for the first time on June 13 vs. Miami...He has appeared in 28 games in the two-hole and the Mets are 19-9 in that span...Nimmo is batting .312 (34-109) with 27 runs, seven doubles, nine home runs, 31 RBI, 15 walks, three steals with a .405 OBP, a .624 SLG and a 1.029 OPS when batting second this season...He has safely reached base in 26 of his last 27 games, posting a .410 OBP in that span...He has collected 63 RBI in 90 games this year...He recorded a career-high 68 RBI in 152 games last season.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Entering June, Nimmo was batting .214/.350/.378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 36 games since then, he is batting .294/.377/.559 with 30 runs, nine doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 34 RBI, 16 walks, four steals with a .936 OPS...He has brought his OPS up from .728 on May 31 to .825 entering today.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 52 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .299/.380/.526 with 38 runs, 18 doubles, 10 home runs, 32 RBI, 22 walks, 12 steals with a .906 OPS...Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and second in the NL with a 4.2 fWAR this season...He has posted a 3.5 fWAR since May 1...That is fourth-best in the majors in that span...In 66 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .278/.351/.496 with 12 home runs and 41 RBI...The Mets are 29-22 when Lindor bats first this season.

MANAEA NEWS & NOTES

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut...He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit *Elias*.

WRITING A CHECK FOR 10K: On June 1 vs. Arizona, Manaea recorded 10 strikeouts...It was his eighth career game with double-digit strikeouts and his first since May 14, 2022 at Atlanta when he was a member of the Padres...It was the first double-digit strikeout performance by a Mets pitcher this season and the first since Jose Quintana's 10-strikeout performance on September 23, 2023 at Philadelphia.

SUCCESSFUL SEAN: In his first two starts as a Met, Manaea allowed one run over 11.0 innings...He joined Harry Parker, Masato Yoshii, Dillon Gee and Chris Bassitt as the only starters in franchise history to allow one or zero runs through their first two career starts with the Mets...Manaea allowed only four hits in his first two start with the club, tied with Rick Reed, Bruce Chen and Kazuhisa Ishii for the fewest hits allowed by a Met in their first two games with the club (Min. 10.0 IP)...His 14 strikeouts are tied with Bassitt, Steven Matz and Kodai Senga for the fifth-most in franchise history by a pitcher through in their first two games with the club...Only Pedro Martinez (21), Aaron Harang (18), Matt Harvey (18) and Pedro Astacio (16) had more strikeouts through their first two games as a Met.

HOMER HAPPY: Over his last ten starts, Manaea has allowed eight home runs over 55.0 innings...In his first eight starts of the season, the southpaw allowed one homer over 41.1 innings...His 0.22 HR/9 rate during his first eight starts of the season, was the sixth-lowest rate in the majors during that span (Min. 40.0 IP).

SWEEPIN SAMOAN: At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal...Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering...Through his first 18 starts of the 2024 season, opposing batters are 9-60 with 33 strikeouts in at-bats ending with the pitch...His 50.8 K% with the pitch is second-best in the majors, while his 44.0 whiff% is sixth-best mark in the majors this season (Min. 25 Plate Appearances).

SINK OR SWIM: This season, Manaea has held batters to a .216 (32-148) average on his sinker...Manaea has thrown the pitch 39.9% of the time, the highest usage rate of any of his six pitches in his arsenal...The southpaw has a run value of 12 with his sinker, tied for the second-best mark in the majors and his 34 strikeouts via the sinker are tied for sixth-most in the majors.

NO HITS FOR YOU: On April 20, 2018, Manaea threw a no-hitter against the Red Sox in Oakland...The southpaw walked two and struck out 10...It was the 12th no-hitter in Athletics history and the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Oakland...According to *Elias*, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in major league history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOSE QUINTANA (4-6, 4.13)

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed five runs over 5.2 innings on July 14 vs. Colorado at Citi Field and recorded a loss...Allowed six hits, issued one walk and recorded eight strikeouts.

OPENING UP: Quintana took the mound for Opening Day on March 29 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...He became the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He was the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

- Has 26 home runs in 83 career games against Miami, tied with David Wright for the most in franchise history...Are the third-most against any single opponent since 2019 behind Aaron Judge's 29 homers against Baltimore and his 27 homers against Washington.
- Is tied for fifth in the NL and tied for 14th in the majors with 19 home runs...Also ranks tied for 11th in the NL in extra-base hits (40), tied for 13th in doubles (21), 14th in total bases (166) and tied for 16th in runs (53).
- Was named a National League All-Star for the fourth time in his career...Is the 11th player in franchise history to be selected to four or more All-Star Games and is the eighth position player in franchise to be selected to four or more All-Star Games.

- Has 549 RBI, seventh-most in franchise history...Carlos Beltrán (559) is next.
- Picked up his second three-hit game of the season on June 17 vs. Texas (Also: 4/13 vs. Kansas City...Has 29 multi-hit games, tied for the seventh-most in the NL and tied for 14th-most in the majors.
- Went 2-5 with a two-run homer and a two-run single on June 16 vs. San Diego...Was his ninth career five-RBI game, the second-most such games in franchise history behind David Wright (10)...Are the second-most such games since 2019 behind only Nelson Cruz (10).

- Is batting .333/.410/.552 with 15 RBI and 12 extra-base hits in 28 games since returning from the IL on June 11.
- Hit safely in a career-best 10 straight games from June 15-28...Batted .515/.595/.939 with three home runs, five doubles, 10 RBI and seven runs during the stretch...Was the longest hitting streak by a Mets catcher since Wilson Ramos' 26-game hitting streak from August 3 - September 3, 2023.
- Went 2-5 with a go-ahead double in the sixth and an RBI triple in the 10th on July 1 at Washington...Was his first career triple.
- Posted a 1123 OPS in June, the highest mark by a catcher younger than 23 in a month (Min. 50 Plate Appearances) since Johnny Bench in June 1970 (1208)...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.
- Went 3-3 with a home run, a double, a walk, three RBI and three runs on June 26 vs. Yankees...Was the third time in his career reaching base four times in a game.
- Has 30 home runs, the fourth-most by a catcher before turning 23...The only catchers with more homers prior to turning 23 are Johnny Bench (87), Iván Rodríguez (37) and Darrell Porter (31).
