TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners play the second of a 3-game series tonight against the Washington Nationals (1-0)...Seattle will also welcome the Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5) to T-Mobile Park on the 9-game homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 6-4 road trip against the San Diego Padres (3-0), Chicago White Sox (2-1) and Houston Astros (1-3)...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Dave Valle on the call, with Jen Mueller serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) with Rick Rizzs, Angie Mentink and Gary Hill Jr. on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners opened the 9-game homestand with a 9-1 win over the Nationals... eattle is 14-11 at home and 16-12 on the road this season...the Mariners are 21-4 when scoring 5+ runs and 25-7 when scoring at least 4.

- Top of The West The Mariners are in 1st place in the AL West Division, 1.5 games ahead of 2nd place Houston and 4.5 games ahead of the Rangers.
- Hold On Seattle is 22-0 when leading after 7 innings, and 25-0 after 8 innings, this season.
- Walk It Out The Mariners offense has a 10.2% walk rate, 2nd-highest in the Majors behind the Yankees (10.4%).
- Never Out of It Seattle has 15 come-from-behind victories this season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors, trailing only the Dodgers (18), Twins (16) and Cubs (16).
- **Programming Note -** Friday's game is a scheduled <u>7:10</u> start while Saturday's first pitch is set for <u>4:15</u> and will air exclusively on FOX with Jason Benetti and Adam Wainwright on the call.

CAL: BEST CATCHER IN THE GAME...catcher Cal Raleigh hit two home runs yesterday and has posted a .975 OPS in 53 games this season, batting .258 (50x194) with 35 runs, 10 doubles, 19 home runs, 37 RBI, 34 walks and 5 stolen bases, with a .372 on-base percentage and .603 slugging percentage...he leads MLB catchers in virtually every offensive statistical category, and overall in the Majors ranks 2nd in home runs, T-9th in walks (34), 4th in slugging percentage, 5th in OPS, 6th in extra-base hits (29), T-5th in total bases (117), T-4th in bWAR (2.9), 5th in OPS+ (184), 2nd in fWAR (3.2) and 5th in wRC+ (179)...Cal has appeared in all 53 of the Mariners games this season.

REMEMBER WHEN KIRBY WENT ON STRIKE?...the last time George Kirby faced the Washington Nationals at T-Mobile Park on Aug. 24, 2022, he began the game with an MLB-record (since pitch tracking began in 1988) 24-consecutive strikes to begin the game, besting the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on Aug. 30, 2018 vs. STL (w/PIT).

THE J-ROD SHOW IS A HIT...Julio Rodríguez was 3-for-5 with a home run and 3 RBI in last night's game and has recorded 3 hits in back-to-back games...over his last 18 games since May 6, Julio is batting .312 (24x77) with 13 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 16 RBI and 1 stolen base, getting on base at a .338 clip and slugging .532 (.870 OPS)...overall in May, J-Rod is batting .293 (27x92) with a .841 OPS, a .330 OBP and slugging .511 with 15 runs, 2 doubles, 6 home runs and 18 RBI.

FIRST FOUR AND ONE YEAR AGO ... Julio Rodríguez is up to 90 career home runs with two-thirds of his fourth career season to go...his 90 home runs trail only **Cal Raleigh** (93) and Alvin Davis (92) in Mariners history through a player's first 4 seasons...Julio currently ranks 7th among centerfielders (min. 50% of games) in MLB history through 4 seasons, trailing Joe DiMaggio (137 HR)...Julio needs just 12 more home runs this season to pass Earl Averill (101) and Wally Berger (101) for 2nd among centerfielders...last year, Raleigh set the MLB record among catchers in their first 4 career seasons, passing Mike Piazza (92 HR).

PITCHING OVER LAST 13 GAMES...the Mariners pitching staff since May 13 is 8-5 with a 2.35 ERA (30 ER, 115.0 IP) with 100 strikeouts and 22 walks...Seattle has held its opponents to 3-or-fewer runs in 10 of those 13 games...during that span (5/13-c), Seattle's 2.35 ERA ranks 2nd in MLB to the Yankees (2.00 ERA), while its 4.55 strikeout-to-walk ratio leads baseball over the next-closest Yankees (4.35 SO/BB).

SERIES-LY SOLID...the Mariners own an 11-5-1 series record in 2025 (4-3-1 at home and 7-2 on the road)...the Mariners won 9 consecutive series from April 7-May 7, the second-longest series winning streak in club history...since **Dan Wilson** took the helm on Aug. 23, 2024, Seattle owns a 18-7-3 series record.

REPEAT AL RELIEVER OF THE MONTH?...right-hander Andrés Muñoz is tied for the Major League lead with 17 saves this season (also: Robert Suarez-SD)...in 23 appearances, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month for March/April is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 22.2 IP) with 8 hits allowed, 2 runs allowed (0 earned runs), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 28 strikeouts, sporting a 0.706 WHIP, while limiting opponents to a .108 batting average (8x74)...his 22.2 innings pitched and counting without allowing an earned run to begin the season are a Mariners franchise record for a relief pitcher...Muñoz leads MLB relievers in bWAR (2.1) and has already surpassed his career-high 2.0 bWAR from last season...the franchise record for highest bWAR in a season by a Scottle religious belongs to Rill Caudill (4.4 bWAR) in a season by a Scottle religious belongs to Rill Caudill (4.4 bWAR) in 1982. highest bWAR in a season by a Seattle reliever belongs to Bill Caudill (4.4 bWAR) in 1982.

DOSCIENTOS JUEGOS...Andrés Muñoz has appeared in 200 regular season games with the Mariners (2021-c)...in a Seattle uniform, the 26-year-old right-hander has 56 saves and a 2.20 ERA (48 ER, 196.2 IP) with 73 walks and 269 strikeouts, a 0.992 WHIP, 12.3 strikeouts-per-9 ratio and 3.68 strikeout-to-walk ratio, holding opponents to a .177 batting average and .526 OPS.

HARD-HITTING STUFF...the Mariners have 3 of the top-10 players with the highest barrels-per-plate appearance percentage in the Major Leagues according to Baseball Savant...Cal Raleigh (13.4 Brls/PA%) ranks 3rd in the big leagues, while Rowdy Tellez (12.0) ranks 9th and Jorge Polanco (11.8) ranks 10th.

BRYAN WOO: AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH CANDIDATE ... right-hander Bryan Woo has a 1.71 ERA (6 ER, 31.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 1 walk in 5 May starts, holding opponents to a .225 batting average... Woo's 1.71 ERA ranks 5th in the American League (min. 25 IP) in May, while his 30.0 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks 2nd to Kevin Gausman-TOR (33.0 SO/BB)...in Mariners history, the only pitchers with a better strikeout-to-walk ratio (min. 25 IP) in a calendar month that woo's current 30.0 mark are Hisashi Iwakuma (39 SO, 1 BB in 42.2 IP) in July 2014 and Logan Gilbert (31 SO, 1 BB in 35.2 IP) in June 2024.

ON THE HOMESTAND...the Mariners are home at T-Mobile Park for a 9-game homestand, hosting the Washington Nationals (3 G, 5/27-5/29), Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5)...the homestand is highlighted by Randy Arozarena Bobblehead 3-Day Giveaway from May 27-29, K-Pop Fireworks Night on May 30, Little League Day on June 1, Pride Night on June 4 and a pair of Mariners Value Games on June 3 and June 5, with tickets starting at \$11.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Cal Raleigh recorded the 13th multi-homer game of his career last night and his 3rd this season, and...YOU MAY ALSO KNOW?...that he has homered from both sides of the plate (4/16 at CIN), from the left side twice (5/2 at TEX) and from the right side twice (5/27 vs. WSH), the first time in his career he has hit two homers in a game from the right side, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that he is the first catcher in MLB history to homer from both sides of the plate in a game, homer twice from the left sidein a game and twice from the right sidein a game in the same year?...h/t to OptaSTATS for the note.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 2nd start of the season...he is also making his 91st career start and 3rd against the Nationals.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle: selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Tv Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...L#1 in season debut against the Houston Astros on May 22...he allowed 5 runs on 6 hits with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts across 3.2 innings of work...it marked his first Major League start since Sept. 25, 2024 after beginning the season on the 15-day injured list due to right shoulder inflammation.

IN HIS OWN WORDS

"I could take some things to learn from today...obviously didn't go the way I wanted to, but I was trying to take a couple of things from today and, most importantly, I felt good, so kind of just take that for the next start.

Kirby on his 2025 season debut in Houston

HOME SWEET HOME...is making his first start at T-Mobile park since Sept. 15, 2024 vs. TEX when he tossed 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit and no walks in the 7-0 win...holds a 2.99 ERA (82 ER, 247.0 IP) across 42 career starts at T-Mobile Park...his ERA is the 2nd-best mark in Mariners history at T-Mobile park (min. 200 IP), trailing only Luis Castillo's 2.86 ERA (85 ER, 267.2 IP)...of that list, his 9.36 SO/9 at T-Mobile Park is the 4th-best mark while his 8.57 SO/BB is the best mark in franchise history.

AGAINST THE NL EAST...holds a 2-4 record with a 2.67 ERA (16 ER, 45.0 IP) against NL East teams...against those opponents, he has allowed 45 hits, 6 home runs, and just 4 walks with 50 strikeouts across 9 career starts.

11 IN A ROW...has collected a decision in each of his last 11 consecutive

starts (8/7/24-c), including 10 consecutive decisions to end his 2024 season...his current 11-game streak is the longest by a Mariners pitcher since Luis Castillo recorded 14 consecutive decisions from Sept. 7,

2023-May 12, 2024...his 10 straight decisions to end the 2024 season marked the longest streak by a Mariner at the end of a season since Charie Furbush recorded 10 in a row from Aug. 3-Sept. 25, 2011.

NO FREE PASSES HERE...Kirby is the only pitcher in Mariners history to toss 500+ innings and less than 70 walks in a player's first 90 career starts...he is also the only Major League pitcher in the last 25 years to toss 500+ innings and 65-or-fewer walks through his first 90 career starts.

ETCHED IN THE RECORD BOOKS...Kirby's 488 career strikeouts are the 5th-most by a Mariners pitcher through his first 90 career starts. trailing James Paxton (533), Félix Hernández (519), Logan Gilbert (506), and Erik Hanson (493)...of pitchers with 500 innings pitched through their first 90 career starts, his 3.49 ERA is the 3rd best in Mariners history, trailing Hisashi Iwakuma (3.08) and James Paxton (3.37).

2024 TOTALS...went 14-11 with a 3.53 ERA (75 ER, 191 IP) with 23 walks and 179 strikouts in the 2024 season...he also limited opponents to a .245 batting average with a 1.068 WHIP across a career-high 33 starts...he also set career-high marks in wins (14), innings pitched (191.0) and strikeouts (179).

KING GEORGE...led the Majors in SO/BB ratio (7.78) for the 2nd straight season, becoming the 1st pitcher to do that since Cliff Lee in 2012-13...Kirby also led the Majors in fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.1) for the 2nd straight season, also the first to do that since Lee in 2012-13.

QUALITY STUFF...recorded 20 quality starts (for the 2nd consecutive season, becoming 1 of 3 pitchers in MLB with 20+ starts in each of the last 2 years (also: Logan Webb-SF and Zack Wheeler-PHI)...Kirby is 1 of 8 pitchers to record multiple 20+ quality start seasons with Seattle, joining Felix Hernandez (7x), Jamie Moyer (5x), Randy Johnson (4x), Mark Langston (3x), Mike Moore (3x), Erik Hanson (2x) and Jason Vargas (2x).

MORE QUALITY STUFF...recorded 9 consecutive quality starts from June 9-July 26, longest quality start streak of his career and 4th-longest in MLB...he has completed 6.0 innings in 56 of his 90 career starts and 22 games in his 33 starts in 2024...last season, the Mariners went 14-8 in games that Kirby pitched 6.0+ innings, compared to their 2-9 record when he went less than 6.0 innings.

GOING ON STRIKE...began his outing on 8/24/22 vs. Washington by throwing 24-consecutive strikes, the most to start a game since the pitch tracking era (1988-current), passing the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on 8/30/18 vs. STL with PIT.
