





**#17 AARON BOONE—Manager****Career Managerial Record: 569-403 (7th-most wins by a Yankees Manager, next: Joe Girardi, 910)**

- The 2024 season marks his seventh year at the helm for the Yankees (also 2018-23)...guided the Yankees to an 82-80 record in 2023, finishing fourth in the AL East...marked the Yankees 31st consecutive winning season and sixth such season under Boone...has led the Yankees to two division titles (2019 and 2022).
- According to *Elias*, was the first Manager in Baseball history to reach the postseason in each of his first five managerial seasons...was the third Manager to make the playoffs in his first five seasons with the Yankees (2018-22), joining Casey Stengel (first five from 1949-53) and Joe Torre (first 12 from 1996-2007).
- Was re-signed by the Yankees on 10/19/21 to a three-year contract through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...was named the 33rd Manager in club history on 12/4/17...is the 18th person to both play for, and manage, the Yankees...is one of eight active managers to have played for the franchise he currently manages, joining Kevin Cash (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (Boston), A.J. Hinch (Detroit), Mark Kotsay (Oakland), Dave Martinez (Washington/Montreal), Bob Melvin (San Francisco) and Dave Roberts (Los Angeles-NL).
- Has 38 career managerial ejections (five in 2024: 7/21 vs. TB, 6/22 vs. ATL, 5/28 at LAA, 4/22 vs. OAK, 4/10 vs. MIA; seven in 2023; nine in 2022; six in 2021; two in 2020; five in 2019; four in 2018).

**YANKEE DOODLES — HITTERS****#95 OSWALDO CABRERA—INF/OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/4G (4x)**

- Four of his 5HR have either tied the game (two) or given the Yankees the lead (two) this season.
- Is batting .317 (13-for-41) with 11R, 2 doubles, 6RBI, 4BB, 1HP, 1SB and 1SF over his last 18 games (since 6/22).
- Has hit safely in each of his last six starts (since 7/6), batting .500/.545/.500 (9-for-18) with 6R, 3RBI, 3BB, 1SF and 1SB over that span.
- Was 2-for-4 with 1R and 2RBI on Monday vs. Tampa Bay...hit a two-run single in the fourth inning.
- In 55 career Interleague games, is batting .277 (41-for-148) with 25R, 7 doubles, 5HR, 22RBI, 18BB and 45B.
- Appeared defensively at all three outfield positions (LF - 51G/34GS, RF - 49G/25GS, CF - 1G), 3B (15G/13GS), 2B (6G/3GS), SS (5G/5GS) and 1B (1G) in 2023...according to *Elias*, was just the third player in franchise history to play all three outfield positions and all four infield positions in a single season, joining Clay Bellinger (2000) and Wid Conroy (1905).

- Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list prior to Friday's game...missed six team games...was originally placed on the 10-day injured list on 7/12 (retroactive to 7/9) with the stomach flu.
- Has not played in each of the last four games.
- Was acquired along with cash considerations from the Oakland Athletics in exchange for INF Jordan Groshans on 6/23...was added to the active roster prior to the game on 6/25.
- Hit .236 (29-for-123) with 12R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 5RBI, 9BB and 3HP in 39 games with Oakland this season, appearing defensively at first base (24G/17GS) and third base (14G/11GS)...over his last 24 games with the Athletics (5/4-6/16), hit .275/.351/.377 (19-for-69) with 8R, 1 double, 2HR, 3RBI, 6BB and 2HP...signed a Major League contract with San Francisco on 2/7 before being released on 3/11...was signed by Oakland to a Major League contract on 3/16 before being designated for assignment on 6/18.
- Has appeared over parts of eight Major League seasons with Houston (2017-18), New York-NL (2019-22), San Francisco (2022-23), Oakland (2024) and Yankees (2024).
- Has posted a .771 OPS in his career vs. left-handed pitchers.

- Four of his 6HR this season have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (three).
- Has reached base in 22 of his last 25 starts (since 6/6).
- Was 1-for-3 with 1R and 1BB on Monday vs. Tampa Bay.
- Is a two-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020, '22)...was just the fourth player in Padres history to win multiple Gold Gloves, joining Tony Gwynn (five), Steve Finley (two) and Dave Winfield (two).

**Current Trend:** 5H/3BB/1HP in last 22PA**2024 Multi-Hit Games:** 3; 2-hit (2), 3-hit (1), 4-hit (0)**#14 JAHMAI JONES—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/4G**

- Is batting .321/.406/.536 (9-for-28) with 5R, 1 double, 1 triple, 1HR, 3RBI, 2BB and 2HP in nine starts this season.
- Has not played in each of the last two games.
- Appeared in seven games with Milwaukee in 2023 over two stints (7/3-9 and 7/16-28), hitting .200 (2-for-10) with 2R, 1 double, 3RBI, 1BB and 1SB.

**Current Trend:** 7H in last 23AB**2024 Multi-Hit Games:** 1; 2-hit (0), 3-hit (1), 4-hit (0)**#99 AARON JUDGE—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/8G**

- Has reached base in 87 of his 100 games this season, batting .310/.435/.676 (111-for-358) with 76R, 24 doubles, 1 triple, 35HR, 89RBI, 75BB, 6HP, 2SF and 55B...during his 2022 AL MVP campaign, had hit .297/.383/.671 (113-for-380) with 87R, 16 doubles, 42HR, 91RBI, 53BB, 2HP, 45F and 105B through his first 100 games.
- His 87 games reaching base this season are tied with Juan Soto and San Diego's Jurickson Proffar for the Major League lead...has reached base multiple times in 62 of those games, tied with Juan Soto for the most games in the Majors...has reached base at least three times in 31 games this season, the second-most games in the Majors behind only Juan Soto (33)...has recorded multiple walks in 15 games this season, the second-most such games in the Majors behind only Juan Soto (22).
- Leads the Majors in HR (35), RBI (89), OBP (.435), SLG (.676), OPS (1.111) and extra-base hits (60), is tied for first in game-winning RBI (15), ranks second in walks (75, second in AL), times on base (192, second in AL), total bases (242, first in AL), go-ahead RBI (21, second in AL) and WAR among position players (6.6 - FanGraphs, second in AL), fifth in runs scored (76, fourth in AL) and multi-hit games (35, second in AL), and eighth in BA (.310, fourth in AL).
- 17 of his 35HR this year have either given the Yankees the lead (16) or tied the game (one).
- Is one of seven players in franchise history (14th time) to hit at least 35HR through the team's first 102 games of a season, joining Babe Ruth (42HR in 1921 and 1928, 37HR in 1920 and 36HR in 1930), Lou Gehrig (36HR in 1934 and 35HR in 1927), Roger Maris (40HR in 1961 and 35HR in 1960), Mickey Mantle (39HR in 1961 and 36HR in 1956), Tino Martinez (35HR in 1997), Alex Rodriguez (35HR in 2007) and his own 42HR in 2022.
- Is just the third Yankee in the last 83 years (since 1942) to record at least 60XBH through the team's first 102 games of a season, joining Alex Rodriguez (60XBH in 2007) and Alfonso Soriano (62XBH in 2002).
- Is one of four Yankees (fifth time) in the last 63 years (since 1962) to record at least 89RBI in the Yankees' first 102 games of a season, joining his own 91RBI in 2022, Alex Rodriguez (102RBI in 2007), Bernie Williams (96RBI in 2000) and Tino Martinez (97RBI in 1997).

- Is the sixth Yankee (sixth time) in the last 63 years (since 1962) to record at least 242 total bases through the Yankees' first 102 games of a season, joining his own 255TB in 2022, Alex Rodriguez (246TB in 2007), Alfonso Soriano (250TB in 2002), Derek Jeter (242TB in 1999) and Tino Martinez (247TB in 1997).
- Is batting .372/.478/.915 (35-for-94) with 21R, 6 doubles, 15HR, 34RBI, 19BB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB in 26 Interleague games this year.
- Has hit .329/.391/.817 (27-for-82) with 17R, 4 doubles, 12HR, 22RBI, 7BB, 2HP, 1SF and 1SB in 23 career games vs. the Mets...has homered in each of his last four games vs. the Mets (since 8/22/22) and has 7HR in his last eight games against New York-NL (since 9/11/21).
- Over his last 73 games (since 4/27), is hitting .362/.481/.802 (93-for-257) with 67R, 18 doubles, 1 triple, 31HR, 76RBI, 55BB, 5HP, 1SF and 45B...had hit just .178/.317/.356 (18-for-101) with 9R, 6 doubles, 4HR, 13RBI, 20BB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB over his first 27 games of the season from 3/28-4/26.
- Walked in a season-high-tying seven straight games from 7/11-21 (also had a seven-game streak from 6/1-8)...drew 11BB over that span.
- Was 2-for-5 with 1R on Monday vs. Tampa Bay.
- Reached base three times and hit his Major League-leading 35th HR of the season with a three-run shot in the seventh inning on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB).
- His 34HR marked the most by a Yankee prior to the All-Star break in franchise history...also are tied for the seventh-most in Major League history prior to the All-Star break, trailing only Barry Bonds' 39HR in 2001, Chris Davis' 37HR in 2013, Reggie Jackson's 37HR in 1969, Mark McGwire's 37HR in 1998, Luis Gonzalez's 35HR in 2001 and Ken Griffey Jr.'s 35HR in 1998.
- Was 0-for-2 for the American League in the All-Star Game on Tuesday...batted fourth in the starting lineup for the AL for the second time in his career (also 2021)...was named to his sixth career All-Star team (also 2017-18, '21-23).
- Became just the fifth Yankees outfielder to start at least five All-Star Games, joining Mickey Mantle (13), Joe DiMaggio (9), Dave Winfield (7) and Roger Maris (5)...was elected to the ASG in 2023 as a starter but did not play due to injury.
- Has reached the 30HR mark for the fifth time in his career (also 62HR in 2022, 52HR in 2017, 39HR in 2021 and 37HR in 2023)...is just the seventh player in franchise history to record five seasons of at least 30HR, joining Babe Ruth (13), Lou Gehrig (10), Mickey Mantle (nine), Alex Rodriguez (eight), Joe DiMaggio (seven) and Jason Giambi (five)...is just the third Yankee to hit at least 30HR in five of his first nine seasons, joining Mantle (five) and DiMaggio (five).
- Is hitting .392/.505/.899 (31-for-79) with 19R, 4 doubles, 12HR, 22RBI, 17BB, 2HP, 1SF and 35B in the first inning this season...12 of his 35HR this season have come in the first inning, the most in the Majors...the Yankees are 11-1 this year when he homers in the first inning and 18-3 in those games since 2023.
- The Yankees have gone 192-62 in his career when he homers...since 2020, the Yankees are 120-33 in those games...the Yankees are 24-9 this year when he homers.
- Has hit 292HR in 935 career Major League games, the most HR through a player's first 935 career games in Major League history (previous: Ryan Howard - 265HR).
- Since 2017, leads the Majors in HR (288), AB/HR (11.39) and WAR among position players (47.1), ranks second in walks (626), SLG (.602), OPS (1.006) and game-winning RBI (95), third in OBP (.403) and PA/BB (6.34), sixth in pitches per plate appearances (4.23), eighth in runs scored (680), ninth in extra-base hits (452) and 10th in go-ahead RBI (144).
- His 292 career home runs are the seventh-most in Yankees history...trails only Babe Ruth (659), Mickey Mantle (536), Lou Gehrig (493), Joe DiMaggio (361), Yogi Berra (358) and Alex Rodriguez (351)...are also the most HR as a member of the Yankees among players drafted and signed by the organization.

- Has reached base safely in 27 of his 38 games this season (with a PA) since returning from the injured list on 5/28.
- Reached base twice and hit his first HR of the season with a solo shot in the fifth inning on Monday vs. Tampa Bay (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB)...marked his first HR since 9/5/23 vs. Detroit, snapping a 57-game homerless streak (9/6/23-7/20/24)...was the second-longest homerless streak of his career, trailing only an 81-game stretch with Colorado from 8/13/13-5/27/14.
- As a Yankee (since 2019), has hit .290/.380/.443 (123-for-424) with 68R, 18 doubles, 4 triples, 13HR, 38RBI, 60BB, 3HP, 35F and 45B in 115 Interleague games.
- Has appeared in parts of 14 Major League seasons with Chicago-NL (2011), Colorado (2012-18) and the Yankees (2019-24)...won the NL batting title in 2016 (.348 w/ Colorado) and the AL batting title in 2020 (.364 w/ the Yankees)...according to the *Elias*, is just one of three players in Major League history to win a batting title in both leagues (also Luis Arraez and Ed Delahanty).

- Was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre prior to game on 7/13.
- Has not played in each of the last two games.
- Made his Major League debut on Saturday vs. Tampa Bay, entering the game as a defensive replacement at C (Wells) in the ninth inning (1-for-1)...recorded his first career Major League hit with a single in the ninth.
- In 71 games this season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, has hit .269 (68-for-253) with 45R, 17 doubles, 9HR, 47RBI, 45BB, 6HP, 45F and 8SB...has appeared defensively at C (45G/45GS), 1B (11G/10GS) and 3B (1G).
- Combined with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in 2023 to hit .239 (82-for-343) with 48R, 18 doubles, 12HR, 44RBI, 64BB, 9HP and 65B in 100 games...following the season, hit .256 (33-for-129) with 20R, 9 doubles, 2HR, 24RBI and 17BB in 40 games with the Cardenales de Lara of the Venezuelan Winter League.
- Following the 2023 season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as "Best Defensive Catcher" in the Yankees system.
- Was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 7/2/15...was resigned by the Yankees as a minor league free agent 10/21/22...was added to the active roster on 11/6/23.

### #93 BEN RICE—C/INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/6G

- Has reached base in 19 of his 24 starts this season.
- Has 18RBI over his last 17 games (since 6/30).
- Since 6/30, is hitting .273/.292/.773 (6-for-22) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 14RBI, 1BB and 1SF with RISP.
- Was 0-for-5 on Monday vs. Tampa Bay.
- Was just the sixth Yankee in franchise history to hit at least 6HR in his first 24 career games, joining Gary Sánchez (11HR from 2015-16), Shane Spencer (8HR in 1998), Kevin Maas (8HR in 1990), Shelley Duncan (6HR in 2007) and Steve Whitaker (6HR in 1966).
- Was just the seventh Yankee in franchise history to record at least 19RBI in his first 24 career games (since RBI became an official stat in 1920), joining Joe DiMaggio (27RBI in 1936), Shane Spencer (22RBI in 1998), Mickey Mantle (22RBI in 1951), George Selkirk (21RBI in 1934), Gary Sánchez (21RBI from 2015-16) and Hideki Matsui (21RBI in 2003).
- In 60 combined games with Double-A Somerset (49G) and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (11G) this season, has batted .275/.393/.532 (61-for-222) with 45R, 12 doubles, 15HR, 36RBI, 40BB and 9SB.
- Following the 2023 season, was named by MLB Pipeline as the Yankees' "Hitting Prospect of the Year" and was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the "Best Hitter for Average" among Yankees farmhands.

### #22 JUAN SOTO—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 4G/10G

- Has reached base safely in 87 of his 98 games this season, batting .311/.435/.594 (112-for-360) with 82R, 19 doubles, 4 triples, 25HR, 71RBI, 80BB, 2HP, 4SF and 5SB...his 87 games reaching base are tied with Aaron Judge and San Diego's Jurickson Profar for the most in the Majors...has reached base multiple times in 44 of his last 68 games (since 4/30) and in 62 of his 98 games this year...his 62 games of reaching base multiple times are tied with Aaron Judge for the most in the Majors...has also reached base at least three times in 33 games this season, the most such games in the Majors.
- Leads the Majors in walks (80) and times on base (194), is tied for first in runs scored (82, tied for first in AL) ranks second in OBP (.435, second in AL), third in OPS (1.029, second in AL) and SLG (.594, second in AL), fourth in WAR among position players (6.3 - FanGraphs, fourth in AL), is tied for fourth in RBI (71, tied for third in AL), fifth in BA (.311, third in AL) and sixth in HR (25, fourth in AL).
- His 22 multi-walk games this season are the most in the Majors.
- Is hitting .400/.495/.814 (28-for-70) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR, 50RBI, 16BB, 1HP and 4SF with RISP this season...ranks first in the Majors in BA and second in OBP, SLG and OPS (1.309) among Major League hitters with RISP this year.
- Is hitting .307/.429/.515 (31-for-101) with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR, 22BB, 1HP and 2SF vs. left-handed pitchers this season...among Major League left-handed batters, ranks second in OBP, fourth in OPS (.943), fifth in SLG and eighth in BA vs. left-handed pitchers.
- Is just the third Yankee (fourth time) in the last 87 years (since 1938) to record at least 25HR and 80BB in the team's first 102 games of a season, joining Jason Giambi (28HR/86BB in 2003) and Mickey Mantle (39HR/81BB in 1961 and 29HR/117BB in 1957)...is one of just five Yankees (19 times) to accomplish the feat (also Babe Ruth - 11 times; Lou Gehrig - four times).
- Is just the third Yankee (fourth time) in the last 87 years (since 1938) to record at least 80BB in the team's first 102 games of a season, joining Mickey Mantle (117BB in 1957 and 81BB in 1961) and Jason Giambi (86BB in 2003)...is one of just five Yankees (20th time) to accomplish the feat (also Babe Ruth - 11 times; Lou Gehrig - five times).
- Is just the third Yankee in the last 63 years (since 1962) to reach base at least 194 times in the team's first 102 games of a season, joining Jason Giambi (196TOB in 2002) and Derek Jeter (206TOB in 1999).
- Has recorded multiple hits in seven of his last nine games, batting .475/.512/.975 (19-for-40) with 10R, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 8RBI, 3BB and 1SB over that span (since 7/10).
- Recorded his 21st career multi-HR game and fourth of the year (also 2HR on 5/18 vs. Chicago-AL, 5/22 vs. Seattle and 6/2 at San Francisco) on Monday vs. Tampa Bay (3-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI)...hit a solo home run in the seventh inning and a three-run HR in the eighth inning, marking his 24th and 25th home runs of the year...his three extra-base hits tied his career high (fourth time: also 3XBB on 7/19/21 vs. Miami with Washington, 9/1/19 vs. Miami with Washington and 9/11/18-G2 at Philadelphia with Washington).
- His 21 career multi-HR games are tied with Eddie Mathews for the second-most by a Major League player age 25-or-younger, trailing only Mel Ott's 24 multi-HR games.
- Has recorded at least 3H in back-to-back games for the fifth time in his career and second time this season (also 2G on 5/7-8/24, 9/22-23/21, 7/18-19/21 and 5/23-24/19)...has recorded at least 3H in three of his last four games.
- In 76 career games vs. the Mets, is hitting .290/.416/.571 (75-for-259) with 45R, 17 doubles, 1 triple, 18HR, 45RBI, 54BB, 2HP and 7SB.
- Recorded a two-run double for the American League in the third inning of the 2024 All-Star Game (1-for-1, 1R, 1 double, 2RBI, 1BB)...batted third in the starting lineup, marking the first time in his career he has started in the Midsummer Classic.
- Has led the Majors in walks in each of the previous three seasons (132BB in 2023, 135BB in 2022, 145BB in 2021)...is the first player to lead the Majors in three straight seasons since Barry Bonds did so in four straight seasons from 2001-04...according to *Elias*, became one of 11 players all-time to lead the Majors in walks (since walks were first tracked in both leagues in 1913) in three-or-more seasons and joined Ted Williams (1941-42) as the only two players to do so multiple times before turning 25.
- His 720 career walks are the fourth-most by a player through his first 877 career games, trailing only Ted Williams (799), Max Bishop (781) and Frank Thomas (729)...are also the most by a Major League player prior to their 26th birthday (previous: Mickey Mantle-668BB).

### #25 GLEYBER TORRES—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/7G

- Ranks eighth in the Majors (fifth in AL) in pitches per plate appearance (4.22).
- Has reached base in 10 of his last 11 games (since 7/4), 19 of his last 22 games (since 6/18), 55 of his last 64 games (since 5/2), 60 of his last 72 games (since 4/24) and in 78 of his 96 games this season.
- Is batting .298 (17-for-59) with 6R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI, 6BB and 1SF in his last 16 games (since 6/28).
- Since 6/22, is batting .316 (6-for-19) with 1 double, 1HR, 7RBI, 2BB and 1SF with RISP.
- Did not play on Monday vs. Tampa Bay.

### #24 ALEX VERDUGO—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/11G

- Is tied for third in the Majors in game-winning RBI (11, tied for third in AL) and tied for fifth in sac flies (six, tied for third in AL)...also ranks fourth in the AL in percentage of swings put into play (45.1) and 10th in PA/K (6.49).
- Seven of his 10HR this year have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (six).
- Reached base twice and snapped an 0-for-20 stretch with a single in the sixth inning on Monday vs. Tampa Bay (1-for-3, 1BB).
- His 127 doubles over the last four seasons (since 2021) are the fourth-most in the American League and tied for the fifth-most in the Majors.
- Since 2020, his 39 outfield assists are tied for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Hunter Renfroe (42) and Teoscar Hernández (41).
- Is one of just eight Major League outfielders (min. 50% of games in OF) to appear in at least 140 games in each of the previous three seasons (2021-23).
- Is one of just two Major League players to strike out less than 100 times in each of the previous three seasons from 2021-23 (min. 600PA), joining Cleveland's José Ramírez.

### #11 ANTHONY VOLPE—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 5G/21G

- Is tied for third in the Majors in triples (seven, third in AL)...also is tied for ninth in hits among AL batters (105).
- Has 25 multi-hit games in 101 games this season...had 23 multi-hit games in 159 games in 2023.
