## RHP Chris Bassitt (4-2, 3.66) vs. LHP Tyler Anderson (6-0, 2.90) <br> SNY • WCBS 880 AM • ESPN 1050

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Dodgers, $2-0$, last night ending a sixgame winning streak...The Mets are 4-1 in their last five games and 7-3 in their last 10 games...The New York is 13-2-1 in 17 series this year...The Mets continue a 10game, 11-day California road trip ( $0-1$ ) at the Dodgers ( $0-1$ ), Padres (three games) and Angels (three games).

DOES ANYBODY REALLY KNOW WHAT TIME IT IS?: Today, Major League Baseball has announced that the game time on Wednesday, October 5 game vs. Washington has been changed to $4: 10$ p.m.

AW, SNAP: Mets pitchers threw 25.0 consecutive scoreless innings from the seventh inning on May 30 until the streak was broken in the fifth inning last night...The Mets last night became the last team in the majors this season to be shut out...The Mets were blanked in their 53rd game of the season, ending the fourth-longest season-opening streak in franchise history...The longest streak was accomplished by the 1986 Mets who were blanked in their 86 th game...The 1993 Mets were shut out in their 59th game and 1994 team was shut out in their 58th game.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets lead the majors with a . 290 (127-438) average with runners in scoring position...They rank third in MLB with a .360 OBP and seventh with a . 443 SLG in those situations...Several Mets are hitting .300 or better with RISP...Jeff McNeil leads the club with a . 395 (17-43) mark in those scenarios...J.D. Davis is hitting . 389 (7-18), Tomas Nido is batting . 364 (8-22), Francisco Lindor has hit . 340 (18-53), Mark Canha is batting . 333 (14-42) and Pete Alonso is hitting .319 (15-47)...Alonso has seven home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, two more than any other hitter in the majors.

SLOW DOWN, YOU'RE DOING FINE: Chris Bassitt owns the third-lowest average exit velocity ( 85.1 mph ) among all qualifying pitchers in the majors...That would be the lowest full-season mark of his career.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has posted a 0.61 ERA (one earned run/14.2 innings) over their last four games...They have allowed 10 hits, walked four and struck out 13 in that span...They have not allowed a run in their last 13.1 innings...The team's 3.39 ERA from relievers is third in the National League.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil is batting 320 (56-175) with 26 runs, 13 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 26 RBI, 15 walks, two steals with a .375 OBP, a 457 SLG and an . 832 OPS this season... He ranks fourth in the NL in batting average and ninth in the league in OBP (.375)...McNeil is ninth in the NL with 56 hits and tied for ninth with 13 doubles...ls tied for seventh in MLB with 18 multi-hit games...He is fifth in MLB with a 346 (28-81) road average and ranks fourth in MLB with a . 349 (46-131) average vs. RHP.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is $16-10$ on the road this year...Their .615 road winning percentage is the third-best in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 16th win on the road until June 19 in 2021 in their 36th road game (16-20)...New York is batting .259/.328/.395 away from Citi Field...Their .259 road average ranks second in the majors, while their . 328 OBP ranks third.

I LOVE LA: Brandon Nimmo is batting 406 (13-32) with five runs, two doubles, two home runs, four RBI, two walks with a . 457 OBP and a .656 SLG in 12 career games at Dodger Stadium.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN': Pete Alonso is batting . 361 (13-32) at the ballpark with six runs, two doubles, a triple, four home runs, nine RBI with a . 410 OBP, a 806 SLG and a 1.216 OPS in that span.

THE GUILLORME CHEF: Luis Guillorme has reached base safely in seven straight games dating to May $25 \ldots$...He is batting . 417 (10-24) with nine runs, a double, three RBI, seven walks, a . 548 OBP and a 1.007 OPS...He is batting $.356 / .448 / .444$ with 19 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 15 walks and a steal with a . 448 OBP and a . 444 SLG this season...After batting . 071 (1-14) in his first eight games, Guillorme is batting . 408 (31-76) with 19 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 12 walks, a steal with a . 489 OBP, a . 513 SLG and a 1.002 OPS over his last 27 games...Among players with 100 or more plate appearances, Guillorme's .356 batting average is fourth in the majors and second in the NL...His . 448 OBP tops the major leagues.

MARTE PARTAY: Starling Marte has safely hit in 13 of his last 15 games and is batting .328 (22-67) in that span with 15 runs, four doubles, two triples, three home runs, 11 RBI, two walks and a .930 OPS in that stretch...He is batting . 280 (54-193) with 32 runs, nine doubles, two triples, six home runs, 31 RBI with a . 440 SLG in 45 games this year.

DODGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped the season series to the Dodgers
in each of the last five seasons...The Mets last won a series at Dodgers Stadium from September 3-5, 2018, winning two of the three games.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: J.D. Davis has recorded multiple hits in four of his last seven games... He is batting $.423(11-26)$ with six runs, three doubles, three RBI, a walk with a . 464 OBP, a .538 SLG and a 1.003 OPS in that span... Over his last 17 games, Davis is batting .286/.349/.393...He owns a . 341/.429/.537 slashline in 15 road games, compared to a $.170 / .264 / .213$ slashline in 16 games at Slashline in 15 road

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last six games, Tomás Nido is batting . 444 (8-18) with five runs, a double, three RBI, a walk with a . 974 OPS...Over his last 15 games, he is batting . $311(14-45)$ with five runs, two doubles, five RBI, three walks with a .354 OBP.

JOY DIVISION: The Mets have been in first place all but one day this season... The Mets enter play today with a 9.5-game lead, the largest lead in MLB...It is one game below their largest lead of the season.

BY THE WAY: New York has won a National League-leading 35 games...Their . 660 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 35-18 record through the team's first 53 games...Only the 1986 $(37-16)$ and the $1988(36-17)$ teams posted a better record through the first 53 games of the season...The 1988 team also went 35-18.

CAN'T STOP: Francisco Lindor has driven in a run in 10 consecutive games, the longest streak in MLB this season and tied for the second-longest ever by a Met... He has 20 RBI in that span...The streak is tied for the longest by a National League shortshop with Hanley Ramirez (June 21-July 1, 2009)...Courtesy of Stats Perform.

LINSANITY: Lindor has 20 RBI in his last 10 games and has 43 RBI this season, seven more than he had in the entire first half last year ( 87 games )... He did not reach 43 RBI last year until September 5 in his 99th game of the year...Lindor is fourth in the majors and third in the NL in RBI...He is tied for firth in the majors and third in the NL with 37 runs scored.

FRANCISCO INFERNO: Over his last 18 games, Francisco Lindor is batting . 324 (22-68) with 19 runs, two doubles, two triples, three home runs, 24 RBI, 10 walks, three steals with a . 402 OBP, a .544 SLG and a . 947 OPS...He has raised his batting average from .231 to .261 in that span and his OBP has risen from .315 to .345 .

DOMINATING DİAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the sixth-most in the majors... He leads major league relievers with 40 strikeouts...His 16.62 strikeouts per nine innings also leads the majors... He has struck out 40 of the 88 batters he faced, good for $45.5 \%$... He is $2-1$ with 11 saves, a 2.49 ERA (six the 88 batters he faced, good for $45.5 \% \ldots$... He is $2-1$ with 11 saves, a 2.49 ERA (six
earned runs/21.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are $21-1$ when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets....That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodríguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets... He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is $10-14$ with 74 saves, a 3.80 ERA ( 71 earned runs $/ 168.0$ innings) with 69 walks and 278 strikeouts... His 278 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the thirdhighest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (305) and Josh Hader (297) have struck out more...Additionally, his 278 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 286 ...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Mets Manager Buck Showalter is in his first season with the team...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with $1,586 \ldots$ He ranks 23 rd on the all-time win list, surpassing Dick Williams $(1,571)$ earlier this year...Tommy Lasorda is next at 1,599 wins.


LAST TIME OUT: In his 10th start as a New York Met, Bassitt went 6.0 innings against the Phillies on May 29 allowing only one run on two hits... He came out of the game with 100 total pitches with three walks and seven strikeouts...The two hits given up came in the first and third inning--a single and double...Following the hits, Bassitt retired the next 10 batters he faced...This was the sixth time he has allowed one or no runs in a start this season.

THE GANG HITS THE ROAD: Bassitt has won three of his four road starts this season, going 3-0 with a 3.68 ERA (nine earned runs/22.0 innings)...Across those starts he has struck out 22 batters and walked eight... His three road wins rank tied for fifth in the majors...Bassitt has a .214 opponent batting average on the road compared to his .234 batting average at home.

VS. LOS ANGELES: Tonight, Bassitt make first career away start against the Dodgers...Bassitt has only made one start in his career against the Dodgers and it was at the Coliseum with Oakland April 6, 2021...In that start he went 6.0 innings giving up four runs on nine hits... He struck out four batters and walked one... Against the NL West, Bassitt owns a 4.25 ERA ( 32 earned runs/ 67.2 innings).
SLOW DOWN, YOU'RE DOING FINE: Chris Bassitt owns the third-lowest average exit velocity ( 85.1 mph ) among all qualifying pitchers in the majors...That would be the lowest full-season mark of his career.

DON'T STOP ME NOW: Bassitt is tied for seventh in the NL with seven starts of at least 6.0 innings this year...He has allowed three runs or fewer in all but three of his starts this season...In 116 career games ( 103 starts), Bassitt has only given up four or more runs 25 times...He has surrendered three runs or fewer in his remaining 91 games.

HOLLYWOOD STAR: Since 2020, Bassitt ranks 10th in the majors with 7.1 bWAR... In 2022 he ranks 10th in the NL in strikeouts (60).

RIGHT WHERE HE WANTS THEM: When Bassitt is ahead in the count against opponents they are held to a . 174 batting average... He owns a sub-. 200 opponent batting average when there are two strikes in any count.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: Chris Bassitt ranks eighth in strikeouts (60) and seventh in strikeout percentage (24.4) among starters through their first ten games as a New York Met.
FEW HITS: The right-hander ranks 11th-fewest in the majors in hits allowed to righthanded batters and 10th-fewest in that category among right handed starters.

JUNE: This is Bassitt's first start of June...In 17 career starts in the month of June Bassitt owns a $7-6$ record and 3.28 ERA ( 35 earned runs/96.0 innings)...Bassitt's June numbers are some of his lowest in any month having given up the fewest hits and fewest runs in June (min. 90.0 innings)

NEVER SAY NEVER: In eight seasons in the majors, Chris Bassitt had never allowed more than two home runs in a game prior to his start on May 24...Bassitt's eight runs allowed were the most he has ever allowed in a start...The last time Bassitt gave up more than six runs in a game was on September 13, 2019 when he gave up seven to the Rangers in Texas.
